For Health's Sake

Don't put yourself at risk for a winter fire — part 2

Keeping warm

here are more ways to keep warm than just using the fireplace. Here are a few suggestions:

- Set the thermostat at 65 degrees or higher.
- Never leave fireplaces, woodstoves or space heaters unattended. Always use extreme caution with auxiliary heat sources.
- Speak with a trusted contractor about doing a winter survey on your home. You may want to install plastic coating over your windows and doors, a sump pump in your

basement, storm windows or consider purchasing special padding or foam to prevent drafts around cracks where air can escape. If a complete storm window upgrade is out of your price range, consider replacing old storm windows on just the northern exposure of your home where it is vulnerable to the cold.

- Add extra insulation to attics, basements and crawl spaces. Ideally, the attic should be five to ten degrees warmer than the outside air.
- Have the heating system serviced. Furnaces, boilers and chimneys should be serviced at least once a year to prevent fire

and smoke damage.

Last Heath Ledger film surprisingly delightful

love going to a movie I know little about, then finding myself delighted with what I see. Terry Gilliam's The Imaginarium of Doctor Parnassus is a recent example. Of course, almost everyone had heard of the film because actor Heath Ledger passed away during filming. With speculation about Parnassus rampant, Gilliam and co-writer Charles McKeown eventually reworked the script and cast Johnny

Depp, Jude Law and Colin Farrell to fill in for Ledger.

Although set in modern-day London, the film's dark streets and costumes resemble a much earlier era. Dr. Parnassus (Christopher Plummer) is a dreamer and creative artist who harbors a deep secret. He travels the streets of London pulling along his whimsical Imaginarium - a traveling side show that beckons onlookers to come on stage and step through the Dr.'s magic mirror.

Helping with this charade, Percy (Verne Troyer) is the perfect sidekick who keeps the customers coming and the show moving along. Co-worker Anton (Andrew Garfield) evens out Percy's sarcastic personality. He's a starry-eyed youth who has eyes for Parnassus' daughter, Valentina (Lily Cole), and will do anything to be near her. Competition enters the scene when commoner Tonu

(Ledger) gets rescued from the streets, and he and Valentina are instantly attracted to each

Most viewers will be immediately entranced with the movie's mystifying story, the incredible look of the film and the performances. I was willing to go along for the ride right from the beginning, and the story becomes even more intriguing as the plot thickens. We soon learn that years ago - when Parnassus was in his prime and seeking one particular beauty - he made a deal with the devil, Mr. Nick (Tom Waits). This agreement involved turning his daughter over to Mr. Nick when she was 16. With the time close at hand. Mr. Nick is hot on the trail and licking his lips at Valentina's every move. Can making another deal with Dr. Nick save Parnassus' precious daughter?

Cinematographer Nicola Pecorini (Tideland) and editor Mick Audsley (Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire) had their work cut out for them with this film but excel in capturing every magical moment so inclusively we want to revisit every scene. Stepping through that magic mirror transports Parnassus's victims - customers - into an imaginary world that changes their personality and outlook on life. Hopefully, when they emerge back on stage, they will shower him with cash as well as their expensive possessions. These fanciful worlds come alive through CG and the efforts of Peerless Camera Company, the London-based optical house.

It's in these magical worlds where we meet our quartet of gents playing Tony in different mediums. Ledger (The Dark Knight) is terrific in his transformations and brings great energy to the film. Depp (Public Enemies), Jude Law (Sherlock Holmes) and Colin Farrell (Crazy Heart) receive little screen time in Parnassus, but their transitions as Tony work extremely well within the story's imaginary elements.

While I found Plummer exceptional in his anomalous role and Cole delightful as the girl quickly becoming a woman in


more ways than one, it's Trover who amused me the most. His idiosuncratic character. enhanced by his small size, is hilarious. In fact, he's one of my picks for this year's Best Supporting Actor.

Parents should note that while the movie's trailers may

look enticing to youngsters, a "PG-13" rating seems quite appropriate for this film.

2010 Nissan Altima Hybrid

ome people may not know this, but when Nissan and Toyota started their Hybrid technology back in 2002, they signed an agreement that they would share the technology. Today Toyota supplies Nissan with the Hybrid system and Nissan takes care of the rest. With this relationship, one would think the two companies would have vehicles that drive and act the same. This is the farthest from the truth, both companies' hybrid vehicles drive totally different and the Altima is a wonderful five passenger sedan. No one would even know that it was a hybrid if it wasn't for the no-sound city driving. One point everyone asks about when mentioning electric vehicles or even hybrid is how far can it be driven? Not realizing electric vehicles are for short distance driving and hybrid are for combined short and long distance driving. The Hybrid Altima will give you 600 miles of range on one tank of fuel. Now that is what I'm talking about, regular unleaded fuel and go 600 miles, Hybrids are starting to make sense to me.

Let's chat about the car itself; the gas-power comes from a 2.5-liter Dual Overhead Camshaft 16-Valve four cylinder front wheel drive engine back by a Electronically Controlled Continuously Variable Transmission that has no shift points. Once the driver steps down on the gas, first the electric motor kicks in and with more foot pressure, the gas engine kicks in with your acceleration needs. The electric motor is a 198 Hybrid horsepower unit and the transition is smooth as butter. If consumers need to know the Power pack contains 244.8V of power coming from a sealed Nickel-Metal Hydride (Ni-MH) 40 horsepower (30 KW) unit. The other thing worth mentioning about the 2010 Nissan Hybrid Altima is it is rated as Advanced Technology Partial Zero Emissions vehicles which helps the environment and keep the air clean.


The rest of the Altima is just like its gas burning cousin except for a different dash layout, but all in all it is a great five passenger car with all the amenities that aren't normally in a Hybrid. With the Altima, consumers get styling contoured reclining front seats, tilt and telescoping steering wheel, cruise control with steering wheel controls, AM/FM/CD/AUX audio system with six

speakers thought out the car. Also includes A/C in cabin filter, dual zone climate controls, rear passenger floor vents for heat and cool air, power windows with driver power up and down, power door locks dual 12-volt DC power outlets for all the electronic gadgets. Also included are front map lights and sunglass storage pod in the roof, door panel will hold water

Moving outside the vehicle one will notice a very distinct styling that sets the Altima apart from the Hybrid competition, Halogen lighting, chrome tipped exhaust tips, (kind of funny having performance exhaust tips on a Hybrid), and a well designed body that slips through the air giving 35 miles per gallon in the city and 33 on the open road.

Warranty coverage is interesting, the car gets a 3 year 36,000 mile bumper to bumper warranty, the drivetrain is covered for 5-year 60,000 mile powertrain warranty and the Altima Hybrid System is covered by an 8-year 100,000 mile warranty and certain portions of the mandated California Emission items are covered for 15 years or 150,000 miles.



Finding time to train my puppy ... ask a trainer

Dear Trainer,

have a new dog that is about 8 months old. We have taken two group classes, but I wasn't very good about doing the training between each meeting, so now our dog doesn't seem like she is really trained at all. The reason is that I'm so busy all the time, and by the time I get home from work, training my dog was the last thing I wanted to do. My New Year's resolution is to carve out time to work with my dog so I thought I would start by asking you if you had any ideas about how to fit everything in and still have time to work with her.

Signed, Busy Bee

Dear Busy,

I know exactly how you feel as I too am very busy, and have a new puppy that requires me to teach her what I expect of her, as well as getting through house training.

My first advice is to take a deep breathe when ever you feel overwhelmed by your dog, because whether or not you realize it, you are training your dog every waking moment you are with your dog. So, with

that in mind, be careful what you teach! Often when we are busy, we tend to react to situations rather than respond. So, if your dog is doing something you don't want her to do and you react by giving attention to your dog in that moment, you may very well train your dog to believe that misbehaving gets your attention.

Next, all is not lost if you began with classes, at least you know what the basics are and it's not like you have to learn all of the timing, etc. again. With that, let's look at how you can fit in your training without it seeming like such a daunting task.

Keep it short

Training should be done in short sessions, so that is to your advantage. Dogs or people don't like the old "drill" type of training that used to be taught, so look for 2-10 minutes a day to work on the basics, and intertwine others as you go about your business.
can intertwine training things
"Fra Contact," "Sit," like "Eye Contact," "Sit," and "Down," with all kinds of things you would be doing anyway. For instance, if you are working in the kitchen, fixing a meal or a snack, most dogs will usually hang close since that is the room with

all the food. Practice asking your dog to "Sit," while you prepare your food. You can have a small amount of some special things that won't contaminate your food to reinforce your dog. A few things that come to mind are tiny pieces of cheese, Cheerios, Gold Fish crackers, or small pieces of hot dogs. You can count out 10 treats and get 10 "Sits, Eye Contact, or Down" as you ready your food.

I work at my computer a lot when I am not working with my clients, so I have a mat set up right by my desk to give the puppy a visual of where I would like her. Every time she lies on her mat, she gets a treat. It didn't take long before the mat to became like a target for my puppy and now I can take it around the house with me if I want her to lie down and relax, rather than being under feet, and I don't have to reinforce her very often because the behavior has become one she likes.

I also take my puppy's mat with me when we go places and she knows how to calm herself down, even in public. This makes for easy, simple training and gives dogs a skill that they should have in their toolbox.

Be prepared

Keep treats in your pocket or around the house in candy dishes where your dog can't reach them, but are easy to grab into if you see your dog doing something you like. Reinforcing good behaviors when you see them will encourage your dog to repeat those behaviors again. So, don't ignore your dog if she is sitting calmly, reinforce that calmness by walking by and dropping a treat on the ground between her paws. Again, this is very easy training and little time is required.

I really like to count out treats and have little bags with 30 or so treats, all ready to go for "official" training sessions. I also make little labels for them with one behavior

on each one. That way I can reach into the refrigerator and pull out a bag and whatever is written on the bag is the behavior I train. So, if it's sit that I got, I will get 15 sits from that 30 treats, since I use a treat after every sit to toss away so my puppy will get up from the sit, so I can do it again. This is a great game for dogs and sitting becomes a very normal behavior to offer when you train like this. Also, if you are intertwining your training throughout the day or evening, and "Sit," is one of the behaviors you are working on, your dog will start offering sits all the time in hopes you are going to "play that game" again. It will be the same with the other behaviors you are working on as well.

To find extra "official" time to train, look at training during activities you don't love to do, so things like sorting laundry, commercial time while watching TV, waiting for something in the microwave, dusting, etc. It's easy to train your dog during those times and they also give you an end point to the training.

These are exactly the things I do with my puppy and she is pretty good at all of her basics, and I don't feel like I had to spend too much of my precious time on any skill set.
