

Circus Vargas coming to East County



Local plastic surgeon gives back with his time and talent

r. Ervin S. Wheeler, M.D., F.A.C.S., is much more than a "Top Plastic Surgeon" (San Diego Magazine) in the County. He's very proud of his profession where he improves people's physical appearance and self-esteem by providing safe, natural-looking, and

aesthetically pleasing face and body enhancement at his stateof-the-art Aesthetic Plastic Surgery Center in La Mesa.

Wheeler's commitment to his trade, however, goes far beyond the clients who walk through his door. He actually travels south of the border in Mexico where he volunteers his time and talents several times a year repairing children's cleftlips and palates. He does this free of charge.

"It's kind of cliché, but I want to give back," Wheeler said. "I have the ability to do these things." Wheeler has seen a great need in Mexico for the kind of help he can offer because many people fall outside the country's health

care system. Wheeler works through an organization called Interface, which originated through UCSD but is now a privately run organization. He's been a plastic surgeon, and doing humanitarian work for 30 years.

Wheeler normally makes three to five trips a year to Mexico to help the less fortunate, but because of cut-backs due to the economy; he's had to limit his trips to three times a year. His work is funded mostly through donations from private San Diego County citizens.

He, the nurses and anesthesiologists average three to five days per trip. Most recently, the team has gone to Mexicali and La Piedad. Working from local hospitals, they normally help 30 to 40 children, but sometimes up to 100 children per weekend. The team goes

beyond just showing up. "We bring our own equipment rather than using the Mexican hospitals' equipment," Wheeler said.

In addition to repairing cleftlips and palates for needy children, Wheeler also works with burn victims, and children suffering from congenital defects or facial trauma. He refrains from performing high-risk surgeries that would require hospitalization or blood transfusions. Occasionally he extends his healing hands to adults. Once when asked for help from a 69-year-old man with a cleft-lip, Wheeler obliged. The man soon returned – with his mustache shaved off - to thank the doctor. The man was grateful that the 68-year-old woman by his side had agreed to marry him as a result of the procedure.

"The couple was of Indian heritage from a small village in rural Mexico, and had not been allowed to marry because the man had a physical deformity," said Wheeler, who expressed that stories like these make

his humanitarian efforts more rewarding than they already are.

San Diego Magazine awarded its coveted title of "Top Plastic Surgeon" to Wheeler in 2005 because of his exceptional skills, his outstanding record for safety, and his dedication to his profession. In addition to his La Mesa practice, Wheeler trains future plastic surgeons as an Associate Professor at the University of California's School of Medicine in San Diego. There he can stay on top of plastic surgery advancements and contribute to the future of medicine. Wheeler also works as a consultant to Cytori Therapeutics to develop adult stem cell treatments for cardiovascular, spine, and gastrointestinal disorders, and to find new approaches for aesthetic and reconstructive surgery using adult stem cells.





For Realth's Sake

Exercise: Good for the brain

ou've heard that memory, as well as the ability to think and process information quickly, diminishes with age. You know the feeling. You come face to face with a longtime acquaintance and her name sticks on the tip of your tongue. Or, you suddenly draw a blank when dialing a telephone number you've known for years.

Many of us experience memory glitches and accept these occurrences as a normal sign of aging that will only worsen over time. However, there are things we can do to stay sharp. New studies show that exercise actually improves memory and cognitive ability.

According to Dr. Steven Weiniger, author of Stand Taller ~ Live Longer: An Anti-Aging Strategy, "Current research shows physical fitness has a positive effect on mental fitness. Regular exercise is a powerful strategy for improving memory, as well as reduc-

ing the risks of illness that could lead to memory loss."

A 2006 study reported in the Annals of Internal Medicine found that people ages 65 and older that exercised at least three times per week had a 30-40% lower risk of dementia than those in their age group who did not exercise.

"You cannot ignore the mindbody connection. Research shows consistent exercise reduces the risk of developing dementia and Alzheimer's. As important to note is that not exercising increases the risk of these illnesses. For the sake of the brain and the body, move it to keep it," says Dr. Weiniger.

Here are some easy ways to get started:

1. Walk. Find excuses to walk every day. Stroll to the mailbox; always choose parking spots that are further from your desired destination, walk around the house while chat-

ting on the phone. If you've already developed a daily walking routine, increase the distance and duration of your trips.

- **2. Explore.** Now is a great time to discover new interests that involve active participation. Start a garden, participate in nature walks, volunteer in your community, or join a social group that organizes regular outings.
- **3. Partner.** Schedule a regular walk with a good friend;

plan picnic lunches that begin and end with a walk in the park; sign up for a yoga, tai chi or posture exercise class. Commit to stay fit together.

Exercise your brain by moving your body. Start now, be consistent and gradually increase activity to stay fit in body and mind.



'Dear John' should have been a made-for-TV-movie

ost everyone knows what a Dear John letter is. The dreaded missive breaks a man's heart when he knows what's about to happen before he even opens the letter. Dear John is adapted from the book written by Nicholas Sparks who also created the tear-jerkers The Notebook and Message in a Bottle.

While special ops soldier John Tyree (Channing Tatum) is enjoying his two week vacation, he runs into Savannah Curtis (Amanda Seyfried), and they immediately strike up a relationship. The two weeks go by quickly, and they vow to keep in constant touch via snail mail. Each one eagerly awaits the one-year mark when John is released from duty. But circumstances change when

the 9-11 tragedy occurs, and John is asked to re-enlist. He must decide between duty and love.

I don't know a good reason why this movie is in the theaters and not on the Lifetime channel. There's no nudity, language, or memorable action scenes to speak of. Tatum's commanding presence and Seyfried's infectious smile is not good enough reason for single men to spend money on a ticket. Of course, the target audience is women, and at least from the reactions of women sitting next to me in the theater, it was well received.

Performances by the cast are sufficient. Seyfried is pleasant and has a good onscreen chemistry with Tatum. The best performance is from Richard Jenkins as John's father. There is a scene with him and his son

that should get the waterworks going, so have those tissues ready. *Dear John* is mediocre, a tad boring at times and slightly predictable, but does deliver the necessary qualities to touch a few hearts for those who can relate to this scenario – especially military wives and girlfriends.



'From Paris With Love' wastes its star power with predictable script

ovie fans love John Travolta. Longtime fans were charmed by the 1950s doo-wop slicked hair baddie in Grease or the hilarious Vinnie Barbarino in the TV series Welcome Back Carter. Who doesn't think about Travolta in his white suit when hearing the music score to Saturday Night Fever? Newer fans gained respect for his talent in the Oscar-nominated Pulp Fiction. Unfortunately, From Paris with Love is another mediocre movie slice in Travolta's film pie, but I can't deny it's a joy to see him again on the big screen. Whether viewers will enjoy the film depends on one's taste in movies. If excessive violence and more bodies gunned down than bullets in a submachine gun get your adrenalin jumping, than From Paris with Love might be for you.

James Reece (Jonathan Rhys Meyers), an American living in Paris, is the assistant to U.S. Ambassador Bennington (Richard Durden), but he really wants to be a spy. Unknown by Bennington, Reece is on the call-waiting list to be a real CIA secret operative. His first test involves getting a hidden mic into one of Bennington's high profile government meetings. With no game plan ahead of time, chewing gun comes to his rescue.

While enjoying blissful romantic days with his French girlfriend Caroline (Kasia Smutniak), Reece receives the call he's been waiting for. He's to report to the airport and help an undercover operative get through customs. That's where Reece meets the bald-headed, ear-ring wearing Charlie Wax (Travolta) who looks like a thug and refuses to surrender his numerous cans of energy drinks to customs.

Reece comes to the rescue and learns in the car on their way to their assignment why those cans were important. When the guys enter a Chinese restaurant and Wax kills every employee – and more that emerge from hidden places – Reece isn't sure what to make of his new partner.

Wax and Reese are like Dirty Harry and Rambo one minute and Jackie Chan and Owen Wilson (Shanghai Knights) the next. Their work involves exploiting and killing numerous drug runners and terrorists of various ethnic

origins. In between the blood baths, a few moments of humor occur.

One such moment comes in a scene where Wax shoots up the Chinese restaurant so thoroughly that cocaine rains down from the ceiling. Wax empties a large vase of flowers, collects some of the cocaine and hands the vase to Reece, who ridiculously holds on to it through many unrealistic action scenes. Another shows Max sitting in the window of a moving car while hanging on to a bazooka and trying to shoot a suspected terrorist in another moving car. Implausible, but at least laughable.

As far as Travolta goes, he's the same character he was in *The Taking of Pelham 1 2 3*, only this time he's on the other side of the badge. His character is all over the place but because Travolta feels he's this operative, we do too. Caroline is a beautiful young girl who makes dresses out of their apartment curtains and is as smitten with Reece as he is with her. Smutniak has a great chemistry with Rhys Meyers.

After watching the Golden Globe winning (*Elvis*) and nominated-twice Rhys Meyers in *The Tudors* TV series, I believe he set the bar for his other performances exceptionally high. Happily, I found his portrayal fit the character in *From Paris with Love*. He has an excellent rapport with Travolta, is amusing in the comedy scenes and quite believable in more emotional sequences near the end of the film

From Paris with Love offers nothing new for its genre. Adi Hasak's screenplay from a

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING CHAPTER 16.60 OF TITLE 16 OF THE EL CAJON MUNICIPAL CODE AND ADDING A
NEW CHAPTER 16.60 TO TITLE 16 OF THE EL CAJON MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING THE CITY OF EL CAJON STANDARD URBAN STORM WATER
MITIGATION PLAN.

On January 24, 2007, the San Diego Regional Water Quality Control Board adopted Order No. R9-2007-0001, which amended its Order No. 2001-01, regulating storm water discharges and pollutants in urban runoff in the city of El Cajon and throughout the County of San Diego, in accordance with its National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit No. CAS0108758. Order No. R9-2007-0001 continues the mandate established by Order No. 2001-01 by requiring that the city of El Caion adopt ordinances and regulations to prevent the discharge of pollutants from urban runoff into the rivers and bays within the County of San Diego, and into the Pacific Ocean. Part of Order No. R9-2007-0001 is the requirement that the various public agencies within the County, having jurisdiction over the control of storm waters that originate in and pass through each jurisdiction, have a consistent, multi-jurisdictional plan for mitigating the impact of storm waters that may ultimately reach rivers and bays, and the Pacific Ocean, in San Diego County.

Super Bowl Champs —Saints are dat good

t took 43 years for this Mississippi delta bayou to prove that patience is a virtue. Its residents and fans are celebrating Mardi Gras early in 2010 thanks to the world-champion, that's right...world champion New Orleans Saints ... after laying claim to the title and hoisting the Vince Lombardi trophy high, humbling Peyton Manning and the Indianapolis Colts 31-17 in Super Bowl XLIV.

"Mardi Gras may never end," said a beaming, winning quarterback Drew Brees who was deservingly named Most Valuable Player based on his spectacular Super game-day performance, completing 32-of-39 passes for 288 yards, 2 touchdowns, no interceptions

He finished second All-Time with highest Super Bowl pass completion percentage of 82.1 percent runner up to former New York Giants quarterback Phil Simms at 88.0 percent (now a CBS Sports lead analyst who called this game).

Drew Brees, a former Chargers starting quarterback, arrived in New Orleans in 2006 and was given a chance that no other team would while he recovered from a torn labrum surgery on a severely separated shoulder.

He was welcomed to a city and region that suffered through hurricane Katrina when winds and rain tore it to shreds, and flooding waters engulfed the majority of the community. In 2006, the Saints played all their games on the road except for one. No one

knew if the city or the football team could rebound...but rebound they did.

The New Orleans Saints rebuilt that year with nine free-agents.

The city rebuilt slowly with determination from its residents and support from a caring nation.

"We just continued to believe in ourselves and found a way to win," said Brees. "People were evacuating to places all over the country. Most left not knowing if New Orleans would ever come back."

Come back they did, both the city and their football team.

Overcoming a 10-point deficit, a 5-point underdog, the

Saints again after trailing by at least one touchdown in all three post-season games, emulated the never-say-die attitude of its city.

Down 10-0 early after quarter one (38-yard Stover field goal, 19-yard Manning to Garcon TD pass) the Saints got to within four points at the halftime intermission 10-6 on two (second year kicker) Hartley field goals of 46, and 44 yards.

The game would change because of another Payton... Saints Head Coach Sean Payton

Calling a gutsy on-sides kick to start the 2'nd half, momentum would soon turn in the Saints direction. This was to be the first ever Super Bowl pre-fourth quarter onside kick attempt. He even informed the referees of the kick before the game and the team of his plan at the intermission. Payton showed confidence in his kicker and the team. He also told the club in the locker room. "We're 30 minutes from being World Champions."

True to his word to start the third quarter and to everyone's surprise except the Saints, the onside kick went through the hands of the Colts Hank Baskett and was recovered at the New Orleans 42-yard line by Chris Reich giving New Orleans resurgent hope of a remarkable comeback.

Coach Payton also showed leadership and intellect when he challenged and won a critical fourth quarter 2-point conversion that was overturned in his favor giving New Orleans a 24-17 lead .

Down by 7 points in the fourth quarter, the Colts were driving hoping to tie it up. That's when New Orleans Saints Tracy Porter hopped in front of Reggie Wayne, Peyton Manning pass jetting 74-yards to the end zone putting the black-and-gold up 14-points sealing the victory. Manning drove his team down to the Saints 5-yard line but the drive ended when a fourth down pass fell incomplete. Let the party begin...

San Diego native, Helix High (player of the week from this paper), USC alumnus Reggie Bush played well catching four Drew Brees passes for 38yards while gaining 25-yards on five rushing attempts.

"Our coach is unbelievable," said a celebratory Drew Brees as his head coach was carried off the field.

Being the perfectionist that he is, Sean Payton had this to say hours after his teams victory. "Last night was great, yet there is still something that burns in you to separate yourself more."

Super Bowl XLIV in Miami was an entertaining game, one of the best I can remember. These were two evenly matched teams with two potential first ballot future Hall-of-Fame quarterbacks and excellent coaching.

Sean Payton couldn't have coached a better game. Peyton Manning was Peyton Manning. He had his team in it until the final interception. Drew Brees proved he is a Hall-of-Fame Super Bowl MVP and couldn't have played a better game.

This Saints victory wasn't just another Super Bowl win. It was a long-awaited championship for an organization and fans that needed a rallying point. This was a culmination of their long hard fought efforts.

Yet the desire burns in their Head Coach, team, and city to repeat...

New Orleans is a city truly united by their team, and their team was united by them.

Bumper-To-Bumper with Dave Stall

Dave: I just bought a 2006 Chevy Silverado 1500 from Carmax. I've had it only a week and when I test drove it the transmission shifted hard between gears. I asked the salesman and he said he would make me an appointment with service to check it out. I want a new transmission, this is a new truck, and I feel deserve it. What are my options? Dawn.

Dawn: Naturally you will feel that way but the ball is in Carmax's court. They will check out the transmission and since you have been driving it they may just repair or rebuild it. As long as they address the problem, fix it and you have a warranty you should be good to go. I have had no complaints on Carmax so I would proceed as per their directions and keep me in the loop if you need to.

Dave: I bought a 2010 Ford Flex. I love the car but it has a bunch of gremlins in it. It makes ding noises at times and the transmission flairs. I've had it back to them seven times but with no correction. The dealer has been great, I get a loaner every time and the owner of the dealership has met me personally in the service drive to make sure I'm taken care of. I appreciate all the dealer has done but my wife won't drive the car any more. What should we do? One more thing, I got \$3500 from the Cash for Clunkers Program which helped me buy the Flex, will I lose that on the replacement vehicle? Ralph.

Ralph: Much as I hate to bring it up but I think you have a solid Lemon Law Case where the manufacturer needs to take back the Flex and replace it with another Flex since you really like the car. It's a long process but if you stick to it you will end up with a new Flex. As far as the Cash for Clunkers issue that will be up to Ford Motor Company, make sure you put that in your letter when corresponding with Ford, good luck.

Dave: Do I have to run 91 octane gas in my Toyota FJ?

Aida: No, but be prepared for possible fuel injection contamination, poor fuel mileage and possible damage to your intake and exhaust valves if you don't. Using the correct fuel will pay for itself in the long run, trust me!

After driving the 2010 Altima SR for a few days I kept wondering if I could live with out the 3.5 SR Premium Package which sets buyers back \$2,380. Included in the package are leather accents in the seats and shift knob. The driver and passenger's seats have powered lumbar including seat heaters. Also included are Bluetooth, Bose Premium Sound System with nine speakers and XM radio, USB port with iPod hook up, 4.3 inch screen for navigation and back up camera, auto dimming rear view mirror, compass, Homelink (for those gates, lights

and garage door openers) and rear A/C vents for the rear passengers.

The next package put on my tester was the Sport Package, another \$2,370 which included a rear deck lid spoiler, fog lights, High Intensity Xenon headlights, dual zone A/C, and a power sun roof with sliding shade.

Are we done yet? Nope, now we have another bundle of goodies marked Technology Package which will set buyers back another \$1,780. This package includes Nissan Navigation System with touch screen, a 9.3 GB Music Hard

Drive XM, NavTraffic, Nav Weather, streaming audio DVD Player and a VTR jack.

If none of these items sound interesting the base Altima comes well equipped for a mere \$24,520 versus \$31,945 plus tax and license. Standard equipment is a long and comprehensive list including a 3.5-liter V6 that produces 270 horsepower and 20 miles per gallon in the city and 27 on the open road all with unleaded fuel. The Continuously Variable Transmission helps with gas mileage as well as giving the driver a feel of power when needed. There are front and rear sway bars for handling, power rack and pinion steering, independent front suspension, multi-link in the rear, disc brakes and a 17-inch tire and wheel package.


Safety is all around with the Nissan front air bag system, side impact air bags, roof mounted curtain air bag, and front seat active head rests, zone body construction with front and rear crumble zones. The Altima received only a four-star rating for frontal impact as per the NHTSA instead of five stars. Owners also get ABS braking, traction control, vehicle

dynamic control, tire pressure monitoring system, and vehicle security system,

Comfort abounds in the 8-way power cloth driver seat and 60/40 split rear seats, accented with wood and leather treatment, a leather-wrapped steering wheel with cruise control – with audio controls in the steering wheel – trip computer with outside temperature, and the list goes on.

Taking the Altima on the open road is a dream, even though I noticed a slight drag at times coming from the transmission, and I think that is CVT normality. The Altima accelerates to the freeway smoothly, passes the slow folks and it gets good mileage. The controls are easy to read and operate, there are minimum blind spots, and I love the warning system in the outside mirrors about on-coming traffic from either the left or right of the car. Back seat is comfortable for full-sized adults.

The Altima has been around since 1993, and has it come a long way, but so has all the other car manufacturers. Check out the all new Altima and take it for a drive.

Dog piddles when excited ... ask a trainer

Dear Trainer,

adopted a dog about a week ago and we are really enjoying her, however, she pees every time we come home from work. She seems to like us because she always turns over for a belly rub whenever we bend to pet her and talk to her after we get home, but as soon as we talk to her or try to rub her tummy she leaves a little puddle of urine. The shelter where we adopted her said she is healthy, so I don't think it is a medical issue. She is a poodle mix, about 15 pounds and 3 years old. Right now we tell her, "No pee," but the last time I did that she piddled even more. I'm not sure what to do. and we would appreciate any help you can give us.

Signed, Peeved at Pee

Dear Peeved,

Congratulations on your new dog and kudos for adopting from a shelter. Your new dog hasn't really had the time needed to adjust to your home yet and submissive urination, as it is known, is not unusual for dogs when they are not sure about their relationship with humans, or other dogs for that matter.

Submissive urination is a puppy behavior that often continues into adulthood because it is incorrectly addressed as a normal behavior; rather it is often punished as a housetraining issue. For clarity, it is not a housetraining problem, rather a behavior related issue.

Puppies use submissive urination and the belly up posture as a way to communicate. They have different pheromones than adult dogs and they often show their belly and express small amounts of urine when they want to communicate that they are puppies, and subordinate to adult dogs or a humans. This also happens when a puppy feels social pressure from us or other dogs during extreme excitement. Both the bellu up posture and the urination are considered "submissive" behaviors.

Why it continues

The reason puppies don't always "grow out of it," is often related to how it is handled by humans when it happens. Because people don't want dog urine on their floors, many respond to the puppy when it happens with some sort of startle response. "No," is a common reaction, as is picking up the puppy and rushing him/her to their elimination area,

clapping hands, and sometimes spanking the puppy.

When the reason a puppy urinates is due to excitement, the common denominator driving the behavior is often an animated response toward the puppy's excitement; such as baby talk and overly excited petting, and it often happens, as in your situation, when people have been away for a time. Unfortunately, all of these responses can and do exacerbate the issue.

To help your dog get over this problem it's important to look at it from the dog's point of view. When you come home and your dog is super excited to see you, and then she piddles due to that excitement when you pet and talk to her she is trying to tell you that she is overwhelmed. Also, since she is new to your home, she is likely unsure about your intentions with the petting and the talking and so she is trying to communicate that she will submit to you with the peeing and the tummy up posture. Unfortunately, you, and by trying to rub her tummy, you confirm to her that she must try harder to get

her communication "heard," and so she urinates.

As you found out, telling her, "No pee," made matters worse because your dog was doing everything in her power to relay that she didn't want to have any problems with you, via the urination, but then was scolded for doing so. When her communication resulted in the scolding, your dog tried even harder to get her message across, and urinated even more. As you can guess, it will become a cycle if this course of action continues.

What to do now

Since your dog is trying to show you respect with her actions, it's time to honor her intentions and respond accordingly. Going forward, when you come home, simply ignore your dog as though she were invisible. Go about your business and wait for the initial excitement to die down. This usually takes about 10-15 minutes, so that can be a gauge for you to use.

After you have been home for the suggested time, sit down and allow your dog to come to you for petting. Try not to bend over your dog as that can be a lot of social pressure for a submissive dog and she might feel the need to show you "in her way" that she will submit. Instead, don't make a lot of direct eye contact, keep your voice in a normal range, and pet her under the chin rather than the top of the head. If at any time she shows her belly to you, just walk away to let her know that you understand it was too much for her and you will stop trying to interact.

If you adhere to interacting with your new dog this way for a few weeks, she will learn that you "get it," and that you are safe. Once that is established, it won't take long for both behaviors to go away and your relationship will grow stronger as your time together passes.

Finally, support your new dog with good nutrition that helps maintain mental stability. Look for brands that are grain free and contain no corn, wheat or soy products. You can also look into supplementing your dog's diet with a fish oil to add more omega 3 fatty acids which are known to help maintain brain stability.
