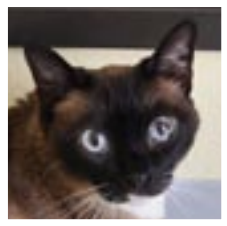

Viejas granted restraining order protecting sacred burial ground

The Viejas Band of Kumeyaay Indians has been granted a restraining order in Superior Court of California-San Diego County to halt the Padre Dam Municipal Water District from further desecrating a recently-unearthed Kumeyaay burial and ceremonial ground. In a hearing today, Judge Judith Hayes ordered the District to avoid construction over roughly two-thirds of the construction

site until at least June 25 when the hearing for a permanent injunction is scheduled. A representative for the California Attorney General's office appeared at today's hearing and spoke in favor of the restraining order. The District agreed to continue to use a Native American monitor and to allow Viejas the opportunity to view site activities.

On June 17, the California Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) is scheduled to hear testimony about the importance of cultural resources at the site. That is a continuation of the Commission's first hearing, which was held on April 6, 2010.

If the Commission makes findings that the site is a sanctified cemetery, and that the project will irreparably harm the site, the Commission may issue recommendations for mitigating impacts to the site, which could include complete avoidance of the entire site. If the District ignores the recommendations and proceeds with the current project, the NAHC will then be in the position to request that the state Attorney General initiate legal action against the District.

Padre Dam Municipal Water District is constructing a new reservoir and pumping station at the site, which is on approximately two acres south of I-8 near Lake Jennings Park Road and Old Highway 80.

Qualified Native American

Monitors and experts hired by the District in 2007 to conduct the initial investigations of tribal cultural resources warned of the cultural significance of the site and recommended the District avoid it. However, the District approved the project without revealing this information to tribes and the public. In its environmental review document the District said the project would not have any potentially significant adverse effects on cultural resources. Subsequent investigations have proven those claims to be wrong.

Human remains and a very high density of burned pottery sherds were later uncovered at the site, indicating a sacred burial ground and ceremonial place where cremated Native Americans were buried in sacred pottery urns.

In documenting the discovered cultural resources at the site, a data recovery report prepared for the District by its experts called the discovery "unparalleled in the San Diego region" and said the site contained "one of the highest densities of Native American ceramic sherds ever found in San Diego County," which has 19,000 recorded archaeological sites.

Although only approximately six percent of the site was

recovered, the District's report already details the significance of the discovery:

- 14 human bones belonging to at least 3-8 individuals have been positively identified by the Coroner, dating to A. D. 780 - 1910.

- 204 other bone fragments are considered either likely to be human or have yet to be assessed but were treated as though they were human. (Fragmented remains are typical of the traditional cremation practices of local Indian Bands.)

- The District's report also says that the human remains found during excavations at the site were mostly "burned during cremation" and that the "calcined bones may have come from human cremations given the large amounts of burned pottery and other burial artifacts that may have been grave goods." (Actual quotes from Padre Dam Water District's Data Recovery Report, August 2009.)

The Viejas Band of Kumeyaay Indians, who have been designated as the most likely descendants of those who are buried at the site, requested that the District fully assess the site and construction plans in order to prevent further desecration of the sacred site.

The Band also agreed to work with the District to review other alternative sites that had been considered by the District.

The Padre Dam Municipal Water District, however, unilaterally declared on May 21, 2010, that it would not wait for the Heritage Commission ruling, would not fully assess the cultural resource status of the site, would not plan on avoiding or recovering the tribal cultural resources on the other 94 percent of the property and would immediately resume construction. According to the District's own reports, the proposed construction work would effectively result in total destruction of the prehistoric archaeological site.

Attorneys for the Viejas Band sought the restraining order against the Padre Dam Municipal Water District to halt construction until the matter is decided by the Native American Heritage Commission and the District complies with California law.

Viejas Tribal Chairman Bobby L. Barrett said, "This site is sacred to our people, and it is culturally and historically significant for all residents

of San Diego County and southern California. From the beginning, our request of the Padre Dam Municipal Water District has been reasonable: simply complete a full assessment of cultural resources on the current site to help us better understand the extent to which tribal cultural resources may be present throughout the property. This would seem entirely reasonable given that the District's own report recognizes the immense historic and cultural significance of what has already been discovered – and that report only covers a six percent sample of the site. Until there's a full assessment, we don't know what, if any, other options exist for onsite project redesign. The District also previously considered three other alternative sites, and we continue to offer to work with them to further assess those and other sites as possible options. To move forward and desecrate this sacred burial ground would dishonor those who have been laid to rest there. It would also dishonor their living relatives and everyone in San Diego County who appreciates the cultural and historical significance of this site."

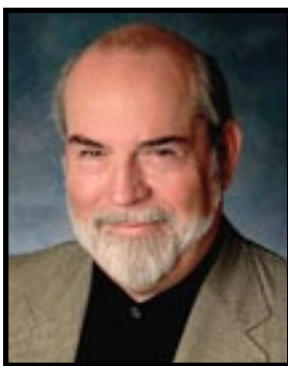

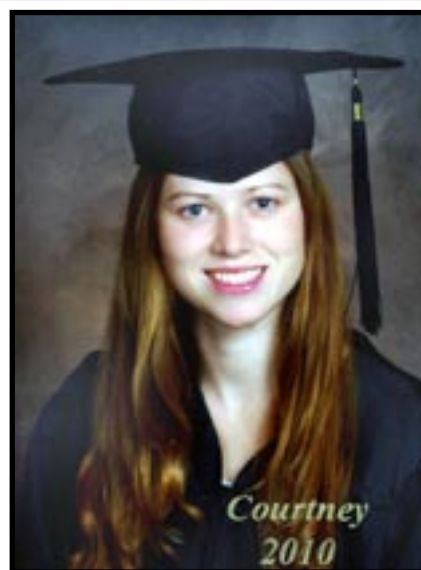

Have you ever been totally absorbed while reading a book, gardening, listening to music, or watching a movie? Did you notice that when you were "lost" in those activities

that you forgot to notice the things going on around you? Did that chronic pain go away for a moment? Did the day to day concerns and stress reduce? This is the trancelike state or focused attention that is similar to what happens when you are in hypnosis.

Hypnosis or hypnotherapy is an altered state of consciousness. When you are under hypnosis:

- Your attention is more focused
- You are more responsive to suggestions
- Your senses are more heightened
- Concentration is heightened

Hypnosis has been practiced for thousands of years and approved by the American Medical Association as a viable healthcare practice since 1958. It has been compared to deep thought, meditation, prayer, an alpha wave state similar to that right before you fall asleep, or that "zoning out" when doing a repetitive or focused activity.

It is not clear how hypnosis works. However, it appears to

Don't be fooled — 'Splice' is sci-fi porn

There's something almost disgusting watching Academy Award-winner Adrien Brody on a barn floor humping a hybrid lab experiment, a creature with legs like a kangaroo and a stinger on its tail. Sorry if that spoils your take on the new film *Splice* — but this information is already abuzz on the internet.

Clive (Brody) and Elsa (Sarah Polley) are genetic engineers specializing in splicing DNA from animals to create new hybrids. They are also an affectionate couple who share the love of their work; yet Elsa refuses Clive's pleas to have a baby.

The first hour of the film — which played to a dead-silent audience at the screen-

ing I attended — comes across as intriguing. The couple's current project produces two giant worm-like creatures that are supposed to open the world to new discoveries. But while working secretly on another project of their own, Clive and Elsa's lives change drastically.

Unbeknownst to Clive, Elsa has added human DNA to their project. When the screeching, unrecognizable creature in the lab gets Clive's attention, Elsa must reveal what she did. Clive informs her they are morally bound to destroy it. However, as days go by and it begins to have more and more human features, Elsa refuses the idea. Clive is also disturbed because he can see that Elsa is becoming emotionally attached to "Dren," the name they end up giving it.

In no time at all Dren starts growing older and must be hidden, so Clive and Elsa take it to an abandoned barn. As the creature watches the loving relationship between Clive and Elsa, it wants to be Elsa and get all that affection from Clive. By this time, everyone in the once dead silent theatre where I saw the film was laughing hysterically. It's hard not to. For example, when Dren seems to be dead, Clive says, "She's dead." But just like in those old B-movie thrillers where the dead person is never dead, neither is Dren. Yet 20 minutes later in another scene Clive pronounces her dead for the second time. One moviegoer shouted out, "again?" And right — she isn't.

I have no idea what writer-director Vincenzo Natali had in mind when he wrote this

movie or at least the second half. By now the entire plot has changed from intriguing to sci-fi porn. The intriguing dilemma about the moral complexities of genetics completely disappears into a byproduct of sexually ravaging creatures. Several times I looked at these two above average actors and said to myself, "You've got to be kidding!"

Of course, the hype will get some folks who care nothing about plot into the theatre, but after these viewers experience a few of their own repulsive moans, they'll probably figure out Clive and Elsa aren't the only ones feeling the pierce of Dren's deadly tail or tale.

'Marmaduke' — disappointing for most audiences

Kids and dogs make a perfect match — they have little expectations from each other. That's why small children will probably love *Marmaduke*. However, should adults have to watch this offering along with the kiddies, they are in for a clichéd no-brainer of a movie.

Based on the very popular comic book about a giant Great Dane, the movie relates a story concerning the Winslow kids who find out their dad (Lee Pace) has an exciting new job opportunity. The only problem? They have to uproot and move to Orange County, CA.

Daughter Barbara (Caroline Sunshine) complains the most, for she can't bear to lose her friends. Younger brother Brian (Finley Jacobsen) says he's okay with the move. But once enrolled at a new school, he doesn't even tell his dad he's not really playing soccer -- but skateboarding with new friends instead.

Humans are not the star of this live action comedy. *Marmaduke* (voiced by Owen Wilson), Carlos the cat (voiced by George Lopez) and a slew of other dog-park roaming canines get the spotlight here. Phil Winslow's new job is working for a pet food company. When his boss (William Macy) tells Phil to bring his dog to the

park to discuss business, Marmaduke makes the trip. While in the park he soon learns he may be the biggest dog there, but he has no status.

The rest of the movie entails Marmaduke's face-off with Bosco (voiced by Keifer Sutherland), and a wrong-choice romance with some hard lessons to learn.

I feel *Marmaduke* contains too much negativity and bad behavior. Therefore, I can't recommend it for young children. And, I think anyone over 12 is likely to be bored. That narrows the audience quite a bit. Perhaps this one should be placed on your wait-for-DVD list.

Still, I did enjoy the complete CGI dog dance at the end. It was hilarious, so be sure to stay for the credits.

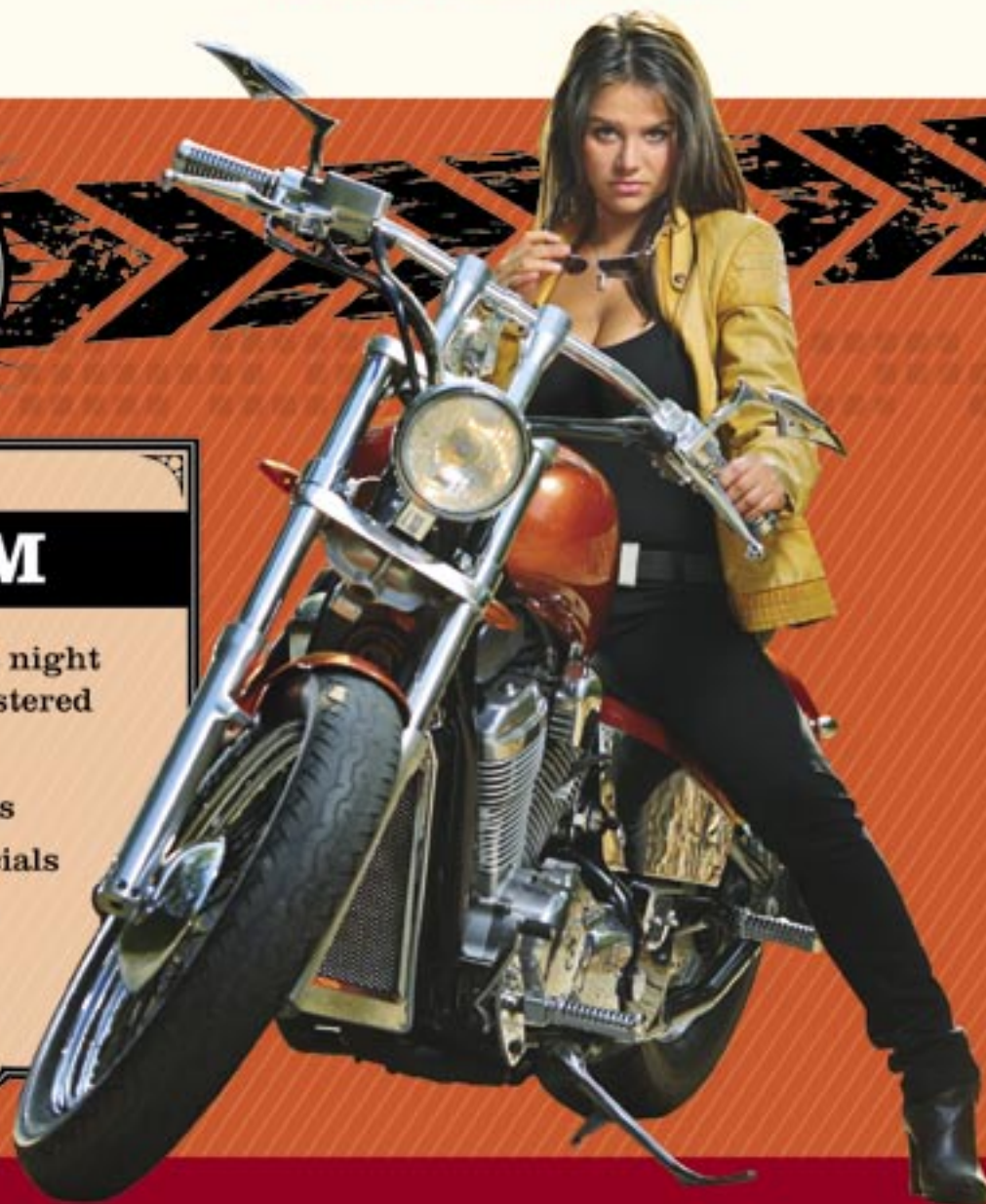

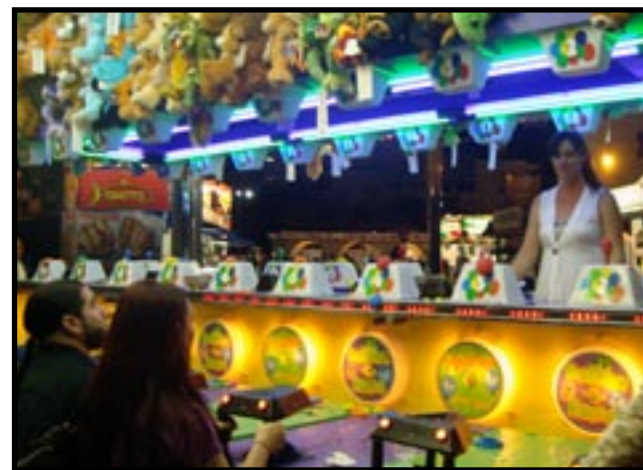

ORDINANCE NO. 4948

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING SECTIONS

2.24.200, 2.24.210 AND 2.24.220 OF CHAPTER 2.24 OF TITLE 2 OF THE EL CAJON MUNICIPAL CODE AND ADDING NEW SECTIONS 2.24.200, 2.24.210 AND 2.24.220 TO CHAPTER 2.24 OF TITLE 2 OF THE EL CAJON MUNICIPAL CODE PERTAINING TO THE PLANNING COMMISSION.

WHEREAS, on July 22, 2008, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 78-08 initiating an update to the City's Zoning Ordinance that would, at a minimum, codify legal findings on which discretionary planning approvals are to be made, clarify and centralize public hearing noticing requirements, streamline development review processes, clean up working titles, and remove identified ambiguities; and

WHEREAS, in the course of conducting that update, it was determined that regulations in Title 2 of the Municipal Code pertaining to the Planning Commission were also outdated and in need of revision to be consistent with current practice, while allowing flexibility in duties and compensation of the Planning Commission in the future; and

WHEREAS, the City Council considered amendments to Title 2, Sections 2.24.200, 2.24.210, and 2.24.220 at its May 25, 2010 meeting.

SECTION 1. Based upon the record as a whole, the City Council hereby makes the following findings:

A. The proposed amendments to the Municipal Code are exempt from review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to the "General Rule" that CEQA only applies to projects that have the potential for causing a significant physical effect on the environment (CEQA Guidelines, Section 1506 (b) (3) and the proposed amendments will have no physical effect on the environment.

SECTION 2. The City Council hereby repeals Sections 2.24.200, 2.24.210 and 2.24.220 of Chapter 2.24 of Title 2 of the El Cajon Municipal Code.

SECTION 3. The City Council hereby adds Sections 2.24.200, 2.24.210 and 2.24.220 to Chapter 2.24 of Title 2 of the El Cajon Municipal Code as follows:

A. 2.24.200 Planning commission—Powers and duties.
The planning commission is created pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 3 of Title 7 of the Government Code of the state of California,

and shall have, and is vested with, all the powers and duties provided therein, and such other powers and duties as may be conferred upon planning commissions by any and all laws of the state and Titles 16 and 17 of the city of El Cajon Municipal Code.
B. 2.24.210 Compensation of planning commissioners.
Each planning commissioner may receive compensation for each meeting attended, and may receive compensation for travel and other expenses when such expenditures are authorized by the city council.
C. 2.24.220 Secretary of planning commission.
The director of community development, or his or her designee, shall act as the secretary of the planning commission.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days following its passage and adoption.

ORDINANCE NO. 17 (ZONING ORDINANCE) OF THE EL CAJON MUNICIPAL CODE AND ADOPTING A NEW TITLE 17 (ZONING ORDINANCE) OF THE EL CAJON MUNICIPAL CODE. (ZONING ORDINANCE AMENDMENT NO. 415).

This ordinance updates, revises, and reorganizes the City of El Cajon Zoning Ordinance. While the vast majority of the Zoning Ordinance is unchanged, substantive changes include making portions of the Zoning Ordinance consistent with changes in State laws, codifying legal findings, streamlining the development review processes, revising working titles, removing ambiguities, reorganizing regulations, modernizing land use classifications, eliminating duplication, and adopting administrative procedures resulting in a reduction in administrative fees and expenses for certain types of development activities.

The reorganization of the Zoning Ordinance will also result in new designations for zoning classifications, and will adopt a new Zoning Map consistent with these re-designated classifications.

Padres' winning streak bring them to first place in NL West

There was no "Gray May" for the San Diego Padres who began the month of June in first place in the NL West claiming the best record in the National League, 2nd best in baseball. They are surprising a lot of people while contagiously winning without any household names except for Adrian Gonzalez and Heath Bell.

Celebrating Memorial Day with a bang, honoring United States veterans who gave their lives to secure freedom for our country and the world, surviving members from the attack on Pearl Harbor in World War II were in attendance at Petco Park witnessing the Padres offense launch their own fireworks during the game, scoring the most runs ever by one team at Petco Park, tying their season high of 19-hits after they dismantled the New York Mets 18-6 in the first game of the series, winning their last home stand in May.

Spearheading that monu-

mental hitting assault was Jerry Hairston Jr. Trailing 1-0 in the second inning the Padres shortstop/utility player with the bases loaded launched a rocket skyward, jerking an inside fastball by Mets pitcher Takahashi into the left field seats inside the foul pole for a grand-slam home run giving the Friars a 4-1 lead.

"Baseball is crazy," said Hairston Jr. "This park is definitely not a hitters ball park. It's just one of those things where we just got on a roll. Hitting is contagious. Once you get a couple of runs you start feeling good as a team. But don't expect 18 (runs) every night."

"In order for us to win we have to be consistent top to bottom 1 through 9. That's how we been winning ball games all year and hopefully it will continue. We have a good ball club. Obviously a lot of people aren't giving us enough credit. That's the way we like it. We want to surprise people."

Padres skipper Bud Black had a big smile on his face after that game. He said, "When

Jerry Hairston hit that ball into the Western Metals Supply Co. building, that was awesome. That really got us going from that point on. Our hitting got contagious, and that can happen. We hope now it becomes contagious game to game and not just a one game thing. Not that we're going to score 18 runs every night."

He continued, on, "There were some good signs last night. Chase swung the bat well from the right side. Hundley had some good swings. Denorfia sprayed the ball around the field. A number of good things we saw from a number of players. Hopefully that can jump start us a little bit and get some guys headed in the right direction offensively. Overall a good win. Those are good to get. Save some arms in the bullpen. Not that you ever relax, but you have a pretty good feeling about how the games going to end up in the later stages of that one."

Also instrumental in that run-hit attack was cleanup hitter third baseman Chase Headley

with 4-hits, 4-runs scored, one home run (crushed over the center field fence). He commented after the game, "It was one of those nights. Baseball is a funny game. You can go out and square up a whole bunch of balls and wind up with no hits. Tonight we came out and we hit the ball good, had a lot of hits that fell in for us. It was nice to come out and get the first game. It's always nice to kind of save the bullpen and give those guy's a little bit of a break, and give K.C. (Kevin Correia) a win. It was nice to do that."

Padres Catcher Nick Hundley continued swinging a red-hot bat going 3-for-4 in the game. Both he and Yorvit Torrealba sharing the catching duties for the team and are playing exceptionally well with the bat, defensively, and with handling the pitchers.

On June 2, Padres first baseman Adrian Gonzalez hit a walk off grand slam home run giving the Padres a 5-1 victory over the Mets. This 'grand salami' was his second of the season, third in his career and the fifth Padre in history.

Head coach Bud Black complimented his All Star power hitting first baseman saying, "We talked about his off field power. He has the ability with his swing to manipulate the bat and in certain venues, we've seen it at Petco too. His Grand Slam against the Mets was to the opposite field. We've seen it in Cincinnati, we've seen it in Philadelphia. He can sort of play to the ballpark. That is a good tribute to his ability as a hitter by the way he can go line-to-line with power. It doesn't surprise me yet we never take it for granted."

The team then traveled to the historic city of Philadelphia, PA opposing the Phillies at Citizens Bank Ballpark splitting a four-game series. Dropping the first two games, the Padres battled back winning the third game in

10 innings on an Oscar Salazar game winning pinch hit. This win came despite a costly base running error by Tony Gwynn Jr. making the third out after getting thrown at third base. He redeemed himself two innings later throwing out Placido Polanco at third base after a single by Chase Utley in the bottom of the 10th.

In the fourth game Monday San Diego native, Phillies LHP Cole Hamels held the Padres hitless for the first six-and-a-third innings until Adrian Gonzalez and Scott Hairston hit back-to-back home runs in the 7th inning. Gonzalez would go deep again in the ninth after bullpen closer Heath Bell would pick up his 16th save in 19 attempts in a 3-1 Padres win.

"This was a good win for us no doubt. Losing the first two games then bouncing back and winning that game on Sunday when K.C. (Kevin Correia) got knocked out early. Gallagher did a nice job (in relief)," commented Padres skipper Bud Black.

He continued saying, "To take on Cole Hamels who is at the top of his game, the best I've seen him throw in a couple years. And have Wade (Leblanc) match him pitch for pitch, mixing pitches and changing speeds very well. With big home runs by Adrian and Scotty gave us some breathing room. Coming back to win the last two after losing the first two was big for us."

Granted the Padres have good pitching. Former G.M. Kevin Towers laid the foundation with his young starters and sound bullpen last year.

Current Padres General manager Jed Hoyer has added to that. Cleverly waiting to the end of free-agent signings early this year Hoyer acquired veteran starter Jon Garland a proven 12-to-15 game winner workhorse for a low price. This has

given the team an ace in their starting rotation and depth at that position.

Hoyer did not stop there. Acquiring catcher Yorvit Torrealba solidified the catching position. This veteran is great working with his pitchers, has hit in the clutch, and has thrown out nearly half of the opposition's base runners. He also is a mentor to the Padres young catcher Nick Hundley.

Acquiring Jerry Hairston Jr. has already paid dividends filling in for the injured Cabrera at shortstop. He also gives breathers to Eckstein at second and Headley at third thus keeping the infield fresh. He can also play all the outfield positions.

The Padres youth may and can get better. Will Venable, Kyle Blanks, Tony Gwynn Jr. have not reached their potential yet. It would be a different story for the team if they had reached it while the offense struggled.

Also, factor in the activation of outfielder Scott Hairston to the team this Thursday after playing for the Lake Elsinore Storm rehabbing a left hamstring strain he suffered on May 16, and with the eminent return of Padres long reliever Tim Stauffer who started his rehab assignment last Thursday to last three or four games.

Off to their best start ever the Padres have beaten all the teams, but it is still early in the season. What has been proved are the teams that have tanked. The NL West has four teams in the hunt for first place. The true test results will come at the All-Star break. Then we will see if this team can stay in competition for the division title, and the playoffs.

One thing is for sure. Bud Black has his team playing inspirationally one game at a time. They have the resiliency to overcome obstacles and continue to play fundamentally sound baseball. They are fun to watch, support each other, and play to win games, not to just pad their personal stats.

After three games with the Phillies, the Padres took the bus ride to City Field in New York to finish their regular season schedule with the Mets before coming home for inter-league play starting this weekend against the Seattle Mariners, then the Toronto Blue Jays.

Kamps Propane a real neighborhood asset

Kamps has been serving the East County residents with propane deliveries since 1969. John Kamps started the company in the San Diego area before moving the headquarters to Manteca, California. Each of the individual branches of the company is operated like its own headquarters, with a manager, training and a full range of propane services and technical expertise on propane applications.

Propane, a by-product of the gasoline refineries, is a green fuel with a low carbon footprint and one of the cleanest of fossil fuels. The Environmental Protection Agency has deemed propane an attractive option for avoiding greenhouse emission in nearly any application.

Working with propane is

not a job to take on lightly. There are federal, local and state requirements that must be constantly met. Craig Linden, Kamps manager, works with the San Diego County Hazard Materials Division on a regular basis in regards to the chemicals the employees use. Handling a hazardous material requires drivers to pass a test about Federal Hazmat regulations and become a licensed commercial driver with special permits to carry and use a hazardous material.

In addition to home and business delivery, Kamps fills 100-pound cylinders for consumers and also sells those cylinders through the local service stations. They also carry a range of propane-powered equipment and appliances. Federal tax credits under the Economic Recovery Act have up to \$1500 tax credits available for home energy improvements.

Some companies run their vehicles on propane. Linden, who had prior experience with propane, is an inventor and earned a BA in Business Administration from San Diego State, oversees the operation at the Alpine facility. "We have six delivery vehicles," he said. "At one time propane was a popular vehicle fuel and that is coming back. We have two trucks that run on propane and two more ordered."

Because of the economic situation Kamps has been more flexible with customers feeling

the crunch. "We're happy to take calls from customers who need adjustments or are concerned about problems," Linden said.

Kamps offers new customer specials, incentives to switch from another company and several plan options. These include:

- * E-Z saver plan – calculated over a year and divided into 12 monthly payments
- * Credit Challenged – Will Call when needed and pay at that time
- * Senior Discount
- * Electronic Reader Discount

"The Electronic Reader is the new SMART System that Kamps has spent nearly \$3 million to implement," Linden said. "It's a meter that goes on the tank and displays the Tank Fuel Level, Outside Temperature, Inside Temperature, and the Time, and we can read all of that remotely."

The system can also send an immediate alert for Low Fuel Level, Unusual Usage and Low Inside Temperature. There's no cost to the consumer, and customers who elect to have the new SMART system will have a \$.05 per gallon discount on all propane purchases for using the system. Kamps expects the system to be fully deployed within this year.

"This has come about because John Kamps is very progressive about his business," Linden said. "While some companies are still stuck

in the same technology they had 40 years ago; that's not his method. The company is family owned, but if he sees a way to improve the company or the product, he goes for it. We have 12 employees who because of Kamps' standards, share a positive attitude which makes for a great working relationship overall."

John Kamps has seen a con-

sistent growth in his company which he attributes to good managers who focus on customer satisfaction. "We're right here, and we're ready to earn your business every day," the company bio states. Linden said this is something he learned in college and now puts into practice as a Kamps' manager.

"I've learned how important the customer is and how

important it is to maintain good relations with them and respect them as consumers and our customers," he said. "I think in the past few years our focus on this has created a great customer base and a great team."

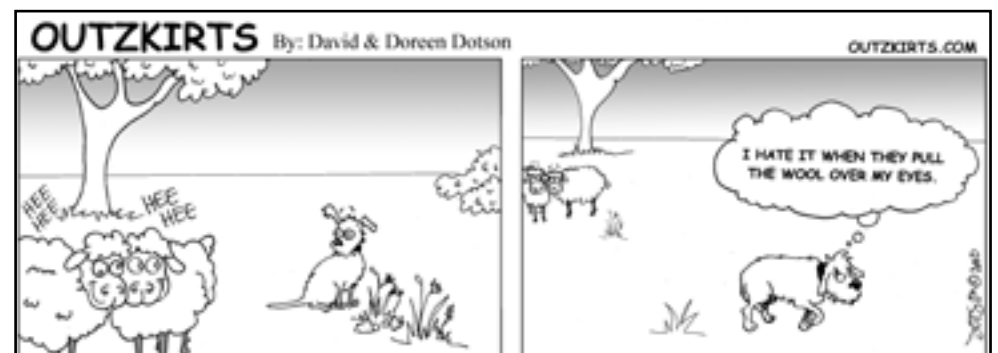

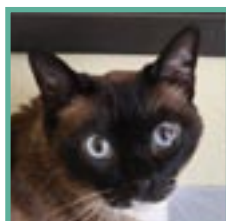

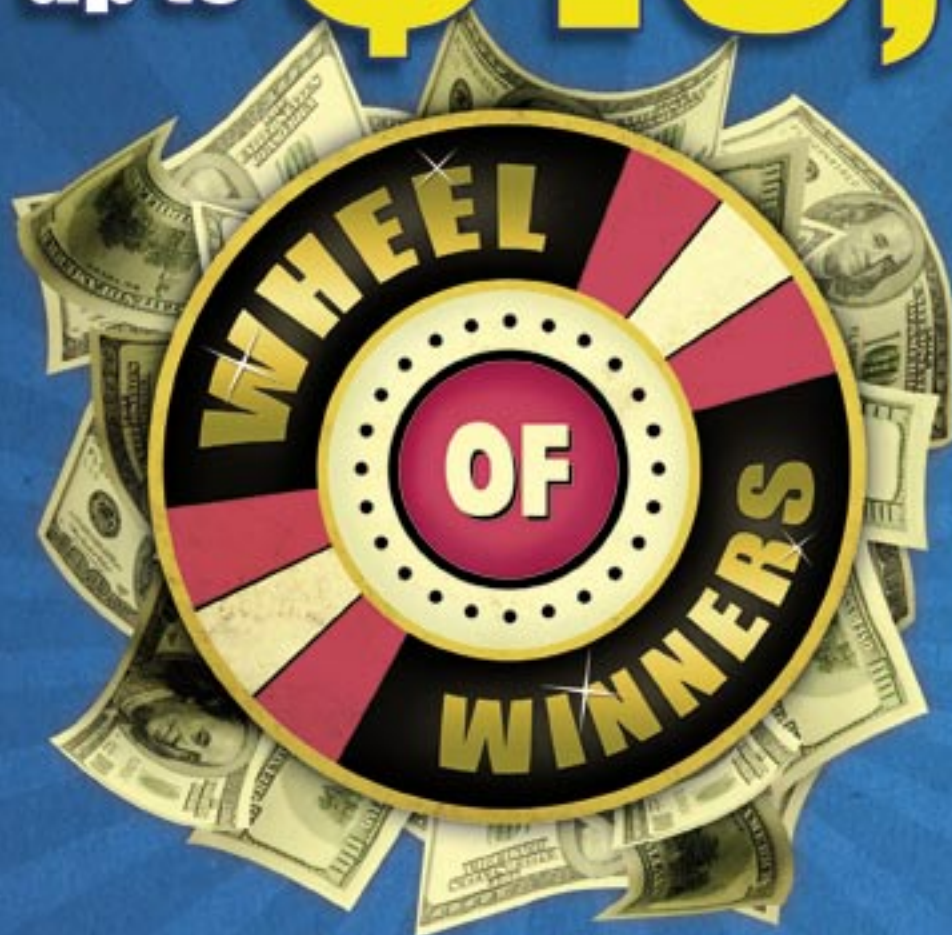
