Alpine brother and sister heading to National Junior Olympics

he Coleman household in Alpine is particularly busy this time of year. That's because their children, Willie and Carlita, are preparing to participate in Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) National Junior Olympics in New Orleans. Willie Coleman III and Carlita Coleman are team record holders in several categories in their club San Diego Cheetahs Youth Track and Field.

Shelly Coleman said her children showed signs of wanting to be physically active at an early age. "When we lived in Chicago, Willie was just a toddler and when we'd go for a walk, he'd just take off running. He's never stopped. In kindergarten he saw some track events on TV and cried, insisting he wanted to run track."

Willie Coleman III, 9, is the current team record holder in the 800m run; fourth in the United States in the 800m run; 32nd in the United States in the 400m run and 24th in the 500m in his division.

Carlita, her mother said, was a little slower to pick up the sports bug. "While Willie always wanted to run, or exercise and never had to be coached, Carlita at first preferred to stay behind, but eventually she saw the benefits Willie was having and started to run as well."

Carlita Coleman, 8, is the current team record holder in the shot put and 106th in United States in the 400m run.

It was after Willie Jr. and Shelly Coleman moved to Alpine in 2009 that their children got serious about competition. After joining the Cheetah Youth Track, the household began to function on the kids' schedules.

"We're always doing something and their competitions and training is a family affair," Shelly Coleman said. "There are snacks to prepare, practices to go to several times a week and constant competitions."

Both brother and sister attend Boulder Oaks Elementary School and excel in reading and writing. One of the benefits to the kids' sports activities is improved focus on their studies.

"There are many benefits we see," Shelly Coleman said. "For Willie we notice a calming peace and happiness when he's running. We've seen changes in more positive attitudes and an encouragement to want to



This week's crystal study is Black Tourmaline. Another name for black tourmaline is Schorl which is an old German mining term. The word tourmaline derives from the Sinhalese word "turmeli" which

County Launches Suicide Prevention Campaign

In the last few months you've been hearing numerous stories in the news about suicide. On average, one San Diegan dies by suicide every day; and "words" <u>can save a life</u>. A new County suicide prevention campaign is focused on getting people to talk about their mental well-being in an effort to save the lives of those who are contemplating suicide. Last vear, 372 suicides were reported in the region. Suicides can be prevented. Know what the warning signs are and be ready to assist a suicidal person in need of help. A new website, www.ToughTimesSD.org, offers information, resources and help for those who might be going through some very difficult times in their lives. Risk factors of suicide include talking of hurting or killing oneself, divorce, separation, family stress, loss of health, job or home, increasing alcohol or drug use, and isolation from family and friends. When people feel hopeless, helpless, and desperate, they might feel no sense of future, no way to make it better. When a friend or a loved one comes to you for help, take it seriously. Ask if he or she is having thoughts of suicide. That simple conversation can make the difference between life and death. People in suicidal danger should call 9-1-1. 

'Much Ado About Nothing' - features talented actors

enedick is a confirmed bachelor. Beatrice is an outspoken independent woman. No, these aren't characters on the latest TV sitcom; they are a 400-year-old couple imagined by William Shakespeare in Much Ado About Nothing, currently running at The 2011 Old Globe Summer Shakespeare Festival in Balboa Park.

The story of two different sets of lovers, Much Ado features the famous bick-

ering couple, Beatrice and Benedick. Contrary to the sparring couple in Taming of the Shrew, Benedick doesn't try to mold Beatrice into a perfect wife. Benedick and Beatrice meet on common ground and through their 'merry war' of wit, and a bit of interference from their friends, they gradually realize that they love each other. In a sub-plot, the other set of lovers, Beatrice's sister Hero and her suitor Claudio, are the targets of malicious Don John, who interferes by besmirching Hero's reputation. Seeing Much Ado now in 2011, we

realize that the relationship and interaction between men and women has not changed much in 400 years.

The scenic design and costumes suggest the era of Jane Austen. The set features a wrought iron conservatory, with airy glass panes. In the opening scene the women are presented in a tableau of a sewing circle, giving the topic of women in the play a central focus. Women's strength of character, societal position, and reputation are all touched on in this favorite comedy. It's also interesting that there are no mothers in this play. The women are either maidens or servants.



Steven Spielberg and Peter Jackson talk about their upcoming film

Interview by Diana Saenger The Adventures of Tintin, based on The Adventures of Tintin series of comic books created by Belgian artist Georges "Hergé" Remi, will be the first animated movie directed by Steven Spielberg. Peter Jackson is on board as a producer and collaborator and set to direct the next film depending on the success of this one. What went into your decision to make this movie in motion capture animation?

P.J: Motion capture is not a genre. It's a tool, a technique, and what we've tried to do is to use motion capture and traditional animation to build up a system. Steven and I are more adept to live action. But we wanted to be able to walk into this virtual work we created with Tintin's characters and locations and to pick up the camera and shoot a live action movie inside this strange hybrid photo real world.

S.S: Five minutes into watching this movie I think everybody will see that the medium is not the message

S.S: Speaking for myself, he's an intrepid tenacious reporter who often becomes more of a part of the story than just one reporting the news. I identify with Tintin because he does not take no for an answer, and that's been the story of my life.

P.J: It's about determina-

but the character, the story and the plot is. Like every movie you're going to forget it if it's 3D or widescreen or 1.85 if the movie is working. Hopefully how it was made will be the least of your concerns; you'll only have a good time.

Costumes and make-up have always helped actors get into their characters. Is this a new challenge with motion capture?

S.S: I've always found that the costumes the actors wear or the make-up or wigs in a live action movie or big costume drama, even though it does give them a sense of ambiance and environment and they feel like they are in a great court or in the west or chased by hobbits or dinosaurs, it all comes

down to the actors looking each other in the eye. That's where the story is told and where all the drama or comedy happens. Your imagination and skills as a professional actor is what sees you through, not what you are wearing or where you are.

How are you avoiding the "Dead Eye" problem that's been present in earlier motion capture movies?

P.J: When you're casting and shooting a movie the eyes are the most important feature of any performer. Any great actor knows how to use their eyes, and as a filmmaker I love those huge close ups because it's those eyes that mean so much to me. When I was doing Lord Of The Rings in New Zea-

land on the computer, we built the eyes of the characters we used in a scientific way. I mean you study real life and the way the light affects it like the way the iris reflects emotion.

In the stories Tintin often falls into a hole. How did you make that cinematic?

S.S: Tintin does fall in a hole in our story, but he gets out quick enough to allow the story to continue. Look at Hergé's books; there's a lot of narrative, adventure but also a lot of subplot. We take time for Captain Haddock to moan about what brought him to drink and close to ruination and we even go back in the first movie to Captain Haddock's ancestors so we get to know a lot about why Captain Haddock is the man he is today.

Since movie fans are starting to complain, what do you see as the future of 3D?

S.S: I certainly hope that 3D gets to the point where people do not notice it, because then it just becomes another tool and an aide to tell the story. And then maybe they can make the ticket price comparable to the 2D movie with the exception

of IMAX where we are getting a premium experience in a premium environment. Not every movie in my opinion should be in 3D.

P.J: Obviously after Avatar it survived for a while, but audiences have realized that there are bad movies that can be in 3D and on top of that you're being changed an extra \$5 to see a movie in 3D rather than 2D. There's a natural human response to that, which has to do with the increased ticket prices. I do believe in 3D. But certainly the brightness issue needs to be addressed if it's to have a long time future in cinema. With the right movie it can make a good film a great film and a great film really amazing to see. Like surround sound these things are not new but another step forward; but something has to be done about the experience.

'Captain America' — is fun, adventurous, enjoyable

ith so many wars
going on in our
world today
wouldn't it be great if we had a
few Captain America's around

to fight along our brave soldiers. While countless Captain America's small and tall roamed the floors this weekend at San Diego's Comic-Con, movie fans can get their latest Captain America fix at the theatre. I think Paramount and Marvel merged their creative juices just right as I found Captain America: The First Avenger very entertaining.

Patriotic Steve Rogers (Chris Evans) is trying everything he can to join his comrades who are heading off to fight in the world conflict of 1941. What Steve more than makes up for in spirit and a macho will-power, however, he lacks in physical stature. At a mere 98 pounds and a check list of ailments that get a big "4F" stamp on his papers, Steve is deemed unfit to fight.

This really hits home when Steve takes on one bully after another in a back alley only to be rescued by his buddy, Bucky Barnes (Sebastian Stan). Bucky invites Steve along on a blind date with him and his gal before he leaves the next day for the war. During the evening, Steve steals away and tries yet another in a long list of recruiting offices, but they uncover his previous attempts and send Steve away.

Unbeknownst to Steve, his rantings about wanting to serve were observed by Dr. Abraham Erskine (Stanley Tucci), who has been looking for a subject for a scientific experiment involving the creation of a super-powered human to fight among the regular troops.

What I liked about this movie was that it felt really grounded in the 1940s era where men in uniforms danced their last night in the states away with a pretty girl. That kind of human sacrifice has touched hearts for more than 70 years since. Zapping Steve in a machine that literally blows up the room is a great warning about how different he will be in the theatre of war, but Paramount and Marvel did not go overboard with the special effects so the story remains edgy and

Director and executive producer Joe Johnston believed "less is more" for this highly anticipated tale. "You only really get one chance to do an

origin story. The 1940s were such an energetic era, fueled by the optimistic belief that 'right' triumphs. Cinematically, it is such a toy box of vehicles, fashion and architecture – and we fill it with the Marvel gadgets and weaponry – it just seemed like a great opportunity to do this story first, then move on," he said.

Evans is drawing huge attention in this film and has a full plate of films ahead of him including: Marvel Studios' The Avengers – the next chapter in Captain America's story, also starring Robert Downey, Jr., Samuel L. Jackson, Scarlett Johansson and Mark Ruffalo; Puncture. based on true story about a drug-addicted lawyer (Evans) and scheduled for release on September 23 this vear: and What's Your Number? (September 30) with Evans as a womanizer who visits his neighbor's ex-boufriends to help find the man of her dreams.

Every aspect of his duo/ character in Captain America is performed perfectly by Evans. His spunky never-take-no for an answer street fighter – enhanced by the visual effects techniques of body slimming and head replacement – set up great charisma for the man who will lead a great cause.

Creating a genuine character as usual is Tommy Lee Jones as Steve/Captain America's Commander, Colonel Phillips. Jones is tough and

had this been a real 40s film his portrayal might have elicited a few of those hiss's audiences showered on unfavorable characters. Hayley Atwell plays Captain America's military liaison Peggy Carter who generates an instant chemistry with Evans. She's his boss but it's difficult for both to maintain a strictly no-hands-on regulation. I did have a problem occasionally buying into Carter running in battle scenes with the Hydra Nazi's wearing a skirt, pressed shirt and perfect make-up. That was a little unrealistic. I also tired of too many scenes of Steve trying to sell war bonds.

Tucci personifies every character he portrays, and with help from some great make-up and a believable accent, he easily transports us back to a lab in the 1940s. Of course every super hero needs a villain to fight, and Hugo Weaving becomes just that as Johann Schmidt/Red Skull, the leader of Hitler's Hydra. In a bit of nostalgia comic book fans get to see inventor Howard Stark (Dominic Cooper), the future father of Tony Stark, aka Iron Man

My only negative is about the film is one I've complained about too often this summer – the 3D glasses. I watched 85 percent of the movie without them. Glasses on or off, fans will find lots to like about Captain America: The First

Local band members perform songs from their CD in a movie

ometimes good things occur when least expected. That's what happened a few months ago when the local Dannie Marie Band received an invitation to submit one of their songs for a movie being filmed in San Diego. When Dannie Marie Pupa and her mother and band manager, Laurel, attended the New Music Seminar in Los Angeles to take workshops and network they handed out some of the bands' CDs. One recipient was Tom Voris, founder of the San Diego band the FAB Rudies.

"A few months ago Tom called to say he was working as the music coordinator for a new movie, *Music High* by Angelic Pictures," Dannie Pupa said. "He wanted to pitch one of our country songs to director Mark Maine for a scene where high school kids are in a battle of the bands."

Maine liked the song "Flavor of the Week," one of three on the Dannie Marie Band's CD they recorded at Big Fish Studio in Encinitas and released in December. Within a few weeks Pupa received a contract.

"They also gave our band members the opportunity to appear as extras in the movie although not everyone was able to take time off from their day jobs," Pupa said. "They did crowd scenes with extras until about noon, and then shot close-ups of the bands later in the day. I got to play guitar in the fictional band Silver Springs featured in the film.

Our drummer, Ryan Poole, and I both played members of a country band, a punk rock band, and an acoustic pop band."

Apparently Poole and Pupa's musical talents really came in handy. She taught chords to the actors of the fictional band Silver Springs so they could perform as if they were a real country band. Poole showed the actors how to play the different instruments when the bands changed from one genre of music to another. But the glitz of appearing in a movie was never far from Pupa's mind.

"My favorite part of being on the set was hanging out with the cast and making new friends with people who I've seen on TV shows and films over the years," she said. "Another thing that made the experience so much fun was having Megan Roethlein, one of my best friends, be in our band for the movie."

Music High is about a teacher (Jonathan Bennett, Mean Girls, Cheaper By The Dozen 2) who is trying to save his career by turning around an unruly class of kids who are deeply divided by cliques based on different genres of music. Other local bands that appeared in the movie include FABulous Rudies and Tan Sister Radio. Music High is the third in a series of contemporary style and attitude films produced by Angelic Pictures and is slated for distribution in early 2012 by Universal

The Dannie Marie Band also includes Coe Schneider (bass), Obediah Byrd (electric guitar) and Josh Gates (acoustic guitar). Since its inception one year ago, it has continued to gain a spotlight. Their song "Marry Me" was a finalist in a wedding competition (check out "The Dannie Marie Band Here Comes the

Bride" on Youtube). They've played at local events, the Del Mar County Fair and the House of Blues. They've sold 250 CDs since December along with download sales from iTunes and CD Baby and appeared on local radio shows

Steele Canyon High School in 2010, was a worship leader at Shadow Mountain Community Church's vacation Bible school program this summer. The band members are also busy writing new songs, and Pupa hopes to proceed with an acting career.

"I am a firm believer that



ORDINANCE NO. 4969

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL CAJON,

CALIFORNIA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF EL CAJON TO PARTICIPATE

IN THE VOLUNTARY ALTERNATIVE REDEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

SUBJECT TO CERTAIN CONDITIONS AND

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill x1 27 ("AB 27") codifies as Part 1.9 of the California Health and Safety Code ("Part 1.9"); and

WHEREAS, AB 27, upon the concurrent enactment of Assembly Bill x1 26 ("AB 26"), establishes a voluntary alternative redevelopment program whereby the El Cajon Redevelopment Agency ("Agency") would be authorized to continue to exist upon the enactment of an ordinance by the City to comply with the provisions of Part 1.9: and

WHEREAS, AB 27 requires the City to notify the County Auditor-Controller ("County"), the State Controller, and the State Department of Finance on or before November 1, 2011, that the City will comply with Part 1.9; and

WHEREAS, AB 27 requires the City to make specified remittances to the County in order to continue the existence of the Agency, as prescribed in Part 1.9; and

WHEREAS, AB 27 authorizes the City to enter into an agreement with the Agency, whereby the Agency would transfer a portion of its tax increment to the City for the purpose of financing certain activities within the City's redevelopment areas, as specified in Part 19 and

WHEREAS, AB 27 imposes specified sanctions on the City in the event that the City fails to make the required remittances, as determined by the Director of Finance; and

WHEREAS, AB 27 authorizes the County to charge a fee that does not exceed the reasonable costs to the County auditor-controller to implement the provisions of Part 1.9; and

WHEREAS, AB 27 authorizes the City to establish a new redevelopment agency if its former agency has been dissolved only after the debt obligations of the Agency have been retired and the City satisfies the provisions of Part 1.9: and

WHEREAS, it is hereby acknowledged by the City Council that the California League of Cities, the California Redevelopment Association, and counsel for the City and Agency have respectively opined that certain or all provisions of AB 26 and AB 27, including but not limited to the effectiveness date.

violate the State Constitution and other laws (collectively, "Laws"), and are invalid and unenforceable; and

WHEREAS, the City Council does not intend, by enactment of this Ordinance, to waive any constitutional and/or legal rights by virtue of the enactment of this Ordinance and, therefore, reserves all of its rights under Laws to challenge the validity of any or all provisions of AB 26 and AB 27 in any administrative or judicial proceeding and/or repeal this Ordinance, without prejudice to the City's right to recover any amounts remitted under Part 1.9; and

WHEREAS, the City Council does not intend, by enactment of this Ordinance, to pledge any of its general fund revenues or other assets, to make the remittance payments contemplated by Part 1.9, it being understood by the City Council that any remittance payments will be funded solely from Agency funds and/or assets transferred to the City in accordance with Part 1.9; and

WHEREAS, the City Council does not intend, by enactment of this Ordinance to waive any rights of appeal regarding the amount of any remittance established by the Department of Finance, as provided in Part 1.9; and

WHEREAS, City staff has determined that the Ordinance is exempt from California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"), pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15378 (b) (4), because such authorizations are not considered a project subject to CEQA review. The community remittance is a government funding mechanism and fiscal activity, which does not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant environmental impact.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL CAJON, CALIFORNIA DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Authorization to Continue Agency. Subject to Sections 3 and 4, herein, the City hereby commits to comply with and make the remittances required by Part 1.9, under protest, and authorize the continuation of the Agency after enactment of AB 27. Any remittance payments required to be paid by the City by Part 1.9 shall be paid solely from Agency funds and/or assets transferred to the City in accordance with Part 1.9.

SECTION 2. Application. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof is held to be invalid for any reason, the remainder of this Ordinance and the application of provisions thereof shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 3. Reservation of Rights. It is the position of the City that certain or all provisions of AB 26 and AB 27 violate the Laws, as referenced in the recitals, above, and are invalid and unenforceable. Neither the adoption of this Ordinance, nor the acknowledgment of or references to any provisions of AB 26 and AB 27, nor the City's payment of any remittances contemplated by AB 27 shall be deemed to be, nor are they

intended as, an acknowledgment of the validity of AB 26 and AB 27, and the City reserves all rights in its sole discretion to challenge the validity of any or all provisions of AB 26 and AB 27 in any administrative or judicial proceeding and/or repeal this Ordinance, without prejudice to the City's right to recover any amounts remitted under Part 1.9.

SECTION 4. Enactment. This Ordinance shall only be deemed as "enacted" within the meaning of Part 1.9 upon (i) adoption of this Ordinance and (ii) the legally effective date of AB 26 and AB 27.

SECTION 5. Authorization of Implementing Actions. The City Manager or designee is hereby authorized to take any actions necessary to implement this Ordinance and comply with Part 1.9, including without limitation, providing required notices to the Auditor Controller, the State Controller, and the Department of Finance; entering into any agreements with the Agency to make the remittance payments; making any remittance payments; or filing appeals.

SECTION 6. CEQA. The City Council determines that approval of this Ordinance is exempt from CEQA, pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15378 (b)(4), because such approval is not considered a project subject to CEQA review. The payment is a government funding mechanism and fiscal activity which does not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant environmental impact.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This Ordinance shall be effective thirty days after its adoption; and the City Clerk shall certify the adoption of this Ordinance and cause it to be published at least once in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of El Cajon within fifteen days after its adoption.







hen I first saw the 2011 Nissan Murano Cross Cabriolet at the Los Angeles auto Show I was not impressed. I started hearing positive remarks concerning the Cross Cabriolet, so I ordered one.

look to it that will grow on any driver who is not a fan or is a no-brainier for fans.



Safety is very important to Nisan and this is noticeable by looking at the convertible top as there is a window just above the back seat head rests. Why? If the Murano was to roll over the car is designed to deploy the two head rest outward, they would not rip through the top during testing so Nissan

installed a window that would break away and allow the roll bars to fully extend.

I felt the Murano Cross Cabriolet should have been in the Infiniti line up not Nissan. The Murano is truly luxurious with a price tag of \$46,390 and out the door minus tax and license \$47,700. What we can learn from pets and wildlife

s humans, we're social animals. We need family, friends, and regular social banter to be happy.

But apparently, we're not the only social animals. There are many things we can learn from pets and wildlife about friendships and taking care of each other. In fact new research has shown that animals of different species can even develop deep friendships with each other.

A new book titled "Unlikely Friendships: 47 Remarkable Stories from the Animal Kingdom" is hitting the bestsellers' lists and showing the world about the prevalent but unique bonds between different animal species across the world.

"I expect that anyone who loves animals, and even those who don't, can't help but be touched by these unusual partnerships," says author and National Geographic writer Jennifer Holland. "They remind us that kindness can rise above anything, even instinct."

For example, when Hurricane Katrina slammed into

New Orleans in 2005, many pet owners were forced to abandon their pets as they rushed to high ground. As domesticated animals were forced to fend for themselves, some formed packs for protection.

Among them were Bob Cat, a male cat, and Bobbi, a female dog, each with a bobbed tail. The fact that Bob Cat was fully blind made the animals' relationship all the more touching. Bobbi the dog had been keeping Bob Cat safe by barking or nudging him in the right direction.

But such strong bonds are not seen only in domesticated animals

In China, staff at a natural reserve witnessed an unusual bond between an abandoned rhesus monkey and white dove believed to be part of a bird migration study. For two months, the macaque and dove shared a space and snacked on corn together. The monkey even showed affection, hugging the dove. If only the dove had hands and arms with which to hug back!

Of course, the most surprising interspecies bonds can sometimes be between humans and other animals, particularly predators. When National Geographic photographer Paul Nicklen was assigned to shoot leopard seals in the Antarctic, he was determined to shoot fast and get out quick. Leopard seals have been known to attack humans.

But a 12-foot female took a liking to Nicklen. The seal hovered around him, as if posing for the camera. She then hunted and killed a penguin -- the seal's usual prey -- and offered it to Nicklen repeatedly. When the photographer ignored her offering, the seal then brought him live penguins and blew bubbles in his face, as if exasperated with his passive nature. For more stories of remarkable friendships in the animal kingdom, check out "Unlikely Friendships."

"If animals can do it, humans can also learn to accept their differences, big and small, and believe in the power of friendship," says Holland. "After all, it's in our nature."
