Helicopters shutdown in Powerlink Project

Tuesday the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) issued a Stop Work Order for helicopter operations on the Sunrise Powerlink transmission line project. Citing concerns about safety risks for the residents of Imperial and San Diego Counties and project personnel, the CPUC is temporarily shutting down all helicopter operations related to the Sunrise Powerlink Project. In the meantime, construction will continue on the project's non-helicopter activities.

The CPUC called for SDG&E to take a series of actions including:

- Holding a safety stand down for all pilots, ground

personnel and those likely to be transported by helicopter

- Rigging training for all personnel involved in rigging activities
- Designating the sites that must be built by helicopter and limit such operations at other sites
- Obtaining CPUC staff concurrence on incident reporting procedures

The CPUC will authorize resumption of helicopter activity once the actions identified are completed. SDG&E is committed to improving all helicopter and construction practices and will comply

with the additional training and incident reporting requirements contained in the CPUC's Order.

The company released the following media statement this afternoon.

In response to the California Public Utilities Commission's (CPUC) "Stop Work Order" for helicopter construction operations on San Diego Gas & Electric's (SDG&E) Sunrise Powerlink project, the company has issued the following statement from Michael R. Niggli, president and chief operating officer of SDG&E:

"SDG&E is committed to improving all helicopter and construction practices related to the project and will comply with the additional training and incident reporting requirements contained in the CPUC's order.

"Last week, we already had notified the CPUC of our intent

to hold a "safety stand down" to review our helicopter operations and had begun working on several of the items requested today by the Commission.

On Sept. 26 and 27, SDG&E and the primary construction contractor conducted two safety stand downs for many of the contracted pilots and will hold additional safety stand downs for all pilots, flight and ground crews and project staff to discuss safety and rigging measures to ensure rigorous compliance in these areas. In addition, we have been working on an updated incident reporting protocol to enhance and clarify the existing reporting process so all helicopter incidents are brought immediately to the attention of the CPUC and other appropriate regulating agencies."

"We recognize the Commission's concerns about recent incidents involving helicopters working on the project and are resolved to improve and main-

tain safe construction practices. Safety is -- and always has been -- the company's top priority in all of our operations. The Sunrise Powerlink project is no exception."

"Our goal is to make any necessary changes to ensure helicopter operations for construction of the Sunrise Powerlink proceed safely for the benefit of our employees,

contractors and the public. I am confident we can meet the CPUC's additional requirements and we look forward to resuming helicopter operations as soon as possible so that we can finish this project and bring it online as scheduled in the second half of 2012. In the meantime, construction will continue on the project's non-helicopter activities."

Assemblyman Jones scores with Second Amendment event

Over 70 residents of the 77th Assembly district attended a Second-Amendment Awareness Event hosted by Assemblyman Brian Jones on Friday, September 23, 2011 at the Lemon Grove Rod and Gun Club in Alpine.

The function included approximately 25 volunteers who donated their time and expertise to instruct novice shooters about accuracy and safety. The focus of the event highlighted the Second Amendment guarantee to own firearms as private citizens. Assemblyman Jones gave an update on legislative issues affecting gun-owners in California. Sam Paredes, Executive Director of Gun Owners California, was also on hand to give an update regarding his organizations efforts to fight gun-control legislation.

"Those who attended this event saw something special and unique to this country—the exercising of Second Amendment rights by members of this community, all of different ages, backgrounds, and affiliations," Jones said. "I only wish that those who push gun control laws were also on hand to see just how safely, responsibly, and respectfully these citizens operated these firearms. To deny these law-abiding individuals the right to enjoy a Friday afternoon practicing their Second Amendment right is

intolerable." Jones also recently spoke on the Assembly Floor in fervent defense of Second Amendment rights.

Jones also spent time interacting with constituents, and said he was particularly touched by the story of an elderly woman whose husband passed away recently and felt the need to protect her home with a firearm. "I am beyond pleased that this event offers citizens like her the opportunity to learn how to safely operate a firearm," Jones added.

Participants had the opportunity to shoot handguns, rifles, and shotguns. Firearms were provided for use by the Lemon Grove Rod & Gun Club, and the Kiwanis Club of Alpine provided food and beverages. "I strongly appreciate and admire those groups who were on hand to support this event," Jones added. "Without them, absolutely none of this would have been possible."

HUD CHARGES LANDLORD WITH DISCRIMINATING AGAINST FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN

WASHINGTON, DC - August 2, 2011—The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) announced in early August that it has charged the owner and manager of Breckenridge Plaza Apartments in Phoenixville, PA, with violating the Fair Housing Act by discriminating against families with children. Breckenridge Plaza, Inc., and Morris Zelikovsky were charged with making discriminatory statements, including in advertisements on craigslist.org, indicating a preference against families with children, offering different rental terms and conditions to families with children, and discouraging families with children from applying for housing.

HUD brings the charge on behalf of the Fair Housing Council of Suburban Philadelphia (FHCSF), a non-profit fair housing organization, which filed a complaint with HUD after FHCSF testers determined that manager Zelikovsky treated same-size households differently by imposing different rental charges when one member of a family was a child. One of the ads placed by Zelikovsky stated: "Winter Special Price for Two Adults." The Fair Housing Act makes it unlawful to make statements that express a preference or otherwise discriminate and to impose different rules and restrictions on families with children.

"Charging higher rent to a family because they have children unjustly saddles them with an extra financial burden and violates the Fair Housing Act," said John Trasviña, HUD Assistant Secretary for Fair Housing and Equal Opportunity. "HUD will continue to take swift action against owners and landlords who impose different terms and conditions on families with children."

According to HUD's charge, after FHCSF noticed ads on craigslist.org and in the local newspaper, The Phoenix, indicating that families with children were being charged higher rents than same-size households without children, FHCSF conducted several rental tests. Zelikovsky told a FHCSF tester posing as a mother with a son that she would have to pay \$775 for a two-bedroom apartment that had been advertised as renting for \$740. Later that same day, Zelikovsky told a different tester posing as a married woman with no children that a two-bedroom apartment rented for \$745 a month.

During a different test conducted by FHCSF, Zelikovsky told a tester posing as a married woman with no children that a two-bedroom apartment was \$740 a month. Later that day, a tester posing as a mother with a child contacted Zelikovsky about a two-bedroom apartment. When the tester asked Zelikovsky if having a child was going to be a problem, he allegedly said, "It's just going to be higher at \$775 a month."

HUD's charge will be heard by a United States Administrative Law Judge soon unless any party to the charge elects to have the case heard in federal district court. If an administrative law judge finds after a hearing that discrimination has occurred, he may award damages to aggrieved persons for the damages caused them by the discrimination.

The judge may also order injunctive relief and other equitable relief to deter further discrimination, as well as payment of attorney fees. In addition, the judge may impose fines in order to vindicate the public interest. If the matter is decided in federal court, the judge may also award punitive damages to aggrieved persons.

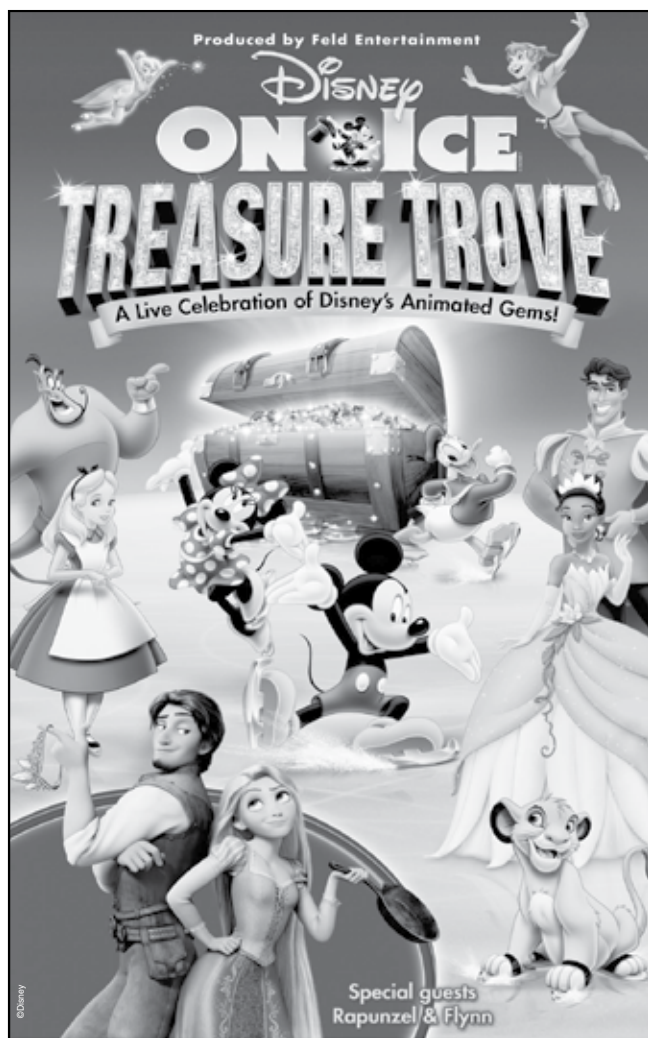

Top ten ways to eat more vegetables

Whether you're trying to lose weight or just maintain a healthy lifestyle, it's important to include a variety of vegetables in meal planning. The health benefits of eating vegetables are many and include reducing the risk of stroke, type 2 diabetes, coronary heart disease, and certain cancers, such as mouth, stomach, and colon cancer.

It can be a challenge to include a sufficient amount of this tasty and beneficial food group to menus. These tips from TOPS Club, Inc. (Take Off Pounds Sensibly), the nonprofit weight-loss support organization, offer some creative ways to eat more vegetables:

1. Make a "pasta" dish with spaghetti squash instead of noodles.

2. Puree cooked vegetables and add them to stews, gravies, and soups.

3. Add raw spinach leaves and an extra-ripe banana to a fruit smoothie. It may sound strange, but the sweetness of the banana masks the taste of the spinach.

4. Baking? Add shredded carrots to muffins or bread.

5. Instead of cheese and meat, pile your morning omelet with onions, mushrooms, and red and green peppers. Chop vegetables the night before to save time in the morning.

6. Add chopped spinach to meat when preparing meatballs or hamburgers.

7. Try mashed cauliflower instead of mashed potatoes. Experiment with different flavorings such as garlic, a dab of butter, and Parmesan cheese.

8. Add salsa to a breakfast burrito, pile it on a veggie burger, or use it in place of

high-fat, creamy vegetable dips.

9. Puree pasta sauce with vegetables such as winter squash or chopped broccoli.

10. Add chopped carrots to casseroles or meat loaf.

The history of Oktoberfest?

It began with the Royal Wedding on Oct. 12, 1810.

Crown Prince Ludwig, later to become King Ludwig I, was married to Princess Therese of Saxony-Hildburghausen on October 12, 1810. The citizens of Munich were invited to attend the festivities held on the fields in front of the city gates to celebrate the

happy royal event. The fields were renamed Theresienwiese ("Theres'a Fields") to honor the Crown Princess, although the locals have since abbreviated the name simply to "Wiesn". Horse races in the presence of the royal family marked the close of the event that was celebrated as a festival for the whole of Bavaria. The decision to repeat the horse

races in subsequent years gave rise to the tradition of Oktoberfest.

The History of The Munich Oktoberfest: Oktoberfest is one great big international celebration. People have been coming to Munich for almost 200 years for the celebration and now come from all over the world to participate in this 16 day party.

Oktoberfest started as a wedding celebration party. Prince Ludwig of Bavaria, who was later crowned King Ludwig I, wanted the people of Munich to share in the celebration of his marriage to Princess Therese of Saxony-Hildburghausen on October 12, 1810. He organized a horserace, offered copious amounts of beer and food, invited all the people of Munich and voila! Oktoberfest was born.

The festival was such a success that Ludwig decided to hold it again the following year in conjunction with the state agricultural festival. In 1816 carnival booths were added and in 1819 the town fathers of Munich decided that the festival should be celebrated every year. Over time, the length of the festival was increased and the date moved backward because of the great weather at the end of September in Bavaria.

Since its beginnings the Oktoberfest has thus been canceled 24 times due to war, disease and other emergencies. By 1960, the last year that horse races were held, Oktoberfest was already a world-famous festival. People from all over the world started attending Oktoberfest in droves.

Oktoberfest is now celebrated all over the world at different venues and in varying measures but definitely, Oktoberfest Munich is the king of festivals and we have King Ludwig to thank for it. A toast to King Ludwig and Therese!

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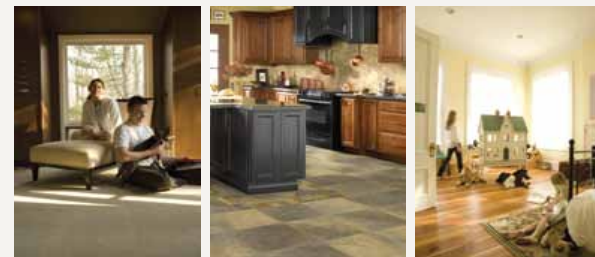

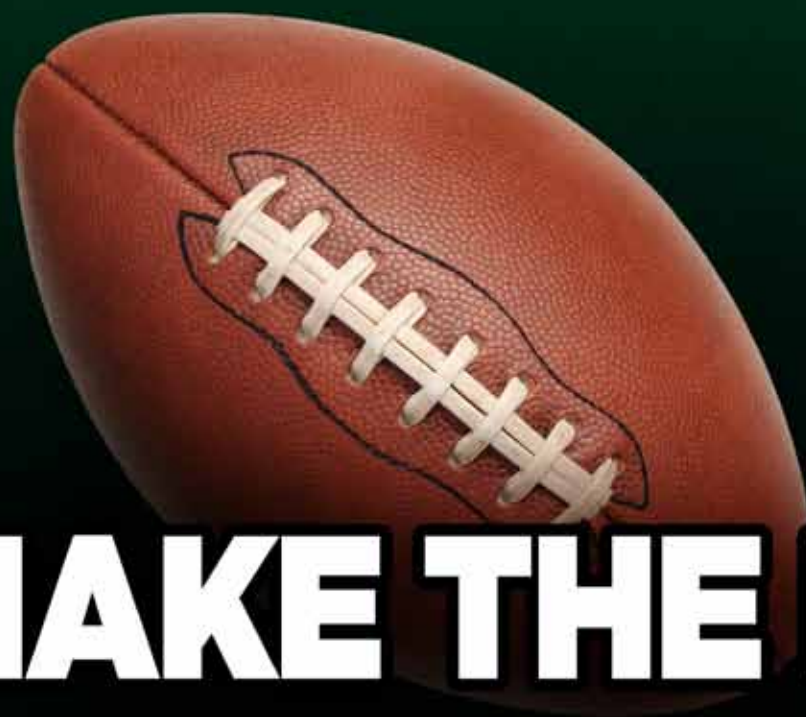

'Machine Gun Preacher' — better suited for DVD

When critics begin checking their watches while watching a movie, it's not a good sign. For me and two other critics, this happened 14 times in *Machine Gun Preacher*. Excited to observe another character portrayed by Gerard Butler and to learn more about this true story, I left the theatre slightly disappointed.

A good and righteous person often earns those stripes from a loathsome background. That's the journey for Sam Childers (Butler), who is a drug-addicted biker just out of jail as the movie opens. He immediately runs back to the dreadful world that sent him to prison.

Sam is always angry, so when he discovers his wife Lynn (Michelle Monaghan) has quit stripping and taken a more responsible job, he becomes a time bomb, both verbally and physically. After returning to the depths of a low-life and almost losing his family, Sam gets coerced by Lynn to go to church, and soon his life turns around.

Now reformed, reading to his daughter at night and starting his own business, Sam takes a giant leap out of his box when learning about the brutal Lord's Resistance Army (LRA) in the Republic of Sudan. Soldiers are killing men and women and taking the children in order to turn them into killing machines. Eventually Sam goes to the Su-

dan and starts an orphanage to take care of the children.

The script of *Machine Gun Preacher* — by relative new screenwriter Jason Kelle — is based on the book *Another Man's War: The True Story of One Man's Battle to Save the Children of Sudan*. Unfortunately, the movie never measures up to its subject. The film seems cliché and uneven. Also, although the many children portrayed in the film are wonderful, the sentimental aspects of the story often feel contrived. I've long been a fan of director Marc Forster (*The Kite Runner*, *Monster's Ball*) but feel he somehow miss-stepped with this film.

From wining female hearts

with his singing in *Phantom of the Opera* (2004) to his strong performance in the actioner *300* (2006), Butler has become a very popular actor. However, Butler's role here feels forced. Those first images showing him too comfortable with a machine gun in his hand and harboring a deep-seated anger never left my mind, and even though his motivations changed, I never felt empathy for him or his mission, but definitely the cause. Monaghan, who was marvelous in *Trucker*, has little wiggle room as a typical housewife cheering her husband on — to a point.

One performance did stand out here — Souleymane Sy Savane as Deng, a soldier from the Sudanese People's Libera-

tion Army (SPLA). Savane effectively authenticates Deng as Sam's partner in establishing the children's shelter. But when it would seem fitting -- in this brutal world of injustice -- for him to become an angry loose

canyon, he's the voice of reason that keeps Sam under control instead.

While I really looked forward to this film, I think *Machine Gun Preacher* might be better viewed on DVD to learn about this true story.

Bolts advert an ambush Sunday

At Qualcomm Stadium last Sunday the San Diego Chargers improved their record to (2-1) defeating the (0-3) Kansas City Chiefs 20-17 in a divisional rival game. The experts predicted a Chargers blowout. The Chiefs made it close.

As the sun broke through the clouds at a packed house, it was the Chiefs who were trying to break through the ranks of the winless by securing their first victory of the season. After a Chiefs fourth quarter comeback Chargers safety Eric Weddle saved the day for San Diego. With 55 seconds left on the clock the Chiefs sought a game tying field goal or go ahead score. The Bolts defender stepped intercepted a pass in front of a Matt Cassel stealing the show from the Chiefs and securing a victory for the home team.

“That’s what you want to do,” Weddle said. “You want to make the play to win the game. We always strive to be in that moment to win the game for our team and that’s what happened.”

Weddle described the play the Chargers used as a read blitz. The Chargers ran that

play in practice, where Weddle was a little aggressive. In the game he was in the right place at the right time, something he has a knack for it seems. A free agent this past off-season, he opted to stay in San Diego. That decision made him the highest paid safety in the National Football League. So far for him, and the Bolts, it’s turning out to be a worthwhile investment.

Statistically, the Chargers dominated in the first half. Kansas City had been out-scored 99-10 going into the second half last Sunday. It appeared to be a cake walk for San Diego. The Chargers let them hang around, and the Chiefs made a game of it. Getting no first downs in the first two quarters Kansas City finished with 13.

Bolts Running back Ryan Mathews had a breakout game gaining 98 yards on 21 carries. He also caught four passes for 51 yards. Kicker Nick Novak – who lived in San Diego until age 13 – connected on both of his field goals (35, 41). The latter in the fourth quarter proved to be the decisive margin of victory. Of his five kickoffs, four went into the end zone. One was a touchback.

Signed to replace Nate Kaeding (out for the season) is Novak, a journeyman in his eighth season. Going without the services of their All-Pro tight end Antonio Gates, were first round draft pick rookie Corey Liuget and free agent safety Bob Sanders. Chargers wide-out Malcolm Floyd who wasn’t expected to play, did, but was a non-factor.

Quarterback Philip Rivers finished the game with a passer rating of only 62.0, completing 24-of-38 passes, no TD’s, two interceptions. He did distribute the ball to seven different receivers.

Chargers Head Coach Norv Turner gave his take after the game saying, “We play the Chiefs twice a year. We understood what type of game it was going to be. It shouldn’t have been this close. We had opportunities and didn’t take advantage of them. We’ve got to keep our guy’s on the practice field. That’s how you get better and play together.”

The Bolts defense played well enough to win, holding K.C. to 17 points. T he Chargers host the Miami Dolphins Sunday at Qualcomm Stadium; game time is 1:15 p.m.

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Whatever happened to good sportsmanship & teamwork?

Jamar Johnson wonders why sports isn’t about playing anymore.

With the NFL spiraling toward a lockout and million-dollar NBA teammates squabbling amongst themselves, Johnson is concerned with what the pros are teaching the rest of us about sports and sportsmanship.

“Some people just love to play, and they’d like to see if they can play at a competitive level and maybe even improve their game,” said Johnson, organizer of the CBL, or Community Basketball Leagues (www.cblhoopsusa.com). “It seems like all the pro leagues, and even the colleges, like to focus on is hype and good talent actually gets pushed away. In their hunt for the next Kobe or the next LeBron, they lose track of guys whose natural ability, teamwork and unselfishness would make them great additions. These are men and women who just love to play for the sake of the game, and it’s a shame that after college, only two percent of them ever get to play in the pros. It’s wrong that many of these talented athletes are prevented from making this game a part of their life after high school or college. Their competitive spirits and their talents need a place to shine.”

That’s why Johnson founded the CBL, which currently has leagues in eight cities for players ranging literally from toddlers to adults, and it is expanding nationwide. His view is that these leagues, which cater to both the former collegiate athlete as well as the weekend warrior, can serve as a way for people to continue their involvement in sports and may even serve as a springboard for those who may have missed opportunities earlier in life.

“We’ve actually had a few former high school players get picked up as scholarship athletes on the college level after having been viewed by the scouts who regularly attend games,” Johnson said. “That’s not to say that people should join because they think they’re going to get their big break with us. They should play because they love the game, but understand that you never know who’s watching. Does that mean they’ll be ‘discovered?’ No, but if they don’t play, they may never know if their futures could have included playing for a school or even a semi-pro or pro league.”

Johnson said he sees more sportsmanship and teamwork in his leagues than most people see in the pros today, and it’s because of the CBL’s focus on friendly competition and the community at large.

“Our players aren’t worried about big salaries or their stats,” he said. “They play out of love of the game, and their communities. We use the league to help raise funds for local charities and community-based organizations, so when our players play, they aren’t just playing for themselves. They are playing for the betterment of their own communities, as well, and that’s unique these days. As pro leagues become more about the money and the fame than about the sport, when owners and players take turns at proving who is greedier and when ticket prices are so high that the average fan can’t even afford to see a pro game in person anymore, it’s good to see athletes compete in a league that is more focused on the game than on the money.”

Jamar Johnson, Organizer and Chief CBL Commissioner, is responsible for all day-to-day business operations. Jamar is a native Elkhart, IN and former standout on Concord High School’s 1988 and 1990 state runner-up basketball teams. Johnson went on to lead the University of Nebraska Men’s basketball program to its first ever Big 12 conference tournament championship in 1994 and completed his Bachelor of Science degree in Human Resources and Family Science.
