

High School Essay Contest opens for 2011-2012

U.S. high school students and their teachers are invited to participate in the *Bill of Rights Institute's* sixth annual *Being an American Essay Contest*.

The largest contest of its kind in the country, the Being an American Essay Contest explores the Founding principles outlined in the Constitution. The contest is administered by the Bill of Rights Institute, a non-profit educational organization in the Washington, D.C. area devoted to educating young people about the Constitution and Founding principles. The 2011-2012 contest is sponsored by the History Channel.

"This contest is unique in that it gives students the opportunity to think about the important Founding principles communicated in our Constitution," said Dr. Jason Ross, Bill of Rights Institute Vice President of Education Programs. "This contest is vital to helping students see their Founding principles as a meaningful part of the American experiment of self-government."

Specifically, students are asked to share their thoughts on the Constitution by answering the following question: "How does the Constitution establish and maintain a culture of liberty?"

The top three student winners from each of the five geographical regions will be awarded cash prizes of \$1,000 (First Place), \$500 (Second Place), and \$250 (Third Place). Teacher sponsors for each student winner will also receive a cash prize of \$100.

"The contest not only honors and awards sponsoring teachers, but also equips them with free lesson plans and other supplemental materials that meet state and national academic standards so they can easily incorporate the essay contest into their classrooms. The Contest is really a tribute to the excellent work teachers do in the important task of civic education," said Ross.

Over 80,000 students have participated in the essay contest since it began in 2006.

"We are pleased to support the Bill of Rights Institute's Being an American Essay Contest," said Dr. Libby O'Connell, SVP, Corporate Outreach and Chief Historian, History Channel. "The contest encourages students to think critically and truly makes the past relevant in their lives today."



I'm having an out-of-cash experience

I have read of people who testified to the fact that they have had an out of body experience. After meeting some of these people I can understand why they would want to abandon their body if only for a moment. My question is, why did they return? Whether this was a real experience or not, only their hairdresser knows for sure.

I have made it one of the primary purposes of my life to stay in my body as long as I live. In fact, I have so developed my body so that there is ample room for my La-Z-Boy chair and me. I like to be comfortable.

Truth compels me to say that I have never experienced an out-of-body experience. Every night when I go to sleep, I am unconscious until morning but I do not think that counts except when it comes to sheep, but who gives a baa-baa about sheep. I have a hard time relating to these people with such esoteric experiences. I do not doubt them, I just do not relate to them.

One thing that I can relate to is "an out-of-cash" experience. There, I said it. Confession is good for the soul. For many years, I was ashamed of having these kinds of experiences. I thought I was the only one in the whole world that ever experienced such trauma in their lives. I kept it a secret for many years.

But all that has changed. I am ready to come out of the closet and confess that when it comes to cash, I am simply out of it.

It's not that I have always had an over abundance of cash. Throughout the years, it has come in a little here and a little there but mostly nowhere. I can never remember a time when my life was flooded with so much cash I did not know what to do with it all.

Being out-of-cash must not be as bad as it sounds. I suppose the terrible thing is how a person gets to that point in life.

I wanted to write a book about my out-of-cash experience but I only got up to chapter 11.

From everything I can gather, everybody seems to be out-of-cash. Even our government has come to such a perilous place as this. The government used to say, "I feel your pain," and now they are really feeling our pain. The government is not broken as some people attest; the government is simply broke. Now they know how I really feel.

Being out-of-cash does have some advantage.

Last Tuesday, for example, was a long hard day and I was glad to get home. When I did get home, my wife greeted me at the door and said, "Let's go out for supper tonight. I don't feel like cooking."

I looked at her and said rather soberly, "I sure would love to go out tonight for supper, but I'm really out-of-cash."

My wife gave me one of her trademark looks and said, "Let's use your credit card."

I would have argued but I was simply out-of-arguments. I must say that through the years she has been very generous with my credit card, which may be why I am really out-of-cash.

Being out-of-cash is not really the worst thing that can happen to a person. About three weeks ago, I had to go out of town for a little trip and forgot to fill up my gas tank. I didn't even think about it. After all, with all the car payments and the monthly insurance payments you would think the car would come up with a little bit of cash on its own. But no, it leaves every-

thing to me. My car once told me it was the responsibility of the owner.

I am not saying that my car is contrary but I was about 7 miles out of town when I ran out-of-gas. It does not matter how much cash you have on hand, if you run out of gas without a gas station nearby it just does not matter.

The men's store where I usually buy my clothing was running a sale on shirts, the kind I usually wear. I had some errands to run and by the time I got to the men's store, they had sold the last shirt. "I'm sorry," the salesperson said, "but you're out-of-luck."

I am not quite sure which is worse, being out-of-cash or being out-of-luck. The truth of the matter is, no matter how much cash you have on hand if there are no more shirts left, you are simply out-of-luck.

A long time ago, I faced the simple truth that money cannot buy everything. I might be able to rent a little bit of happiness but it does not last forever. I have learned that the most important thing in life is to be balanced. Too much of anything, even a good thing, can really be harmful.

This must be what Solomon had in mind when he wrote, "Remove far from me vanity and lies: give me neither poverty nor riches; feed me with food convenient for me: Lest I be full, and deny thee, and say, Who is the LORD? or lest I be poor, and steal, and take the name of my God in vain" (Proverbs 30:8-9 KJV).

The problem today is not that we do not have enough; we simply are not thankful enough for what we have.

Breast Cancer patients higher risk for Melanoma

As Breast Cancer Awareness Month gets underway, *The Skin Cancer Foundation* aims to alert breast cancer patients and survivors that they have an increased risk of developing melanoma, the deadliest form of skin cancer. Research has shown that genetics may play a role – for women carrying a specific breast cancer susceptibility gene, the presence of abnormalities in the gene doubles the risk of melanoma.

The Skin Cancer Foundation

recommends the following skin cancer prevention tips for breast cancer patients and survivors:

Beware of photosensitivity. Photosensitivity is an increased sensitivity or abnormal response of the skin to sunlight or artificial ultraviolet (UV) light; people with photosensitivity are at increased risk of developing skin cancers. Photosensitivity can be caused by certain medical conditions and treatments, and breast cancer patients should find out if their

treatments could make them photosensitive. If so advised by their physicians, breast cancer patients should be especially careful to seek shade and stay out of direct sunlight between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., the sun's most intense hours; wear sun-protective clothing, including wide-brimmed hats and UV-blocking sunglasses; and apply a broad-spectrum (UVA/UVB protection) high Sun Protection Factor sunscreen. SPF 30 or higher is advisable for photosensitive individuals.

Be screened. The Foundation recommends that people at high risk of melanoma and other skin cancers undergo frequent full-body skin screenings by a physician—once a year or more often as your physician advises.

Perform self-exams. Self-exams are also important. Performed regularly (monthly is ideal), self-examination can alert you to changes in the skin and aid in the early detection of skin cancer.

Because skin cancers can

vary in appearance, it is important to be on the lookout for early warning signs. Melanomas, for instance, often resemble moles. Look especially for skin changes of any kind, such as color changes or growth, and do not ignore a suspicious spot simply because it does not hurt. Skin cancers may be painless, but dangerous all the same. See a physician, preferably one who specializes in diseases of the skin, if you note any change in an existing mole, freckle, or spot or if you find a new mole with any of the warning signs of skin cancer.

— AT THE MOVIES —

'Of Love and Other Demons' - a beautiful, painterly look

Science, religion and that greatest witchcraft of all – love – collide in first-time feature director Hilda Hidalgo's take on Gabriel García Márquez' *Of Love and Other Demons* (Del Amor y Otros Demonios). It's an ambitious project – beginning with the master of magical realism – and Hidalgo smartly treats her source material poetically rather than literally. The result is a film both lovely to watch and fascinating to ponder.

Sierva María (Eliza Triana), preteen daughter of privilege in 18th-century Colombia, is growing up nearly a wild child, her uncut coppery red hair grown down to there. Her father, the Marqués Don Ygnacio (Joaquín Climent), more concerned with his drug-dependent wife (Margarita Rosa de Francisco), has left Sierva's care to their black slaves.

We first see her tumbling out

of a hammock. Nearly mute, she seems to have an easier relationship with the natural world of the jungle outside than with the humans in her life. Her comfortable but lonely life changes drastically when she is bitten by a rabid dog in the local market, bringing the forces of 18th century medicine, religion and family into conflict about how to handle Sierva. The question is whether the problem is rabies or demonic possession. The local doctor (Damián Alcázar) says it's unlikely she will get rabies, but if she does, she must be taken to "the island" because "they'll know how to treat her there."

When she comes down with a fever, the church – or rather, the bishop (Jordi Dauder) – leaps to pronounce her demonically possessed and in need of exorcism. Don Ygnacio sends her to Santa Clara convent; the bishop assigns 36-year-old priest Cayetano Delaura (Pablo Derqui) to perform the exorcism. The extremely reluctant

priest (an academic, readying himself for work in the Vatican library) finds her locked and shackled in a basement cell. The first thing she does is bite him. Is this evidence of rabies, demonic possession, stress or something else? Soon reality

and imagination, poetry and that real devil – love – intermingle.

García Márquez reports that as a young journalist, he was assigned to cover the disinterment of the crypts beneath this same Santa Clara convent. Several anomalies were found, the greatest being the skull of a young girl with 22 meters of coppery hair still attached and apparently growing.

Triana and Derqui make the unlikely coupling believable, even poignant; Hidalgo preserves the elements of magical realism while cutting all but the essentials from the plot (only hinting at the real ending); and cinematographer Marcelo Camorino gives the film a beautiful, painterly look.

Of Love and Other Demons runs Oct. 7-13 at Ultra Star Theatre in the Hazard Center as part of the Latino Film Festival.

'What's Your Number' — moronic plot

By just reading the title of *What's Your Number?* I thought this romantic comedy was going to be about single people who ask for telephone numbers to begin a potential meaningful relationship. Actually, the number refers to how many people Ally Darling (Anna Faris) has slept with. It's one of those movies that's trying to cash in on the vulgar trend of uninhibited sex being morally fine. What happened to just dinner and a movie, but certainly not this one?

While out at her sister's bachelorette party, one of the bridesmaids states that if you can't find a mate after 20 one night stands; you're destined to not get married. Ally, who has been with 19 men, becomes so paranoid she vows not to sleep with another man unless she is sure number 20 is her future husband. Using insane and stupid reasoning, she hunts down the last 19 boyfriends she has slept with to see if they are worth rekindling their romance without breaking the 20 rule.

This plot is so brainless; I knew this was going to be a big waste of time. How about just dating people and not sleeping with them until you're at least committed in some permanent emotional way. I know that's boring and these types of plots have been done to death but I would rather see that instead of people being promiscuous as an acceptable way of dating.

What's Your Number? relies entirely on the performances of its main stars, Faris (Yogi Bear) and Chris Evans (Captain America: The First Avenger). Both of their characters are constantly seen in their underwear and sometimes naked — backsides only, no frontals. I have never been a fan of Faris's movies roles as she plays the typical blonde bimbo in almost all of her previous movies. In this film Evans offers a tad more interest.


Kiwanis installation dinner honors Higgins

Injuries many, but Chargers prevail

Improving their record to (3-1), the San Diego Chargers taught the Miami Dolphins (0-4) a lesson in what it takes to win a football game after defeating them 26-16.

Sitting atop the AFC West with their latest victory. The Chargers are off to a quick start. The best early start under the tenure of head coach Norv Turner. This is something not seen by Chargers fans since 2003.

As the sun was shining on 63,002 fans at Qualcomm Stadium last Sunday. They witnessed the Chargers doing what they were supposed to do, win a NFL game by playing mistake-free, zero turnover football combined with a solid defense.

For the second week in a row, it was Chargers free safety Eric Weddle who sealed the deal with a late game interception.

The Dolphins were forced to use backup quarterback Mat Moore (17-26, 167 yards,) for starter Chad Henne who left the game injured in the first quarter. Moore was the most effective

by moving the team down the field. But, it was the talent and depth of the Chargers that was too much for Miami.

With the game in doubt for most of the contest, Chargers kicker Nick Novak connected on four field goals (27,48,23,38). It was his last one at 7:06 in the fourth quarter, that sent the school of Dolphins swimming back to Miami with another loss.

Without the services of tight end Antonio Gates (toe), and cornerback Quentin Jammer (hamstring), injuries were piling up on the Bolts sideline. Outside linebacker Shaun Phillips had a hamstring problem and Vincent Jackson had a leg problem. Both saw limited action, but contributed.

A silver lining in the wake of all these injuries is the fact that a lot of different players are being used, receiving valuable playing time. This will be beneficial as the season progresses. Starting at the cornerback position for the injured Jammer, Chargers rookie Marcus Gilchrist defended well and got his first NFL interception. "Unfortunately we've had a lot of guy's not being able to play," said Chargers head coach Norv Turner.

"All of the guys who had to step in for different players were for different reasons. Today Marcus had to step in and played great at corner and got the interception. Look at Vincent Brown, third and 15 and he makes a big play. Obviously getting the win is the most important thing, but improvement is also important. I think we played a better game this week than last. We have a lot of moving parts — sometimes it's a challenge," said coach Turner.

A calm, collected, and poised Philip Rivers was back to his usual form directing the Chargers' offense efficiently without any mistakes. He completed 21-of-31 passes for 307 yards, one touchdown (55-yard pass to Vincent Jackson), no interceptions.

Running back Ryan Mathews continues to impress his fans and coach. The former number one draft pick for the second week in a row finished with 149-yards of total offense, gaining 81-yards on 16 carries and receiving 5-passes for 68-yards.

Mike Tolbert got into the scoring picture with a majestic one-yard dive over the pile giving the Chargers a 20-10 third quarter lead. Tolbert with 17-yards rushing, and 51-yards on five catches receiving. leads the league in receptions. Together, this dynamic duo accounted for 267-yards from the line of scrimmage.

Wide-out Vincent Jackson in a limited role had three catches, 108-yards, and a touchdown. Vincent Brown, a third round draft pick from SDSU, caught his first two NFL passes. One giving the Chargers a key first down.

Off to a slow start in 2011 due to injuries, the rookie wide receiver commented, "It's a dream come true. I'm happy to be a part of this special thing we've got going here. Just trying to do my part, get strong, and do the best I can."

The Chargers fly to Sports Authority Field at Mile High to tackle the Denver Broncos. Kickoff is 1:15 p.m. Sunday.




2012 Chevrolet Camaro 45th Anniversary Edition

Chevrolet is celebrating 100 years of building automobiles and trucks, and the Camaro has hit the 45th anniversary this year. Camaro did miss a few years of production, and there were a couple of other years they would like to forget as well. Read Camaro, Five Generations of Performance by Darwin Holmstrom, photos by David Newhardt Motor Books Int. to find out more about that.

This Camaro – an SS Camaro with red and charcoal stripes that grace the hood – is a blast to drive. The interior boasts the 45th anniversary logo stitched into the leather seats, headrests and attached just above the glove box. It's subtle, but it tells the story.

The HID headlights with LED Halo rings around the lights make this car look bad to the bone at night. The 20-inch-deep silver painted aluminum wheels are nice. You can put this package on any Camaro in the line up, V6, V8, stick shift transmission or automatic. This

is a perfect way to build your Camaro the way you want it, and even make it unusual if you are creative and have a good relationship with the dealer.

My tester was loaded with a 6.2-liter V8, six-speed manual transmission, and it was expected to average 16 MPG in the city and 24 on the open road. I averaged a combined fuel mileage of 23.5. That's not bad considering I was running up and down the mountain.

Behind the wheel everything is within view thanks to HUD (Heads Up Display). This may take getting used to but once the driver is comfortable with it he/she will be lost without it. The screen is adaptable as it can be changed to provide information, raised or lowered, dimmed or turned off. Every car and truck should have this technology to help keep driver's eyes on the road to ensure a safe drive.

My Camaro was painted Carbon Flash Metallic. So is metallic coming back or what?

Check this jewel out in the sun. It has a black interior and no sunroof, which I love. A sunroof does work in this car, I'm just not a fan them.

The sound system was fabulous and had XM/Sirius radio, AM/FM/CD. There was plenty of storage for the driver and passenger and the seats fit like gloves with enough adjustments for me.

Will this car become a classic? That depends on how

many are sold, but if I was into collecting for my kids' future this would not be a bad way to go.

I asked a couple of KUSI employees on what they thought this car cost. I got numbers of 40, 50 even \$60,000 dollars! Base price on this 6.2-liter V8 is \$35,450, and the 45th anniversary adds \$1,375 and \$900 for destination and a pre-tax total is \$37,725. Check the car out at the nearest dealer and tell them Dave sent you.


