Web-based camera system

provides time lapse progress of San Vicente Dam raise

The San Diego County Water Authority has a new web-based camera system at San Vicente Dam that allows the public to watch progress on the world's largest roller-compacted concrete dam raise. Two cameras offer broad views of construction activities, enabling viewers on the website to see the dam rise up from its foundation, as concrete is placed layer upon layer to bring the new dam to its full height of 337 feet.

Weeks of dam raise work are compressed into brief time-lapse videos. The camera system also posts two new high-resolution photographs every 30 minutes. The updated photographs and timelapse images are posted on the San Vicente Dam Raise web page at www.sdcwa.org/san-vicente-dam-raise.

"The value of this camera technology is that it helps the Water Authority document the historic record of this major construction project, while at the same time allowing members of the public to view its progress online," said Water Authority Board Chair Michael T. Hogan. "This dam raise will help protect the region's economy, job base and quality of life by increasing the amount of water available for use within the county."

The Water Authority is raising San Vicente Dam by 117 feet, more than doubling the storage capacity of San Vicente Reservoir. This additional storage surpasses the capacity of any existing reservoir in San Diego County.

When complete, the expanded reservoir will have the capacity to hold 52,000 acre-feet of water for potential emergency use (an acre-foot is

approximately 326,000 gallons of water - enough to cover a football field one foot deep) and an additional 100.000 acre-feet of water during wet years, for use in subsequent

The San Vicente Dam, which is owned and operated by the city of San Diego, is currently closed to all recreation. Once the dam raise is complete and the reservoir is refilled, it will reopen to recreation sometime between 2014 and 2017, depending on rainfall and supply and demand for water.

San Diego County Sher-iff's Department Captain Edward Musgrove, Santee Patrol Station, has been with the Sheriff's Department 23 years. For Health's Sake

Pedestrian safety tips

n the City of El Cajon, across the County and the Nation, while overall traffic deaths have dropped a bit, pedestrian deaths have risen. Please WALK carefully, as well as drive carefully. Here are some life-saving reminders through the link below.

Parents are the most important models of proper pedestrian behavior for children.

Cross streets safely.

Cross at a corner, using traffic signals and crosswalks. Try to make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of them. Do not assume that because you can see the driver, the driver can see you.

Look left, right and left again when crossing, and keep looking as you cross. Walk, do not run, across the street.

Walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible.

Be a safe pedestrian around cars. Watch for cars that are turning or backing up.

Parents and kids should hold hands in parking lots.

Set pedestrian safety rules for your children.

Never allow children under age 10 to cross streets alone.

Adult supervision is essential until you are sure a child has good traffic skills and judgment.

Children should walk on direct routes with the fewest street crossings.

Make sure children know to cross 10 feet in front of a school bus, never behind, and to wait for adults on the same side of the street as the school bus loading or unloading zone.

Teach your child never to run out into a street for a ball, a pet or any other reason.

Help create an environment that's safe for pedestrians.

Make sure your child plays in safe places away from motor vehicles, such as yards, parks and playgrounds and never in the street. Fence off play areas from driveways and streets.

Buy clothing and accessories incorporating retro reflective materials for your family to wear at dawn and dusk, in the evening and during other low-light situations, such as rainy or foggy weather.

Check frequently for children when backing out of a driveway or a parking space.

In addition: When walking at night - be seen, wear light colored clothing and/or wear reflective tape on your clothing. Do not jay-walk/mid-block cross, cross in well lit areas, cross at corners where motorists expect, do not step in front of moving vehicles, make sure you've been seen and traffic has stopped before crossing. Parents - be a good safety role model for your children.

Motorists drive alert - watch for pedestrians. Don not drive distracted or impaired.

Lets work together to improve the safety of our roadways. Thank you for helping us to educate the public on these reminders.

Note: Since October 13, four pedestrians have been struck in the City of El Cajon, three have died. Go to www. elcajonpolice.org and go to press releases to see each incident. These incidents occurred in various parts of our City. In the evening, most wearing dark clothing.

I simply cannot remember to change the year on the checks I write until May. By the time, I remember the correct year I have forgotten to make deposits into my checking account. I need a reality check, which with any luck will not bounce as high as my checkbook.

That is not the only reason I hesitate going into a new year. The biggest reason has to do with the mistakes I made during the old year.

Looking back over the old year, I worry that my blunders were not as bad as they could have been. Did I make all the gaffes I possibly could? Did I fill my quota? What is my quota, anyway?

For many people, the New Year offers the opportunity to start over again. Actually, what happens is people simply make new mistakes curiously similar to the mistakes made during the old year.


close look at what you've done last year and see what really counted for eternity. In the New Year let's make a difference for Christ.

The Italian film Le Quattro Volte was chosen as Best Foreign Language Film, while Project Nim was voted Best Documentary. Arthur Christmas was voted Best Animated

Emmanuel Lubezki earned Best Cinematographer honors for his work on The Tree of Life. The critics chose Oliver Bugge Coutte for Best Editing, honoring his work on Beginners. Dante Ferretti was cited for Best Production Design for his work on Hugo.

The score for Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows Part 2 was chosen as Best Score, honoring the work of composer Alexandre Desplat, who also wrote the scores this year for Extremely Loud And Incredibly Close and The Tree Of Life.

The wining top honors were the work of the actors in Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows - Part 2 with the award for Best Ensemble Performance.

per. He's also confronted with Dylan's bad behavior at school.


Looking for a way out of everything, Ben sees a simple solution after learning that a zoo is for sale in California. With little more thought than how much Rosie loves animals, he plunks down the money his family left him, loads up the kids, and the move is on.

What Ben finds at Rossmoor Animal Park is a zoo with animals requiring attention, a business unable to get a license to open until repairs are made, and a house that needs renovating. He meets Kelly (Johansson), the zookeeper, and relies on her to get them

'The Artist' - breaks the mold of modern movies





movie and in crisp black and white. Unusual? For today, yes, but not so unusual in the history of Hollywood. Don't forget, films began as black and white photoplays that were soundless. Nobody talked. There were titles at the bottom of the screen to get plot points over to the audience.

The story of *The Artist* is simple. French star Jean Dujardin (OSS 117" Cairo: Nest of Spies) takes on the role of American silent film star George Valentin based on Douglas Fairbanks who enjoyed enormous popularity in the early days of movies. Dujardin did his homework and watched all of Fairbanks's movies.

It's 1927, and Hollywood is about to be shaken to its foundations with the advent of sound - yes, talking pictures! The new replaces the old, and into Valentin's life appears newcomer Peppy Miller (the lovely Berenice Bejo). She tries to breathe new life into his fading star, and the two engage in a melodramatic love story. His star falls and hers rises. The film, however, is not gloomy or sad, but it has many funny and gleeful moments. When the two pair up to tap dance across the screen like Astaire and Rogers, memories flood back about how glamorous Hollywood used to be in those days. This sequence, and others, are perfectly delightful.

Actor John Goodman, who plays the studio mogul, com-

mented that the story is simple, decent and a throwback to earlier-style movies. "There's just something so innocent about it, and it works," he said.

Indeed it does. Dujardin plays a man who is a top star and one who is not ready to switch over to sound films. He's becoming a relic before his time.

The lack of dialogue doesn't seem to impair one's enjoyment. There are certain sounds used for emphasis, but the storyline is not compromised by the elimination of babble. The concise expressions of the actors and the added help of some subtitles are bonuses.

The film first caught fire in Europe where it picked up a boatload of kudos at the Cannes Film Festival. It received a standing ovation, and Dujardin won Best Actor. A funny side note is that the adorable Jack Russell dog (Uggy) in the film won the Palm Dog for best performance by a canine. The film is now being touted for Best Picture, Best Actor and Best Director Oscar nominations. The San Diego $Film\ Critic's\ Society\ picked\ The$ Artist as Best Picture of 2011.





Car tips for your winter trip

FAMILY FEATURES

Before you hit the road this winter, make sure your car and car insurance are ready for the journey. Planning ahead can help avoid mishaps that could ruin your vacation.

Whether you are traveling near or far, you will likely be lugging some valuable items such as skis, a laptop or a video camera — none of which are covered by a car insurance policy.

According to an April 2011 survey released by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC), 40 percent of Americans incorrectly believe their car insurance will cover the replacement of personal items stolen from their vehicle.

"The truth is that these items must be covered by your homeowners or renters insurance policy to be reimbursed if they are stolen or damaged," NAIC president Susan E. Voss said.

One-third of Americans also believe their auto insurance automatically covers a rental car, according to the NAIC survey. However, this is not true, and the NAIC recommends checking with your auto insurance agent to make sure you have adequate car insurance whether driving your own car or a rental.

Top 5 Auto Insurance Tips

- Confirm your car insurance is active and premiums are up-to-date. Have a current copy of your insurance card in the car.
- Select liability limits that are appropriate to your financial circumstances. People with more assets generally need to select higher limits of liability than those with fewer assets. If you are found to be at-fault in an accident and purchased insufficient limits, your personal assets are at risk for the remaining financial obligation.
- If renting a car for the trip, check your policy to see if it includes coverage. Verify potential coverage limitations with your agent, and make sure you are not duplicating benefits from your existing auto, health or home insurance policy. (See sidebar for more tips.)
- Verify your homeowners or renters insurance covers the theft of personal items from a car, especially if you are planning to carry expensive items in your car.
- Check to see if your policy includes roadside assistance. You can be covered for towing, fuel delivery, lockout service, jump-starts and more.

If you are unclear about your car insurance coverage or would like to learn how to lower car insurance costs, visit www.InsureUonline.org or contact your state insurance commissioner. Find your state commissioner at www.naic.org.

WINTERIZE YOUR CAR

To avoid car troubles, schedule a tune-up a few weeks prior to your trip and be sure to get regular oil changes. If you want to do some basic maintenance yourself, here's what Consumer Reports recommends you do:

■ Maintain visibility.

If your car's wipers leave streaks of water behind, or if the rubber on the wiper blade shows signs of stiffness or cracking, get a new set of wipers. Don't use the wipers to remove ice from the windshield — keep an ice scraper on hand. If it's going to snow the next day and your vehicle is parked outside, put the wipers into the raised position to keep them from freezing to the windshield.

■ Use the right oil.

Engine oil will thicken when it's cold, making it harder on the engine. Always check the owner's manual for the manufacturer's recommendation, but generally speaking, you should use a multi-viscosity oil that has

a W as part of the viscosity index. This means it's formulated for winter use.

■ Check other vital fluids.

This includes fluids for the engine, coolant, transmission, brakes, power steering and windshield washers.

Maintain hoses and belts.

You can check hoses on a cool engine by pinching them. There should be no soft spots or bulging areas. Feel for lengthwise cracks in the inner liner of the hoses. Check all belts for worn spots, cracks or shredding fabric reinforcement.

■ Prep the battery.

For maintenance-free batteries, check the window on top to see if it's fully charged. If it's not, have it professionally tested. For conventional batteries, remove the plastic caps on top of the battery and check the fluid level. If it's low, add distilled water. Make sure battery cables are securely attached to the

terminals. If your battery is more than five years old, consider replacing it.

■ Check the brakes.

If your car pulls to one side when you brake, or if you hear any grinding noises or feel unusual vibrations when you apply the brakes, take the vehicle to a mechanic.

■ Make sure you have appropriate tires.

Partially worn tires reduce your ability to stop or get going in snowy driving conditions. Winter tires have tread patterns and compounds that are specifically designed to grip snow and ice for good traction on slippery roads.

■ Pack an emergency kit.

It should include a flashlight, flares or reflective triangle, a distress sign, first aid supplies, basic tools, blankets, water, and a fully charged cell phone. If you have roadside assistance, store the number in a handy location.

Rental Insurance — Do You Need It?

Car rental companies typically offer these products at the counter. Check to see if they duplicate existing coverage before purchasing.

- Collision Damage Waiver (CDW) is also referred to as a Loss Damage Waiver (LDW). If you have comprehensive and collision coverage on your own car, you will likely not need this additional protection. Collision insurance covers the cost of repairs or the actual cash value of the vehicle, if damaged in a crash or rollover.
- Liability Insurance covers medical expenses and damages to another person's property as a result of a car accident caused by the insured's negligence. If you are adequately insured on your own car, you may consider forgoing this.
- Personal Accident Insurance offers coverage to the renter and passengers for medical bills resulting from a car crash. If you have adequate health insurance and disability income insurance,

or are covered by personal injury protection under your own car insurance, you will likely not need this additional insurance. **Personal Effects Coverage** provides for the theft of personal items inside the rental car. If you have a homeowners or renters insurance policy, it generally covers this already. If you frequently travel with expensive jewelry or sports equipment, it may be more cost-effective to purchase a floater under your home or renters insurance policies so the items are fully protected when you travel.
