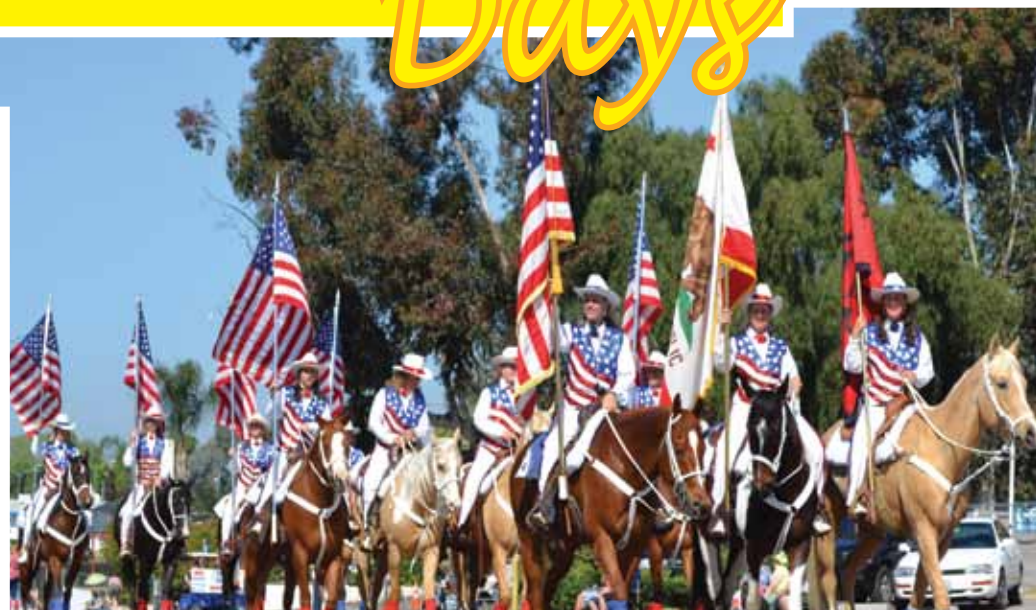

Western Days Parade Grand Marshals Ryan Lindley & Tommie Draheim

We are proud to announce this year's Lakeside Western Days Parade Grand Marshals, Ryan Lindley and Tommie Draheim who exemplify this year's parade theme: Lakeside; A Community Building Leaders. Both Ryan and Tommie are leaders on and off the football field and are wonderful role models in and outside of the Lakeside community.

Both Ryan and Tommie are graduates of El Capitan High School, Class of 2007. Both were star athletes for the Vaquero Football team under Coach Ron Burner, both continued their football success as SDSU's Aztec Quarterback and Offensive Lineman.

Ryan Lindley:

- Played two seasons of varsity football at El Capitan High School and accomplished:
 - As a senior, completed 61 percent of his passes (235-for-385) for 3,521 yards, including 35 touchdowns
 - 2006 Cal-HiSports second-team all-state and first-team pick for Division III League, CIF, San Diego Union-Tribune and Breitbard Hall of Champions Offensive
 - Player of the Year as a senior
 - Russ Saunders Award recipient, given to the county's top senior student-athlete in football by the Hall of Champions
 - Helped the Vaqueros to a league title and an 11-1 record in 2006, the best in school history
 - Threw for 417 yards in a single game in 2006, the eighth highest passing total in section history
 - His junior season, threw for over 2,000 yards and tossed 14 TD passes
 - Career totals include 5,741 yards passing and 49 touchdowns
 - Two-time team captain ... Rated the 34th best quarterback nationally and the No. 97 player overall in California by Rivals.com
 - Scout.com listed him among the top 50 quarterback recruits in the nation and No. 6 in California
 - Ranked No. 62 overall by SuperPrep Magazine in the state
 - An honor student, who ranked in the top six percent of his class and garnered first-team all-academic honors by the San Diego Union-Tribune two straight years

- Also played baseball at El Cap.

His Aztec Football Career:

- A strong-armed passer who made his Aztec debut in 2008 and has been the starter ever since
- Owns SDSU career passing records in yards (12,690), touchdowns (90), total offense (12,415), completions (961), quarterback starts (49) and consecutive quarterback starts (45)
- Threw for over 2,500 yards in each of his four campaigns
- First Aztec to ever pass for over 3,000 yards in three straight years
- Lindy's tabbed him as the 2011 preseason MW Offensive Player of the Year and as having the "strongest arm" in the MW for the second consecutive season
- Rated the sixth-best quarterback nationally by Lindy's
- Preseason second-team all-conference by Athlon's, Lindy's and Phil Steele
- Rivals.com rated him as the 78th-best player in the nation regardless of position in 2011
- Had one career 500-yard passing game, four 400-yard efforts and 14 for 300 or more yards.

Personal: Born June 22, 1989, in San Diego, Calif. Son of Tim and Kay Linn Lindley. Father, Tim, played water polo at Occidental College. Major is social science teaching.

Tommie Draheim

Tommie's Vaquero accomplishments:

- Played at center and defensive tackle as a senior at El Capitan High, helping the Vaqueros to 10-0 regular season record and a berth in the CIF section playoffs
- Was an all-CIF and all-state (medium schools) pick on offense in 2006
- Second-team all-league as a junior
- Won two letters as a thrower on the track and field squad
- Honor roll student.

His Aztec Career:

- 2011: Named a first-team all-Mountain West pick, the first Aztec offensive lineman on the first team since Brendan Darby in 2003
- Started his 21st career outing (18th straight) vs. Cal Poly at left tackle. Starter again at Army and against Washington State, Michigan, TCU, Air Force, Wyoming, New Mexico, at Colorado State, vs. Boise State, at UNLV, vs. Fresno State and in the bowl game against Louisiana-Lafayette
- Voted the team's offensive lineman of the year
- Phil Steele second-team all-MW.
- 2010: Starter at left tackle in all 13 games
- Had a tackle at Wyoming on an INT return.
- 2009: Played in nine contests, starting on seven occasions
- One of four Aztecs to earn a start in their first collegiate game on Sept. 5 at UCLA

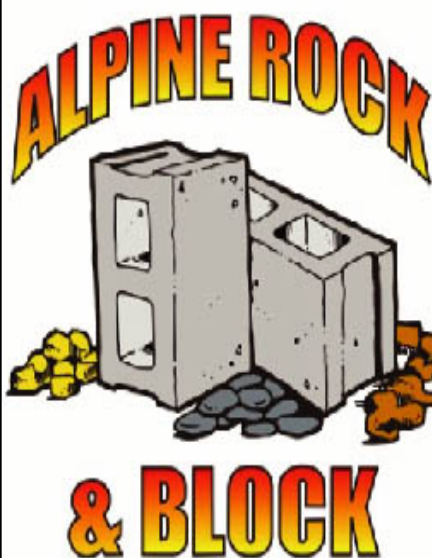

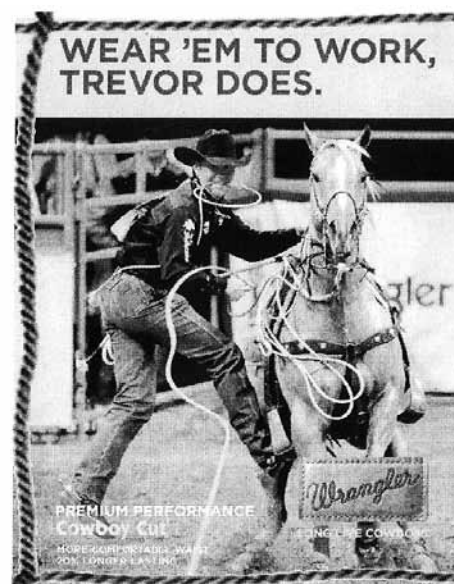

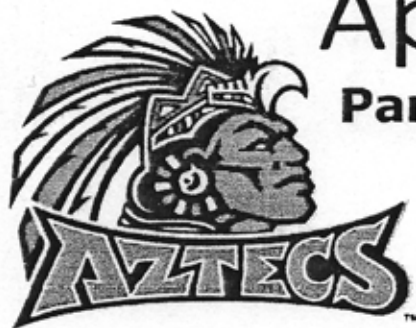

History of the Lakeside Rodeo

As you sit here and read this, you are perhaps watching a sporting event that pairs man and beast in what is often a very physical contest. For the animal it is a natural environment where he tests his limits against any force of nature or man. For the contestant it is a choice to test his limits against

the unknown. Today they come together in the arena as opposed to the corral, the ranch or the plains. Welcome to the Lakeside Rodeo Arena, with its long and varied history and its undisputable value to the "Youth of Lakeside".

On July 5 of 1920 the first rodeo was held in Lakeside. Organized by resident Bill

Kuhner, it was held on the property of Emil Klicka, just south of Lindo Lake in a makeshift arena. For several years there was no rodeo, but it returned to Lakeside in 1933, when the Lakeside Rodeo Association was formed. The rodeo was moved to an area west of what is now Channel Road, where the organizers built a grandstand, chutes and

fences within the days prior to the event, then had to take it all down after the event... only to put it back up for the next rodeo. The Rodeo was held infrequently throughout the next several years, moving to several locations.

In the mid 1960's a group of parents were trying to organize fundraisers to build a lighted football stadium for the El Capitan High School. Parents, teachers and school officials included Arthur Sattler, Donald Foster, M.R. Murry Jr., Russell Savage, John Barrons, Reg Kuhner, Tom La Madrid Sr., Lee Bowen, John Burns, Roy Crane, Anna Curley, Paul Clay, Tom and Jody Hostetler, Charles Perkins along with many others whose names have been lost, or forgotten, yet their legacy lives on. The parents of students attending, or about to enter the high school, wanted to make sure that the school provided the same level of services as the other schools within the growing district and, with the district

building another high school at that time, money was just not available to provide sports facilities for the students of El Capitan. The totally volunteer group, organizing themselves under the title of "El Capitan Stadium Association", eventually met with a long time resident cowboy of Lakeside, Mr. Ben Bruton, and he suggested once again putting on a rodeo for a fundraiser.

The first rodeo for the newly formed Stadium Association was held in the spring of 1964. There were no rodeo grounds, so Ben found temporary seating, chutes as well as fencing and put on a rodeo in a vacant field much like it was done in the past. The event was successful enough that the Stadium Association decided that they could do this every year as long as they had a place to hold the event. In 1966 the El Capitan Stadium Association was formally incorporated as a "not for profit" organization.

In December of 1969, Mrs. Marion Carlson approached the organization and gifted eight acres of vacant land, the current site of the Rodeo facil-

ity, to the group for fundraising and to hold the Rodeo.

Through the years, although members (volunteers) left and new members (volunteers) joined, the group remained focused and completed the building of the football field, lighting, bleachers and concession stands for the High School. Along with the school improvements, the group started working on building the Lakeside Rodeo Arena as a permanent fixture in the community. During that time, the Stadium Association began the annual leasing of a portion of the rodeo land to the Grossmont Union School District to allow El Capitan High School to build and maintain an Agricultural Department. Through the Association, that lease today fosters the ability of students to continue to learn all facets of agriculture, animal care and leadership skills.

The 1980's were busy for the Stadium Association. The Eastern San Diego County Junior Fair had been held for decades at Gillespie Field, but was asked to relocate. The Fair Board and The Stadium Association got together and

went to the Grossmont Union School District, where they asked to lease a piece of land directly behind the now existing Rodeo Grounds next to the track. That lease was fully granted to the Stadium Association and then the Association sub-let to the Fair Board for the "Jr. Fair" to be held on-site each year.

In the late 1980's the El Capitan Stadium Association felt that the high school was not the only entity in the community that needed their help. The Association changed their Constitution to benefit the "Youth of Lakeside". To date, there is probably not a Youth organization within Lakeside's boundaries that has not enjoyed a substantial financial support from the Association. Youth sports has acquired improvements to their individual fields and outfitting in uniforms of their teams. The members assisted the Eastern San Diego County Jr. Fair in building their current facility and each year we continue to financially participate in the Fair auction to help the FFA and 4-H participants sell their individual projects. The ECSA provides annual scholarships

to graduating seniors and encouragement scholarships to eighth grade students to keep them focused on completing their education. Special needs summer programs are funded as are playgrounds at schools, gardens grown by students and desperately needed text books the District cannot afford. Reading Is Fundamental book giveaway, journalism classes, auto mechanics, drafting, computers and fiber networks along with printers, Breakfast with Santa, Boy Scouts, student leadership and countless other needs are met by the Association.

Obviously, the number of requests each year by educators and coaches has increased as the community has grown and State as well as Federal funding has dwindled. In an average year the El Capitan Stadium Association donates in excess of \$120,000.00 as well as services to the Youth of Lakeside.

The original goal was to build a football stadium for the high school... since then The El Capitan Stadium Association, which remains a totally volunteer group, has built a

community of support in which we strive daily to continue to be a good neighbor as well as a benefactor to the Youth.

Thank you for joining us in this endeavor... Your purchase of tickets and the money spent at the snack bars enables the Association to continue to do what the founding parents and community leaders set out to

do; to be a proactive community focused on helping the "Youth of Lakeside" to receive the advantages of a good education, the encouragement of Youth social organizations and a well rounded future without the constraints of government financial hardship.

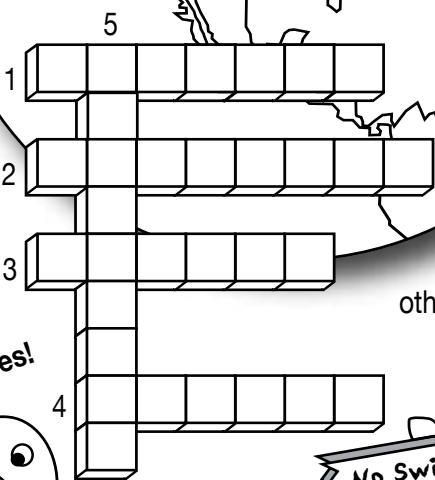
