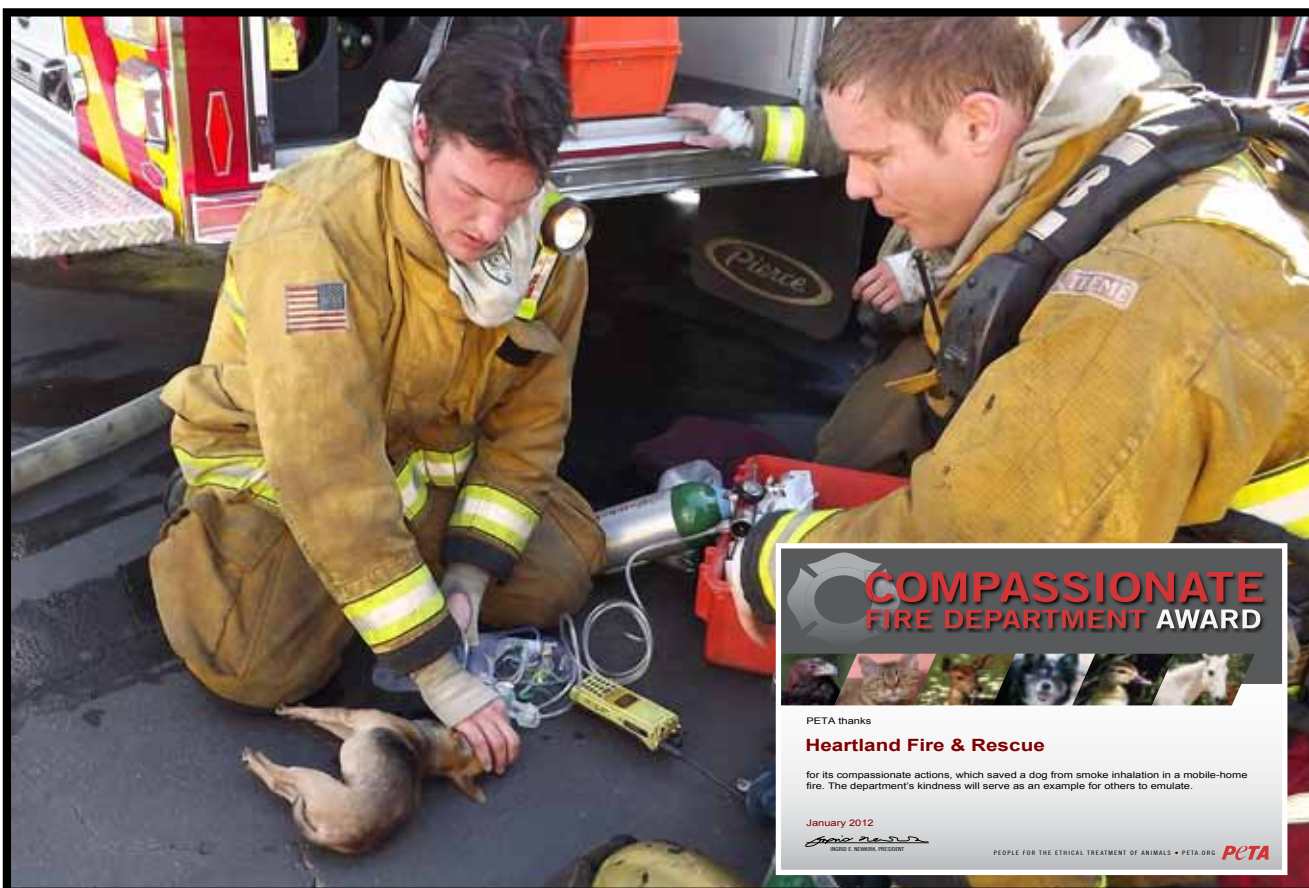

Woman gets her 'Mojo' back after heroic actions by local firefighters

California's new employment laws for 2012

Just when you thought that the State Legislature of California might back off on their oppressive over-regulation of employers in our state, a list of new employment laws that have just taken effect has come to light.

These laws have just gone

into effect, and will certainly have an impact on businesses in California. This listing is just those pieces of legislation that impact the relationship between employers and employees.

In addition to the new employment laws, an order by the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) is also impacting businesses in California. By January 31st, most private-

sector employers must begin displaying an 11"x17" poster that provides information to their employees about unionizing and their right to strike. Copies of this required poster set are available at the Chamber offices again this year at a reduced rate of \$25 plus state sales tax. See...they even get you when you are complying with their laws!

The long list of new laws that

took effect this week covers most of the elements of employment practices. In my next couple of columns, I will go into more depth on the details and impacts of the continuing legislative and regulatory impacts.

Some of the highlights related to the employing process include:

- The prohibition of using credit checks to research job applicants

- Requirements for pregnancy disability leave benefits for any employer of five or more employees

- Fines for "willful misclassification" of independent contractors

- Requirements for written commission pay arrangements (okay...this one is actually a good idea) effective in 2013

- Pay disclosures for non-exempt employees

- A more specific one year organ and bone marrow donor leave

- Prohibition of employment discrimination on the basis of genetic information

- Prohibition of employment discrimination based on gender and apparel expression

- Allowing of the use of e-verify for private employers but not state and local governments

- Restrictions on input on Family Leave

- Huge increases in administrative penalties related to any complaint on minimum wage violations, as well as a four-fold increase on the maximum employer penalties on prevailing wage disputes

- Farm labor contractor and agriculture labor relations noticing and bargaining process changes

- Requiring non-discriminatory insurance benefits for same-sex couples

- Prohibition of state contracts over \$100,000 to be entered into with companies that discriminate related to gender nor sexual orientation issues

- Closing of the loophole on practices of companies who do business in multiple states

The State's heavy hand also includes new restrictions and requirements related to:

- Apprentice Programs
- Safe lifting and handling of patients in hospitals

In addition, the Governor has signed six new pieces of State Workers' Compensation legislation that include:

AB 335 - Requires the workers' compensation administrative director to work with the Commission on Health and Safety and Workers' Compensation to develop regulations regarding notices to injured workers

AB 378 - establishing guidelines for dispensing compound drugs, the circumstances under which those drugs would be covered and the reimbursement amount

AB 397 - addressing the underground economy problem by singling out contractors that do not have workers' compensation coverage

AB 1168 - establishing a fee schedule for vocational experts' services.

AB 1426 - which streamlines the workers' comp process

AB 228 - providing workers' compensation coverage for California employees temporarily work outside the state.

There is a lot there. The East County Chamber has addressed many of these bills and will continue to be vigilant throughout the coming legislative session.

It's an election year. We will hear a lot from candidates, parties, news sources and more. Rest assured that our collective advocacy means something, and it will be hard for a legislator to ignore the collective voice of over 800 member companies and their roughly 10,000 local employees.

We are very grateful for the support of our community, and what it has meant to the tremendous growth we have experienced over the past 12 months. 2012 will be a banner year for this Chamber, as we are in the midst of our celebration of 100 years serving the community. Join us!

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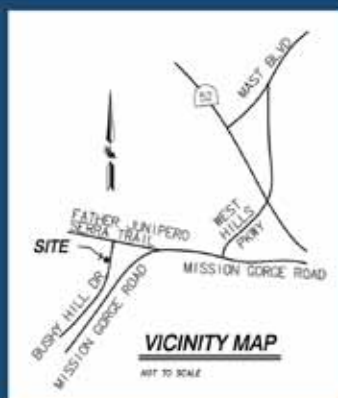


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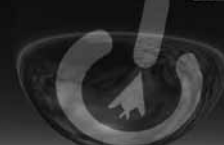

The City of El Cajon is accepting applications for one vacancy on the Personnel Commission. Among their duties, the Personnel Commission hears employee appeals and alleged violations of personnel rules or matters involving alleged discrimination and certifies its findings to City Council. The Commission reviews classification specifications and investigates and makes recommendations on personnel policy. The City Council will make an appointment to

the Commission from a list of three applicants nominated by the four seated members of the Personnel Commission. The three applicants selected for nomination will be notified of the date and time of the City Council meeting and the Personnel Commission meeting. The appointed Commissioner will serve a four (4) year term. Requirements: Applicants must be a resident of the City for not less than one year prior to appointment and continue to reside in the City during the term of office. Personnel Commissioners are required to comply with ethics training requirements and file a Statement of Economic Interests Form 700 according to provisions of the Political Reform Act, the Fair Political Practices Commission, and the City's Conflict of Interest Code. The Council shall make one appointment from a list of three persons nominated by the four appointed Personnel Commission members, except when an incumbent is to be re-nominated in which case one name may be submitted. Continuing Education classes offer community a wealth of learning opportunities

From growing wine grapes to solar panel installation training, there's still time to register for a rich selection of spring courses offered to the public by the Grossmont-Cuyamaca Community College District's Continuing Education program.

These noncredit, ungraded classes offer affordable opportunities to pick up or update job skills or to learn about topics that have always piqued your interest. Classes are held at Cuyamaca or Grossmont colleges and at various locations throughout East County.

Topics for the classes range from complying with workplace safety regulations and better serving business customers to lighter topics such as learning about growing wine grapes. A sampling of the classes includes:

- A beginning and advanced course for attorneys, paralegals, legal assistants or anyone interested in the legal profession offering hands-on training with TrialDirector, trial presentation software that assists in organizing exhibits and depositions, preparing cases for trial, and enhancing case presentations. The beginning course is offered from 10 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Saturday, Jan. 14, with an advanced course offered at the same time the following Saturday. Both courses offer four hours each of continuing legal education credit through the Foothills Bar Association.

- A Business Solutions Academy, a series of classes co-sponsored by the college district and the San Diego East County Chamber of Commerce, is designed to teach East County business owners how to better serve their customers and improve

their company image. Classes will be held Wednesday, Jan. 18, and Wednesday, Jan. 25, from 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. at the chamber offices, 201 S. Magnolia Ave. in El Cajon.

- Classes for businesses requiring compliance with federal and state Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) regulations, as well as federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations. They include a 40-hour course on hazardous waste management, emergency responses, and site cleanup. The Hazardous Waste Operator and Emergency Response (Hazwoper) course is offered Mondays through Fridays or Fridays and Saturdays starting Feb. 6. An eight-hour Hazwoper refresher course is also available for businesses seeking to maintain their annual OSHA certificates.

- An introductory class in solar photovoltaic installation – electricity-producing rooftop panels for residential or commercial buildings – combines academic and hands-on experience for a career in the solar electric PV industry. Beginning with the fundamentals of photovoltaics, solar radiation, site surveys, and system components, the student will learn the foundation and terms used in the field. The classes meet from noon to 5 p.m. Tuesdays and Thursday March 6-April 26.

- On a lighter note, a course on the basics of growing wine grapes is offered from 6 to 9 p.m. Mondays from Jan. 23-March 12, covering grape varieties, parts of the vine, rootstock, climate, geology, the seasonal cycle from bloom to winter dormancy, trellising and pruning, and vineyard practices for high-quality grapes.

- If your thirst for wine wisdom remains unquenched, a course on the wines of the world is offered 6-9 p.m. Wednesday, Jan. 23-March 12. Learn about the different wines and regions of France, Italy, Spain and more, and what the U.S. label law entails. Impress fellow diners the next time you chat with your waiter about a great cabernet or pinot noir from 12 different California regions and the Willamette Valley in Oregon.

On December 27 my assistant heard the terrible news that her 17-year-old niece died tragically in a car accident in Colorado Springs, Colorado. Another niece 6-years-old was also in the car and life-flighted to the Intensive Care Unit at the hospital. My Assistant has worked with me for more than 20 years; and her family is family to me. There was no question that I would accompany her to the funeral and be available to minister and help in any way I could.

This was a tragedy of devastating proportion, not only for the family but also for the high school, friends and entire city. After nine days, two memorial services and visitations at the hospital, we experienced the brokenness of mourning, the shock of a young life ending abruptly and the urgency for healing and recovery for the surviving little girl. I also saw the peace of God and a comfort from the Lord flood the atmosphere otherwise overtaken by sadness, ruin and death. As I have experienced this before, I wanted to write a message to declare there is hope and comfort during the trials of life.

I watch the local news and hear awful stories like this, which tear families apart and pierce the hearts of mothers and fathers with unbearable pain. I am burdened more than ever before to pray. If you have experienced any of the storms of life and need help to find peace and comfort, I want to share a few scriptures. *2 Corinthians 1:3-4*, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort those who are in any trouble, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God." *Isaiah 26:3*, "You will keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on You, because he trusts in You."

I also want to let everyone know they are more than welcome to come to Prayer Mountain and spend time with the Lord. It is a peaceful setting to get alone with God. He is only a prayer away. You can come for an overnight stay or day visit. We also have Morning Prayer, Monday - Friday from 5 a.m. - 9 a.m. I always say, "When you are hardest hit, you must not quit!" Jesus loves you and so do I.

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For Health's Sake

California Medical Association Foundation urges women to take charge of their health

California Medical Association (CMA) Foundation joins forces with other health advocates across the nation to promote "Cervical Health Awareness Month." The CMA Foundation is part of the national Cervical Cancer-Free Campaign, engaged in efforts to increase screening and vaccination and reduce the occurrence of this preventable disease.

Cervical cancer is the second most common form of cancer worldwide and causes 4,000 deaths in the United States yearly. According to the American Cancer Society's California Cancer Facts & Figures 2012 report, it is expected that Cali-

fornia will have 1,455 new cases of cervical cancer in 2012, and 435 deaths from the disease.

In California, Latinas have the highest risk of developing cervical cancer – about one and half times higher than non-Latina white women, African American and Asian/Pacific Islander women – due in large part to a lack of screenings and vaccinations.

Because of this prevalence, the CMA Foundation recognized four organizations for their outstanding work to reduce cervical cancer disparities within California's Latina community and provided them with additional funding to expand on

their work. The four awardees include: Altamed Health Services, Latinas Contra Cancer, UMMA Community Clinic and Worksite Wellness LA. During the month of January, these award winners, in partnership with the CMA Foundation, are hosting events and clinics for early cervical cancer detection and vaccines

Cervical cancer is one of the few preventable cancers that can easily be detected through an inexpensive screening and prevented through vaccination. Studies show the vaccine has the potential to prevent up to 70 percent of cervical cancer cases and deaths in California annually.

"Cervical Health Awareness Month is the perfect opportunity to remind women that screenings and vaccines are widely available often at no or low-cost. Early detection can save lives," states Carol Lee, Esq., president and CEO of the CMA Foundation.

Most cases of cervical cancer are caused by the Human Papillomavirus, or HPV. Millions of American women are infected with HPV, but due to its often symptomless nature, a woman can be unaware of

her risk of developing cervical cancer.

Assistant Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the USC Keck School of Medicine and CMA Foundation Board Member, Diana Ramos, MD, MPH, states, "Cervical cancer is one of a few preventable diseases, so it is imperative that women schedule their recommended appointment for a pap test and also schedule appointments for their adolescents to receive the series of HPV vaccine shots. No woman should ever die from this easily preventable disease."

To see if you qualify for free breast and cervical cancer screening, call "Every Woman Counts" at 1-800-511-2300 Monday - Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Operators speak English, Spanish, Mandarin, Cantonese, Korean, and Vietnamese. If you qualify, you will be referred to participating doctors in your neighborhood.

To see if your child qualifies for a free HPV Vaccine, ask their doctor if they offer "Vaccines for Children" (VFC) shots. Children eligible for California's Child Health and Disability Prevention (CHDP) program may also be eligible for free or low-cost shots.

Improved services for student health clinics at East County colleges to be funded by fee increase

Student health clinics at Grossmont and Cuyamaca colleges will be able to offer longer hours, better staffing and more wellness education as the result of a \$4 per semester fee increase beginning in fall 2012.

Students at the two East County community colleges will begin paying a student fee of \$18 per semester, or \$15 during the summer session, under the new fee structure approved Dec. 13 by the Grossmont-Cuyamaca Community College District board.

Students in the Grossmont-Cuyamaca district have been paying less for student health fees than any other community college in San Diego County. Grossmont and Cuyamaca college students now pay \$14 per semester and \$11 in the summer, compared to \$17 per semester and \$14 during the summer at all other community colleges in the county. The other colleges will also be increasing their fees to \$18 per semester (and \$15 during the summer) beginning next fall.

The most financially needy students who receive public assistance will not be required to pay the student health fee, but students determined to be low-income but not eligible for public assistance will no longer have their health fees waived.

In a presentation to the Governing Board, Cuyamaca College President Mark J. Zacovic and Grossmont College President Sunita V. Cooke said revenues for the student health centers have dropped in the past two years because of decreased enrollment and more low-income students. In the 2010-11 school year, about \$165,000 in general funds had to be used to pay for health center costs not covered by the student fees. With less money available, the district was forced to reduce services at a time when more students are unemployed and have no other health care options.

With the additional funding, the health centers will have additional staffing, expanded clinic hours, and will be able to provide more diagnostic tests, screening and lab tests.

The centers will also offer more education about stopping smoking, weight control and alcohol abuse. Additional crisis counseling will be offered, an important service to deal with the stresses of the unemployed and returning veterans.

"Our health centers provide a vital role on our campuses, especially for many of our students who have no health insurance," said Bill Garrett, president of the Grossmont-Cuyamaca Community College District board. "These fees will allow us to provide the kind of basic health services that our students deserve."

'CATS' - the longest continuously touring show in American theatre history is here

C*CATS*, the show that revolutionized musical theatre is coming to San Diego Civic Theatre for eight performances, January 10 – 15, 2012; as a Broadway/San Diego ~ A Nederlander Presentation. Produced by CATS-Eye, LLC, the national tour of *CATS* is the only production in North America sanctioned by Andrew Lloyd Webber. With original direction by Trevor Nunn and choreography by Gillian Lynne this is the *CATS* credited with the British invasion of Broadway. The national tour of *CATS* is closing in on its 30th anniversary, holding its place as the longest continuously touring Broadway musical in history.

Based on T.S. Eliot's *Old Possum's Book of Practical Cats*, and with music by Andrew Lloyd Webber, *CATS* won seven 1983 Tony Awards

including Best Musical, Best Book of a Musical, Best Lighting and Best Costumes.

New for the 2011-2012 touring production of *CATS* will be the reintroduction of twin cats "Coricopat" (male) and "Tantomile" (female). These two cats were last seen in the Broadway production and the original 1st national tour. The twins are psychic and therefore are an integral part of the action, providing focus to the story as they indicate to the audience and the other cats what is next to come on stage. They move in perfect unison, with synchronized choreography and speech, and have identical costumes and make-up plots.

CATS opened May 11, 1981 at the New London Theatre in the West End. Eight years later it celebrated its first important milestone: after 3,358 performances *CATS* became the longest

running musical in the history of British theatre. The show opened on Broadway October 7, 1982 at the Winter Garden Theatre in New York City and continued to live up to its motto "Now and Forever." On June 19, 1997, *CATS* became the longest running musical on Broadway. It ended its 18 year run on September 10, 2000 with 7,485 performances. That record was broken by *The Phantom of the Opera* on January 9, 2006 when *Phantom* celebrated its 7,486th curtain.

In October of 1991 *CATS* became the longest continuously touring show in American theatre history. Five continents, 26 countries, over eight and a half million audience members and almost 30 years later, *CATS* is still America's most loved family musical. Celebrating not only its Broadway touring legacy but the birth of the musical spectacular, *CATS* is still revolutionary and awe inspiring. Now that it has been seen by millions of audience members worldwide, it is time to celebrate

with the whole family the magic, the mystery, the wonder of *CATS*. Create a special 'memory' one more time.

Streep likely to get Oscar-nomination for 'The Iron Lady'

The *Iron Lady* shows us one of the most divisive women of the 20th century. She served for almost 12 years as England's Prime Minister, and there were an equal number of supporters as those who loathed her.

Tackling the part of Margaret Thatcher in *The Iron Lady*, was challenging indeed for Meryl Streep. She not only played the strong British politician as a woman during her prime, but she also captured Thatcher as an old woman suffering from Alzheimer's disease.

Director Phyllida Lloyd (*Mama Mia!*) took an even-handed style at this film which satisfies neither lovers of Thatcher nor her detractors. Lloyd preferred a soft touch approach to her subject. But Lloyd had to show Thatcher as both a bully of monstrous proportions and a world-class leader. Streep, of course, is magnificent in showing both sides of the lady with equal ease. Squabbles with the House of Commons? She's vicious and wants – and gets – her way.

With the use of flash backs and flash forwards, Lloyd shows Thatcher during her dotage in her 80s when she is suffering from the loss of her faculties. She dotes on her husband (Jim Broadbent)

and makes him breakfast, even though he passed away more than a decade before. The scenes with Broadbent turn Thatcher into a real human being with frailties and a heart.

Streep, in her old age make-up, is touching, and brings more than a tear to one's eyes. She doesn't simply don a wig and put on a fake nose to become her character. She actually becomes them with voice inflections, bodily movements, ticks, warts, and all, and makes the audience think she is actually the character.

Some will enjoy a little "fire and music" (a tip of the hat to Bette Davis in *All About Eve*) in the film when the great lady uproots the British Empire with her astounding policies that knocks the stuffing out of everything the

Brits held dear. She attacked the unions, financial deregulations, public spending and any manner of money squandering to upset the rest of the government. Streep handles the task well as Thatcher steps up to the job and shows her own "fire and music" when going up against all the other politicians who are against her.

Streep, who is definitely the Bette Davis of the 21st Century, has a knack for playing strong women (*The Devil Wears Prada*) and women of character. She can pick up an accent easily and can speak like a native of Australia, England, Denmark, Italy, Poland and points between. She has been awarded with the Oscar twice, but nominated about 16 times. Streep was most recently honored with the

lifetime achievement from the Kennedy Center Awards this past December.

As often happens, Streep's performance is better than the movie. There is a more delicate approach to the subject taken by director Lloyd than perhaps the subject matter deserves. It

could have been more hard-hitting considering the lead character and the events that affected much of the world. The film is definitely one of the better-made films of the season and should rank high with audiences. Is there perhaps another Oscar-nomination in the cards for Streep?

'Joyful Noise' rocks with good music and iconic stars

Can anyone imagine a real food fight between Dolly Parton and Queen Latifah? That's just one of the scenes in *Joyful Noise*. It's a family-style dramedy about a choir that wants to win a gospel music competition so bad they're willing to bend their criteria and ride on a bus more than 2000 miles.

Vi Rose (Latifah) and G.G.

Sparrow sing in the same church choir in Georgia. When Bernard (Kris Kristofferson) the choir director, passes away, Pastor Dale (Courtney B. Vance) chooses Vi Rose to be the choir director. This does not set well with G. G. The director was her husband and she assisted in arranging the music, but even more important, she's the biggest financial giver to the church. However, Pastor Dale stands by his first choice.

Rehearsals continue but the woman's relationships are strained. That friendship is challenged even more when G. G.'s troubled grandson Randy (Jeremy Jordan) returns to town. He has some musical skills which the choir likes; their status-quo gospel tunes have become too monotonous for them. This annoys Vi Rose but not as much as his attention to her teen-aged daughter Olivia (Keke Palmer).

Randy and Olivia are soon dating behind Vi Rose's back. She resents him but does see some good in him like when he takes time to help her Asperger's son Walter (Dexter Darden) who has a meltdown. Randy befriends Walter, helps him learn to play the piano and just have fun.

Vi Rose is also stressed that her husband Marcus (Jessie L. Martin) re-joined the Armed Forces and is off to deployment. She believes he just wanted out of the marriage and dealing with the resentment by her children is more than she can handle. Her meanness soon becomes a problem for her

friends and choir members. It's just the opposite with G. G. who guides Randy with sweet grandmotherly advice and keeps the choir moving forward.

The joy in this film, written and directed by Todd Graff (*Bandstand*), is the music and watching Parton and Latifah work out their differences. The choir enters a national competition, but because of their lackluster performance they miss the top prize. When the first place team is found disqualified, they get another chance. This time Vi Rose listens to her choir and allows Randy to join and update their music choices.

Performances are key here. Latifah does what she does best – stand her ground – and sing. Parton is pretty much true to her personality as well – joyous, steadfast and mighty strong for a little spitfire.

Jordan (TV's *Law & Order*), Palmer (*Medea Goes To Jail*) and Darden (*Standing Ovation*) are equally impressive as well. Jordan makes his film debut here but is an actor to watch. He can sing, act and has lots of charisma. Palmer was excellent in taking her character through the different emotions of teen-bliss and teen-angst. The five-minute appearance of Kristofferson did nothing to show any talent and really was more disappointment than proposed.

Joyful Noise is a great film for families and anyone who likes music and family ups and downs.
