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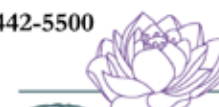

Alpine Boy Scout earns highest rank in scouting

Boy Scout Troop 105 and a local Alpine family had something to celebrate on January 3 when Scout Nathan Drinkwater attained the rank of Eagle Scout, the highest rank in Scouting. The requirement to obtain this honor includes: Be active in your troop, team, crew, or ship for a period of at least six months after you have achieved the rank of Life Scout; Demonstrate that you live by the principles of the Scout Oath and Law in your daily life; List the names of individuals who know you

personally and would be willing to provide a recommendation on your behalf, including parents/guardians, religious, educational, and employer references; and earn a total of 21 merit badges that each have their own requirements.

"Part of the requirement also includes planning and completing a service project that demonstrates leadership," said Ed Thibault, Scout Master of Troop 105. "It's very rewarding to see they understand the program and take something away they can

use the rest of their life. Also that boys hold the values the scout law teaches them which includes a lot of hard work on their part. Only about five percent of all boys obtain Eagle Scout status."

Drinkwater's project – coordinated by Kiwanis member Richard Rabell – was to plan and build a second Kiwanian Memorial Wall at the gazebo at the Alpine Woman's Club.

"Nathan was going to do some landscaping at the Woman's Club, but I suggested he build a new memorial, which the Kiwanis needed," Rabell said. "That way he would have something that lasted longer and he could really be proud of. Nathan did a great job, and it was an honor for me to work with such a fine Scout on behalf of the Kiwanis and the Woman's Club."

Drinkwater has been in scouts for 11 years and worked hard to meet all of the requirements. The goal of the Boy Scouts of America is to help boys develop into honorable men. Scouting's value can be incorporated into a boy's home, school, and religious community, adding to all three and, in some cases, filling in where family, school, or

religious support is lacking. Scouts have many opportunities to learn skills of leadership, of the outdoors, and of life. Every Scouting activity moves boys towards three basic aims: Character development, Citizenship training and Mental and physical fitness.

At one point Drinkwater almost thought the requirements for Eagle Scout were too difficult. "Scouts helped teach me valuable lessons that molded me to have better morals, become selfless and a helpful member in society," Drinkwater said. "I always wanted to earn the rank of Eagle Scout but doubted I could do the amount of work it required. But little by little and with the help and support of my parents and scout leaders I made it. I could not have done it without them, and I'm very proud to be an Eagle Scout."

Drinkwater is now attending Grossmont College and hopes to become a civil engineer. His Scout Court of Honor will be February 26 where friends and family will gather to see a local dignitary present him with his official honor.

San Diego Rotary 21st Annual Salute to Local Heroes Luncheon

The San Diego Rotary Club sponsors an annual luncheon dedicated to honoring citizens in the community who have gone above and beyond to assist law enforcement. This year, the El Cajon Police Department was given the opportunity to include one of our own citizens as an honoree. El Cajon Police Chief Jim Redman selected "Dave Lembcke."

On August 21, 2011, officers from the El Cajon Police Department responded to a call of a male walking toward a house on Prince Street waving a gun. Officer Jarred Slocum and his trainee Officer Tim McFarland were the first to arrive on scene.

What the officers did not know at the time was that just before they had arrived on scene, the male, Kevin Collier had already shot and killed his 14 month old daughter and then shot and killed his mother in law. He was now inside the house armed with several guns. As the officers were taking up positions of cover outside, Kevin Collier began shooting at the officers. Officer Slocum was struck in the head by one of the rounds. Disoriented, Officer Slocum stumbled into the open directly into the line of fire and fell to the ground. Officer McFarland went to Officer Slocum's aid and began dragging his partner out of the line of fire. Two citizens, who witnessed the shooting, risked their own lives by stepping into the line of fire to help Officer McFarland drag Officer Slocum to safety. One of these citizens, Dave Lembcke then stood by and comforted Officer Slocum until Sgt. Rich Gonsalves was able to coordinate an officer rescue. This is a great example of citizens getting involved and making a difference.

Grossmont High School breaks ground on largest classroom project in the Proposition U construction program

Grossmont High School and Grossmont Union High School District (GUHSD) broke ground at the construction site of the new humanities building at Grossmont High School on Wednesday, Jan. 11. The two-story, 35,000-square-foot building is the largest classroom project in the Proposition U construction program and will add 31 classrooms, replacing eight 1920s-era condemned classrooms and outdated relocatable classrooms. With an easily accessible entryway for students, the humanities

building will provide additional learning space for English, social science, math and special education classes. Additional work includes construction of an auto shop, tennis courts and related site improvements.

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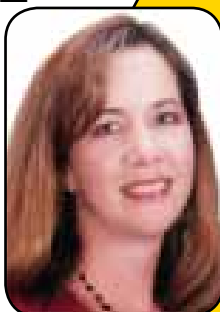
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Inspiration

Horn nails his role in 'Extremely Loud & Incredibly Close'

Ten years after 9/11, director Stephen Daldry and screenwriter Eric Roth tackle a story focused on the events of that tragic date. Their film, *Extremely Loud & Incredibly Close*, deals with how one family is still trying to come to grips with their loss. It's based on Jonathan Safran Foer's post-9/11 novel.

Eleven-year-old Oskar Schell (Thomas Horn) is left to deal with his father's death in the Twin Towers. Although Thomas (Tom Hanks) did not work there, he was attending a meeting in the Towers on 9/11. While his wife Linda (Sandra Bullock) grieves in her own way, it's Oskar, a youngster with high intelligence but eccentric and obsessive behaviors – a form of Asperger's – that she worries about.

As shown in flashbacks, Thomas was especially dedicated to Oskar, making fun time also a learning curve as they played word games and had scavenger hunts. Along with his memories – and unbeknownst to his mother – Oskar also has hidden the last six voice messages his dad left when he called from the Twin Towers while obviously aware he wasn't going to get out.

Somewhat of an amateur inventor, Oskar loves to explore new things. So he's excited when he finds a mysterious key belonging to his dad that bears the name Black on the back. It's a challenge for him, and he can't imagine what the key will reveal, but he's excited to find out. Gathering maps, plotting some key landmarks, and armed with a list of people in New York's five boroughs who might have known his dad and what the key unlocks, Oskar sets out on the adventure. Linda is hesitant about her son's plans, but knowing how much he needs to be proactive in his healing, allows him this freedom.

Oskar's journey is extensive and adventurous, especially since he fears subways, swings, and elevators – but he meets a host of interesting people, some who slam the door in his face. In his own building he meets his grandmother's (Zoe Cadwell) new renter (Max von Sydow), a man he eventually convinces to accompany him on a day trip. Other encounters include: Stan (John Goodman), their doorman; Abby Black (Viola Davis), a new divorcee; a deli worker (Julian Tepper) and a prayer woman (Bernadette Drayton).

While the movie tends to be a little long with some redundant elements, young Thomas Horn is amazing. With only a TV appearance as a contestant on *Jeopardy* and a role in TV's *Made in Hollywood* to his credit, Horn steals this poignant movie. He projects pure emotions of loss, sadness and determination during every moment he's on screen.

"It didn't take long before everyone in the crew began to feel that we weren't dealing with a child actor," Daldry said. "He was just our leading man and he proved to be extraordinary."

Daldry is no stranger to finding heartfelt stories – *Billy Elliot*, *The Reader*, *The Hours* – and casting sensational actors such as Jamie Bell in *Billy Elliot*.

Hanks is only in the film in flashbacks but seals his character thoroughly. Bullock could have phoned in her small role. Alexandre Desplat's (*Harry*

Potter and the Deathly Hallows: Part 2) moving musical score beefs up the sadness in this film, however, there are a few visuals

shown about 9/11 that may be grim for some to watch. Still, the story is an important and touching reminder that so many

are still dealing with their loss, and to miss the performance of Thomas Horn would be unfortunate.

'Contraband' offers nothing new — save your money

Contraband has a lot going for it action wise but other than that it's disappointing. Even the star power of Mark Wahlberg, Ben Foster and Kate Beckinsale can't push this crime drama past mediocre due to a script that doesn't know what it wants to be and has no redeemable characters.

Chris Farraday (Mark Wahlberg) has finally turned his back on his life of crime. That's not been easy since his own dad is in jail and other family

members are still in the drug trade, but Chris now has his wife Kate (Beckinsale) and two boys to protect, and he'll go the distance to do that.

His walk on the straight side is short, however, when Kate's brother, Andy (Caleb Landry Jones), fouls up a drug deal he's involved in and Tim (Giovanni Ribisi), his boss wants the cash Andy lost returned immediately. For the young and inexperienced Andy this is a life and death matter but one only Chris can possibly make right.

Chris tries to reason with Tim but the drug dealer only threatens Chris' family as well. Chris has no choice but to make a drug run on a freighter to Panama. Before he gathers his crew Chris consults with his friend Sebastian (Ben Foster) who will stay behind, handle Tim and keep an eye on Kate and the boys.

Every scenario that follows next can be seen in any crime show on TV. Chris first experiences problems in Panama with the counterfeiter (Diego Luna), because Andy has once again disobeyed orders and run off with the cash for the counterfeit money. Once Chris and his team square that deal they have to get the contraband of money and

drugs back on the ship, but the dog-nosed-sharp Captain (J.K. Simmons) is already suspicious and ready to spoil their plans.

There are a few twists that pop but the typical drug wars, violence and blood shed put a damper on any enjoyment of this film. Some of the actions have no reactions, many of the antics shown are not plausible and the characters – especially Kate and Sebastian – are written more for shock value rather than reality. *Contraband*, directed by Baltasar Kormakur and written by Arnaldur Indridason and Oskar Jonasson, is filmed mostly in dark times, which makes the viewer have to work in some scenes to figure out what's going on.

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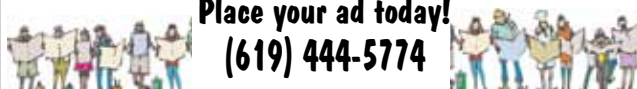
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


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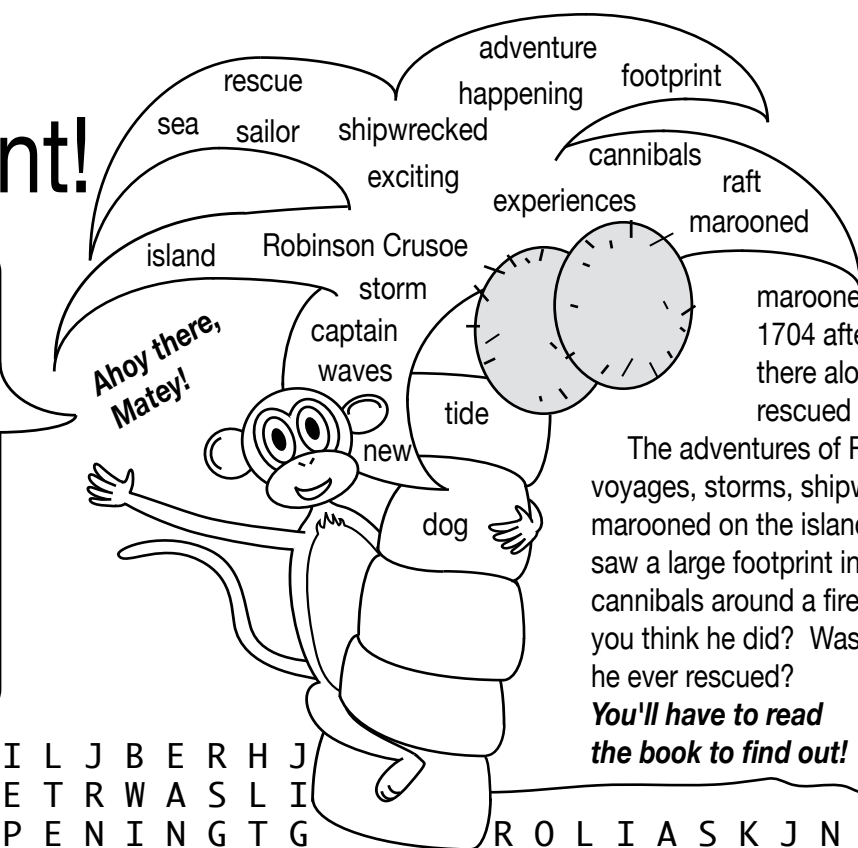
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Adventures and Excitement!

That the Court find that the decedent died intestate as to all properties not otherwise identified to the Will;
