The Hall family arrived in San Diego in 1886, and not finding it to their liking, moved to El Cajon, where Jesse Phillip Rexford Hall and his wife Charlotte purchased 60 acres for wheat, fruit trees, and a vineyard in the east end of the Valley. Later, their eldest son, Wilson Dana Hall, added 40 acres to the south for wheat. JPR, and son WD, built this redwood home in about 1896, after WD had been working

on the Hotel Del Coronado. Visit this beautiful home during the Historic Home Tour on Saturday, May 4, from 1 to 4 p.m. Don't miss this rare opportunity to tour one of El Cajon's historic homes! Sharing a piece of history

Centennial Moment: J.P.R. house built in 1890s

Below is an excerpt from Bus and Auto Tour of Historical El Cajon by the El Cajon Historical Society. The excerpt describes the Historic JPR Hall Ranch House, which was the focal point of a 60-acre ranch with wheat, hay, an orchard and a vineyard planted by the parents and siblings of W.D. Hall.

Jesse Phillip Rexford and his wife Charlotte arrived in San Diego in 1886 and not finding the city to their liking, bought land in the east end of the El Cajon Valley. After working on the Hotel Del Coronado (now 125 years old), Wilson Dana Hall, eldest son, helped his father build the current home out of redwood. The family gave up the home in the 1930s and after various owners, remodeling in the 1940s, and sale of much of the land, the home is now surrounded by tract housing. The home was purchased in 1959 by former City Councilman and Mayor Albert Van Zanten and his wife June. It is now owned by their daughter Jonna Waite and her husband Ken

P.R. Hall house: In 1898 on what is now a cul de sac, settler J.P.R. Hall built this Victorian house for his wife and ten children.

For the previous 13 years they'd lived in a much smaller house on what was their 60 acre-ranch. The front of this notable house reveals highpitched, double-cross gables with double-sashed windows surrounded by narrow sideby-side boards on the bias. After building it, Hall joked that he had a 10-room house with 12 Halls in it. One of those children, W.D. Hall, grew up to own the popular hardware store and lumberyard where City Hall now stands. Privately owned, this home has been often used for fundraising luncheons benefitting the Society."



have two church services on the street Thursday and Saturdays at 12 noon, in the heart of San Diego, CA, and they have really touched my heart. I run across many who say, "I don't believe in God, or God loves me just the way I am."

Help for stuttering — complex disorder devastative for children and parents

arents eagerly anticipate the moment when their child first begins to talk. But for some parents, it is a time of anxiety because their child struggles to get words out. As many as five percent of preschool children nationwide have repetitions and prolongations of sounds severe enough to be of concern to their parents.

The DVD in English and Spanish, Stuttering and Your Child: Help for Parents, helps parents detect stuttering and take action toward helping their child and is available at most public libraries. Some libraries have an older video format

Produced by the nonprofit Stuttering Foundation, the film describes what kinds of stuttering young children may exhibit, how parents can help at home, and the role of a speech pathologist in evaluating and treating children who stutter.

"Stuttering typically begins between the ages of two and five," says Barry Guitar, Ph.D., professor and chair of Communication Sciences at the University of Vermont in Burlington . "It may begin gradually or suddenly, and many of these children outgrow their disfluencies naturally. However, if a child continues to stutter for several months, or appears to be frustrated by it, parents should seek assistance."

Guitar appears in the DVD with other nationally recognized experts in stuttering: Peter Ramig, Ph.D., of the University of Colorado at Boulder, Diane Hill, M.A., of Northwestern University, Patricia Zebrowski, Ph.D., of the University of Iowa, and Kristin Chmela, M.A., also of Northwestern University.

These experts address common concerns that parents have about their child, such as how to help the child at home and whether to seek the advice of a speech pathologist.

Strategies parents can use to help reduce stuttering are given throughout the DVD and include reducing the number of questions they ask the child, focusing on taking turns during conversations, and making time to read or talk with the child in a relaxed manner.

"Parents are relieved to discover that they are not alone and that other parents share their concerns," says speech pathologist Kristin Chmela.

"Stuttering remains a mystery to most people," notes Jane Fraser, president of the Stuttering Foundation. "Watching a young child struggle to speak can be devastating. This DVD is designed to reassure parents and families that many preschoolers stutter, that they can be helped, and

Tracy Lawrence's respect for country-music tradition has

made him one of his genre's cornerstone stylists. The Arkansas native burst on the scene with 1991's Platinum-selling Sticks and Stones. The album contained four massive radio hits, including its title tune. Alibis, issued in 1993, sold more than two million copies and spawned four consecutive No. 1 hits, "Alibis," "Can't Break it to My Heart," "My Second Home" and "If the Good Die Young."

Longing to feel something positive about his life Roberto daydreams about the trip he and Luisa were going to take when he got a job. That would be back to the hotel in Cartagena where he and Luisa celebrated their honeymoon.

When Roberto arrives he sees that the hotel is long gone and in its place is a huge museum that is still under construction. Yet another case

of bad luck is more than he can endure. Wanting to find just a little piece of any remembrance to happier times there, Roberto goes past the "do not enter" barriers and ends up dangling from a huge statue hanging off a crane. Moments later he slips and falls face up on barbwire framing with a piece of barbwire sticking into the back of his head.

Mota is a Spanish TV comedian and he brings a light heartedness to Roberto's plight. The many times that someone bounces the boards he's on and steps on him and he shutters and screams, is at once funny and breathholding.

Hayek doesn't have to do much to instill realism in her characters. She plays Luisa perky and sweet as the loving and encouraging wife at home; but on the accident scene she becomes a roaring lion, "My husband is not for sale!"

Their two children, Lorenzo (Eduardo Casanova) and Barbara (Nerea Camacho), make a brief appearance to their father's side with Lorenzo bringing some of his own comic relief in the way he looks and dresses which only angers Roberto even more.

Viewers of As Luck Would Have It will have different reactions to this scenario and ending of the film. Some will

here was so much testosterone in the air in the theater at a screening of G.I. Joe: Retaliation that the girl sitting next to me started growing a moustache. Mine fell off from an overdose. Whenever a Dwayne "The Rock" Johnson movie is released, you can bet there will be lots of muscle thrown around, sometimes just to stimulate the ladies.

However, Dwayne looks great but can't act too much because it will spoil his image, and is generally greatly likeable. We don't have to worry about his going bad because he is always the hero and never lets the audience forget. He can blast his way out of a difficult situation with ease, or squeeze the enemy to smithereens with his boa constrictor biceps. Johnson is a star.

The plot here is secondary to all the action sequences. The CGI staff worked overtime to create some stunning shots of men flying through the air in sky-high mountains surrounding an Asian aerie for the bad

guys. Explosions, sword fights, ju-jitsu, and good old American fisticuffs pummel the viewer every five seconds. Actions scenes are strung together with the flimsiest plot threads only to move on to yet another series of head-bopping, mouth-dropping "how-did-they-do-that?" scenes.

Director Jon M. Chu seemingly is a graduate of the old Hong Kong Kung Fu School of Filmmaking and a classmate of veteran Jackie Chan. Handsome young Asian star Lee Byung-hun returns as Storm Shadow to participate in the most unbelievably stunning karate chops and sword slashings ever put on screen. He is certainly enjoyable to watch. He is constantly in the air, spinning, whirling and gyrating at the speed of light. He doesn't like the bad guys.

There is nothing new here in the plot. The team of G.I. Joe's has been discredited by the President of the United States (Jonathan Pryce). They were framed by evil Zartan (Arnold Vosloo) for stealing nuclear warheads from Paki-

stan. Meanwhile, his team of no-goodniks is impersonating the real President with a Pryce look-alike. Naturally, in a plot device as old as the silent movies, the evil ones want to take over the world by confiscating all the nuclear bombs.

Current heart-throb Channing Tatum, completely dressed and void of any gyrations that shot him to stardom last year in *Magic Mike*, makes a pointless appearance in the film. He's there merely for name value. All the publicity about his part being beefed up certainly doesn't show as he comes in for what amounts to a large cameo. In case you're interested, his buns

look just as good in 3D as they did on a flat screen.

Young Joseph Gordon-Levitt did not return as Cobra Commander in this sequel and, as such, his was the best part not in the picture. Also not returning was Sienna Miller, and this happy circumstance greatly improved the movie.

Action fans will flock to this movie. Johnson is a great favorite, Tatum is catnip to the ladies, and young boys love explosions and plane crashes. With every scene an ear-splitting catastrophe or a kung fu extravaganza, what more could you ask?

Season over for Aztecs men's basketball

wo games into the NCAA tournament, San Diego State men's basketball post season came to an abrupt end at the Wells Fargo Arena losing to Florida Gulf Coast 81-71 in the South Regional in south Philadelphia.

Aztecs fans are puzzled after the stinging loss.to number 15 seeded Florida Gulf Coast. For the first time ever history books were re-written at the Aztecs expense by allowing a number 17 seed to reach the Sweet Sixteen. FGC was the bu far the much better team Sunday over number seven seeded SDSU.

Making their first appearance in the NCAA post season in only their second season in Division 1 basketball, the Eagles completely outplayed the Aztecs in the transition game fueled by their steals and turnovers, and by the bi-partisan crowd, many of whom cheered for this new Cinderella team. The Aztecs defense were no match for the 'run and gun offense' and the quick hands of the Eagle 'stealthe-ball' defense.

"They are as good of a running team as there is around. When they run they feed off the frenzy that they create," surmised SDSU head coach Steve Fisher.

After a one-point lead at halftime, San Diego State led 46-44 when their wheels came off. After getting three turnovers, the Eagles quickly turned those into six point, before going on a 17-0 scoring run, a period in which the Aztecs did not score a single point in over seven and a half minutes. Achilles heel also were seventeen Aztecs turnovers quickly converted into $22\,$ points by FGC.

Junior, Jamaal Franklin (who may be eyeing the NBA next season) led all Aztecs scorers with 20 points, collaring 11 rebounds. This gave him 26 for his career, 13 for the season.

Florida Gulf Coast shot a sizzling 56 percent from the field. Aztecs shot 44 percent, good enough to win most games, but not when committing 17 turnovers.

Hats off to Aztecs seniors Chase Tapley, De-Shaun Stephens, and James Rahon who played their last game for SDSU. These kids meant so much to the team. In his four years at SDSU Tapley has seen over 100 victories with his head coach

ment. We're really going to miss our seniors," said coach Fisher.
