

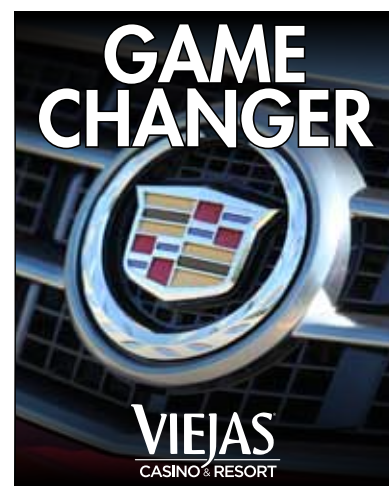

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El Cajon Centennial Moments

Sharing a piece of history

Centennial Moment: El Cajon's Hotel del Corona

Continuing the Centennial Moments, below is a brief chronological note on the American-European settlement of El Cajon Valley on San Diego County's inland frontier.

In 1886, a large and elegant hotel had a grand opening across Main Street from Knox's hotel. Owned by Mrs. Anna S. Knowles of San Diego, the new hotel was named the Hotel del Corona, and was so modern that there were screens on its windows. It had everything else, too: a sophisticated dining room, a grand saloon, barber shop, attractive and large meeting rooms and, of course, short and long-term rooms for rent. And on the rooftop was a sight-seeing gazebo from which visitors could view the entire valley - and where land salesmen could point out what was available for purchase.

By 1887, El Cajon could claim to be connected to San Diego by three telephone lines, and in 1889, both "The El Cajon Star"

and "Valley News" started publishing the community's first newspapers. In 1892 El Cajon Valley had about 600 inhabitants with land selling at \$25 to \$150 an acre. At the corner of Lexington and Jamacha Road, H.S. Richards built a wine factory, later to be sold to two of El Cajon's earliest settlers, E.E. Burgess and William Stell.

St. Madeleine Sophie's Center Annual Morning Glory

St. Madeleine Sophie's Center's 14th Annual Morning Glory Brunch was once again generating a buzz around town, and it's not just because the bees and butterflies are attracted to St. Madeleine's organic garden. At this popular brunch, guests were treated to brunch fare, including home-style cinnamon rolls and mimosas, along with live music and opportunities to bid on Chinese

and silent auction items. More than 30 food and wine stations, boutique shopping, art and gardening demonstrations and the annual frog race will top off this annual brunch, with all proceeds benefitting St. Madeleine Sophie's Center.

St. Madeleine Sophie's Center (SMSC) is a non-denominational program helping nearly 400 people with developmental disabilities, their families and

communities, discover, explore, and nurture their full potential. Located in El Cajon, California, 20 miles east of Downtown San Diego, the organization provides service to the greater San Diego communities.

SMSC offers progressive programs and services with a teacher-to-student ratio ranging from 1:3 to 1:8, including Work Activity and Supported Employment; Behavior Modification; Computer Lab, Organic Garden & Worm Farm; Culinary Arts; Aquatics; Aerobics, Fitness, Yoga and Dance; Sophie's Gallery Art Program (the first program of its kind in the region, it has three sites: SMSC's main campus; Downtown El Cajon; and NTC Point Loma); Music Therapy; Reading; Speech Therapy/ Sign Language; and a Senior Program for students age 50+ (the first program of its kind in the region). SMSC also operates its own fleet of 30 paratransit vans and buses that transport students to and from SMSC each day, to work sites and on field trips.

Move It or Lose It: 5 moves to put seniors back in the game

For Americans 65 and older, falling down can be the worst thing to happen to them, according to statistics from the National Council on Aging:

- One in three seniors experiences a significant fall each year
- Every 18 seconds, a senior is admitted into an emergency room after losing balance and hitting the ground
- Every 35 minutes, an elderly person dies from a fall – the leading cause of death for seniors

"The projected cost in health-care expenses for 2020 due to fall-related injuries in the United States is \$55 billion," says Karen Peterson, a therapist with multiple certifications, and author of "Move With Balance: Healthy Aging Activities for Brain and Body," (www.MoveWithBalance.org). She's also the founder and director of Giving Back, a nonprofit organization that grows and spreads programs that support senior health.

"It's important for seniors to keep moving and learning, that's what helps improve balance and coordination, and even helps build new neural pathways," says Peterson, who emphasizes the cognitive importance to her workout programs. "But if you're rather frail, or just very fearful of falling, you're less likely to get up and move around." These activities benefit all seniors, from 55 to 105.

Peterson says a fun, social program of games and activities that include exercises

specifically designed for seniors helps them address multiple issues, including those that tend to keep seniors sedentary – which only lessens their strength and balance.

Last year, her program was independently evaluated from Hawaii's Department of Health, which found a statistically significant reduction in falls from seniors – 38 percent. It also won the MindAlert Award from the American Society on Aging.

"Seniors of all ages need to continually work on improving their balance, coordination, strength, vision and cognitive skills. When they do, they're less likely to fall – and more able to enjoy life."

Peterson suggests these moves, which address many different areas of the body:

- The cross-crawl: After various light warm-ups, begin with the basic cross-crawl, which focuses on the fundamentals of balance. March in place, lifting the knees high. At the same time, reach across and touch the lifted knee with the opposite hand or elbow; alternate and keep going. This can be done sitting, standing or lying down. Once any of these exercises are mastered, Peterson says, participants should continue to challenge themselves. For even greater balance work, and to exercise the vestibular system, close your eyes and count backwards from 100 by threes. "It's not fun if you're not conquering a challenge," she says. Her book includes several challenges for each exercise.

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— AT THE MOVIES —

A touching film that highlights appalling practices

Sometimes the best of intentions can end up as an unexpected journey as is the topic of *Not Today*. When Pastors Mathew Cork and Brent Martz made a trip to India they discovered the tragic lives of India's Dalits – the untouchables. "Dalit" refers to those who have been broken and ground down by those above them in the social hierarchy in a deliberate and active way.

Dalits are at risk of discrimination, dehumanization, degradation, and violence every day, and make up nearly one quarter of India's 1.2 billion society, with population estimates of 250 million people. The Dalits are history's longest standing oppressed people group. Official figures show that there are three million prostitutes in India, and of these

1.2 million are children. Many Dalits are as young as seven or eight and become the victim of sex-trafficking for brothels, pornography, and live feeds for the internet. This is the subject *Not Today* hopes to bring to the forefront with this film.

The story centers on Caden Welles (Cody Longo), a mal-content young man tired of hearing his girlfriend Audrey (Cassie Scerbo) and Sarah (Shari Rigby) his mother, preach to him. One night he and his poker-playing, inebriated buddies decide to take a trip to India wanting to be free to indulge in whatever they want.

Surprisingly, Sarah agrees to this as she's hoping it will cause Caden to face challenges he doesn't have at home and grow up. Luke (John Schneider), Caden's stepfather, disagrees

thinking this is not a good idea at all, but is out-voted.

When the guys arrive in Hyderabad, Caden snags a fancy suite overlooking the city in a swanky hotel. After a night of drinking and entertainment, Caden suddenly feels sick. His buddies take off, and after a little sleep Caden heads to the streets still under the influence. He ends up in a section of town that doesn't look familiar to him.

Caden is approached by Kiran (Walid Amini); a homeless man begging for food for his daughter he says hasn't eaten for days. He tells Caden he fears Annika (Persis Karen) will be kidnaped and put into sex-trafficking. Caden is rude to the man telling him he probably has a mansion on a hill and refuses to help him.

In *The Company You Keep* the sins of the past re-emerge themselves when a member of a revolutionary militant group who committed crimes years earlier gives herself up.

Sharon (Susan Sarandon), a Canadian housewife and mom, has finally reached the age to atone for her crimes as a young woman in college for her part in a '70s robbery that resulted in the death of a bank guard. She leaves her life and family behind to give herself up.

News journalists and law enforcement officers are excited by her decision and expect to finally flush out all of those who participated in the crime.

Ben Shepard (Shia LaBeouf) is one of these journalists. An act-before-he-thinks type, he's always in trouble with this boss and about to lose his job. He's really hungry to find the other assailants and starts to hound Jim Grant (Robert Redford), a local lawyer in New York.

Grant has his hands full trying to raise his daughter Isabel (Jackie Evancho – yes the terrific singer from *America's Got Talent*) alone after his wife's death. Hoping to get the annoying reporter off his back, Jim parks the daughter and takes off on a road trip to get news about the members of Weather Underground.

Jim's first stop is to his bud Donal (Nick Nolte). Before they can barely say hello the feds are

on Jim's heels, so Donal gives him a car and he slips away.

The film is a road trip thriller revealing very slowly the answers to – was Jim involved?; Will they put him in jail? And who are the other members of this fast asleep group?

Redford's direction and his own performance keep this film intriguing. LaBeouf also does a good job in rounding out a character who won't back off of his quest for even a minute.

Add in the enormous notable cast members that include Anna Kendrick, Brenda Gleeson, Brit Marling, Chris Cooper, Julie Christie, Richard Jenkins, Sam Elliot, Stanley Tucci, Terrence Howard and others and this thriller is a movie fans' dessert.

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and Caden realizes he treated Kiran badly and heads out to find him again. It takes a while and when he finds Kiran, Annika is gone. Her father sold her to a man who said he would take care of her and send her to school. Caden knows this is a lie and is panicked for Annika and angry at and sorry for her father for having to do such a thing.

The movie then follows Caden on an arduous journey that will test him, make him scream and throw things, but dig deep inside and find the strength and moral core to do the right thing.

Not Today is compelling and very well acted. The faith-based film upholds the motto, "None of us are free if one of us is enslaved."

The movie is good for mature audiences who don't miss bloodshed and bullets,

and sheds a light on a sad and dangerous practice still going on in the world every day.

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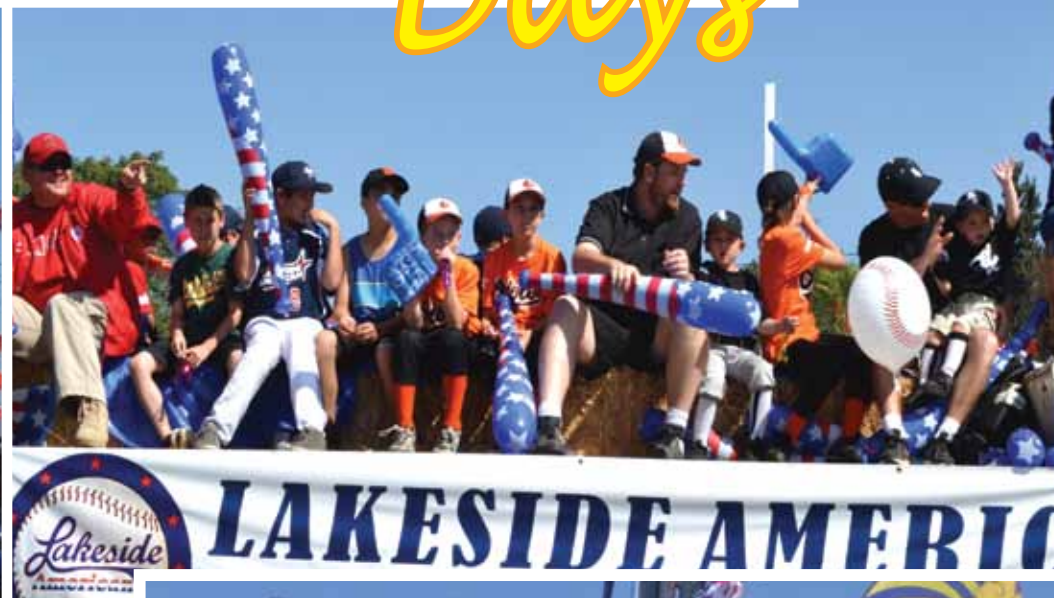

This year’s Western Day Parade is dedicated to George A.F. Jacques. Known as “Jake” to his friends. “Jake” was an avid equestrian and rode in parades all over California, Arizona, and Nevada on his favorite parade horse, “Tonga”. Jake logged in more than 30 years’ worth of parade riding.

Jake rode in the Lakeside Western Parade from 1973 through 1989 and became the Equestrian Chairman for

both the Lakeside Chamber’s Parade until 2011. He was also the Equestrian Chairman for the El Cajon’s Mother Goose Parade. The Lakeside Chamber depended on Jake for his expertise in this area and was an integral part of the parade’s organization. Each year Jake would organize the equestrian’s entries to ensure the distinguished Equestrians were honored and the safety of the riders and their horses was assured. Jake took great pride in the fact that the Lakeside Western Day parade hosted

more Equestrian Rider entries than any other parade in Southern California, and only on occasion was 2nd to the Rose Parade.

Jake was born in Rhode Island on Oct. 8, 1919. He served in the US Army in the Pacific during WWII in Company C, 118th Medical Battalion. In 1956 George and his wife Esther, and children George and Nancy, moved to San Diego. He was employed by Pacific Glass and Mirror Company from 1956 to his

retirement in 1985. He was a member of the Glaziers Union Local 1399.

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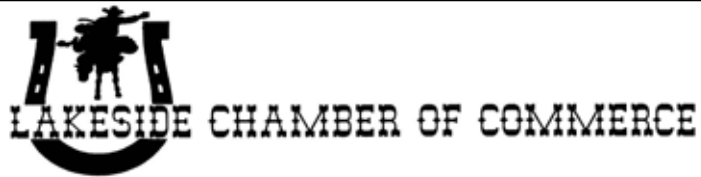


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History of the Lakeside Rodeo

As you sit here and read this, you are perhaps watching a sporting event that pairs man and beast in what is often a very physical contest. For the animal it is a natural environment where he tests his limits against any force of nature or man. For the contestant it is a choice to test his limits against the unknown. Today they come together in the arena as opposed to the corral, the ranch or the plains. Welcome to the Lakeside Rodeo Arena, with its long and varied history and its undisputable value to the "Youth of Lakeside".

On July 5 of 1920 the first rodeo was held in Lakeside. Organized by resident Bill Kuhner, it was held on the property of Emil Klicka, just south of Lindo Lake in a makeshift arena. For several years there was no rodeo, but it returned to Lakeside in 1933, when the Lakeside Rodeo Association was formed. The rodeo was moved to an area west of what is now Channel Road, where the organizers built a grandstand, chutes and

fences within the days prior to the event, then had to take it all down after the event... only to put it back up for the next rodeo. The Rodeo was held infrequently throughout the next several years, moving to several locations.

In the mid 1960's a group of parents were trying to organize fundraisers to build a lighted football stadium for the El Capitan High School. Parents, teachers and school officials included Arthur Sattler, Donald Foster, M.R. Murry Jr., Russell Savage, John Barrons, Reg Kuhner, Tom La Madrid Sr., Lee Bowen, John Burns, Roy Crane, Anna Curley, Paul Clay, Tom and Jody Hostetler, Charles Perkins along with many others whose names have been lost, or forgotten, yet their legacy lives on. The parents of students attending, or about to enter the high school, wanted to make sure that the school provided the same level of services as the other schools within the growing district and, with the district building another high school at that time, money was just not available to provide sports facilities for the students of El

Capitan. The totally volunteer group, organizing themselves under the title of "El Capitan Stadium Association", eventually met with a long time resident cowboy of Lakeside, Mr. Ben Bruton, and he suggested once again putting on a rodeo for a fundraiser.

The first rodeo for the newly formed Stadium Association was held in the spring of 1964. There were no rodeo grounds, so Ben found temporary seating, chutes as well as fencing and put on a rodeo in a vacant field much like it was done in the past. The event was successful enough that the Stadium Association decided that they could do this every year as long as they had a place to hold the event. In 1966 the El Capitan Stadium Association was formally incorporated as a "not for profit" organization.

In December of 1969, Mrs. Marion Carlson approached the organization and gifted eight acres of vacant land, the current site of the Rodeo facility, to the group for fundraising and to hold the Rodeo.

Through the years, although

members (volunteers) left and new members (volunteers) joined, the group remained focused and completed the building of the football field, lighting, bleachers and concession stands for the High School. Along with the school improvements, the group started working on building the Lakeside Rodeo Arena as a permanent fixture in the community. During that time, the Stadium Association began the annual leasing of a portion of the rodeo land to the Grossmont Union School District to allow El Capitan High School to build and maintain an Agricultural Department. Through the Association, that lease today fosters the ability of students to continue to learn all facets of agriculture, animal care and leadership skills.

The 1980's were busy for the Stadium Association. The Eastern San Diego County Junior Fair had been held for decades at Gillespie Field, but was asked to relocate. The Fair Board and The Stadium Association got together and went to the Grossmont Union School District, where they asked to lease a piece of land directly behind the now existing Rodeo Grounds next to the track. That lease was fully granted to the Stadium Association and then the Association sub-let to the Fair Board for the "Jr. Fair" to be held on-site each year.

In the late 1980's the El Capitan Stadium Association felt that the high school was not the only entity in the



community that needed their help. The Association changed their Constitution to benefit the "Youth of Lakeside". To date, there is probably not a Youth organization within Lakeside's boundaries that has not enjoyed a substantial financial support from the Association. Youth sports has acquired improvements to their individual fields and outfitting in uniforms of their teams. The members assisted the Eastern San Diego County Jr. Fair in building their current facility and each year we continue to financially participate in the Fair auction to help the FFA and 4-H participants sell their individual projects. The ECSA provides annual scholarships to graduating seniors and encouragement scholarships to eighth grade students to keep them focused on completing their education. Special needs summer programs are funded as are playgrounds at schools, gardens grown by students and desperately needed text books the District cannot af-

ford. Reading Is Fundamental book giveaway, journalism classes, auto mechanics, drafting, computers and fiber networks along with printers, Breakfast with Santa, Boy Scouts, student leadership and countless other needs are met by the Association.

Obviously, the number of requests each year by educators and coaches has increased as the community has grown and State as well as Federal funding has dwindled. In an average year the El Capitan Stadium Association donates in excess of \$120,000.00 as well as services to the Youth of Lakeside.

The original goal was to build a football stadium for the high school... since then The El Capitan Stadium Association, which remains a totally volunteer group, has built a community of support in which we strive daily to continue to be a good neighbor as well as a benefactor to the Youth.

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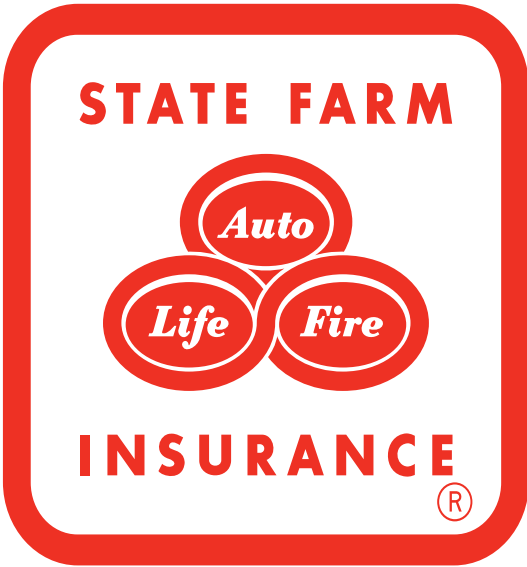

What you need to know to make the right food choices for your pets

PET FOOD LABELS DECODED

FAMILY FEATURES

Pet owners want the very best for their animals, but it can be hard to choose the right food. With hundreds of pet food products available, how do you decide what's best for your pet? It's smart to start with the label — but labels can be confusing if you don't know what to look for. Here's what you need to know.

Pet Food Names

So what's in a product name? More than you might think. According to the manual produced by The Association of American Feed Control Officials (AAFCO), if a pet food name says:

- **Chicken, beef, seafood, lamb** — it must contain 95 percent of that ingredient.
- **A combination of ingredients** (Chicken and Liver) — the two named ingredients together must make up 95 percent of the total weight. The first ingredient should be the predominant one. This only applies to animal-based ingredients.
- **Dinner, entrée, platter, formula, etc.** (Beef Dinner; Seafood Platter) — it must contain 25 percent of the listed ingredient. If more than one ingredient is included in the name, the combination of ingredients must total 25 percent of the product.
- **With** (Lamb with Rice) — it must contain 3 percent of the primary ingredient.
- **Flavor** (Chicken Flavored) — no minimum requirements, but the pet should be able to detect the taste.

Ingredient List

The primary goal of pet food is to deliver key nutrients to your pet. The higher the ingredient quality is, the easier it is for your pet to absorb and use the nutrients they contain. Here's a closer look at pet food ingredients, the primary nutrients they deliver and the health benefits they offer to pets.

- **Fresh meat, chicken, poultry by-product meal, meat by-products, soybean meal and egg** — High quality protein for muscle tone and development and healthy skin.
- **Animal fat, fish oil and vegetable oil** — Fats and essential fatty acids for energy, improved taste and healthy skin and coat.
- **Corn, rice, barley, sorghum** — Carbohydrates for energy and other nutrients for healthy skin and coat.
- **Cellulose, soybean mill run and beet pulp** — Fiber sources that promote

intestinal tract health; some are helpful in weight control.

Chemical names in the ingredient list are most often vitamins or minerals added for complete nutrition.

What about by-products? A by-product is a secondary food item that is made from a primary ingredient production stream. A by-product like "chicken by-product meal" can contain organ meat that has a high nutritional value. In fact, it's a more concentrated protein source than raw chicken alone and contains high quality, highly digestible protein.

Not all by-products are created equal. For example, a high-quality pet food often recommended by veterinarians, such as Hill's (makers of Science Diet and Prescription Diet), only accept high quality by-product ingredients. However, bargain brands may use inferior ingredients that include feathers or other lower-nutritional parts of the animal.

Guaranteed Analyses

By law, pet food packaging must show the minimum percentages of crude protein and fat, as well as the maximum percentages of crude fiber and moisture in the product. This is not an indication of the actual nutrient content or a guarantee of nutritional quality.

- **The minimum amount guarantee** shows the lowest amount of nutrient in the food. For example, a product may have a minimum fat guarantee of 8 percent, but actually contain 15 percent of fat.
- **The maximum amount guarantee** may be 5 percent fiber, but the product may only have 1 percent fiber.

Remember, if the actual nutritional content is not clear on the packaging, you can always contact the manufacturer directly via their product information toll-free number on the package.

Nutritional Adequacy Statement

The Association of American Feed Control Officials (AAFCO) sets the nutritional

guidelines for pet foods sold in the United States. The nutritional adequacy is determined by one of two methods — formulation and feeding trials.

- **Feeding trial method** — This requires the manufacturer to utilize an AAFCO-protocol feeding trial using the food as the sole source of nutrition. The pets' performance is documented when fed the food. A sample label statement might read, "Animal feeding tests using AAFCO procedures indicate this food provides complete and balanced nutrition for maintenance of adult dogs."
- **Formulation method** — This requires the manufacturer to formulate the food to meet AAFCO nutrient profiles for dogs and cats. Because it is a calculation of nutrient levels, and AAFCO feeding trials with pets are not required, this is a faster, less-expensive method. A statement on a product using this method might read, "Formulated to meet the nutritional levels established by AAFCO Cat Food Profiles for maintenance of adult cats."

Ages and Stages

The AAFCO guidelines only govern food for three pet life stages: growth and reproduction, maintenance, and all life stages. Foods formulated for all life stages must meet the most nutritionally demanding life stage — growth and reproduction. So while getting an all life stages food to feed several pets of different ages might sound good, in reality, this food is designed for pets under a year old, or for nursing animals — and may not be a good choice for the nutritional needs of pets in other life stages.

What Does "Natural" Mean?

AAFCO has developed some guidelines for natural claims for pet foods.

- In general, the term "Natural" is applied to products that are free of artificial flavors, artificial colors and artificial preservatives.
- While preservatives are needed to prevent food from going rancid, natural products use natural source preservatives instead of artificial ones.
- "Holistic" has no legal definition and can be used however the manufacturer chooses.
- The word "Organic" refers to how the source plants were grown or animals were raised. Currently, USDA and state regulators allow the usage of "organic" on pet food labels if human guidelines are met.

Organic terminology includes the following:

- 100 percent organic. Everything in the bag or can is organic.
- Organic — at least 95 percent of the content is organic.
- Made with organic — at least 70 percent is organic (however, the USDA "Organic Seal" may not be used on the label).
- Any product with less than 70 percent organic ingredients cannot be called organic, but may list organic ingredients in the product's ingredient list as organic (e.g. organic chicken).

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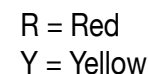

To improve motor skills, physical coordination and cognition, there are many dance exercises that are appropriate for seniors. If needed, use a chair for assistance. Place your feet shoulder-width apart. Now, simultaneously extend your left foot and your right arm forward. Keep your left toes pointed down, touching the floor; or for more difficulty, maintain the toes a few inches off the floor. Repeat this move with your left arm and right foot. Hold each pose for several seconds, and increase holding time.

- Sensory integration – the arrow chart: Look at an arrow chart and call out the direction indicated by each individual symbol. Then, thrust your arms in that direction; in other words, say and do what the arrow indicates. For an additional challenge, do the opposite of what the arrow indicates.

- Side-step walk: Walk side-stepping – bring your right foot across the left and step down three to five inches away from the left foot, ankles crossed. The closer the feet, the harder it is to balance. Alternate crossing the foot in front and then behind the other foot as you move along; repeat several times, then do the same with opposite feet. As a bonus challenge, try a reading exercise from a vision card, designed for stimulating the brain/visual system, while sidestepping.

- The cat jump: This activity is practice in case of a fall;

the muscle memory of the movement will be etched in your body. Bend your knees in a squat. Jump a little off the ground with both feet, and land softly, like a cat, without jarring your body. Repeat until you are confident in your ability to prevent a spill.

"Research shows that most falls are preventable," Peterson says. "These and other exercises, performed regularly, are a great way to achieve safety and a revitalized lifestyle."
