



SDG&E offers solutions to future rate hike

prian Freye, a project advisor for San Diego Gas & Electric (SDG&E) addressed Kiwanians at their August 3 morning meeting. Freve used a power point presentation to show how supplying energy to Southern Californian has changed over the years.

The recent shut down of the ment officials — not SDG&E San Onofre Nuclear Power Plant has already resulted in the nearly 3.5 million rate payers receiving notices that rates will go up in September. County to help keep inmate fire camps open

he Board of Supervisors on Tuesday (Aug. 6) moved to ensure that low-risk prisoners remain on the front lines of backcountry firefighting.

By unanimous vote, the board authorized county staff to complete an agreement with state officials that would house qualified inmates at local fire camps operated by the state. The move came at the urging of Supervisor Dianne Jacob, District Attorney Bonnie Dumanis, Sheriff Bill Gore and county Chief Administrative Officer Helen Robbins-Meyer.

"Keeping the camps open is critical to public safety because they provide much-needed boots on the ground when wildfire hits," said Supervisor Jacob, board vice chairwoman. "Inmate crews put added muscle into our efforts to manage overgrown brush and to fight major blazes.

The number of male and female prisoners housed at state fire camps is thinning due to a 2011 U.S. Supreme Court ruling, affirmed last week, that requires California to lower its inmate population. Many are transferred to county jails as part of a statewide process known as prison realignment.

"Re-establishing the process of sending approved inmates to fire camps has the double benefit of easing the jail population and helping protect San Diego County from wildfires,' said District Attorney Bonnie Dumanis. "It makes sense as law enforcement in the county works together to respond to the ongoing challenges of prisoner realignment."

Under a housing contract that is expected to be finalized, about 50 inmates would be transferred from county facilities



Centennial Moment: Mother Goose Parade conceived in 1946



Below is an excerpt from a brochure published in 1961 in honor of the City's 50th anniversary of incorporation: "50 Years of Progress." The brochure chronicles events in the City by each year, from incorporation in 1912, through present day, at that time, in 1961. This Centennial Moment focuses specifically on the year 1946.

his was the year that brought about the birth of the Mother Goose Parade. True, it was only a dream this year when Thomas Wigton, Jr. conceived the idea while adding the final touches to a Christmas theme display window in his store.

Wigton took his idea to other business people of the town of how he wanted to bring to animated life the imaginary world of childhood, made up of floats in a parade. The men

who served on that first Parade Board were Thomas Wigton. Jr., as president; Carlyle Reed as vice president; J.W. Milston as secretary and treasurer. James Free, Max Glaser, Hamilton Judy and C. Rupert as

There was a spectacular oil and gasoline fire at the Langley Oil Products Company on East Main Street which amounted to a loss of \$50,000. For a while there was considerable concern when gasoline and flaming oil mixed with water flowed down a storm drain ditch that passed under the W.D. Hall Company main

This was a year of another spectacular event in the late history of El Cajon that has contributed greatly to the city today. Tom Jackman took his idea of an Industrial Park to Steve Fletcher, who owned the land. Fletcher liked the idea and the potential both to him and to the City of El Cajon. To start the ball rolling, Jackman purchased one acre of the land. He recalls today that it was all he could afford. Thus Jackman started out to sell the idea to the industry, and the industry listened to him.

According to a story in the "Union Title and Trust Topics" there were three houses completed in the Fletcher Hills area this year.

The City Council passed an ordinance that all businesses within the City limits would be licensed to operate.

to local state-run camps. They would join prisoners who are already serving time at the rural outposts.

The county plans to budget as much as \$950,000 in state realignment money to pay for the housing arrangement during the current fiscal year.

Funding beyond the middle of next year is uncertain. Under current California policy, the state must charge counties \$46 a day to house realigned offenders at fire camps. San Diego County officials plan to ask Sacramento lawmakers to reduce or eliminate that fee.

Dropping the fee would give counties a financial incentive to shift qualified prisoners to fire camps, freeing up more jail space to absorb the huge number of state inmates being transferred under realignment.

A report issued in May by the San Diego County Grand Jury emphasized the importance of the four local fire camps and recommended the county act swiftly to help keep them in year-around operation.

Inmate firefighters have been at the backbone of state fire protection efforts for decades. The California prison system, working with Cal Fire, operates more than 40 fire camps statewide.

The four camps in San Diego County are located near the backcountry communities of Rainbow, Warner Springs, Mc-Cain Valley and Julian.

Wildfires

The County of San Diego and County Supervisor Dianne Jacob is urging back country residents to clear defensible fire space around their homes. "We have had little rain and there is a lot of brush and other vegetation built up in our backcountry," Jacob said. "As of May 2013 we have had 1600 wildfires for the year which is 500 more than the same period last year."

Fire officials urge residents to maintain at least 100 feet of defensible space around their homes by pruning, cutting, mowing and taking other steps to reduce vegetation near structures. Supervisor Jacob and others advise residents to register their cell phone numbers and email address with the county reverse 911 system at readysandiego.org.

At the website residents can sign up to receive evacuation notices and other emergency alerts in a crisis. Smart phone owners can also download the app SDEmergency to help keep tabs on disaster. It's available for Apple and Android users.

'Percy Jackson; Sea of Monsters' works for kids

hen the gods are away; the kids will play. Or in Percy Jackson & The Olympians: Sea of Monsters, maybe go to extra lengths to make a difference. Continuing the adaptation of author Rick Riordan's young reader's book series into films, Sea of Monsters follows the 2010 film Percy Jackson & The Olympians: The Lightning Thief, which is about Greek Myth of gods and monsters.

The adventure involves children of the Greek gods. Percy (Logan Lerman), who has a mortal mother, has only recently learned he's the son of Greek sea god Poseidon. Yet as he sticks his hand in a body of

water and beckons for a sign that his father hears him, Percy gets no such response.

Percy is training at Camp Half-Blood along with other children of gods, but it's a dark mood there. Many are still mourning the loss of their friend Thalia. In a previous episode, she was turned into a tree. With the help from a couple of silly teachers Percy gets his training and his position in society.

Mr. D. (Stanley Tucci) swiftly walks around teaching the kids certain things, but he's often leaving off the end of the conversation leaving the kids to mostly decide their own course. Meanwhile, Chiron (Anthony Head), who is a Centaur (half-man, half-horse) provides more educational aspects to the campers and options when they must face some huge battles.

The Camp is no longer safe as monsters are invading and Thalia's tree, once the barrier gate to the Camp, has been poisoned. During the Camp games the young people battle to be the leaders. Percy always seems to come in second place behind Clarisse (Leven Rambin).

Before the story goes into a wild adventure Percy learns a new kid in camp is claiming to be his half-brother. Percy takes one look at the cyclops (someone who has only one eye in the middle of his forehead) to rebuff Tyson (Douglas Smith). Athena's daughter Annabeth (Alexandra Daddario) convinces him to take Tuson along to rescue their friend Grover (Brandon T. Jackson), from a Cyclops. A familiar question arises. Will the Chargers front line be able to protect their quarterback?


Looking impressive in camp is rookie linebacker Manti Te'o. Linebacker Larry English is healthy and looking for a season that a number one draft pick in his position should have.






