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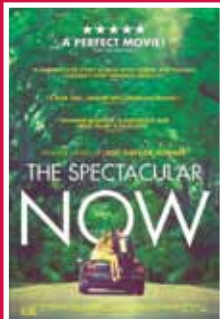

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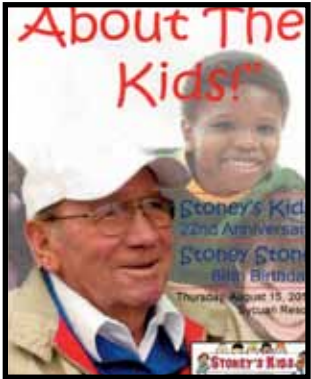

Lakeside's Roundup of Events —

Lakeside Fire Board

The Insurance Services Office (ISO) has completed its analysis of the structural fill suppression delivery system provided in the Lakeside Community.

ISO's Public Protection Classification (PPC) plays an important role in the underwriting process at insurance companies. Each insurance company independently determines the premiums it charges to policy holders. The way an insurance company uses ISO's information in public fire protection may depend on several things: the companies Fire/loss experience, rate making mythology, underwriting guidelines, and the market strategy.

PPC is important to communities and fire departments. Communities whose PPC improve may get lower insurance policies. PPC also provides fire departments with a valuable land mark, and is used by many departments as a valuable tool when planning budgeting and justifying fire protection improvement.

The community protection baseline information gathered by ISO's is an essential foundation upon which determination of the relative level of fire protection is made using the fire suppression rating schedule.

At the August 13 Lakeside Fire Board Meeting, Fire Chief Andy Parr told the board he's pleased the Lakeside Fire Department has received a PPC rating of three explaining it needed to get below nine, and this will be a big cost saving on insurance.

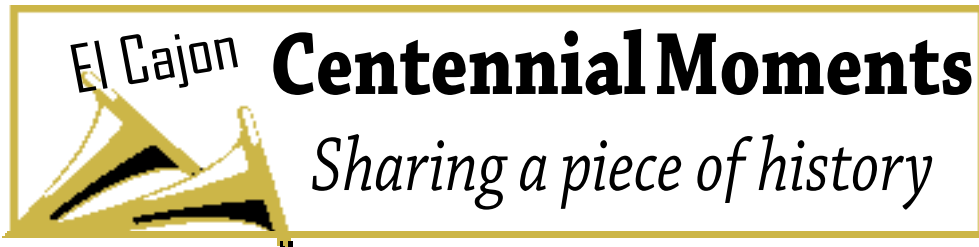
Eucalyptus Hills Fire Safe Council

The Eucalyptus Hills Fire Safe Council was presented with Certificates of Recognition from Supervisor Second District Dianne Jacob and Supervisor Fifth District Bill Horn. State Senator Joel Anderson recognized the council for Fire Safe Council Project of the year "Chipping day", outstanding Community Fire Safe Council and outstanding Community Service.

Other groups wishing to form a Fire Safe Council have used Eucalyptus as a guideline.

The Eucalyptus Fire Safe Council has put on Chipping Days which has eliminated the Fire load by 100s of tons of flammable brush and limbs. The group has been innovative getting grants and accepting donations at Chipping Days which has enabled them to continue chipping every few months.

Centennial Moment: City Manager hired in 1950

Below is an excerpt from a brochure published in 1961 in honor of the City's 50th anniversary of incorporation: "50 Years of Progress." The brochure chronicles events in the City by each year, from incorporation in 1912, through present day, at that time, in 1961. This Centennial moment focuses specifically on the year 1950. Photo is courtesy of the El Cajon Historical Society.

As a result of the study by the City Council it was decided to advertise in civic publications for a City Manager. After considerable

screening by the Council, Bernard Noden was selected for the post.

Election results for three councilmen for a period of four years showed that J.R. Steel, Carlos Hull and Hovey Crandall were seated. One thousand one hundred and fifty-two votes were cast in the election.

An island down the center of Main Street was proposed by the State Highway Commission as a safety measure. Considerable controversy developed both for and against the idea.

Building permits for 244 new dwellings in the City, valued at \$2,200,000, were issued in 1950.

Also 16 permits for commercial buildings were issued with a total dollar value of \$2,194,264.

In the span of nine years since 1941, the grammar school enrollment went from 850 to 2,250.

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At the Movies

'The Spectacular Now' - one of the top films this year

There are many teen-related movies these days about everything from raucous college parties to vampires. *The Spectacular Now* aims for a more lasting impression that will have both adults and mature teens walking away feeling they spent their money well.

Screenwriters Scott Neustadter and Michael H. Weber (*500 Days of Summer*) have adapted Tim Thorp's novel into a compelling film about

the journey of two teens, Sutter (Miles Teller) and Aimee (Shailene Woodley.)

Outwardly, Sutter is the one who always seems to have it all. Maybe it's that his cup is usually filled with alcohol or just that he's a good actor as the life of the party. Inwardly, there's a rumbling volcano of family desperation and anger waiting to explode.

When Sutter's girlfriend Cassidy (Brie Larson) finds life more interesting with the high school quarterback; Sutter

is left adrift. He puts on a good face that he's okay with it, but clearly he is not. Always wanting to make others feel good, Sutter's eye of good intention is always wandering. He finds himself intrigued by a student who very much sticks to herself.

Aimee is not a nerd or in any way a misfit. She's just a young girl walking to her own beat that wants to do well in school so she can change her life. When Sutter wakes up on Aimee's lawn one morning after an obviously drunken night, it's Aimee who rescues him and invites him to help her with her paper route.

Sutter slowly becomes infatuated with Aimee; however, she needs a little time before she responds to his attention. She can see how he looks at

Cassidy when they are in the same space at school.

Jennifer Jason Leigh handles the role of Sutter's mom quite well. Kyle Chandler as Sutter's dad is exceptionally steely and distressing when Sutter finally confronts him.

Teller (*Footloose*, *Rabbit Hole*) and Woodley (*The Descendants*) both offer excellent portrayals of these characters. It's clear Sutter has no plan of where he's going or how to appease his anger with his mother over his missing father. Teller taps into every emotion as if he's lived this scenario. He's spot-on with the teen who ambles through the day at school like he's on top of everything with a smile and false easiness. Yet when Sutter is alone, Teller nails those decisive moments of gravity when Sutter could

easily become won over by the darkness.

Woodley, whose resume is filled with TV work, wowed audiences and earned several critics' awards for her cantankerous role as George Clooney's daughter in *The Descendants*. At home Aimee is also in a negative place. Woodley captures this with every gaze into Aimee's eyes. She doesn't quite know how to take Sutter's attention. She's

never had a boyfriend and isn't quite sure that Sutter really likes her and is not using her to make Cassidy jealous. Woodley's calm demeanor through the film renders a fascinating character who blooms right before our eyes.

Both teens need saving, but are they the right ones to save each other? *The Spectacular Now* has humor, is tender and one of the top films of the year so far.

Lead actor in 'The Spectacular Now' leaving a footprint

Directed James Pon-soldt has ushered into theaters a sweet and smart summer romantic comedy in *The Spectacular Now*. Situated in a small town senior high schooler Sutter (Miles Teller) is kind of off-beat. He's growing apart from the girl he imagined he might always be with, but soon a very unlikely girl catches his eye. Aimee (Shailene Woodley, *The Descendants*) is a reserved and stick-to herself girl. The two experience a senior year they never saw coming.

Miles Teller is slowly building an impressive film career. His films include *Rabbit Hole* (2010), *Footloose* (2011), *Project X* 2012, and *21 and Over* (2013). Miles was very congenial in his San Diego publicity tour interview for *The Spectacular Now*.

Q: You personify a char-

acter who is really about the "now" and not the future. What did James -- who spent years looking for the right actor-- see in you that he offered you the lead?

MT: James and I met at a bar, and I guess I'm a good person to have a beer with. I'm not very Hollywood. I grew up in a small town in Florida, so I'm pretty down to Earth. But I really related to the character, and I think that showed when James and I met.

Q: I enjoyed that this film has humor but is not over the top, and it feels like real life today. Did that appeal to you when considering this role?

MT: It was the best script that I've ever read so I didn't have to force anything; it was all right there on the page. Sutter is a social chameleon and very good at making friends. He makes others feel good about

themselves because he can't go internally into about his own life; it's too sad for him.

Q: You did the opposite sides of Sutter so well. Was that a challenge to pull off?

MT: I was initially nervous about this role because I knew it would be the biggest challenge I've had in my career, but if I did it well it would be rewarding, and it wasn't easy. But I kind of like that sad clown (his character). For the first 20 minutes of the movie you think, I've seen this character before. But then because of the great writing and directing you can see some of the skeletons in his closet.

Q: Do you have an intense crush in high school that you thought about while becoming this character?

MT: (he laughs) I dated one of my sister's friends in high

school. She was two years older than me and a cheer leader, but it was kind of a hand-me down friend. But I had a lot of "interests" in high school. I had a good time.

Q: Do you see a theme here relating to teens who according to their peers don't measure up?

MT: I thought it was pretty realistic to high school. I think people are categorized and you have to fall into a group not quite sure who you are. I think that's what was so nice about Shailene's character. She's not a traditional nerd or geek, just someone you pass in the hall every day that you don't know much about. I liked that about this film. And there's no vampires or magic just a realistic portrayal of a rural high school.

Q: What was it like working with Shailene Woodley?

MT: She's great. She's very talented. We work in similar ways in that we're very much in the moment. We have an idea of what we want to do but if the other person is doing something different then you just go with it and try not to micro-manage too much.

Q: When did you know you wanted to be an actor?

MT: I have two older sisters who are more theatrical and my older sister had a country music contract for a while; and I watched her growing up. At the end of my sophomore year in high school I played a character in the high school in the play *Footloose* and played the same character (Willard) in the movie. At the end of my junior year I had decided to make a run for it (in an acting career).

Q: What did you think when you landed the role of Jason in *Rabbit Hole*?

MT: I knew if I could get a manager I was good enough to land some gigs. When I got *Rabbit Hole* I was so excited. Nicole Kidman kind of hand-picked me, and I called my mom and everyone was freaking out.

Q: James said this story by Tim Tharp was his story. Do you think this will bring in viewers who will also associate with it?

MT: I think everyone knew a Sutter in high school, and everyone will fall in love with Shailene Woodley's character. Some viewers will want them to stay together, and others will want her to run away from this guy and never come back. Overall, I think we did an accurate portrayal of high-schoolers and bring many back to those times and remember who they liked, what they were feeling and who was important to them.

Q: What was it like to work with James?

MT: He was great. He's not one that directs with a heavy hand. He listens to you and for Shailene and I to have some control over our character for as young as we are, is rare.

Teller has four films in production:

Get A Job: with Bryan Cranston and Anna Kendrick about some college kids trying to find a job.

Two Night Stand: a small indie comedy about two people who get stuck in a snowstorm together.

Are We Officially Dating: a romantic comedy with Zack Efron and Michael B. Jordan about three bachelors who make a pact to have fun.

Divergent: a young adult film similar to *Hunger Games* starring Kate Winslet and Theo James.



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

Long Beach Queen Mary

It's not too late to plan something really special before the kids are book-bound back to school and moms are balancing two jobs while packing lunches.

The Queen Mary is just a few blocks from the Aquarium of the Pacific. The maiden voyage of the Cunard ship line's Queen Mary was on May 27, 1936, when she departed from Southampton, England embarking on her maiden voyage to become one of the grandest ship lines on the seas. She boasted five dining areas and lounges, two cocktail bars and swimming pools, a grand ballroom, a squash court and even a small hospital.

Like an anxious child, her

voyages would become surprising as well as entertaining and frightful. For 14 years she was host to royalty and movie stars, but when she docked in New York City in September of 1939, it would be the last civilian transport for many years. As World War II started, the Queen Mary's transformation into a troopship had begun. Painted a camouflaged grey color and stripped of her luxurious amenities she was dubbed the "Grey Ghost."

The Queen Mary was the largest and fastest troopship to sail, capable of transporting as many as 16,000 troops at 30 knots. After the end of WWII, the Queen Mary began a 10-month retrofitting process, which would return the ship to her original glory. On July 21, 1947, the Queen Mary resumed

regular passenger service across the Atlantic Ocean for two more decades. Bought by the City of Long Beach, the Queen Mary arrived in Long Beach, California, on December 9, 1967. She now a floating Hotel, Attraction and Event & Wedding Venue, home to three world-class restaurants, numerous gift shops and more.

We began our visit by dining in Sir Winston's Restaurant & Lounge. We had great panoramic ocean view of surrounding areas and enjoyed the classic Art Deco décor. We were surprised at how reasonable the prices were and enjoyed first-class ship service; and the food was exceptional.

Before we boarded we checked out the tour options on the ship. They include a

twilight tour; group or private tours; Diana: Legacy of a Princess tour (13,000 sq. ft. exhibition); a Ghost tour; Her Finest Hour: A WWII tour; The Glory Days historical tour, and Scorpion tour. We chose the Glory Days and Ghost tour, which my 12-year-old granddaughter was excited to take. Both were informative with exceptional guides who knew their history but made it fun. The Ghost tour is mostly done in the dark and more for youngsters than adults – especially the first 10-deck hike down the stairs.

We found the prices reasonable for the tours and also enjoyed scoping out the ship on
