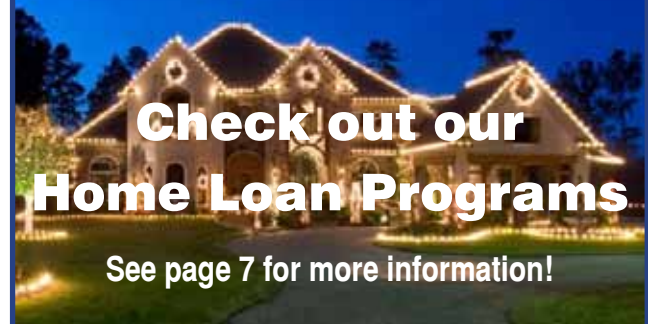

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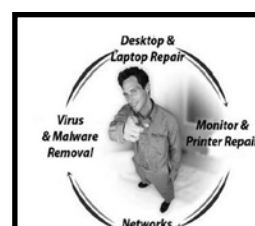

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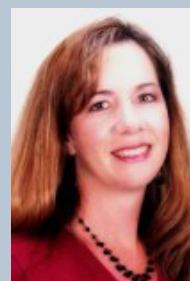
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Country Stew

Pair with Renwood Zinfandel, California

Yield: 6 servings

- 5 pounds bone-in short ribs, trimmed and cut into 2-inch pieces**
- 3/4 cup all-purpose flour**
- 1/4 cup vegetable oil**
- 2 cups water**
- 1 1/3 cups Renwood Zinfandel**
- 1 medium onion, chopped**
- 1 clove garlic, minced**
- 2 teaspoons salt**
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper**
- 2 beef bouillon cubes**
- 6 large Wisconsin potatoes, washed, peeled and quartered**
- 1/2 pound small fresh mushrooms, cleaned and trimmed**
- 1 package (10 ounces) frozen whole green beans**
- 1 can (16 ounces) peeled whole tomatoes, undrained**

1. Dredge ribs in flour to coat; reserve leftover flour.
2. Heat oil in 8-quart Dutch oven on moderate heat.
3. Add half of ribs and brown on all sides. Once browned, remove ribs. Repeat instructions for remaining ribs.
4. Stir in the reserved flour. While stirring, add 1 cup water and wine and stir until thickened.
5. Return ribs to the pan.
6. Add onion, garlic, salt, pepper and bouillon and bring to a boil.
7. Cover and lower heat to simmer for about 1 hour, or until ribs are tender.
8. Remove ribs with slotted spoon and cover with foil to keep warm.
9. Add potatoes, mushrooms and beans. Simmer 20 to 30 minutes, or until vegetables are tender.
10. Add ribs and tomatoes with liquid, and heat through.
11. Use slotted spoon to remove meat and vegetables to large serving platter.
12. Remove gravy to serving container and serve with ribs.

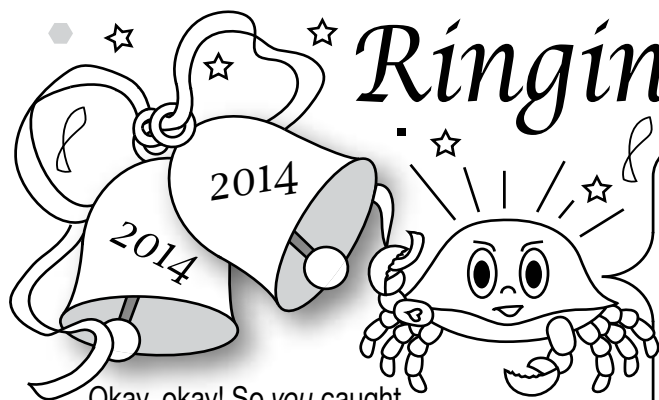
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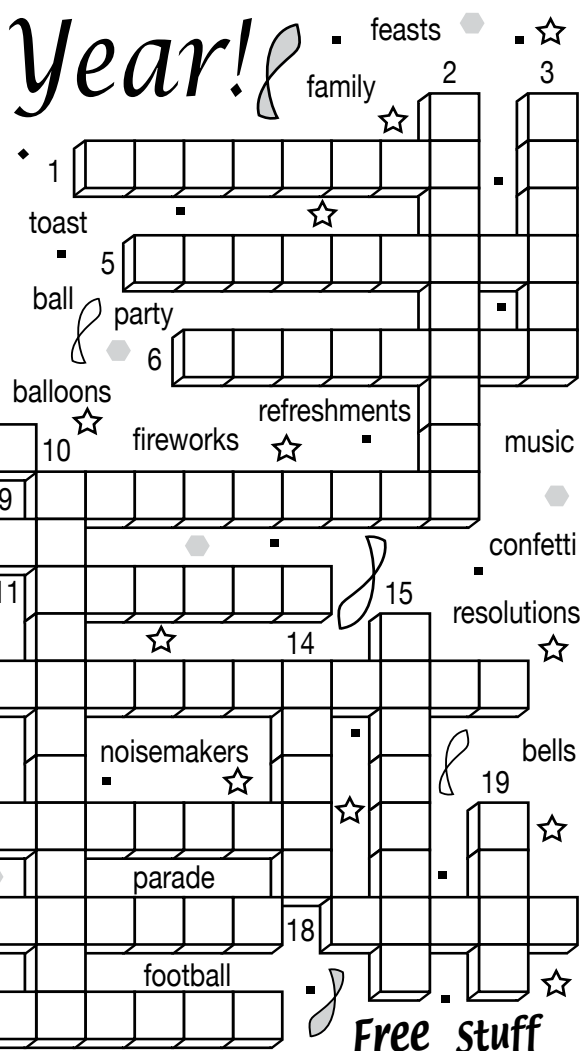

'The Wolf of Wall Street' one of the worst of 2013

If a movie lover's idea of spending three hours watching grown men fondle every woman in their work place, snort coke out of a prostitute's butt and listen to vulgar dialogue almost every five minutes of the film -- then *The Wolf of Wall Street* is the film to see this season.

Martin Scorsese's mega film depicts the 1990's financial pillages by those like real-life swindler Jordan Belfort. The con man -- played by Leonardo DiCaprio -- sold penny stocks to investors who never made a profit even though Belfort made millions off of them.

It's apparent in the first moments of the film that Belfort

has no morals, no conscience and no regard for females. After latching on to this second trophy wife, Naomi (Margot Robbie), Belfort seems to have the perfect life -- attested to by his Long Island mansion, runway wardrobe and a boat

that could substitute for a cruise ship.

But none of this is enough. When he brings Donnie Azoff (Jonah Hill) into his office staff they are off on a crazy, unimaginable free ride of greed,

drugs and debauchery. Even if one enjoys this type of film -- which I consider is almost pure porn -- Terence Winter's script itself is one note. The crime is not new, the acting over the top (especially by DiCaprio and Hill), and the

same scenarios throughout -- drugs, excessive sex, profanity throughout, and some violence -- become way too annoying for a three hour film where there's no entertainment unless one is gratified by the destruction of other people's lives.

Interviews with Martin Scorsese and Leonardo DiCaprio

In my review of *The Wolf of Wall Street* I expound on why I feel it's not a good movie to see, so I thought it would be interesting for my readers to read some of the thinking process behind the film. These are snippets of interviews with Martin Scorsese by Stephen Whitty on Thestarledger.com and Leonardo DiCaprio by Joe Neumaier for the *New York Daily News*. Interview with Martin Scorsese by Stephen Whitty

Martin Scorsese is cold, and tired and out of breath. Sitting in a chilly hotel ballroom for a press conference, he wears his overcoat draped over his

shoulders, Fellini-style; later, sitting for another interview in his room, he'll sip gingerly at a soda, his asthma inhaler by his hand. He is 71, and a little weary, and it shows.

Except when you see his new movie. Because *The Wolf of Wall Street* feels, not like the relaxed, reflective movie of an elder statesman, but the cocky film of a 30-year-old — fast-paced, rudely verbal, often graphically sexy and full of pure filmmaking joy.

"It's not about good people, bad people," Scorsese says philosophically of early negotiations with investors and distributors, and the long road to shooting. "It's about what they need, what we want to do, what we can deliver to the marketplace."

That story began back on

the set of "The Departed," when star Leonardo DiCaprio showed the director a tell-all memoir of one drug-fueled broker's rise to the top, and precipitous plummet to the bottom.

"Am I my brother's keeper?" Scorsese asks. "What happens to that responsibility, ultimately?... That's been something in every one of the films I've made."

But to that, the movie adds a brash feeling — young, sarcastic, explicitly sexy — mixed with a clear-eyed calm. It is sometimes amused at its characters' wallows in excess. But it's not particularly appalled, and it certainly preaches no sermons.

That approach has already challenged some critics at early screenings, where a few com-

plained that the movie's nasty albeit attractive hero never changes — that there is, they say, no redemptive arc.

The charge has been leveled at Scorsese before — he makes downbeat movies about low-life characters.

"A lot of people want a character they can root for," he says. "I understand that, it's great, there are a lot of great pictures with heroes like that — 'Casablanca,' 'Shane,' 'Chinatown' — you root for those guys, you're on their side. But do you have to have a character you like for the picture to work? Do you even have to have a plot? What's wrong with just dropping an audience into a world?"

He did that with "Hugo," a gentle fable of long-gone Paris and the birth of cinema. He did it years ago in "Kundun," the story of the Dalai Lama, and "The Age of Innocence," a careful re-creation of 19th-century, upper-class New York. (All films which also easily disprove the assumption he's only interested in violent losers.)

One is his work with DiCaprio, a collaboration that is now in its fifth film and, the director says, "rejuvenates me."

"Working with Leo, it's very easy because we have a lot of the same reference points, we like a lot of the same pictures, and music," Scorsese says. "He recently got into Django Reinhardt, the Mills Brothers! I'm 30 years older, but we connect on a lot of the same levels. And the more we work together, the more I know how much I can push him, how much more I can get out of him... Bob (De Niro), the collaboration's much

more intuitive, much more unspoken. Or if it's spoken, not always articulate! But there's, again, a very very deep connection."

The wolf of *The Wolf of Wall Street* may have been a wild man, a louse and a convicted swindler, but director Martin Scorsese's antihero Jordan Belfort really knew how to spend his ill-gotten booty.

"We wanted to create the sense of a modern-day Roman Empire," says "Wolf" star Leonardo DiCaprio in an exclusive chat with the Daily

News. "We wanted the film to have this sense of everyone giving in to every temptation, minus the maidens putting grapes in our mouths."

He says Jordan Belfort's 2007 biography of the same title "reflected everything that's wrong with today's society. This hedonistic lifestyle, this period in Wall Street's history when Jordan gave in to every carnal indulgence.

"We purposely didn't show Belfort's victims. We wanted the film to be a hypnotic ride the audience goes on, so they get lost in this world and not see the destruction left in the

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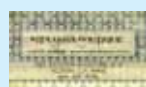


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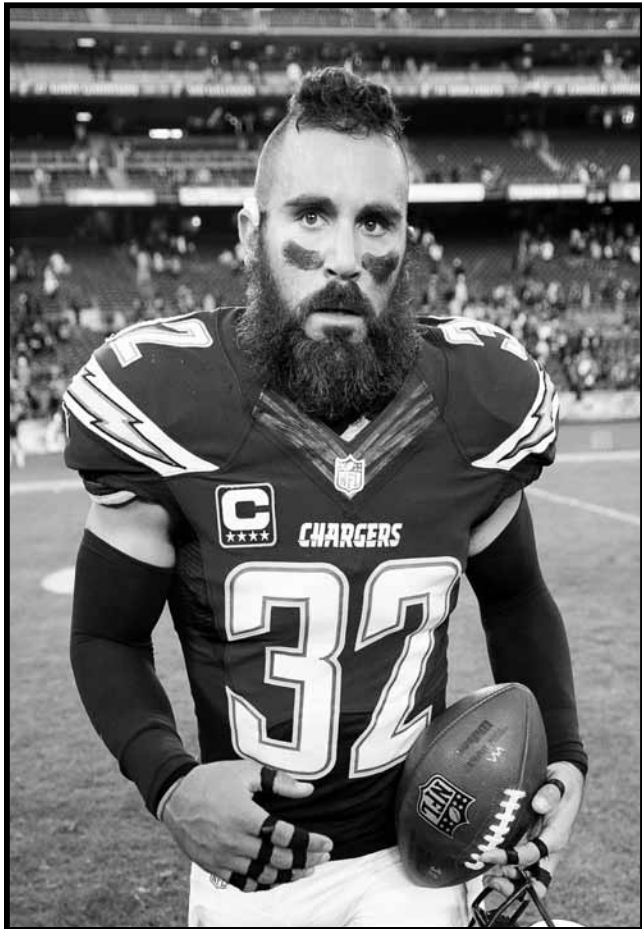

Chargers take down the Raiders 26-13

The San Diego Chargers left for dead a few weeks ago but improving their record to (8-7) winning three games in a row, they are still alive and kicking.

Bolts kicker Nick Novack named the AFC Special Teams-Player of the week after kicking four field goals (27, 48, 28, 33-yards). Still in the mix for the sixth and last AFC Wild Card spot the Chargers handily defeated the Oakland Raiders 26-13 in front of 65,675 at Qualcomm Stadium.

Everything went right for San Diego last Sunday as the two other contenders for that spot the (8-7) Miami Dolphins fell to Buffalo and the (8-7) Baltimore Ravens got destroyed by the Patriots.

"First off, I would like to say Merry Christmas to everyone. I hope you guys have a happy holiday with your families and any visitors coming into town. Thank you for everything this year up to this point in time," said head coach Mike McCoy.

Following a sloppy first half with the score tied at 10 apiece; the Chargers outscored Oakland 16-3 in the second half, after they stepped all over themselves.

Give credit to the (4-12) Oakland Raiders who had nothing to play for except pride. They played hard physically and gave the Chargers their best shot. However, when you commit 12 penalties (three more were declined) limiting the Oakland running game to 59-yards, the other team usually wins. But the Raiders made San Diego earn it.

Not playing their best game of the year (three turnovers) the Bolts still found a way to get it done.

One yard shy of three consecutive 100-yd. rushing games this season (25 rushes-99 yards) Ryan Mathews is finally exhibiting the skills, deserving the respect given to a number one draft pick.

Chargers center Nick Hardwick -- one of the most tenured veterans -- commented on the improvement of Mathews this season. "He's just being very concise in his runs, clear in what he wants to get done, Hardwick said. "He knows

where the runs are intended to go. He's taken it there and is being very decisive getting downhill trusting his eyes, making it happen, and picking up extra yards as he's hit."

On the victory Sunday Hardwick said, "It was an awesome team win. The defense kept us in it. We had three turnovers. That was a lot of fun, and we're still in this thing. We're fired up in this locker room."

Also fired up was Chargers free safety Eric Weddle who made the play of the game. The Bolts defensive captain made an acrobatic interception late in the second quarter leading up to the Mathews touchdown run.

Welcome back Melvin Ingram. Forcing McGloin to fumble under a heavy pass rush, Ingram is returning to his pre-injury form, which has to present a scare for every opponent's quarterback.

With a pedestrian effort Philip Rivers completed 19-of-29 passes for 201-yards 1-TD, 1 INT. The interception came in the second quarter on a badly underthrown pass to Vincent Brown. Shrugging it off Rivers touchdown pass in the third quarter went to rookie wide-out sensation Keenan Allen

(4-yards) completing a 12-play 77-yard drive that consumed 6:18 on the clock.

Time of possession is a statistic the Chargers have dominated all season leading the NFL. Controlling the clock for 34.5 minutes to 25.5, the Chargers also dominated third down conversions with 6 out of 11.

The Special team's play of the game occurred when S Darrell Stuckey and WR Seyi Ajitutu stuck it to the Raiders kick returner forcing a fumble recovered by TE LaDarius Green.

What more could Chargers fans want? The team heads into the last week of the season with a chance to make the playoffs. Everything went right last Sunday. Can it happen again?

The Bolts will play the final game of the regular season (a meaningful one) this Sunday at Qualcomm Stadium against the Kansas City Chiefs. They need to win and get help with losses to Miami and Baltimore.

They also need rallying support from the fans at Qualcomm Stadium.

Nick Hardwick said last Sunday that no matter what happens next week get in or

don't get into the playoffs, we need to beat Kansas City to continue moving into the right direction."

wake of this giant ship of greed."

"I don't want to say that Marty does 'unconscious trilogies,' but 'Wolf' is thematically the same type of movie as Goodfellas and Casino," says DiCaprio. "It's like, 'What would the kids of those guys in Goodfellas go on to do?' The more I started researching Wall Street, the more I thought, 'These guys have an underworld mentality.'"

To convey Belfort's hard-charging selling power and charm, DiCaprio had constant contact with the man he played, who now lectures on morality in business.

"What he did was deplorable," says DiCaprio. "But I do respect anyone who's going to be forthright about his mistakes. He's not the way he was anymore."

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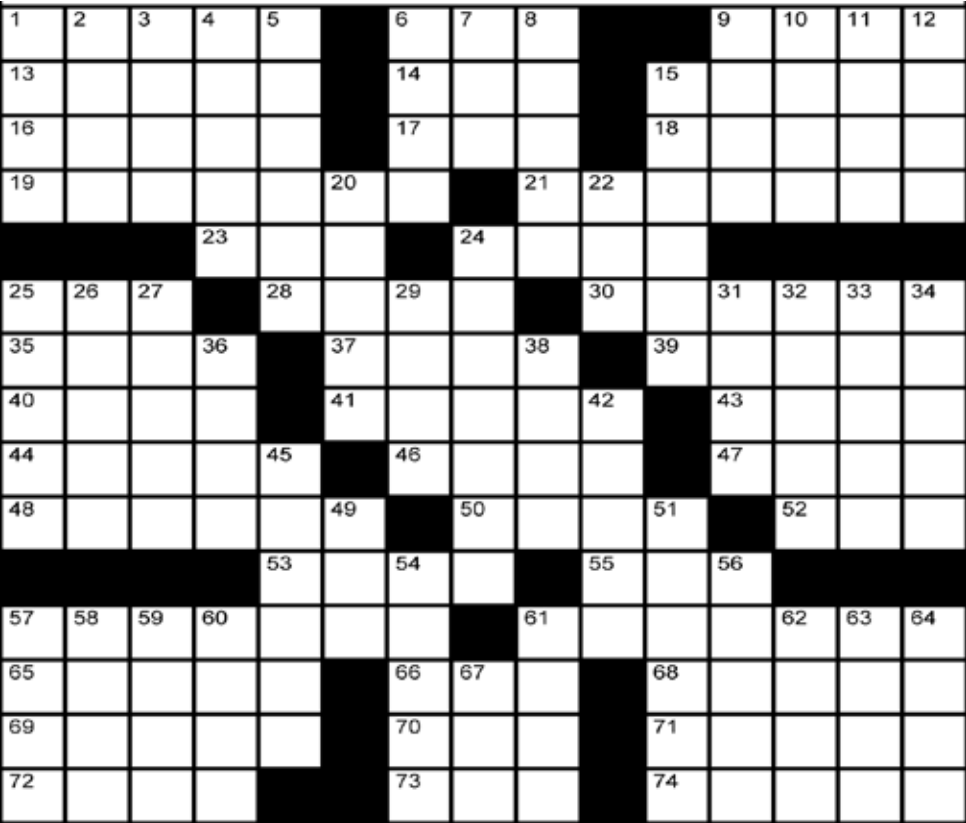

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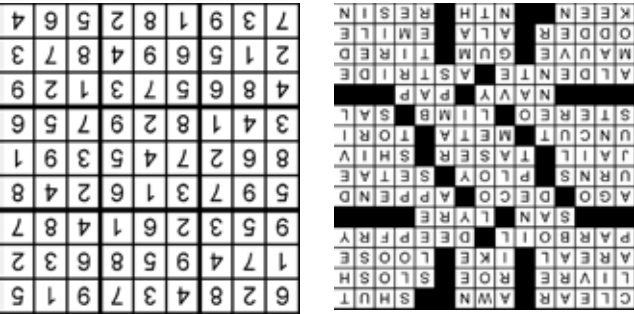
