## Belvedere Fundraiser

The murders of brothers Gianni and Salvatore Belvedere and Gianni's fiancé Ilona Flint are under investigation by the San Diego Police and Riverside Police with no arrests to date. Salvatore and Ilona were shot to death outside the Westfield Mission Valley Mall on December 24. Gianni was found dead in the trunk of his car in Riverside on January 17.

Sunday, April 13 the Belvedere family, hoping to keep attention on the case, held a fundraiser at the East Bound Bar and Grill, 10053 Main Avenue in Lakeside. The fundraiser was held from 3 to 11 p.m. and had a large number of items for auction. One of the items auctioned was a San Antonio Spurs signed ball, which went for \$400. The money raised from the fundraiser will go to Crime Stoppers. The funds is now at \$10,000. The family is hoping to raise the amount to \$50,000. A portion of East Bounds sales for the event will also go to the fund.

The brother's aunt Collette Donato said there were 30 members of the family involved in the fundraiser. Asked what she would say to the public Donato said "Please Pray, the family is praying for answers."

Anonymous tips may be made to Crime Stoppers at (888) 540-8477 or call the San Diego Police Department. The family plans more fundraisers to help draw more attention to the case. The brother's sister Antoinette said "If somebody knows something, please come forward."

**Joseph Coleman Drew "Joe"**  
**January 21, 1940 - April 9, 2014**

Joe Drew was born January 21, 1940 to Elmer Joseph Drew and Violet Coleman Drew in National City, CA. He was raised La Mesa, CA and attended Lemon Avenue School and Helix High School in La Mesa.

Drew attended the University of Wyoming where he met the love of his life, Kay, the very first week of school. After a motorcycle trip to the Panama Canal they married in September, 1962. Working at the local paper and on nearby ranches, he graduated in 1963 with a degree in Business Administration.

After joining the California National Guard at 17, Drew enrolled in ROTC in college and became a U.S. Army Officer in July 1963. He served two years in the regular U.S. Army Infantry as a 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant and a 1st Lieutenant. He was trained as an Army Ranger and was a Recon Platoon Leader and a Company Commander.

Upon leaving the Army Drew joined the family business, Drew Ford, started by his father Elmer in 1927. Drew Ford has been ranked as one of the 100 largest volume Ford dealers in the nation for 30 consecutive years. Joe Drew is known for treating his customers and employees fairly.

Drew was active in his business and community life, and helped raise funds for various organizations in the county and served on various boards. He received many honors over the years including; La Mesa "Man of the Year" in 1974, Grossmont Healthcare District Honoree of the Year, FFA Honorary Member for his support of the youth AG Program for East County, and named the Distinguished Alumnus of the University of Wyoming in 2013.

Drew was elected to the Grossmont High School District Board of Trustees and served as President. He was named a recipient of the 1989 *TIME* Magazine Quality Dealer Award. He served as Chairman on the National Ford Dealer Council of the Product Planning and Finance Committee, and was a founder of the San Diego Automotive Museum in Balboa Park.

Drew's hobbies over the years included hiking, back packing, running marathons, climbing the Matterhorn, riding motorcycles, hunting, fishing, organic gardening, woodworking, and history.

Joe Drew went home to the Lord on April 9, 2014. He is survived by his beloved wife, Kay; his daughter, Sarah Drew of Mill Valley; his son, Bill and daughter-in-law, Anna of Rancho Santa Fe; three grandchildren, Nicole, Paige and Greta; his sister, Esther Long of Parker Colorado and many nieces and nephews. His daughter Ann preceded him in death.

He loved his family and friends, and will be remembered as a generous, caring husband, father and friend. The family thanks Grossmont Sharp Hospice for all their care and support to their family.

**A** community "fun-raiser" with a country fair atmosphere will be held to honor Angela August on Sunday, April 27 from 1:00 to 5:00 PM at the Alpine Woman's Club. Angela was killed when her car was hit by a drunk driver on Interstate 8 near Alpine in June 2012, just five days before her graduation with honors from UCSD. Last year's event raised \$6000 for MADD (Mothers Against Drunk Drivers).

Channel 6 News Anchor Marc Bailey will emcee the event, which includes entertainment by music and dance groups every half hour; a petting zoo from Lakeside 4H; carnival games; arts and crafts for sale; face painting; art table; makeup consultant; massage therapist; silent auction and raffles; Alpine Outlaws jail; gourmet burgers; a dunk tank with local school principals and school board members; and a California Highway Patrol drunk driving demonstration.

The victim's mother, Dawn August, is coordinating the event again this year to bring awareness to the issue of drunk driving. August added that honoring the memory of her daughter with this "fun-raiser" helps their family heal from the devastation of Angela's death. "The day will be a celebration of Angela's favorite things, like music, dance, art, and animals." Since Angela loved pets, East County Animal Rescue and Wee Companions will be bringing rescued dogs, guinea pigs and bunnies that are available for adoption.

# More to this mirror than meets the eye

Many people admit shuddering when seeing their own image in a mirror while walking through their homes. In Mike Flanagan's *Oculus*, siblings Tim and Kaylie Russell do not want to look into the decorative mirror in their house either. But their reasons have nothing to do with vanity; it's because the mirror is haunted.

After the family acquired the mirror 10 years ago, strange things happened. Tim (Brenton Thwaites) and Kaylie's (Karen Gillian) parents ended up dead. Worse yet, Tim was blamed for killing his father and sent to a mental hospital. Now he's out, and Kaylie feels bad that she got to be raised in a foster home while her brother was held in confinement. She's determined to be there for him.

Tim appears a little taken aback when Kaylie reveals they are going back to live in their family home – mirror and all. She's convinced there are reasons their dad was murdered, and it was not Tim's fault. To prove this, Kaylie sets up a mess of studio equipment – a

cross between equipment used by NASA and an elaborate movie set – in their dad's former office. While Kaylie tries experiment after experiment that have some freaky/scary moments, Tim still insists his theory is the truth.

Although many flashbacks in this movie kind of break up the intense fright scenes, in a way they make those scenes seem more unrealistic. Actors playing the siblings as seen 10 years earlier are Garrett Ryan as Tim and Annalise Basso as Kaylie. Rory Cochrane and Katee Sackhoff portray their parents. At the time, everyone is excited about moving into the house. Mr. Russell likes the addition of the intriguing antique mirror in his office at first, but eventually the strange things that begin to happen frighten him into pure panic mode.

The heavyweights behind this movie have credible projects in the horror genre. Mike Flanagan, director, co-writer and editor of the film, also directed and wrote *Absentia* (2011). Jason Blum, who produced *Oculus*, also produced *Paranormal Activity*

1, 2, 3, 4 and the upcoming 5 as well as *Sinister*, *Insidious*, and more.

*Oculus* began as a short film in 2005. For the full-length feature, the filmmakers wanted to make more than a jump-and-scream horror film. They call it a "Mulder/Scully" dynamic, which refers to "The X-Files" – the adventures of two paranormal investigators with a theme of mysticism versus reason.

Co-writer Howard said, "It was one of the biggest challenges that Mike and I grappled with. When we finally hit on the idea of having the main characters be siblings who have a disagreement about these tragic events in their

past, that opened the door for a richer story."

The mirror, carefully chosen, dressed and even given a name (Phillip Lasser) emerged as just the right special character to help tell the writers' deeply thought-about story.

"In this case, the mirror's distortion impacts the way that the audience peers into the lives of Kaylie and Tim," Flanagan said. "The mirror is 'the prison through which we see this story.'"

Die-hard horror fans who want continuous scare and gore might find *Oculus* a little on the lighter side. But those who actually understand the premise will probably be entertained.

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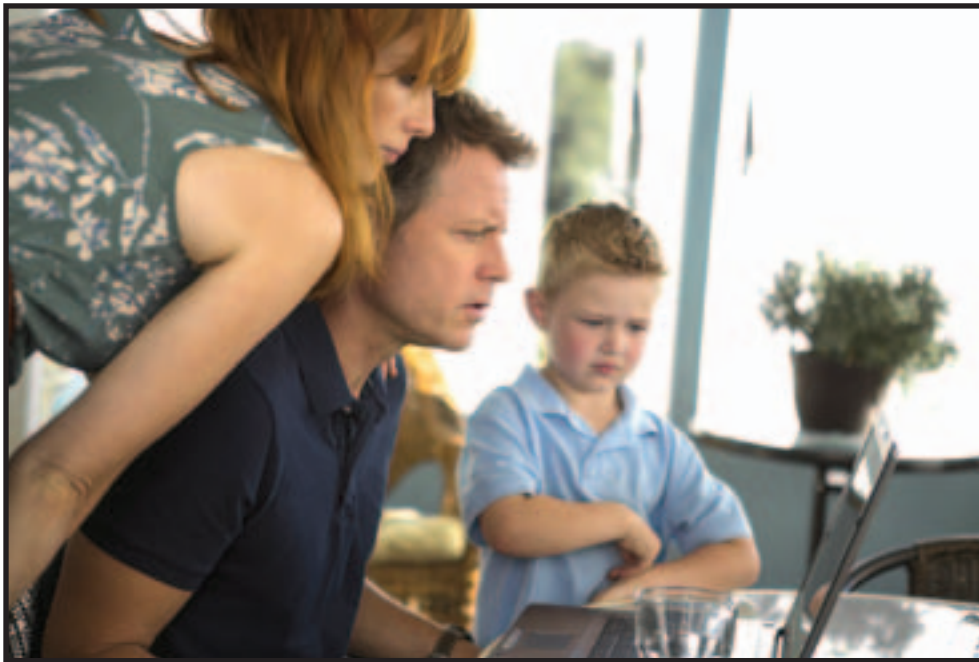

# 'Heaven Is For Real' — inspiring and based on a true story

Since November 2010 when the book *Heaven Is For Real* was released, the mystic of whether the story about a little boy visiting heaven while on the operating table was true or not has raised enormous interest and questions. Adapted from the book by Chris Parker and Randall Wallace (*Pearl Harbor*, *Braveheart*) the movie version of the book opens this week.

Todd Burpo's (Greg Kinnear, *As Good As It Gets*, *Little Miss Sunshine*) family lives in Imperial, Nebraska. Todd is a pastor of Crossroads Wesleyan Church, a volunteer firefighter, wrestling coach for the Junior High School and runs his own business. His wife Sonja (Kelly Reilly) is a stay at home mom taking care of their two children Colton (Connor Corum) and Cassie (Lane Styles).

Life is good for this family until Colton comes down with a serious illness and has to be rushed to a hospital and into emergency surgery. Todd and Sonja are inconsolable fearing they will lose their son. But he pulls through and soon is back home as the adorable and sweet child he's always been.

As their daily life returns to normal Colton begins to say bizarre things like he went to heaven while on the operating table. Sonja totally ignores this behavior, but Todd begins to really listen when Colton says things he could not know. He claims he saw his mom and dad in two different rooms at the hospital and that his dad, "Got mad and was yelling at God."

When Colton says he had a visit with his grandfather and actually picks out his picture as a youth that his father shows him, Todd begins to ask himself if this is really a possibility. Todd brings his belief that Colton did visit heaven to his church partners Jay (Thomas Haden Church, *Sideways*) and Nancy (Margo Martindale, *Secretariat*).

Sensitive to what the family has been through, they pray with Todd and offer their total support. But as more and more stories that seem hard to believe emerge and Todd actually talks about Colton's heavenly visits in his messages at church, Nancy becomes cantankerous and suggests they get a new pastor.

Todd already has enough pressure on him. With the world now hearing this story, work falling off, his wife refus-

ing to believe Colton's story and now the possibility of losing his job as a pastor, life becomes more complicated.

Kinnear is exceptional in this role in many ways. He brings sensitivity to the emotional arc of the story and in treating his son yet he has the strength to get his family through tough financial times. Kinnear also shows great humanity as a pastor seeking answers but providing them for his wife and congregation. Love for Todd's family pours out, and every time Todd looks at his wife, love beams up in Kinnear's eyes.

Corum's role as Colton is as extraordinary as this story. Picked from many young actors' try outs as this role was critical to the story, Corum was selected for his first film role. He's so adorable, the oohs and aahs pour out from audience

members every time Colton is on screen. He and Kinnear bonded instantly.

"He's kind of the greatest version of an actor, in the sense that everything that he does is on instinct, it's effortless, and it's just kind of there without any artificiality to it. It really makes me mad," Kinnear quipped.

Church rounds out the cast well as the local banker but also Todd's good friend. Reilly shows the love that Sonja has for her husband even during times she wants him to stop encouraging Colton to talk about his experience.

The cinematography by Dean Semler (*Maleficent*, *Secretariat*) is exquisite. He captures the mid-western town of Nebraska beautifully. The gorgeous blue skies and the sunlight beaming off the corn silk are perfect travel enticements.

This story was destined to fall into the hands of Randall Wallace and TriStar Pictures executive DeVon Franklin agreed.

"Very few directors have a

sense of the human spirit, and where that spirit fits within the context of all of our experiences in the world, and Randy is one of those directors that sees the bigger picture, but also has not lost the ability to translate the common touch," Franklin said. "What he's done on this film goes beyond anything we were hoping for. He brings such humanity to even simple scenes, right down to the family at the kitchen table."

Obviously Wallace accepted this challenge with an open mind maybe knowing this film could be perceived in different ways and not really putting a footprint on any of them, but letting everyone who sees it come to their own conclusion.

"What I think will draw

people to *Heaven Is For Real* is the idea that they're going to be captivated by a story," Wallace said. "People want to be moved, they want to be grabbed, and they want to be spoken to from the heart."

Taking their real-life story to the big screen must have been a difficult decision for the Burpo family as they realized the film's release would raise questions they would have to answer. Colton is now in high school and continues to speak openly about his experiences. Moore about the family is available at <http://heavenisforreal.net/>

## Cat doesn't like road trips? Tips to help Fluffy enjoy the ride

Let him explore, rub around, and spread his scent around the car. Repeat this for a few minutes each day, gradually increasing the time you spend in the car as you go along.

### 3. Positive Reinforcement:

Once your cat feels calm and comfortable in the car, begin feeding him in the car every day for at least a week. If your cat isn't particularly food-motivated, let him indulge in some play or catnip instead. Associating the car with good, happy things will help make your cat a better traveler.

### 4. Introduce Carrier in Car:

Once your cat sees the car as his territory and the source of good things, you can introduce

him to the idea of being inside the travel carrier in the car. Place your cat in the carrier, and put the carrier in the back seat or cargo area of your vehicle, making sure that the carrier is secure and away from airbags. Then, turn on the engine. Don't drive anywhere - just let your cat get used to the noise and vibration. Do this at least three times a day until your cat gets used to it. Make sure to reward your cat for his patience as soon as he is let out of his carrier.

**5. Short Rides:** Once your cat is used to the car and engine, it's time to get moving. Start by driving up and down the length of your driveway a few times. When the ride is over, take your cat into the house and reward him with play time and treats. When you feel he's ready, extend your trip and drive around the block. Continue taking drives with your cat, gradually increasing the length and duration of the ride each time, and taking care to reward him after each new step in the process. Be sure to take things slowly listen to your cat - he will let you know if he's not comfortable with the speed of the "car training."

**6. Calm Energy:** Your cat can sense your energy. If you are feeling hyped up and stressed, he will too. It's very important for you to stay calm, relaxed and unhurried throughout the process.
