Soft opening of Lakeside Skate Park

Lakeside Skate Park soft opening and ribbon cutting drew hundreds of skaters on April 25. From the first meeting on June 21, 2009, the core group, later known as the Friends of the Lakeside Skate Park, made up their minds Lakeside would have its own skate park for the youth of the community.

There were hurdles along the way, but the group never gave up and the day arrived for the opening of the Park. Seeing the youth of Lakeside waiting at the edge of the skate park for the ribbon cutting and first ride, made the months of hard work worthwhile. One member of Friends of the Lakeside Skate Park, remarked "the day seemed surreal."

Brian Albright, from County Parks and Recreation, told the crowd, "It's often said build it and they will come, but in Lakeside people said, we're already here; let's build it."

County Supervisor Diane Jacob said, "Lakeside has its own skate Park in the unincorporated area in a perfect location. This is an example of a community rallying around its youth. This is a home grown project."

Anton's Contractor Services were recognized for the quality project and the extensive use of local sub-contractors. Local subcontractor Bob's Crane Service donated 15 trees to replace the trees removed during construction of the skate park. Together Anton's Services and Bob's Crane Service planted

12 Palm trees and three Pepper trees.

Founding member of the Friends of the Lakeside Skate Park, Jerry Mosier said, "The Lakeside Skate Park was designed to be an all wheels park. This is your skate park Lakeside."

Miki Vuckovich was present representing the Tony Hawk Foundation and told the crowd the Lakeside skate park is now one of 4,000 in the country. This puts Lakeside on the map.

The minute the ribbon was cut everyone with wheels hit the park.

State law, not County Parks and Recreation, or Friends of Lakeside Skate Park, set the

regulations. Moiser suggested anyone with an issue regarding the regulations should contact their local legislator.

During the April 30 Coffee with Captain Event; Captain James Bovet of the Santee station fielded questions regarding the skate park. One of the concerns voiced about the enforcement of the park regulations was about the hours, like the skate park is being used as early as 6 and 7 a.m. when the park doesn't open until 9 a.m. Captain Bovet told the audience Skate Rules and Regulations will be strictly enforced by the Sheriffs, with tickets issued when necessary.

The official Grand Opening for the Lakeside Skate Park is scheduled for June 21, 2014.

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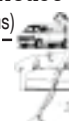

El Cajon celebration planned For NASCAR Champion Jimmie Johnson

The El Cajon City Council is recognizing El Cajon native Jimmie Johnson for his racing accomplishments and philanthropic contributions to the community on Tuesday, June 17, as he returns to El Cajon for this special celebration. The City is encouraging everyone to attend and show their support for one of NASCAR's biggest stars.

El Cajon Mayor Bill Wells, the City Council, Senator Joel Anderson, and other local dignitaries will be honoring Johnson during a special ceremony beginning promptly at 11 a.m. local time. Additionally, portions of the event will be broadcast live on 101.5 KGB.

Johnson continues to make his hometown proud. In 2013, he won his sixth NASCAR Sprint Cup Series championship, adding to a NASCAR record five championships in a row (2006-2010). At just 38, he is the youngest driver to win six titles. His 66 Sprint Cup wins since 2002 ties him for eighth on the all-time wins list.

Despite his extremely busy schedule, Johnson still visits San Diego each year, not only to see family, but to give back to the community through the Jimmie Johnson Foundation. To date, his Foundation has given more than \$6.5 million dollars to schools here in El Cajon and across the nation.

You know that you can count on its trusty shot of caffeine to rev you up and get you started on your busy day. Except: The early hours of the morning generally are not the best time of day for a

caffeine boost—which means that many people are drinking their coffee all wrong.

It's a question of chronopharmacology, or how drugs (including caffeine) interact with our natural biologic rhythms, I heard from internist and endocrinologist Joseph J. Pinzone, MD, CEO and medical director of Amai Medical & Wellness in Santa Monica

and assistant clinical professor of medicine at the David Geffen School of Medicine at the University of California, Los Angeles. Here's what Dr. Pinzone thinks you really ought to be doing and why—but don't worry, you don't have to give up your beloved joe...

The Cortisol/Caffeine connection

A primary effect of caffeine is to trigger the release of the hormone cortisol, which is related to a number of functions, including alertness and the stress response. The more cortisol that's circulating in your system, the more energized and awake you feel. But: Cortisol levels naturally rise first thing in the morning (typically between 6 a.m. and 8 a.m., depending on an individual's sleep/wake cycle). "Your body doesn't really need the caffeine at that point because cortisol levels are already rising as you're waking up," said Dr. Pinzone.

Then why do so many people crave coffee before their feet even hit the floor? It's more a matter of habit than chronobiology. People think that the coffee is revving them up because its first-thing-in-the-morning consumption

happens to coincide with the body's natural cortisol surge. But biochemically, the caffeine is redundant at that point — and what's more, by consuming caffeine when it's not really needed, your body builds up tolerance to it, diminishing its ability to provide that longed-for energy jolt.

Cortisol levels do not remain consistent throughout the day. After the early-morning rise, cortisol dips in midmorning... peaks again around midday... falls again... rises once more between 4 and 6 p.m... and then ebbs before bedtime.

What this means, coffee-wise...

- For maximum energy-boosting impact, delay your first cup of java until the mid-morning cortisol slump starts to sap your stamina, typically at around 10 a.m., Dr. Pinzone suggested.

- Then, instead of having another cup with lunch, wait until your midafternoon energy dip, which for many people occurs at around 2 p.m. A cup of coffee then could help you power through the rest of your workday.

- As for the evening drop in cortisol, you probably are best off just letting it happen. After all, it's helping your body prepare for sleep, and caffeine at that point could interfere with your slumber. But go ahead and experiment if you want to, Dr. Pinzone said — if you enjoy an evening burst of energy and are still able to sleep just fine, a dinnertime cup (or half-cup) of coffee could be OK for you.

Lots more great reasons to drink coffee: A well-timed energy boost is not the only advantage of drinking coffee.

off the assembly line on July 6, 1943. Most C-53's assigned to the USAF trained with the 101st Airborne Screaming Eagles) and the 82nd Airborne (All-American) which will be represented by re-enactors at "AirShow San Diego" for 2014.

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Dull web of repetition in new 'Spider-man'

Super heroes have fascinated fans for decades, so when they went from comic books to films the potential fell at the feet of filmmakers. The latest to hit the big screen is Marvel's *The Amazing Spider-Man 2* with Andrew Garfield returning as the great and surprising Spider-Man.

After a little catch up on how Peter Parker, aka Spider-Man, lost his parents, the action begins. Parker is always a quick costume change away from imminent rescues, and in New York City there is always someone to rescue.

Those unfamiliar with the Spider-Man legacy might enjoy the slow move into the real heart of this story, including all about the Parker family, the spider that started everything, and how Peter came to live with his aunt and uncle. Aunt May, now a widow, shares her home with Peter. Fights about who will do his laundry aside, it seems nice to see Peter show genuine affection for his aunt, played superbly by Sally

Meanwhile, Spider-Man's romance with Gwen Stacy (Emma Stone) has reached a fever pitch. He wants her to stay out of harm's way but can't seem to be away from her for very long. She's the

same, trying not to interfere with his Spider-Man duties and even agreeing that maybe they should break up. That's hard to imagine, since they can't keep their hands off of each other. But Parker thinks he sees the image of her deceased father at times warning him not to let his daughter get hurt.

Like the bounce in the stones hitting rough points through the water, so does the relationship between the two when Harry once again sees Spider-Man as the enemy.

The 3-D action is fun but the story doesn't seem to offer

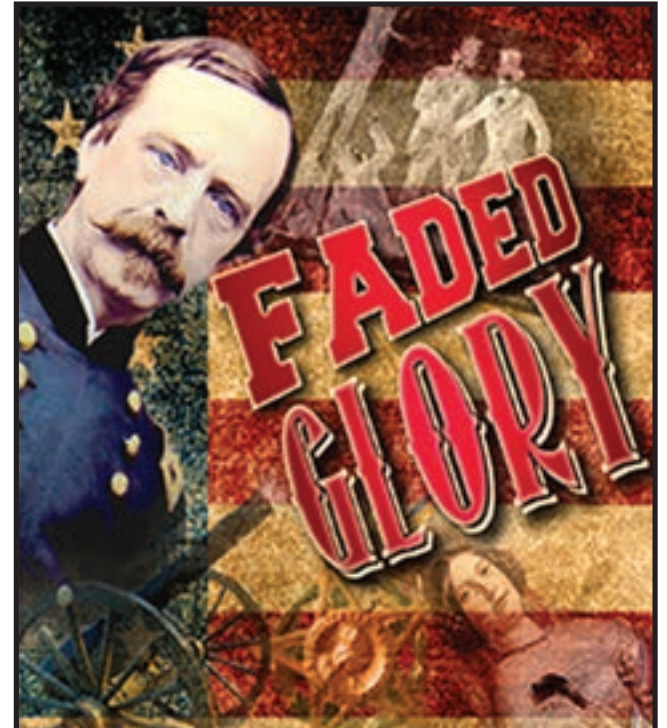

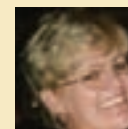

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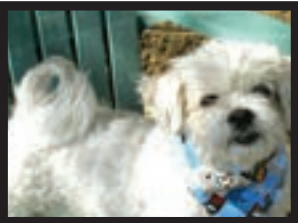
