Water Authority recommends mandatory water-use restrictions

Potable water use has declined by 20 percent in San Diego County 2007-2014; per capita water use in region already below 2020 conservation target

In response to deepening drought conditions and new statewide directives, the San Diego County Water Authority staff will recommend that the agency's Board of Directors activate the next stage of the region's drought response plan next week and declare a Level 2 Drought Alert calling for mandatory water conservation measures to prevent water waste. The actions would help San Diego County keep as much water as possible in storage for 2015 and comply with emergency water conservation mandates approved today by the State Water Resources Control Board.

State regulations, which are focused on ornamental landscapes and turf grass that use potable water, take effect Aug. 1. The Water Authority's Board will consider its response at its next meeting on July 24.

The region's Model Drought Response Ordinance identifies four levels of drought response with progressive water-use restrictions designed to align demand with supply during water shortages. The Board declared a Level 1 Drought Watch condition on Feb. 13. Level 1 outlines a number of voluntary practices to encourage increased water conservation. Level 2 makes Level 1 measures mandatory, and it adds outdoor watering restrictions such as limiting landscape irrigation to no more than three days per week. During the months of November through May, landscape irrigation is limited to no more than once per week. Level 2 manda-

tory conservation measures in the model ordinance include:

- Limiting outdoor watering days and times
- Watering only during the late evening or early morning hours
- Eliminating runoff from irrigation systems
- Repairing all leaks within 72 hours
- Turning off water fountains and other water features unless they use recycled water
- Using hoses with shut-off valves for washing cars (or patronizing commercial car washes that re-circulate water)
- Serving water to restaurant patrons only upon request
- Offering hotel guests the

option of not laundering towels and linens daily

- Using recycled or non-potable water for construction when available

Local rules may vary based on regulations adopted by member agencies. City councils and water district boards will have to take action to activate mandatory water-use restrictions in their jurisdictions.

Proposed changes to the Water Authority's drought response level follow months of record-breaking high temperatures and increasing concerns statewide about maintaining storage reserves for 2015 and beyond. Earlier today, the State Water Resources Control Board in Sacramento adopted emergency water conservation regulations that establish mandatory water-saving measures statewide. Those prohibitions are primarily aimed at reducing how much water is used outdoors, where more than half of the total water is used at a typical single-family home.

"Regional investments and a demonstrated commitment to conservation have buffered San Diego County from the worst effects of the drought so far, but we believe the right thing to do now is to move to mandatory water conservation measures," said Maureen Stapleton, general manager of the Water Authority. "We don't know how long this drought will last – and the unusually hot and dry conditions have made it more challenging to save water with voluntary efforts."

The Water Authority is not anticipating cutbacks to its imported water supplies this year that would trigger mandatory supply cutbacks to its member agencies, however, that could happen next year if conditions don't improve. The region's improved water supply reliability is the result of two decades of investments by the San Diego region to diversify its water supply sources, investments in Southern California reservoir storage and a sharp reduction in regional water use since 2007.

The San Diego region's largest water supplier, the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California, is expected to deliver approximately 1.1 million acre-feet of water from storage to meet demand in its service area this year, reducing MWD's reserves by about half. If MWD allocates water to its

member agencies next year, the impacts of those reductions will be moderated in San Diego County by regional investments in additional sources, such as the Colorado River water transfers and the Carlsbad Desalination Project, which is expected to produce water as soon as fall 2015.

State and local water officials have been monitoring current drought conditions since 2012. After the start of a third straight dry year in 2014, Gov. Jerry Brown declared a drought-related state of emergency Jan. 17 and asked for voluntary water conservation statewide.

On Feb. 13, the Water Authority's Board went to Level 1 Drought Watch and formally activated the agency's Water Shortage and Drought Response Plan, which outlines a series of orderly and progressive steps for the Water Authority to take during drought conditions. That plan, designed to minimize impacts to the region's economy and quality of life, played a key role in helping member agencies manage water supply challenges during the last major

drought. The Water Authority went to Level 2 in July 2009 and advised its member agencies to reduce their water use by an average of 8 percent in response to supply reductions by MWD. By the time water supply improvements allowed for the end of mandatory cutbacks in April 2011, the region had cut its water use by about 20 percent. The proposed Level 2 Drought Alert actions are intended to achieve water savings of up to 20 percent.

In April, the Water Authority launched its drought outreach campaign, "When in Drought: Save every day, every way." The campaign includes ads, public service announcements, online communications and drought reminders provided by community partners in public places such as San Diego International Airport and Petco Park. The campaign is located online at www.whenindrought.org.

Despite conservation efforts, extremely hot and dry conditions pushed up regional water use an estimated 3.5 percent in fiscal year 2014 compared to

How to re-cover a dining room chair

Gather Supplies and Remove Seat Cushion

Remove seat cushion from chair frame and original fabric from cushion. Tip: When selecting the new fabric, choose one that coordinates with the decor of your dining room.

Cut Lining

Place seat frame with cushion side face down on lining. Trace three inches out from edge of cushion around entire frame using temporary fabric pen. Cut along line.

Staple Lining to Cushion Frame

Attach lining to frame using staple gun. Begin by stapling lining to frame at center point of each side, and then at each corner, pulling fabric tautly around frame. After sides and corners are stapled in place, continue securing lining to frame by working from center point to corner.

Trim Lining

Trim excess fabric along outer edge of staple line.

Cut Fabric

Place lined seat frame face down on fabric. Trace three inches out from edge of cushion around entire frame using temporary fabric pen. Cut along line. Tip: If using a patterned fabric, appropriately position the design on the seat cushion.

Staple Fabric to Cushion Frame

Attach fabric to frame using staple gun. Begin by stapling fabric to frame at the center point of each side, and then at each corner, pulling fabric tautly around frame.

They soon quieted down and were fixated on the screen watching the movie unfold. I sighed a deep sigh of relief and went back into my previous stupor. I tried to follow the movie, but then I remem-

bered that in the afternoon I had to write a column for my newspapers. As of yet, I did not have an idea what that column would be. As I mused about this, thoughts were beginning to gel and that little light bulb began to flicker. Thoughts were beginning to come into place, and then I heard some loud screaming and clapping and two little girls were jumping up and down singing, "Let it go, let it go, let it go."

"Grandpa," both of them yelled at me in absolute delight, "sing the song with us."

What grandpa's go through while entertaining their grandchildren.

I made a deal with them at that time, "I will sing with you, but I certainly will not dance with you." A grandfather has to draw the line somewhere. And so, I joined in singing, "Let it go, let it go, let it go." I got those words down pretty good, but the rest of the song was a mysterious blank to me. They were excited about singing it and soon I was excited about watching them sing it.

Attach fabric at corners

After sides and corners are stapled in place, continue securing fabric to frame by working from center point to each corner. Pull fabric snugly around curved corners to eliminate tucks on top side of cushion.

Reattach seat cushion to chair frame

After seat cushion is covered with new fabric, reattach to chair frame using original hardware.

Historic San Vicente Dam Raise project completed

San Vicente Dam Raise timeline

- **June 2009** – Work begins to prepare original dam and foundation.
- **Sept. 2011** – Crews place first layer of concrete for raised dam.
- **May 2012** – Raised dam reaches 220 feet, the height of the old dam.
- **Sept. 2012** – Raised dam reaches full height of 337 feet.
- **June 2014** – Dam raise complete, refilling of reservoir to original capacity under way.
- **Late 2014** – Marina complete. (Reservoir expected to reopen to recreation by 2017, depending on water supply availability for refilling.)

The largest water storage project in San Diego County history is complete, providing the region with a critical hedge against future water shortages.

The San Vicente Dam Raise

project adds 152,000 acre-feet of water storage capacity to the reservoir, enough to serve more than 300,000 homes for a year. Filling the reservoir will take two to five years, depending on water supply and demand conditions state-

wide. The newly added storage volume is greater than any reservoir in the county.

The San Vicente Dam Raise Project is the largest piece and final major element of the Water Authority's \$1.5 billion Emergency Storage Project, a system of reservoirs, interconnected pipelines, and pumping stations designed to ensure a six-month supply of water for the San Diego region in case imported water deliveries are interrupted – for instance, by an earthquake. About one-third of the reservoir's new capacity – 52,000 acre-feet – is for emergency use. The project also provides 100,000 acre-feet of "carryover" storage that is designed to be filled during wet years and tapped in dry years.

The dam raise project cost \$416 million. Related projects that include a surge tank, a pump station and 11 miles of large-diameter underground pipeline brought the overall cost to \$838 million.

Approximately 200 state and local water leaders, elected officials, civic and business leaders, and community stakeholders attended a dam raise dedication celebration at the project site on Wednesday.

"This vital enhancement to the region's water storage system will protect our economy and quality of life during future droughts and water supply emergencies," said Thomas V. Wornham, Chair of the Water Authority's Board of Directors. "It proves once again that our region's water agencies, civic leaders and ratepayers are committed to doing what it takes to maintain a reliable supply of water, not only for today but for generations to come."

San Vicente Dam has been owned and operated by the city of San Diego since it was built in 1943 to hold 90,000 acre-feet of water for city customers. Capacity in the enlarged reservoir is shared by the city (90,000 acre-feet) and the Water Authority (152,000 acre-feet). The Water Authority and the city will share the cost of operating the expanded reservoir.

"This project improves water security for everyone living in the San Diego region as well as thousands of businesses that depend on a reliable water source to thrive," said San Di-

ego Mayor Kevin L. Faulconer. "I'm proud the city helped make this happen with our great partners at the San Diego County Water Authority. This project provides a template for how we can complete bold and visionary projects by working together."

John Laird, secretary of the California Natural Resources Agency, also attended Wednesday's ceremony. "Ongoing statewide drought conditions highlight the need for forward-thinking projects like the San Vicente Dam Raise," Laird said. "The Water Authority should be congratulated for starting this project well before the current drought hit, and all Californians should see this as an example of what's possible with good planning and strong financial commitment to water supply reliability."

San Diego Regional Chamber of Commerce President and CEO Jerry Sanders praised the Water Authority's efforts to diversify its water supplies so that the region is no longer dependent on a single supplier for almost all of its water. "This has been a top public policy priority at the Chamber for years," Sanders said. "By combining a diversified set of water supply sources with greatly enhanced storage capacity, we are developing a more robust safety net for San Diego County."

"A reliable water supply is critical for economic growth and maintaining a competitive business climate," said Mark Cafferty, president and CEO of the San Diego Regional Economic Development Corp. "The raised dam will enhance San Diego County's position as a prime spot for starting or growing a company because it provides greater assurance that we can weather future droughts and emergencies."

Construction started in 2000 on the comprehensive set of water storage and delivery enhancements that are part of the Water Authority's Emergency Storage Project. The project included building Olivenhain Dam in North County along with a pipeline connecting Olivenhain Reservoir to the Water Authority's Second Aqueduct, an 11-mile pipeline connecting San Vicente Reservoir to the Water Authority's Second Aqueduct, and pumping facilities at Lake Hodges and San Vicente Reservoir. The expanded pipeline system

allows for regional distribution of water during emergencies.

Expanding San Vicente Reservoir started as a part of the Emergency Storage Project. After Water Authority studies showed the need for more carryover storage in the region, the dam raise was "super-sized" to also include dry-year storage in the reservoir.

"By combining two projects into one, we were able to make a huge addition to our water reserves more quickly and continue our legacy of optimiz-

ing our assets for regional benefit," said Maureen Stapleton, general manager of the Water Authority. "Super-sizing the dam raise proved to be the best way to realize the water supply benefits the region needed at the best value for ratepayers."

Preparatory work on the foundation for the enlarged San Vicente Dam began in June 2009, and construction concluded in June 2014. The dam now stands 337 feet tall, an increase of 117 feet. It was the tallest dam raise in the na-

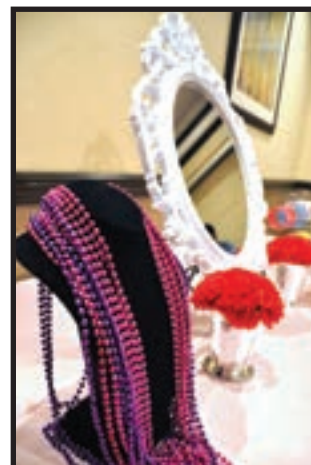

Boat buys season scams

Some red flags you're about to be taken for a ride



It's summer boating season and some boat buyers and sellers are getting ripped off, say's Boat Owners Association of The United States (BoatUS). The national boater advocacy, safety and services group outlined the top boat selling scams reported to its Consumer Protection Bureau and offers some ways to greatly improve your chance of a smooth sale or purchase – and when to walk away.

Getting a cashier's check or money for more than asking price: Anytime a buyer offers to pay more for the asking price of the boat your are selling – run away. Today, it's easy for criminals to print counterfeit bank checks, and by the time your bank figures out the loss, the bad guys are far away, and you will be liable for the lost funds. Always

contact the financial institution on which the check was drawn to verify the account, but don't dial the phone number printed on the check, if possible. The amount of the bank check should also match in numerals and words, and the account number should not be shiny in appearance. Official checks are generally perforated on at least one side.

A twist on the same for the electronic age: Recently PayPal has become a target for scammers. A phony buyer again asks to send substantially more than the asking price. Later, you get a fake confirmation email from PayPal with your user ID for more than the agreed purchase price – with instructions from the buyer advising you to send the extra money to a shipper. The scam can seem even more legit – if you refuse, you may receive additional fake email notices from PayPal threatening to close your account if you don't transfer the extra money as per your "agreement."

An escrow service scam: A bogus seller advertises a boat

on a website at a low, but not scam-worthy price. When the scammer finds a buyer, they will tell them to use a legitimate sounding yet fictitious escrow service, like GoogleMoney.com. But once the funds are transferred, you'll never hear from the seller again. It's wise to use an escrow service for a long-distance purchase, but be very cautious with escrow services you're not familiar with, and go with established providers such as eBay's Escrow.com.

Email red flags that mean you may be taken for a ride: Poor grammar, spelling and language use; no phone number for the buyer/seller; generic references (ex. "merchandise") to the boat being sold; changing names and locations in emails; a buyer who shows no interest in haggling over price or seeing the boat firsthand; a buyer or seller who has no interest in discussing titling or verifying the boat's Hull Identification Number (HIN).

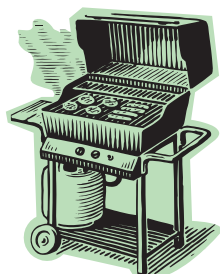

An Orphan Car is: “any marque or brand of vehicle produced by a company that has discontinued business entirely.” The name is often confused with a brand that is terminated while the parent company continues to exist (e.g. Pontiac, Oldsmobile, etc.)

True orphan cars are brands like Packard, Cord, Auburn, Pierce-Arrow, Hudson, etc.) Historians agree that more than 2,000 automotive companies world-wide have gone out of business during the last 120 years. Most of them came and went from 1900-1920. A narrow slice of the B section includes:

- Blood (1902-1905), Borland Electric (1910-1916)
- Brew-Hatcher (1904-1905), Brogan (1946-1952), Bryan (1918-1923), Buckmobile (1903-1905), Burg (1910-1913).

Even successful companies

went out of business. Studebaker started production with covered wagons in the 1850’s. By 1902, the company began to experiment with electric-powered vehicles. They started producing combustion engine cars in 1904 and sold them for more than 60 years. Sadly, the factory closed in 1966. Studebaker is gone.

Nash started in 1916. It had an excellent reputation for trucks and innovative cars. It no longer exists because of image problems and the fact that it was ahead of its time. It suffered from identity issues through a series of sales. The path for Nash was: Nash to Nash-Kelvinator, to Nash Rambler, to American Motors Corporation, to AMC/Renault, to Chrysler, to Daimler-Chrysler, to now...Fiat.

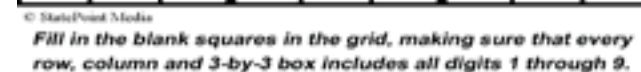

the prior fiscal year. However, even with this weather-driven increase, water use in San Diego County has declined 20 percent since 2007.

Rainfall at Lindbergh Field is about half of normal so far in 2014, and average temperatures at Lindbergh Field are the highest since at least 1940 for January through May. While there is a high likelihood of an El Niño weather phenomenon forming this fall and winter, forecasters are beginning to downgrade its strength, lowering its potential to produce heavy rain and snow that California needs this winter to stabilize water supplies.

More than 80 percent of respondents to a March public opinion survey by the Water Authority said they consider

tion and the tallest in the world using a construction technique called roller-compacted concrete. Roller-compacted concrete is just as strong as conventional concrete but takes less time and water. It is placed in layers, one on top of the other, in a process that resembles road construction.

Concrete for the San Vicente project was custom-designed to match the strength of the original dam, allowing the two sections of concrete to function as one unit. Almost all of the concrete was produced on site with material mined from the hillsides near the old marina, avoiding 100,000 delivery truck trips through the local community.

The Water Authority also conducted a comprehensive environmental mitigation program for the project. The program met all wildlife agency permit requirements and created, enhanced, restored or preserved more than 670 acres of sensitive upland and wetland habitats from Oceanside to Imperial Beach. In many locations, the mitigation pro-

gram resulted in multiple public benefits, such as watershed protection and preserving existing trail systems.

Now that work is finished on the dam, remaining construction projects in the area include the completion of a new, improved marina that will feature twice as many boat launch lanes, a longer boat ramp and more parking spaces. In addition, a new pipeline will be built for the city of San Diego to replace a section that will be under water when the expanded reservoir is full. The ancillary projects are expected to be completed in 2015.

The city of San Diego plans to reopen the reservoir to the public as soon as the water level reaches the new boat ramp, which will depend on the availability of imported water and local rainfall along with local water demand.

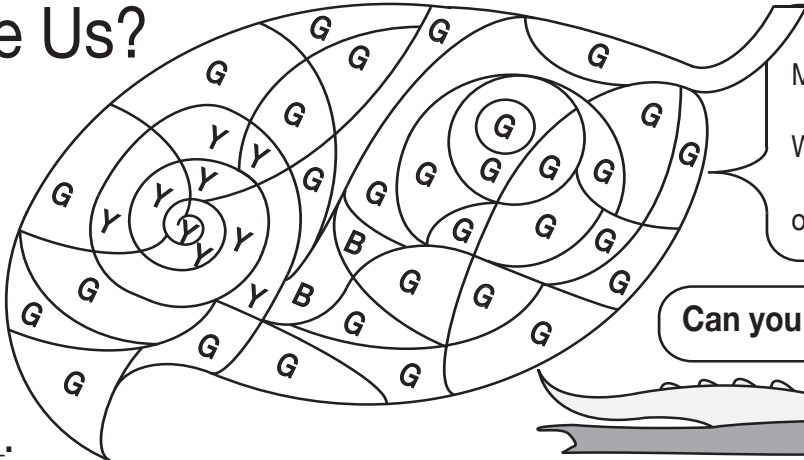

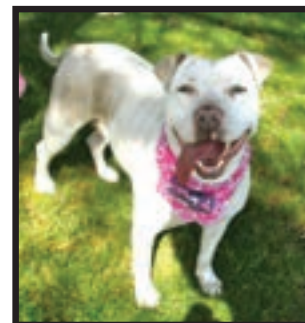

Dog beach outing: Tips and Do's and Don'ts

With the weather heating up, it's time to start checking out some dog friendly beaches with your four-legged friend! For most dogs, getting to run around in the sand, dip into the waves, and fetch balls out of the water is the best day ever! Here are some tips to ensure that you and your dog have a fun and safe beach experience.

First things first

Check with your local beaches before you pack up the dog, since not all beaches allow them. Depending on the time of year, some beaches allow dogs during the off-season, but summer is a different story. Call ahead or visit the beach's website for information. It's also important if you can bring your dog, to find out whether or not they need to be on leash or if they can roam free. Bring a long leash no matter what, but know ahead of time if there will be an area where a leash isn't necessary. If they don't need to have a leash, only let them be without it if you know for an absolute fact that they will respond to your voice commands. Other dogs, people, certain scents, birds, etc, may catch their attention and cause them to tune you out, which could be a recipe for disaster (no one wants a dog fight). Some people on the beach (as well as easily frightened children) will be less

dog-friendly than others, so be mindful of who your dog might be approaching to avoid any sort of snafu.

Never, EVER leave your dog unattended. Even the most well-trained dog can get distracted; pay extra special attention to your surroundings and any potential situations that may cause your dog to wander or run off. Follow ALL of the rules set by the beach. You don't want to be the reason that dogs aren't allowed at that particular beach anymore.

Pro swimmer or doggie swim vest?

If you want to bring your dog to the beach, you probably have a good idea that your furry friend loves to swim. If this is the first time your dog will be swimming, you may want to read up on his breed just to be sure. For example, sharpei's tend to be afraid of water. Obviously there are exceptions to the rule, but finding out if swimming is characteristic of the breed will be a good indicator of how enthusiastic (or timid) they might be. When you bring the pup to the water, if he isn't diving right in, take it slow. Don't force your dog to go in. He may feel more comfortable if you head in first and call him. If you're nervous or unsure, purchasing a dog life vest to bring with you would be a safe bet.

Dog beach don'ts:

- Don't let your dogs go into areas on the beach where they're not allowed. Dunes and grassy areas need to be protected from any sort of environmental damage that a dog might cause.

- Don't let your dog out of your site. Not even once. Paying attention and being proactive will go a long way in protecting you and your dog. The last thing you want is to be sued for a dog fight or by someone that had a run-in with your dog.

- Don't forget to bring the leash, beach towels, umbrella, fresh water, and doggie sunscreen (yes, you can actually get sunscreen specifically made for dogs).

- Don't leave a mess behind! Don't count on the beach supplying waste bags, so bring your own and be diligent about cleaning up. No one wants to find a surprise just laying on the beach or buried in the sand.

Dog beach dos:

- Do make sure your dog's vaccinations are current and that he's wearing the proper ID. Keep your vet's number on hand just in case something happens.

- Do check the ocean for jellyfish and stingrays. A sting to your dog will be sure to ruin both his and your experience.

- Do set a time limit for your beach trip. A couple hours might be just the right amount of time at the beach, depending on your dog's activity level. At the first sign of your dog tiring, pack it up and get back on the road.
