CPUC hosts public participation hearings on Thursday

The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) will hold a series of Public Participation Hearings throughout the state to hear directly from the public about cases at the

CPUC related to electricity rates. Regarding "rate design" - restrictions on residential rate design were lifted after the signing of Assembly Bill 327 in October 2013, and utilities can now propose residential rates that are more reflective of cost. The CPUC is currently evaluating a residential electric rate design change proposal that could include baseline percentage changes and time of use rates. The CPUC is holding a series of Public Participation Hearings in Phase 1 of its proceeding (R.12-06-013) to provide an opportunity for customers of Southern California Edison, Pacific Gas and Electric Company, and San Diego Gas & Electric to communicate directly with the CPUC about how proposed rate design changes, if approved, would impact them. The CPUC's Public Advisor's Office will be available at each Hearing to advise customers on reading their utility bills, to help resolve billing problems, to explain available programs to reduce costs to customers, to distribute information about the CPUC and provide information on how to participate in CPUC proceedings. Public Participation Hearings will be held in El Cajon on Thursday, Sept. 18 at 2 and 6:30 p.m. in the El Cajon City Council Chambers, 200 Civic Center Way, El Cajon, CA 92020.

Comments from the public can help the CPUC reach an informed decision, and consumers are encouraged to attend Public Participation Hearings. For more information on

Food for Thought: Bloating & Gas?

Digestive enzymes have made a huge difference in my health. In fact, using digestive enzymes has helped me to digest my food much better and allowed me to keep my gallbladder.

So what are digestive enzymes?

Your digestive system doesn't absorb food. It absorbs the nutrients in your food. So your body has to break down that chicken dinner you just ate into its multiple nutrient pieces: simple sugars from carbs, amino acids from proteins, cholesterol and fatty acids from fats, and all of the minerals, vitamins, plant matter and other animal compounds that you've consumed.

Our body produces its own digestive enzymes in the pancreas, small intestine, salivary glands and in the stomach. The job of digestive enzymes is to turn that food into the nutrients that our body needs to absorb. But sometimes, for any number of reasons from the simple process of aging, to stress, to low stomach acid, your body might be slacking in digestive enzyme production.

Dear Friends,

I had a wonderful time preaching the gospel across Boston, Philadelphia, and Maine; there is nothing like watching lives changed by the power of God. 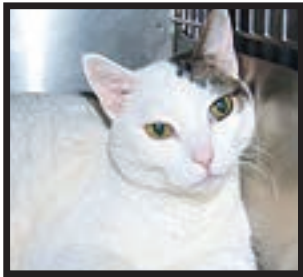

What should you do if your dog doesn't like your date?

You can also add your scent to the clothing by rubbing it on your arm and then placing in a spot where your dog spends a great deal of time. This will help your dog get used to the person's scent over time and you are not introducing the person to your dog by invading all his senses at one time.

‘The Identical’ has a solid story and great music

Director Dustin Marcellino's *The Identical* is a throwback to the days of rock 'n' roll. The story actually begins in 1936 when William (Brian Geraghty) and Helen Hemsley (Amanda Crew) have new twin boys. Henry visits a revival tent where Pastor Reece Wade (Ray Liotta) is asking for prayer as his wife Louise (Ashley Judd) has just had her third miscarriage. The

plea for prayer to be able to have a family sets heavy on William's heart.

Already faced with no job and no way to feed two more mouths, William prays and suggests they give one of the babies to the Wades. Of course, Helen is aghast at this suggestion. But, soon they are handing over one of the boys to the Wades, who at first refuse.

The movie then shows what

Ryan's (Blake Rayne) life is like growing up with a fire and brimstone sermon-speaking pastor and his developing years in the church. Jumps to the 1970s and Ryan is starting to feel his oats. He loves music, but more than church music. He and his friend Dino, (Seth Green), cross the state line to find a roadhouse bar where the tunes are hot and make Ryan want to shake his booty. The guys get by with this a few times until Seth's dad sends the cops out for stealing his car.

Ryan ends up in jail, which mortifies his dad.

Eventually Ryan and Dino start a band and Ryan is ecstatic. Shortly after he discovers that a guy named Drexel Hemsley (also played by Rayne), has a dynamite career with rock 'n' roll. As he starts making comments to his mother about how he feels connected to Drexel, his mother starts to worry. At first watching the film it's apparent that Blake Rayne not only looks and squirms like Elvis (who did have a twin that didn't survive), he sounds like him. At first I thought Rayne was lip-singing Elvis's songs he sounded so much like him. But none of the songs in the film are ones Elvis performed and are written for this film.

The faith issue is a part of this movie but it's more about caring for others and learning what to do at the right time it's needed. While nearly all of the critics have brutality criticized

The Identical, there's a lot of entertainment here.

The story of the twins rouses intrigue if they will meet. Drama separates a father with a deep faith and his son who wants to spread his wings. A mother wants what's best for her son, but is obedient to her husband.

The music is great and the actors did a good job with their portrayals. Liotta turns in one of the strongest performance he's done in a while. Judd is sweet and believable as a

church-going woman. Green is a cut up and is responsible for a lot of laughs in the movie. Erin Cottrell is sweet and sincere as Ryan's girlfriend.

But it's Blake Rayne who is the special enjoyment in this film. His superb singing and swagger brings back memories of the forever missed Elvis Presley.

Director Dustin Marcellino said, "It's a story about miracles, calling, destiny and fighting for your God-given dreams."

Alex Angert, Official Adjudicator from Guinness World Records, then took the podium and said, "It gives me great

Chargers' white lightning downs Seahawks

Winning their first game of the season the (1-1) San Diego Chargers defeated the defending Super Bowl champion (1-1) Seattle Seahawks 30-21.

It was a hot weekend in San Diego. Game time temperature at Qualcomm Stadium hovered around 94 degrees, but it was much hotter on the field of play. With temperature reaching a blistering 120 degrees on the field, it was the Chargers dressed in all white that turned up the heat on the Seahawks soundly defeating Seattle in all three phases of the game.

"We understood it was going to be hot. We've all played in games like this before. You don't want to walk off the football field with a loss saying that was an excuse. Both teams had to

deal with it. Our team did a great job dealing with it," said Chargers Head Coach Mike McCoy.

Getting a nine-point win over a team that was favored by a touchdown. It was the Bolts who found comfort playing at home on Sunday unlike a week earlier where they had to wait and wait to play. They were the last team to play that week in the second half of a Monday night football double-header on the road in Arizona.

The Bolts bounced back after that game in a big way reflecting their head coach & staff, executing an excellent game plan.

Time of possession was a major part of the plan. The Chargers commanded the clock 42:15 minutes to the Seahawks 17:45. The Bolts ran 75 offensive plays to Seattle's 40.

"It's a great team win. They played football the way you have to play against a great football team. A lot of guy's stepped up and did some great things," said McCoy.

"They stuck to the plan. They kept on pounding. It wasn't pretty but this was the way we were going to do it. Pound and pound them. Take our shots when we were there."

The Chargers started to pound them at first with RB Ryan Mathews. A holding penalty on TE John Phillips nullified a Mathews TD run in the second quarter. Mathews then fumbled twice, recovering the first fumble then strained his MCL trying to recover the second. He was carted off the field and is expected to miss four or five weeks.

Chargers RB Danny Woodhead moved the chains with eight rushes for 32-yards. He also caught four of Rivers' passes for 28-yards. Donald Brown contributed running for 21-yards on seven carries. Even QB Philip Rivers moved the chains several times with a couple of key runs.

Leading the team out of the Chargers tunnel Rivers shrugged off the Monday night loss and did what he had to do. He completed 28 of 37 passes for 284-yards, tossing three touchdowns and no interceptions.

His favorite target Antonio Gates caught all seven passes thrown to him, three of them touchdowns leading the Chargers receivers with 96-yards.

Rivers and Gates have hooked up 64 times for touchdowns in their illustrious career. Gates said, "Over time and repetition we've learned how to click. He's great at reading my posture and knowing what I'm trying to get done. But the biggest thing is he trusts me. I can't say enough about him and my teammates."

"They are one of the most prolific tandems in the history of the game," said McCoy.

The Chargers lost their Pro-Bowl center Nick Hardwick for the season due to a recurring neck injury aggravated at Arizona in the season opener.

Next man up number #74 Rich Ohrmberger filling in for Hardwick. Snapping the ball to Rivers without a flaw the 6-2, 300 lb. six-year veteran from Penn St. performed flawlessly, calling out the plays to his fellow lineman while delivering key blocks for his team's offensive unit.

Coach McCoy praised his center by saying, "He played plenty for us last year. We never skipped a beat with him. He's a veteran who's played plenty of football. He's a good leader when Nick went out."

The Bolts BIGS on the offensive line were able to control the vaunted Seattle swarming defense matching and exceeding them physically in the trenches led by Bolts big man tackle D.J. Fluker.

Credit the San Diego Chargers defense for muzzling Seattle's explosive offense. Known for his ability to run the ball well, Seattle QB Russell Wilson ran the ball only twice for 18-yards. He did complete 17 of 25 passes for 201-yards tossing one TD.

Stifling Seattle RB Marshawn Lynch the big back rambled for just 36-yards in the game, putting a feather in the cap of Chargers Defensive coordinator John Pagano. Credit the Chargers BIGS, the linebackers and secondary for gang tackling the power back.

Young Chargers cornerbacks Shareece Wright and Jason Verrett led all Bolts with five tackles apiece while providing excellent pass coverage.

Chargers OLB Jarrett Johnson did not suit up for the game. He was with his wife who was having a baby.

OLB Melvin Ingram caused a strip-sack fumble of Wilson. OLB Dwight Freeney sacked Wilson once. Both players with their speed and power rushes created havoc for the Seattle quarterback. Said Ingram after the game, "Everybody did their job and the results took care of themselves."

Ingram complimented the Chargers faithful in attendance saying, "The fans were very impressive. They feed energy to us and makes us want to go out and play hard."

ORDINANCE NO. 5015

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL CAJON REPEALING SECTION 17.105.020 AND ADDING A NEW SECTION 17.105.020 TO CHAPTER 17.105; REPEALING SECTION 17.110.020 AND ADDING A NEW SECTION 17.110.020 TO CHAPTER 17.110; REPEALING SECTION 17.145.150 AND ADDING A NEW SECTION 17.145.150 TO CHAPTER 17.145; ADDING A NEW SECTION 17.225.200 TO CHAPTER 17.225; AND ADDING A NEW CHAPTER 17.250; ALL TO TITLE 17 OF THE EL CAJON MUNICIPAL CODE

This ordinance, along with a proposed ordinance amending El Cajon Municipal Code Title 5 (Business and Regulations), is intended to address the secondary effects from the unregulated establishment of pawn shops, alternative lending establishments, secondhand merchandise stores and kiosks through the application of land use regulations including spatial standards, permit and license requirements, and ensure that pawnbrokers and secondhand dealers operate in a manner that reduces the traffic of stolen merchandise.

This proposed ordinance makes amendments to Title 17 of the El Cajon Municipal Code (the Zoning Code) to regulate pawn shops, alternative lending establishments, secondhand merchandise stores and kiosks in El Cajon. The ordinance modifies the definitions of "kiosk" and "stand" to include those located indoors, and adds a new Section 17.105.020 amending and eliminating the definition of "secondhand merchandise," all through the amendment of Section 17.105.020 of Chapter 17.105 of the Zoning Code; it amends Section 17.110.020 of Chapter 17.110 of the Zoning Code, which pertains to use classifications, by adding use classifications for alternative lending, pawn shops, secondhand stores and kiosks, and thrift or resale stores; it amends Section 17.145.150 of Chapter 17.145 of the Zoning Code (the Commercial Land Use Table) by adding alternative lending uses and by characterizing electronics sales as electronic retail sales; it clarifies firearms and ammunition sales to mean new and resale sales of those items; it adds the alternatives of "store" and "kiosk" to the secondhand merchandise use category; it includes buying of gold, precious metals, gemstones, jewelry, or electronics in this use category; it adds the term "resale shop" to the thrift shop use category; it adds a new Section 17.225.200 to Chapter 17.225 of the Zoning Code to regulate the location of businesses engaged in alternative lending in the city of El Cajon; and it adds a new Chapter 17.250 to the Zoning Code to regulate the location and operation of businesses engaging in the purchase of secondhand merchandise or taking in secondhand merchandise for pawn

in the city of El Cajon.

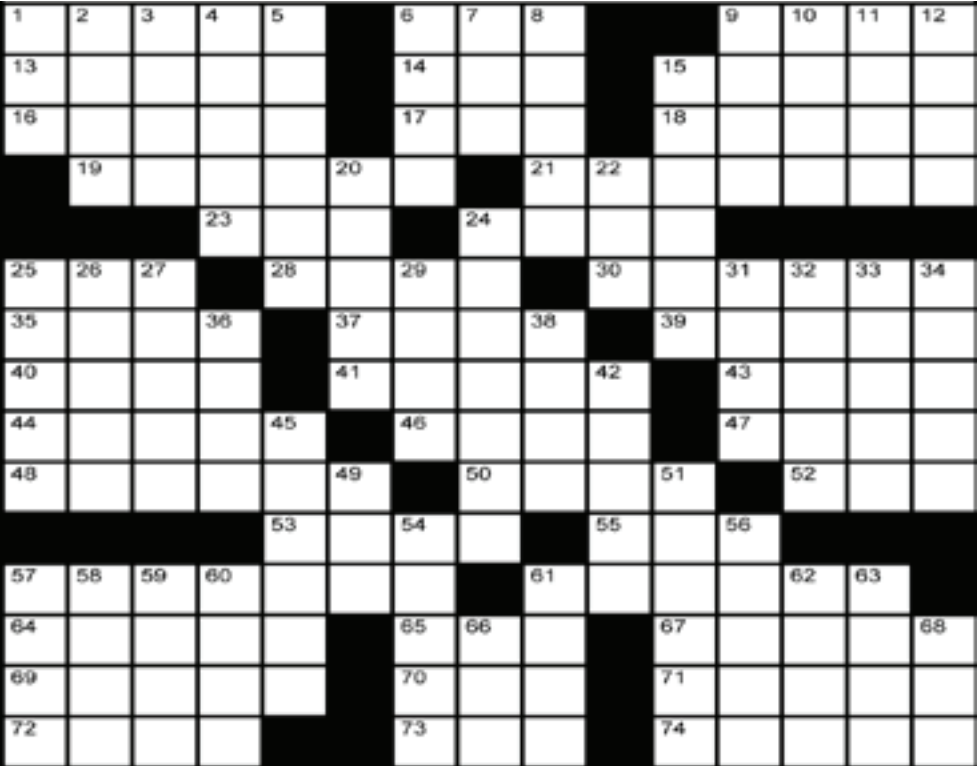

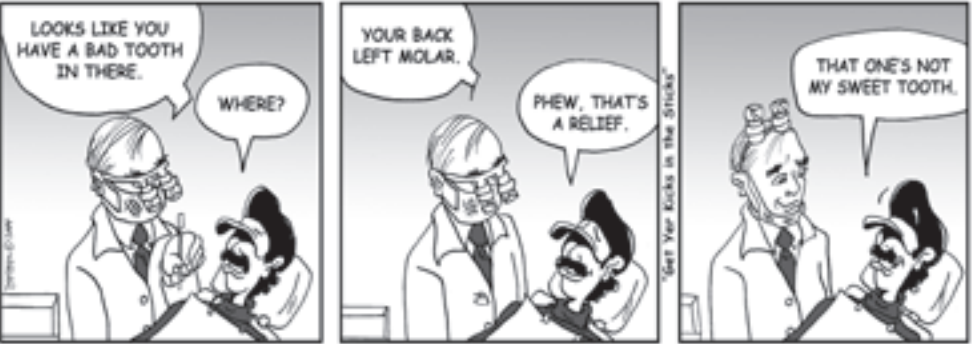

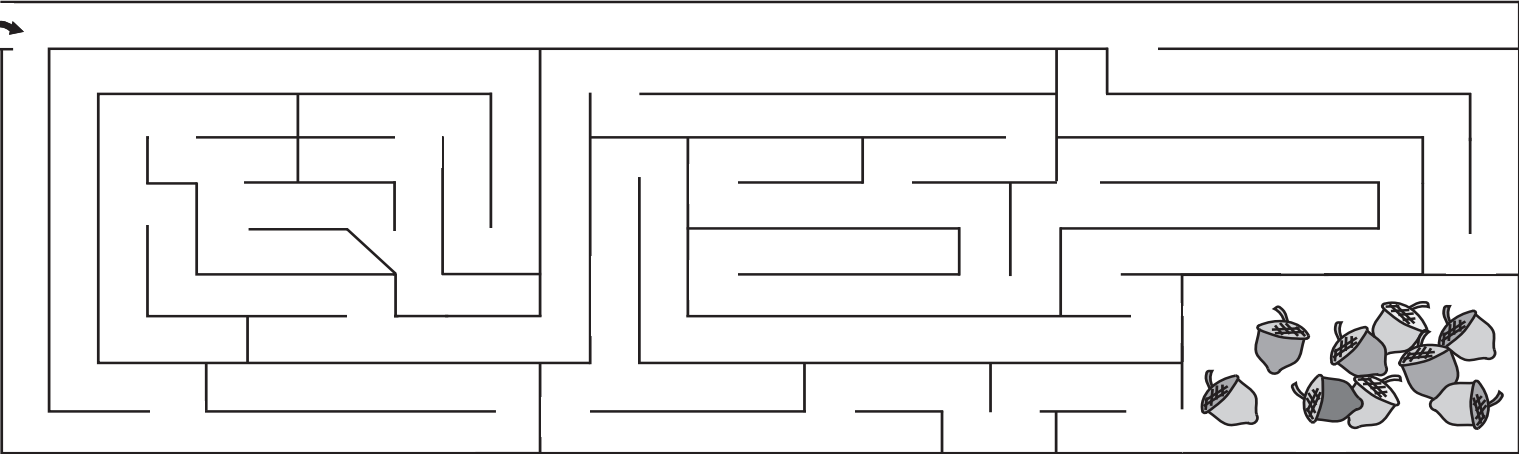
