

#### Come out Alpine and enjoy the Alpine Viejas Days Parade and Craft Fair this weekend

This year's Alpine Viejas Days Parade theme is *Honoring our Veterans*. The parade will begin in a very unique, and wonderful way — the two Veterans organizations in town, the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) and the American Legion, are coming together to provide a joint Honor Guard to lead the parade.

The Alpine Stagecoach Lions Club is a 501c3 Public Charity with a specified mission to provide assistance for the Sight and Hearing Impaired – everything we do is in support of that Mission. Even the parade (an Alpine tradition for over 50 years) is is a fundraising event to enable the Lions to help the sight and hearing impaired.

On June 14, the Alpine Stagecoach Lions Club held a Health Fair for Vision and Diabetes Screenings at the CVS Parking Lot (with their generous permission), where the Lions provided screenings for 32 people; many were able to walk away with reading glasses issued to them at no charge. The club was assisted in this by Dr. Ron Short, an Optometrist from SoCal Kaiser Permanente, utilizing a mobile optometry office provided by the Imperial Lions Club and assisted by other Lions Clubs from San Diego. There were product vendors participating, a Clown to paint the faces of and entertain the children (courtesy of Freespirit the Clown), a Massage Chair and operator from Native Dreams Day Spa, and information booths to help folks learn about the Affordable Care Act (John Yeatman Insurance, Mountain Health, Lions Sight & Hearing Foundation, and Fresh Start Surgical Gifts).

In February the Stagecoach Lions Club will be holding its Annual Dog Show, the proceeds of which will be used to assist the eyesight impaired to obtain a "seeing-eye" or other assistance dog.

Throughout the year, the Lions collect eyeglasses to be refurbished and recycled for use by others.

The Stagecoach Lions are also sponsors of and participants in the Mother Goose Parade Association.

At the September 13 Veterans Wall of Honor ceremony, a challenge went out to all the Veterans present, and their respective organizations, to enter as many veterans as possible to participate in the parade. Alpine has an ever dwindling number of Veterans from WWII and all conflicts since then.

The Viejas Days Parade is staging on both sides of W. Victoria, from the 5-point intersection to the bridge over the freeway. W. Victoria will be closed at 12 p.m., there will be no parking allowed (we have contacted the HOA and apartment managers to let their residents know). Alpine Blvd. from the 5-points to Tavern Road will be similarly closed.

Businesses and Organizations along the staging area have generously donated the use of their parking lots to help with the staging: The Women's Club, The Alpine Community Church, and Holt Travel and Tours.

The Parade Step-Off is at 2 p.m. from Alpine Blvd. and 5-points, and ends at the Alpine Community Center park grounds, where the Craft Fair will have been under way (10 a.m. to 4 p.m.). The Fair is open to the public at NO CHARGE, and will feature music, performances by the Alpine Dance Academy, Arts and Crafts vendors, and organizations distributing literature. Announcing stations will be at the 5-points and in front of Keller Williams Realty.





I said, "Load the equipment, the chairs, and let's go and the Lord will show us what to do." The building we were using was right across from Petco Park, I asked the park if we could use their area, the answer, NO. Outside I noticed the large public sidewalk. ### Does your Fall outing with Rover include a hike?

Top five tips for hiking with your dog

Fall is right around the corner, so why not turn that daily walk into an interesting and fun hike? It's no secret that exercise is a necessity for both you and your dog. We often forget that our dogs are pack animals and their origins are rooted in hunting, playing, and roaming all day long with their pack family. If you are already in the habit of walking your four-legged friend, you know that it's a special time for the two of you to bond as well as establish yourself as the leader of your domestic pack. Why not shake up your routine a bit and kick your workout into high gear by taking your best friend for a hike?

Follow these 5 tips and your hikes will surely be a wonderful experience that you'll both enjoy together.

#### 1. Know your limits

Does vour current exercise endeavor consist of walking around the block a couple times? Then you may want to rethink that 10 mile hike you're mapping out. Not only do you need to be able to hike without difficulty, so does your furry companion. Start intensifying your walks by making them longer and include hills if possible so the two of you can build up your stamina. It's also advisable to take your dog to the vet just to ensure that he will be able to accompany you comfortably when you're ready to hike. Dogs are people pleasers and they never want to let on that they are injured or in pain, so they will endure it for as long as they can.

#### 2. Be prepared

Once you've determined to go on that hike, whether it's a long or a short trip, make sure you have the following items:

• Proper ID tags - The tags MUST be legible and specify your dog's name and your current contact information. It's also a good idea to have a current photo with you just in case you get separated.

- Collar and leash Bring these just as you would when you're going for your regular walks.
   First Aid Vit Human first
- First Aid Kit Human first aid kits can come in handy in the event of a cut or scrape (for either of you). Throw some tweezers in it for easy tick removal.
- Vet's Phone Number In the event that something unexpected happens, keep your vet's phone number with you so you can quickly find out how to best take care of your dog. You can never be too careful.
- Sunscreen You both need sunscreen and they make sunscreen specifically for dogs.
   Light-colored noses are very susceptible to sunburns and dogs can get skin cancer just like you.
- Orange vests Know whether or not you are taking your hike during a hunting season. Orange vests for you and your dog will make sure you both stand out.
- Appropriate Dress When hiking during cooler weather, bring along an extra layer of clothes if your dog tolerates them. For summer hikes, keep a cool, moist scarf or bandana that he can wear to take a bite out of the heat.

#### 3. Bring water & food

Just like you need to fuel up and hydrate for a workout, the same holds true for your canine companion. Bring plenty of water and a dish that he can drink from (they make collapsible bowls for traveling ease) and offer it often along the way. A good rule of thumb is to bring 8 ounces of water for every hour you plan to hike (and don't forget to bring water for yourself!). It's best to keep him from drinking the water in streams or other natural sources, as these could contain nasty bacteria that will make him sick. Bottles of water that are frozen are also great to pack in case the weather is hot and can offer immediate relief to your pooch.

Food should be given on rest breaks or during bouts of less intense activity to ensure that you don't upset his tummy or cause bloating.

#### 4. Be aware of your surroundings

Plan your hikes on trails that are used often and provide a clear path; now is not the time to forge a new one through the wilderness. In most cases, you'll likely encounter the usual suspects of the wildlife world, such as squirrels and maybe a deer or two. Keep your eyes open for common canine offenders, including porcupines and skunks. These animals are not as easily scared off by your dog and may become agitated.

Familiarize yourself with what poison ivy and other unpleasant plants look like. Although your dog can't get poison ivy, they can pass it on to you, so it's best to keep them away from anything suspicious.

#### 5. Mind your manners

The same rules you follow on your routine walks apply to your hikes. Have a carry in, carry out mentality, which includes cleaning up after your dog on the trail. Using a leash will ensure that other hikers, other dogs, as well as the flora and fauna around you will remain undisturbed. If you're both on a more leisurely hike, let others moving at a faster pace pass you easily.

Hiking with your dog is a wonderful way to spend quality time together and enjoy the outdoors all while getting a great workout. You're guaranteed to have a fun and safe hike just by taking a bit of extra time to plan and prepare. Happy hiking!

### A touch road win for the Chargers

mproving their record to (2-1), the San Diego Chargers traveled to Ralph Wilson Stadium in Orchard Park, NY defeating the Buffalo Bills 22-10. With this victory, San Diego shares the lead atop the AFC West with the Denver Broncos.

This one was costly as the Chargers lost another running back to injury.

Danny Woodhead, the fireplug who catches passes so effectively out of the backfield, will catch no more passes this year after sustaining a season ending ankle injury in the first quarter Sunday. He was carted off the field and returned hobbling on crutches. This after the Bolts lost RB Ryan Mathews to injury for at least six weeks. Also, it was learned Mantai Te'o broke his fibula and will be out for a period of four weeks.

"We'll have a game plan like we do every week." It's a very unfortunate situation. But we're going to find a way. It will be the 'next man up," said Chargers Head Mike McCoy.

The Chargers, like they did a week earlier against the defending champion Seahawks, won in all phases of the game, offense, defense, and on special teams

Making a statement in their first couple of series was the Bolts defense, getting a coverage sack and forcing the Bills to punt twice. The Chargers defensive front seven stood tall and held their ground determined to stop the vaunted Buffalo ground attack, which they did effectively holding the tandem of Fred Jackson and C.J. Spillar to 59-yards collectively on 16-carries. Keeping the Bills to just under four-yards per carry. Led by FS Eric Weddle and ILB Mantai Te'o with ten tackles each, the D-line welcomed the return of Jarret Johnson and his run stuffing ability. The OLB contributed with eight tackles.

"A big emphasis for the team was to understand the efficiency of the way they run the ball. I believe they ran it 66 times in two games this season. We challenged the defense. We got to stop the run," said McCov.

By stopping the run, this forced the Bills quarterback

E.J. Manuel to throw the ball. Pressured from the outside and up the middle, Manuel was sacked three times by Corey Liuget, Dwight Freeney, and Kendall Reyes.

This game belonged to Chargers quarterback Philip Rivers. The veteran quarterback is playing the best ball of his career. He is wiser, can survey the whole field, and appears to be quicker with his feet moving around the pocket and taking off downfield when opportunity presents itself as demonstrated in the third quarter on a crucial third down play, making the first down on a nine-yard scamper. But it is quarterback Philip Rivers arm that will get him into the Hall of Fame

Completing 18-of-25 passes for 256-yards, two touchdowns, no interceptions, Rivers continued to get the ball downfield throwing to six different receivers. Malcolm Floyd stretched the field on

two of Rivers passes both for 45-vards.

Floyd moved up to the ninth spot on the Chargers All-Time receiving list.

Eddie Royal caught two touchdown passes from Rivers leading off the scoring in the first quarter (3-yards) and from (5-yards) in the third quarter. TE LaDarius Green is back to form after catching four balls for 64-yards.

All this could not have been accomplished had it not been for RB Donald Brown. The six-year veteran had a career day carrying the load running the ball 31 times Sunday. This was most touches by a Bolts running back since Tomlinson did it eight years ago. Gaining 62-vards on those carries, it was blue-collared Browns' effort that allowed Rivers and the offense to keep the Bills defense guessing and helped the Chargers control the clock in time of possession for nearly 35 minutes in the game.

In 63 plays the Chargers ran on offense, Brown touched the ball 36 times also catching five passes for 27-yards.

"He did an outstanding job of making the most of his opportunities. I am so very proud of the way he played the game," quipped McCoy.

Special teams play of the Chargers continue to shine for San Diego.

Although having more touchbacks in the game Sunday (2) than he had all last year, Mike Scifres let his presence known booming six punts for a 49.0 average. His last two pinned the Bills back near their goal line in the fourth quarter, leading up to a safety when Liuget pressured Manuel into an intentional grounding pass to escape a sack late in the contest

There was talk of a possible letdown by the Chargers Sunday after their huge emotional victory over defending Super Bowl champions Seahawks.

"That was something we stressed all week long, the whole year really," said Mc-Coy.

"Just one week at a time. You got to be consistent as a team and do whatever you can to win. It's not always going to


be perfect, but you have to just keep plugging away. The most important thing is winning games. It's always fun when you win," McCoy said.

Next up, two teams with sub .500 records, the Jacksonville Jaguars and the New York Jets invade Qualcomm Stadium. Good seats are still available for both games.

### Superb drama and acting in 'The Drop'

he Drop doesn't appear to be unique in its plot: but fans of Tom Hardy and James Gandolfini couldn't wait to see this movie. This is Gandolfini's last performance. The crime drama is directed by Michael R. Roskam from a screenplay by Dennis Lehane (Mystic River, Gone Baby Gone) adapated from his own short story "Animal Rescue.

Cousin Marv (Gandolfini) owns a bar in Brooklyn. His nephew, Bob Saginowski (Tom Hardy), is a bartender there but seems as unlikely as a squash in a pickle jar in this job. It's the same in his personal life. He's a shadow moving through a world full of foo.

Marv's bar is one of the designated drop offs by the local mobsters, who rotate bars nightly. When it's their time, Bob is as emotionless as he is in his own life. Handover the money, wipe down the bar and go home.

One evening as he's walking home he hears a puppy whining. He stops, opens a trash can and sees a bleeding pit bull that has Bob at first look. He knocks on the door of the house adjacent to the trash can; the home of Nadia (Noomi Rapace). They have a slight connection through their concern over the wounded puppy which they immediately begin cleaning up.

Bonding quickly over Rocco, Bob's name of choice; soon turns dangerous when Eric Deeds (Matthias Schoenaerts), Nadia's ex, turns up wanting "his" dog back or else. It's obvious that Deeds was the one who hurt the puppy and also has treated Nadia badly.

Lehane's script is interesting in the subtle way its characters live their lives. Marv makes a daily visit to mass to have confession. Yet when his bar is robbed twice and he has to answer to both the police and the bar's actual owner - a Chechen crime family -- Marv can turn on the intense, watchful and silent guy persona.

As Bob and Nadia grow closer, Bob has to question many things. Is Marv telling him the truth about things? Will he and Nadia get together? Can he stop Eric in his tracks before he brutally harms anyone or thing again?

The intrigue of several mysteries run throughout The Drop and the acting is superb. It's worth seeing Hardy in this role which might bring some nominations at Oscar time; and to once again see how fine an actor we lost in James Gandolfini.

**ORDINANCE NO. 5016** 

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF EL CAJON
REPEALING SECTION 17.130.220 AND
ADDING NEW SECTION 17.130.220 TO
CHAPTER 17.130 TO
TITLE 17 OF THE EL CAJON
MUNICIPAL CODE

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EL CAJON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Based upon the record as a whole, the Planning Commission hereby finds that the proposed Zoning Code amendment is exempt from CEQA pursuant to the "General Rule" that CEQA only applies to projects that have the potential for causing a significant physical effect on the environment, (CEQA Guidelines, Section 15061 (b) (3)). The proposed amendment is designed to allow theft deterrent fencing (electrified) subject to satisfying certain criteria, and therefore does not raise this project to a level of significance that warrants CEQA analysis because the intensity of allowable development is not increased and there are no potentially significant environmental effects.

**SECTION 2.** Section 17.130.220 of Chapter 17.130 of Title 17 of the El Cajon Municipal Code is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. A new Section 17.130.220 of Chapter 17.130 of Title 17 of the El Cajon Municipal Code is hereby added to read as follows:

#### 17.130.220 Security fencing.

- A. The use of barbed wire or razor wire or concertina wire is prohibited except under any of the following circumstances:
- 1. When used to enclose livestock on property zoned to permit livestock.
- 2. When used at least six (6) feet above the ground for security purposes on property in the C-M and M zones, except that the barbed, razor or concertina wire shall not overhang the outside of the fence it is attached to, if the fence is on a property line.
- 3. When used at least six (6) feet above the ground for security purposes on property zoned for residential uses that also abuts a public alley and is located across the alley from property in the C-M and M zones
- 4. When used for security purposes around utility substations or public easements, as long as the wire does not overhang the outside of the fence it is attached to, if the fence is on a property line.
- B. The construction and use of electric theft deterrent devices shall be allowed in the C-M and M zones only as provided in this section, subject to the following standards:
- 1. Definition. For the purpose of this section, an electric theft deterrence device is defined as any bare wire or conductor which is supported on insulators and is located outdoors within ten feet of the ground or a walking surface and is attached to a post, fence, wall, or structure, and which is capable of being energized from any electrical source. As used in this section, an "electric fence" or an "electric security fence" is an electric theft deterrence device.
- 2. An administrative zoning permit processed in accordance with Chapter 17.40 of this title.
- 3. In addition to meeting standard application submittal requirements for administrative zoning permits pursuant to Chapter 17.40 of this title, all applications shall include schematics and load calculations indicating and or displaying the location of the power source; materials used for the fence construction; location of the regulating and monitoring equipment, and location of emergency access, Key Box and cut-off
- 4. The following development standards shall apply to any electronic theft deterrent device:

- a. Electric fences shall be minimized from public view for properties located along major and primary streets as indicated on the most recently adopted Circulation Element, and for properties with freeway frontage. A method of visual screening shall be approved by the Director of Community Development.
- b. An electric fence may be installed on properties that do not touch, join at the edge or border, or share a common property line with an existing residential land use or a residential zoning district.
- c. Electric fences shall be installed behind an approved perimeter wall or fence with a minimum height of six feet.
- d. Electric security fence is not permitted within the exterior setback or street side yard setback.
- e. The electric security fence proposed adjacent to a sidewalk must be installed behind the side yard and exterior yard setback and a solid masonry wall.
- 5. The following performance standards shall apply to any electric theft deterrent device:
- a. Electric fences shall have a maximum height of ten feet.
- Electric fencing shall be installed in accordance with the requirements of the currently adopted edition of the California Building Code, California Electrical Code, and Cal-OSHA standards.
- c. The electric security fence is not permitted as a perimeter fence or wall.
- d. Electric fences shall be clearly identified with warning signs of a maximum of nine square feet, prepared in English, Arabic and Spanish that read: "Warning—Electric Fence" at intervals of not less than 60 feet.
- e. Warning signs shall be black typewritten text with a yellow or white background.
- f. Warning signs shall not advertise or provide contact information of the electric fence manufacturer.
- g. An emergency Knox Box or any other similarly approved device (e.g. Rapid Emergency Access Control Transmitter (REACT) System) must be installed at every gate providing access to a property secured by an electric fence to allow fire department, police department, and/or any other emergency responder access.
- In the event that emergency access by emergency responders (e.g. Police Department, Fire Department, etc.) to a property where a permitted electric fence has been installed and is operating, is required due to an emergency or urgent circums and the Knox Box or other similarly approved device is absent or non-functional, and an owner, manager, employee, custodian or any other person with control over the property is not present to disable the electric fence emergency responding personnel shall be authorized to disable the electric fence in order to gain access to the property. As a condition of permit issuance, all applicants issued permits to install or use an electric fence as provided herein agree to waive any and all claims for damages to the electric fence against emergency responding units and/or personnel under such circumstances.
- i. No Electric Fence shall be installed or operated with a power source other than a storage battery not exceeding twelve (12) volts direct current, charged primarily with a solar panel; provided, however, in case of inclement weather or other conditions that inhibit the ability of the solar panel to fully recharge the battery, a charging device may be utilized for such purpose, if connected in a manner that ensures that the charging device cannot provide a source of power directly to the fence. In no case shall an Electric Fence be connected to any other electric power source.
- j. AC current shall not be used to energize any electric fence.
- 10. The following requirements for indemnification shall apply:

- a. The applicant or property owner agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the City of El Cajon or its agents, officers, and employees from any claim, action or proceeding against the City of El Cajon, or its agents, officers, or employees resulting from the approval and installation of an electrical security fence. Prior to issuance of the administrative zoning permits required in this section the applicant or property owner shall execute such indemnification and hold harmless agreements reflecting the obligations required under this subdivision (6), in such form as approved by the City Attorney.
- b. The City of El Cajon shall promptly notify the applicant or property owner of any claim, action, or proceeding and the City of El Cajon shall cooperate fully in the defense.
- c. If the City of El Cajon fails to cooperate fully in the defense, the applicant shall not thereafter be responsible to defend, indemnify, or hold harmless the City of El Cajon.
- 11. Prior to the approval of any request to install an electrical security fence within the City of El Caion, and at all times that the mit is in force and effect, the owner of the electric fence and the property owner(s), if different, shall provide to the City a certificate of commercial general liability insurance covering third party liability risks in a minimum amount of \$1 000.000.00 combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage insurance with the City, and its elected and appointed officers, officials, and employees, named as an additional insureds on the policy or policies. Failure to maintain coverage as required by this paragraph 11 shall be the basis for the revocation of the administrative zoning permit.
- 12. Addition of the electrical security fence shall in no way preclude the installation and maintenance of required landscaping.
- C. Chain link fencing shall be installed so that all pointed edges are facing downward unless the fence has been approved as a security fence as described above.
- D. It shall be unlawful, and a misdemeanor for any person to install, maintain or operate an electric fence in violation of these development standards.

**SECTION 4.** This ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days following its passage and adoption.
