

"Thanks mister", says the little boy.



I'm asking you to please do not sleep on the back step; this is private property, thank you, and I would like to meet you personally."

I never thought I would be giving a homeless man a 24 hour notice. Homelessness is a big problem in San Diego. It's easy to be homeless in this area, its beautiful weather 72 degrees, all year around and with so many government funded food programs. Many of those that are homeless don't feel a need to work. It seems to be much easier to stay on drugs, drunk, and homeless.

Should she stay or should she go?

Deciding whether to take your pet along on your road trips

It's common knowledge that pets are welcome at dog parks, most people parks, and most pet stores. Beyond that, however, the world can sometimes seem a little unfriendly to pet parents who would like to bring their furry best friends along everywhere possible. What many pet parents don't realize is that their pets are welcome in more places than they might think.

Your dog is your family member, so it's only natural to want to enjoy her company all the time, and take her along everywhere possible. However, the decision to travel with a pet - particularly on an extended road trip - is one that requires a good deal of consideration. There are several questions you should ask yourself before loading Fido or Fifi up in the car, and all of them involve ensuring your pet's ultimate comfort and well-being.

What is your pet's temperament?

If your pet is easygoing and adaptable, taking her along is an easy decision. However, if your pet is nervous, anxious, grumpy, uneasy on car rides, or skittish when it comes to new places or new people, she may not be a great candidate for a trip.

You also have to consider others as you plan your trip. If you will be dealing with crowds, using public transportation or visiting beaches, parks or pet friendly hot spots, your pet needs to be well-behaved, properly socialized and friendly.

Is the trip one your pet will enjoy?

Make sure that your travel plans include staying some-

where your pet will be comfortable, and doing things she'll be happy doing. For example, if your pet loves an outdoor adventure, a destination with hiking or river romping will be right up her alley. However, if you will be stuck in work meetings and have to find a doggie day care (as many pet friendly hotels do not allow pets to stay alone in rooms), or you're staying with Aunt Bessie and she doesn't have a yard, you may want to rethink the idea of bringing her along.

Is your pet in good health? If your pet is sick, pregnant, or injured, it's best if she stays home until she is feeling well. After all, she may need more care than you can give her while you're traveling, and since she can't speak, there's no real way of knowing her actual level of discomfort. Pain or discomfort may even cause a change in her temperament, and you may find that your happy-go-lucky furry friend suddenly isn't such a pleasant travel companion.

If your pet is elderly, but in good health, you will need to make a judgment call - if she is used to traveling with you and still seems enthusiastic at the idea, you can probably take her along with no problem, provided she can still comfortably participate. A quick consult with your veterinarian can help you determine whether car travel is right for an elderly pet.

Are you crossing state lines? Different states have different restrictions on pets. Some states require quarantines for carnivorous animals, and some require an up-to-date certificate stating that your pet is in good health. It's a good idea to get such a certificate if you plan to travel through different states

If your pet is healthy and has

the right temperament, hitting the road together is a fantastic way to break up the routine with some new adventures, and a great opportunity to bond. However, even if your pet isn't ideally suited to travel, all is not lost.

There are many ways to alleviate temperament issues. The right training and coaching can help desensitize your pet to the things that upset her and help her become comfortable with traveling. Be aware that most of these techniques take time, and if you want your pet to be a happy traveler, you must be patient and go at her pace.

If your pet is a nervous traveler, planning shorter trips, or planning trips that would be fun and interesting for her can help her adapt and learn that travel can be pleasant. If she suffers from motion sickness, there are plenty of proven remedies that can help her stay well on car rides, including reconditioning, holistic remedies, or medication.

In the end, with a little bit of patience and work on both your parts, even a reluctant rider can learn to enjoy car trips with you, making traveling with your pet a win for everyone.

'The Judge' — excellent cast in poingnant drama

asting a prominent and recognizable actor in a movie usually ups the anticipation as well as audience turnout in theaters. And casting two or more of those actors together probably means the film is worth seeing. That's certainly the case with director David Dobkin's The Judge, starring Robert Downey Jr., Robert Duvall, Billy Bob Thornton, Vincent D'Onofrio, and Vera Farmiga.

Downey Jr. portrays Hank Palmer, an aggressive Chicago lawver - which comes as no surprise since his father is Judge Joseph Palmer (Duvall) in Carlinville, Indiana. Hank has not been back home for many years, but after hearing the bad news of his mother's passing, he feels obligated to return to Carlinville one more time. Along with the grief of losing his mother, Hank also finds out his father has been charged with a murder. The Judge doesn't think he will need any legal help because he's not guilty. He will soon find out that's a big misconception.

Hank feels uncomfortable at home. He and his father have rarely gotten along, and he and his brother Glen (D'Onofrio) aren't the kind to slap and hug each other. But Hank seems happy to see his brother Dale (Jeremy Strong), a simple and gentle young man whose life revolves around his Super 8 camera. With little notice by his family, Dale has captured years of the family's history, personalities of his father and brothers, and

whatever may strike his fancy

at the moment.

As much as Hank wants to leave and go back to his daughter in Chicago -- especially since his wife is leaving him -- he starts to get a glimpse of what this case is really about. He realizes his father will not be able to squirm out of this one without his help. The Judge will hear none of this. He's been the town judge for 42 years and figures he has a lot of favors owed to him. In fact. when it's clear he can't represent himself, he ignores Hank and hires in-over-his-head Dax Shepard (C. P. Kennedy) to be his counsel.

Hank has never understood why his father has never liked him. Perhaps it has to do with something Hank did in the past. Even now, Hank remarks that his dad will hug everyone, but only shake Hank's hand. Once the trial starts Hank might as well be chomping on bricks because Dax does nothing right in representing Hank's father. This is one of the areas of the film were Downey shines: he squirms, fumes, throws things and makes faces at both Dax and his father. Nothing changes.

In between court sessions Hank runs into his high school sweetheart Samantha, played sexily and sweetly by Vera Farmiga. During their first meeting they get off on the wrong foot, but neither one can deny there's still a sexual tension between them. Hank has to remind himself of why he's here in town. That reminder comes in one very poignant scene when Hank has to help his father with one of the most embarrassing moments anyone can experience. It's then that the hate Hank feels for his dad disappears from Downey's face.


So they return to the courtroom, this time with a sur-

It's wonderful to watch Downey and Duvall together -for the first time -- and likewise Downey and Thornton. Nick Schenk (Gran Torino) and Bill Dubuque's screenplay, adapted from a story by Dobkin and Schenk, easily combines several difficult situations into a story of redemption, regret, and perception. These three actors rise in the subtleness of beautiful cinematography by the exceptionally talented Janusz Kaminski (War Horse, Lincoln, Saving Private Ryan), but they can instantly become cold as ice in harsh situations.

Filled with exceptional talent. The Judge is definitely a movie most viewers will enjoy.

prising new element. Dwight Dickham (Thornton) a prosecutor from Gary, Indiana, is the prosecutor in the Judge's trial. He's very familiar with the way Hank works -- taking on the cases of criminals he's too eager to get set free. Dwight wants to make an example of both the Judge and Hank. The setting in the old-world courtroom seems fitting because of the juxtaposition of old ways and new ways to have a trial. and one can't help but wonder if the icy Dwight will triumph or fail in this case.


Jets get knocked down over Mission Valley

by Chuck Karazsia Thile the highflying Blue Angels swooped over Qualcomm Stadium Sunday, a good old fashioned whipping was taking place inside the arena as the San Diego Chargers totally dominated, dismantling the New York Jets 31-0.

Winners of four straight, a

perfect (3-0) at home the (4-1) San Diego Chargers stand alone atop the AFC West with the best record in the AFC.

On a hot afternoon in Mission Valley, with game time temperature in the '90's, San Diego's defense pitched a shutout leaving the Jets feeling black & blue. Chargers quarterback Philip Rivers scorched a Jets secondary for nearly 300-yards with three touchdown passes. And a Chargers rookie running back making his NFL debut sparked his team in extraordinary spectacular fashion.

This game was a case for the defense pitching — the first Chargers shutout in four years. Limiting the Jets running game to 91-yards on 21 carries, the 'white lightning' defense gave New York starting quarterback Gino Smith (4-12, 27 yds) an early shower to cool the heat he took from a relentless pass rush and gang tackling Chargers defenders. His backup, Michael Vick did not fare much better (8-19, 47 yards) as they held

the dangerous running QB to 14-vards on two carries.

Shutting out the Jets from scoring, San Diego has four consecutive quarters of not allowing any points. The Chargers defense held the Jets to 150-yards of total offense and just one third down conversion in 11 attempts. They also controlled the Jets offense in field position by not allowing them to get past the 50-yard line until the fourth quarter. That is something unheard of in the modern day high-scoring NFL.

"They (the defense) did an outstanding job of going out there and playing the way we wanted trying to get turnovers," declared Mike McCov.

Closing out the first half with a brilliant interception, CB Brandon Flowers now has a pick in back-to-back games. OLB Jarrett Johnson forced a fumble Sunday and now has two achieved in back-to-back

The Chargers discovered a running game of their own after losing yet another running back to the injury list Sunday when Donald Brown (neck) left the game in the second quarter after a clothes line tackle sidelined him.

"Next man up" was #43 rookie running back Brandon Oliver. The non-drafted free agent rookie from Buffalo let everyone know in his first NFL appearance he is here to stay. At 5-8, 208, he resembles a flashy Darren Sproles in the open field, and a bruising Mike Tolbert running between the

All he did Sunday was gain 182-total yards on offense, the most since Tomlinson in 2007. Gaining 114-yards on 19 carries against the NFL's number one run defense of the Jets, give credit to his athletic ability, but also to the Chargers offensive line for opening lanes to run. The shortest Chargers roster player also caught four passes for 68-yards leading the Chargers receivers. He scored two touchdowns in his first appearance the first in the second quarter (15-vard run), the second in the third quarter from a (9-yard Rivers pass). Oliver became the first Charger ever to have a 50-uard run and a 50-yard catch in the same game.

"He did a great job stepping up and making the most of his opportunities," acknowledged head Coach McCoy.

Chargers quarterback Philip Rivers was the incomparable gunslinger. Having his best season in an already illustrious career, the signal caller with his quarterback rating of 125.0 Sunday is second to none in that category. He now has four consecutive games above 120.0

In the game Rivers completed 20 of 28 passes 288-yards, three touchdowns. Tossing two of them to his favorite receiver Antonio Gates (8 & 12yd). The duo's 64'th & 65'th. One TD pass went to rookie Brandon Oliver (9-yd.) Rivers is poised and on track to get his team to the next level.

"He's special, the simplest way to say it," said Turner. "He's a great competitor. He works extremely hard. He's a great person to have as the face of your franchise."

Controlling the clock 20:20 to 9:40 in T.O.P. San Diego kept their offense on the field, keeping the Jets defense out of breath and gassed. The

Jets looked like a team that couldn't wait to get out of San Diego.

"It was a great team effort by all three phases," chimed Turner.

Injuries are mounting and players are dropping like flies. Coach Turner responded to the epidemic Chargers injuries

"It's been tough, I am not going to lie. We got leadership, a great training staff working to get the guy's back as quickly as possible when they're healthy to go. We got a deep roster as I said coming out of training camp. We have a number of injuries but it's all part of the game. The healthiest 45 are going to play every Sunday. We got some great coaches here. The plays they use, the adjustments they made, the personnel we have. They just keep plugging away.




