Help in updating the San Diego Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan

Please give us your input! The San Diego Multijurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan is a framework that guides communities in making decisions and developing policies to reduce or eliminate risk to life and property. It identifies the types of hazards that threaten our communities, evaluates our vulnerabilities and outlines a strategy to reduce or eliminate the risk posed by those threats.

This year, local, county and special district government agencies will update the region's plan for reducing the threat to life and property from man-made and natural disasters. The results of this survey will be essential in helping a regional working group understand concerns and questions the community has about the threats the region faces and will guide discussions as the group revises the San Diego Multijurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan. This year, the region's 18 city governments, the County and several fire protection and water districts are working together to update the region's plan for mitigating the impact of potential disasters. The group is asking for your input through an online survey. With 18 questions—16 of them multiple choice—the survey just takes a few minutes. It will help gauge residents' level of disaster preparedness and awareness and help local governments set priorities for addressing potential disasters before they happen. Resolve to give blood in January for National Blood Donor Month

The American Red Cross asks eligible blood donors to make a resolution to give blood regularly in 2015, beginning with National Blood Donor Month in January.

National Blood Donor Month recognizes the importance of giving blood and platelets while honoring those who roll up a sleeve to help patients in need. It has been observed during January since 1970, and that's no coincidence. Winter is an especially difficult time to collect enough blood to meet patient needs. Unpredictable winter weather can result in blood drive cancelations, and seasonal illnesses, like the flu, may cause some donors to be unable to make or keep blood donation appointments.

Donors of all blood types are needed, especially those with O negative, A negative and B negative. With a shelf life of 42 days, red blood cells must be constantly replenished to maintain an adequate supply for patients. Individuals who come out to give blood Jan. 1 through Jan. 4 will receive a long-sleeve Red Cross T-shirt, while supplies last.



How to donate blood

Simply download the American Red Cross Blood Donor App, visit redcrossblood.org or call 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767) to make an appointment or for more information. All blood types are needed to ensure a reliable supply for patients. A blood donor card or driver's license or two other forms of identification are required at check-in. Individuals who are 17 years of age (16 with parental consent in some states), weigh at least 110 pounds and are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood. High school students and other donors 18 years of age and younger also have to meet certain height and weight requirements.

Three surprising Christmas invasions

War and its aftermath often have unexpected cultural effects, historian says

The United States has been so militarily influential throughout the world that it was invading other countries before it officially existed, says American history scholar Christopher Kelly.

In 1741, military forces from what would become American soil conducted large-scale operations in Cartagena, Colombia, and the U.S. has been busy changing other parts of the world since then, Kelly says.

"Andorra, Bhutan and Liechtenstein – those are the only three of the United Nations-recognized 194 nations that the U.S. has not invaded," says Kelly, co-author with British historian Stuart Laycock of "America Invades," www. americainvades.com, a global tour of Americans' military impact around the world.

"While America's cultural and economic influence has been ubiquitous, we ultimately decided to define an American invasion as an 'armed attack or intervention in a country by American forces.'"

Naturally, there are bound to be holiday tales amid all the action throughout the past few centuries. Kelly and Laycock share a few that occurred during Word War II.

• An unlikely Battle of the Bulge Christmas dinner. This battle was a last-ditch effort from Hitler during the waning days on the German front. On Christmas Eve, 1944, near the German-Belgian border,

a woman and her 12-year-old son were confronted by three wounded American soldiers on their doorstep. She let the Americans inside, even though it was considered treason by the Nazi regime. Later, four German soldiers knocked on the cottage's door, and the woman provided shelter for them, too. She collected everyone's weapons, insisted upon peace, and shared a chicken for dinner. The next day, the Germans told the Americans how to safely navigate back to their side. The story was told in a Reader's Digest article by the woman's son, the late Fritz Vincken, who reunited with one of the soldiers in 1995.

Operation Christmas Drop is a charitable tradition forged by war. The Japanese front was a simultaneously brutal and tedious effort, made more challenging by the many small islands dotting the South Pacific. One of the results was the creation of Andersen Air Force Base in Guam An air crew from the base flying over the Micronesian atoll of Kapingamarangi near Christmas 1952 spotted islanders waving to them. The crew swiftly gathered miscellaneous items on the plane, placed them in a container with an attached parachute and dropped the goods to the islanders. The Christmas Drop has since become the longest running U.S. Department of Defense mission in full operation, and the longest running humanitarian airlift in the world.

• The odd Christmas tradition of KFC in Japan. America and Japan have been bound to each other since the war and one of those bonds includes Yokota Air Base, originally a facility for Japanese forces but eventually taken over

by the United States during combat. Since hostilities have ended, strong cultural bonds have developed including a Christmas Day tradition of a meal from Kentucky Fried Chicken for the mostly Buddhist nation. "Kurisumasu ni wa kentakkii!" – Kentucky for Christmas! – was inspired by a group of foreigners who were searching for Christmas turkey. Ultimately, they settled for the next best thing, fried chicken.

Every single one of the people who walk through our doors are important to God and treasures to me!



'Annie' a glittering gift under the tree

or most of our lives we have been reading about Little Orphan Annie in comic strips, beginning in 1924 from author Harold Gray. It has been great fodder for theatrical productions and films. Not only is the latest Annie from Columbia Pictures with stars Jamie Foxx and little Quvenzhane Wallis a stunning toe-tapping musical version, but there have been several other previous films made that were not as good. Plus, there was the original 1977 hit Broadway musical from which much of the music comes in the latest version.

The version most people remember is the 1982 Columbia film that starred Albert Finney and Carol Burnett. Aileen Quinn starred as Annie. That film was directed by the formidable Oscar® winner John Huston. As we can see, Annie has been entertaining audiences for decades.

Because the original story and setting (1930s) was getting a little long in the tooth, the producers felt the show needed a bit of a re-polishing and updating to appeal to today's audience's taste in music and humor. They brought in British actress Emma Thompson to update the script and add some much-needed humor. She collaborated on the screenplay with director Gluck and Aline Brosh McKenna, turning out a script that relied on bringing out the humorous side of the characters. Jamie Foxx, now called Will Stacks instead of the time-worn "Daddy Warbucks" uses dead-pan humor to his advantage. He's still rich, but he's a strong billionaire from the 21st Century now. Foxx is a likeable person in his own right, but he has to play a somewhat disagreeable man who frequently makes us laugh because of his seriousness

hands of mean and acidic Miss Hannigan, who runs a home for foster children. Cameron Diaz plays Miss Hannigan aggressively over the top and exaggerates her every gesture and facial tick. Overdoing it too

much, she should win the Ham Actress Award of the Year.

Stacks saves Annie's life by saving her from getting run over by a truck. They bond and Annie becomes the catalyst for Stacks' running for New York Mayor. Stack's slimy campaign manager, played humorously by handsome Bobby Cannavale, encourages him to use Annie to boost his polls numbers. Naturally, this complicates their relationship.

The music is tuneful and happy and has been updated with altered lurics to todau's rhythms. Kids today can relate to it easily. It's toe-tapping even for the adults, who will enjoy hearing favorites "Tomorrow," "Little Girls," and this reviewer's favorite, "It's A Hard Knock Life" featuring a new down beat and cadence. The original music is by Martin Charnin & Charles Strouse with newer

songs written by Greg Kurstin, Sia, and Will Glick.

A funny, happy musical is perfect for the holiday season.

How well do you know your cat?

s a cat owner, you do your best to take care of your pet. But there may be some things you don't know about cats that could affect its health and happiness.

For example, a survey conducted by Wakefield Research on behalf of Purina ONE found that only 3 percent of respondents thought that playfulness is a sign of a healthy cat. Here are eight other cat facts that can help you keep your kitty

Cats require more protein than dogs. Dietary protein is digested and broken down into individual amino acids While dogs require 10 essential amino acids, cats require the same 10 plus one more:

Cats need physical activity to maintain their muscle tone, alleviate stress and burn off excess energy. Yet 76 percent of cat owners say their cats spend less than half of their time being active. Most cat owners (81 percent) know bright eyes are a key indicator of cat health. Another indicator? A shiny coat. And what you feed your cat can make a difference. Within three weeks of switching your cat to a food optimal in omega-6 fatty acids and essential vitamins and minerals, such as Purina ONE, you may notice brighter eyes and a shinier coat.
