## Brady Construction pledges \$3 million

## Expanding fun for La Mesa Boys & Girls Club

A special fundraising open house took place at the Boys & Girls Club Brady Family Teen Center on July 24, at the La Mesa Middle School campus.

Honoring Ron and Mary Alice Brady of the La Mesa based Brady Construction Companies, the Brady's have pledged \$1 million to renovate the Brady Family Teen Center and another \$2 million to help build a new 25,000-square-

foot clubhouse to be called the Brady Family Clubhouse to be located on the west end of the middle school campus at Highland Park.

Commendations to Mr. and Mrs. Brady for their generosity

and commitment to support the youth were given from La Mesa Mayor Art Madrid, the La Mesa City Council, and from U.S. Congressman Duncan Hunter.

Attending the special event were alumni from the Helix High School graduating classes of 1967 to 1970, the years Hall of Fame basketball player Bill Walton, a La Mesa native, attended and graduated from Helix H.S. in 1970. Walton spoke to the assembled crowd praising the good moral upbringing his parents gave him and the support provided to him from his close friends, and relatives. He shared memories of his youth growing up in La Mesa and expressed the need and importance for youngsters (ages 11-18) to gather in a friendly, educational, hassle-free environment as offered by the Boys & Girls Club, their home-away-from-home.

Bob Taylor, the founder of Taylor guitars presented a \$50,000 check from the non-profit organization East County EDC Foundation affiliated with the San Diego East County Development Council (ECEDC) of which Taylor is a member. The money donated on behalf of the Matt Magana Fund will be used for computer equipment and career developmental training in the computer room at the Brady Family Clubhouse.

Magana, who passed away at age 20, was a standout industrial arts student at Helix H.S. His mother, Diane Magana, was in attendance at the ceremony and presented a plaque recognizing her son for his outstanding life achievements.

Mayor Art Madrid presented a commendation from the City of La Mesa to the East County EDC Foundation Board.

Steve South, President/CEO of EDCO Disposal, and chairman of the La Mesa Capital Campaign, revealed a new website [www.FriendsOfBillWalton.org](http://www.FriendsOfBillWalton.org) for fundraising efforts to the Bill Walton Gymnasium.

Serving as honorary chairman of the Boys & Girls Club of East County Foundation La Mesa Capital Campaign, Walton is spearheading a drive to collect \$4.5 million to build the Brady Family Clubhouse, renovate the Brady Family Teen Center, and fund an endowment to operate both facilities. The Brady Family Clubhouse

will include a 10,000 square foot gymnasium honorably named after him.

An inductee in the Boys & Girls Clubs of America Hall of Fame, Walton shared his heartfelt memories of growing up in La Mesa, and the privilege and fun he had growing up in San Diego with his friends and relatives. His hope is to keep the torch lit for the youth, as it was for him when he learned the game of basketball, and life in general as a youth.

The children clamored around the legendary champion like a magnet after the ceremony as he signed autographs, took pictures, and shared in the conversation with the youngsters.

"Realize that these young people want so much to be in the game of life," Walton said. "They want to be on top of the mountain, and want to come here and have something to look forward to. How great it is to be part of something special?"

### Senator Anderson and Sheriff Department's Captain Conversation

On July 22 a conversation with Captain James Bovet of the San Diego County Sheriff's Department was held at the Lakeside Library. Bovet announced that mounted patrol is coming to the East County. The patrol team will be volunteers of the Sheriff's Department patrolling the communities of Lakeside, Santee and the unincorporated area of El Cajon. The patrols will be able to access rural areas away from roadways. For information on the new patrol contact Volunteer Services at (858) 974-2084.

Captain Bovet spent the next hour discussing concerns and answering questions of those in attendance. Residents along Maplevue expressed concerns over their safety at some of the apartments in the area. Those concerns ranged from marijuana (medical and other) use to unsavory people in the area, and feeling unsafe when going out to walk in the evenings.

The Captain assured the attendants that the Sheriff's Department is aware there are issues in the Maplevue area and there is a heavy Sheriff's Patrol working there. He was asked if there was anything that could be done about the amount of smoke shops, Hooka lounges and vapor shops that have been opening in Lakeside. Captain Bovet said there was not much that can be done as they are not illegal. He said drugs in the high schools and middle schools remain a high priority. He told the audience heroin is an epidemic in the East County.

The new Sheriff's Station on Parkside is expected to open in the spring of 2015.

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## To refinish or not to refinish

**H**ave you ever eyed an old set of 1950s-era metal lawn chairs and thought, with just a little TLC, those would look extremely cool in my backyard? You're probably right, says refinishing expert Teri Masaschi, author of *Foolproof Wood Finishing: For Those Who Love to Build & Hate to Finish*. The real question with metal pieces is: Do you actually want to make them look good as new? And if the answer is yes, how much time and effort will it take to restore those pieces to their former glory?

## Leaving well enough alone

The first thing you want to consider with metal furniture, Masaschi says, is whether you even want to remove rust and other signs of wear. "The industrial look is really hot right now," she says. "If you have a piece like an old metal workbench from a factory where they manufactured parts, and the metal has taken a beating and there's an old rusty, dirty patina with hardly any paint left, well, people are putting those in their kitchens now. You don't want to touch that, because it will hurt the value of it. The most you'll want to do is wash it with soap and water."

This may be especially true for old metal lighting with clamps, candlesticks, and brass and iron beds, so look at them through a contemporary lens before you decide to refinish. If you can't incorporate them into your own look, you might want to sell them instead. Check out vintage stores on sites such as [Etsy.com](http://Etsy.com) to get a feel for what people are buying; good keywords to use are "vintage," "rustic," "rusty chic" and "industrial."

## Things I have learned in my lifetime

In celebrating my recent birthday, I found myself caught up in a case of nostalgia. I never imagined I would really get this old. One thing I have learned in growing older is that my eyes are not quite what they used to be. For example, the mailbox used to be rather close to the

front door of our house. Now, I can barely see it from the front door and it takes over an hour to reach it by walking. To be truthful, halfway to the mailbox I have to pause and catch my breath.

## — In Memoriam —



Robert "Bob" Jackson

Robert "Bob" Jackson grew up on a farm in Red Lodge, Montana. After graduating from high school, he immediately enlisted in the Navy, where he was rapidly promoted from Seaman all the way through the enlisted ranks and the Warrant Officer ranks, ultimately retiring as a "mustang" Lieutenant after 20 years.

He served in Vietnam from 1968 to 1969 and was in charge of the first group of River Patrol Boats. When one of the PBRs was sunk, he spent three days and nights under enemy fire repairing it. That, and other acts of bravery during the Vietnam War, caused the Navy to award him the coveted Navy Commendation Medal with Combat V.

Upon retirement, he was offered the position of Lieutenant Commander of the Midway, but turned it down when they wouldn't allow him to pursue his Master's Degree simultaneously. He had earned his Bachelor of Arts degree Cum Laude while in service to the Navy. After retiring from the Navy, he went on to enjoy a very successful career selling specialized industrial tools.

Jackson and his first wife, Rose, moved to Alpine in 1994. Bob had been President of his Kiwanis Club in Issaquah WA., where he was instrumental in founding the Issaquah Food and Clothing Bank, still operating today. He immediately joined the Kiwanis

Club of Alpine where he was as active as his job managing sales in several states would allow.

Jackson served as Lieutenant Governor of the Kiwanis Clubs of Division 31 in 2002-03, allowing him to oversee the activities of the 15 very active Kiwanis Clubs in East County. He served as a Kiwanian for 29 years, earning the Legion of Honor award, a Dunlap Fellowship in 2003 and Kiwanis International Life Membership in 2004. He also handled Special Olympics for the Kiwanis Cal-Nev-Ha District for 25 years.

When the Cedar Fire hit in 2003, Jackson had just retired from Atlas-Copco, and immediately began coordinating relief in Harbison Canyon, which was so severely damaged by the fire. As the Immediate Past Lieutenant Governor, he worked side by side with the then current Lieutenant Governor Oscar Knight III in the fire relief efforts, recruiting assistance from all of the East County Kiwanis Clubs in the Division.

Jackson's efforts came to the attention of Senator Dennis Hollingsworth, who then hired him to assist families who had lost their homes to connect with all of the federal and state services available to them. In addition to those duties, Jackson served the Senator as a Field Representative, speaking on his behalf whenever needed. In 2007, the Senator named Jackson "Veteran of the Year."

After his first marriage ended, Jackson married fellow Kiwanian Debbie Jackson in 2006. They were often teased about the fact that her last name was already Jackson when they married.

In 2007, he once again became heavily involved in relief efforts for the Harris Fire. In 2008, he was one of the original group that conceived the idea of finding a way to honor veterans in Alpine. The initial thought of a plaque on a boulder was quickly dismissed, and after years of meetings and fundraisers, the Alpine Veterans Wall of Honor was built on land owned by the Alpine Community Center in 2011. It now stands 70-feet long and 6-feet high and will ultimately honor close to a thousand veterans. Jackson and his wife Debbie have been in charge of overseeing the production of the individual tiles honoring veterans since the beginning. Of all of his many achievements, Jackson was proudest of the Wall of Honor.

Jackson lost his long battle with cancer on July 20, passing away at home with his family at his side. He leaves behind his widow, Debbie Jackson, daughter Christine Dell of Bullhead City, AZ., son Scott Jackson of El Cajon, step-daughter Cathy Wright of Santee, nephews Glenn and Wayne Fluke of Rancho Cordova CA and four grandchildren.

There will be a Celebration of Life for Bob Jackson on Saturday, August 2nd at 1 p.m. at the Alpine Community Center.

## Dear Dr. Luauna — Our story makes impact



Dear Readers,

You may not think your story makes impact; let me share with you what happened at our Church on the Beach Service at Mission Beach.

We find parking and unload our equipment, we stake out a location on the grass across from the Belmont Roller coaster, every 3rd Sunday of the month at 10:30 a.m. We unpack, our 8 foot high, blue flag with white block letters, which simply say, "CHURCH." As the flag is flying, we set up our white, plastic folding chairs, yes we feel somewhat awkward.

Yes, it's a little intimidating surrounded by people who have no thought of church or God while they are at the beach in their swimsuits, or barbecuing with their friends or family. Mission Beach is filled with people from every walk of life.

Why do we have Church on the Beach? I am burdened to take the gospel, the life-changing power of God outside the four walls of the church building where the people are. We start out singing a few songs, "Amazing Grace, or How Great Thou Art," and then I open my Bible and share a complete sermon.

Yes, I am nervous to begin with, but when I see the multitudes of people, young and old with brokenness written all over them. I know they are hurting, searching, lost, and in need of the Savior. Many times during the sermon, the Holy Spirit compels me to share my story of how Jesus rescued me from a life of sin and darkness. I never know who is really listening but I do know as I lift up the power of the cross the Holy Spirit will draw people to Jesus.

I was heading out for a night of partying when Jesus interrupted my life by placing a faithful servant to witness to me. The same way, I stand on Mission Beach and preach the gospel.

On this particular Sunday, we were done and packing up; a middle-aged man approached me. He was perplexed, in his strong Iraqi accent he said, "I watched the people; they were laughing and making fun of you, they don't care, why should you care? You share your heart, your husband was killed." He was holding his head in both hands, shaking his head expressing his disbelief, then he said, "But, I was listening to your story, it touched my heart deeply. Maybe we need Jesus, we are Muslim, but we need Jesus like you talked about."

My son is broken, we have been here in America for five years, and he is into everything bad." I asked this to pray with me too accept Jesus, and then we also prayed for his son.

Our story, our testimonies in Jesus are so powerful and they makes great impact for eternity.

Maybe someday, you too will join me on a third Sunday morning of the month at Mission Beach, 10 a.m., together we make the difference.

Jesus compelled us; Go forth into the entire world to preach the gospel. Let's start right in our own land; America is in need of the gospel message.

The harvest is outside those four walls. Let's not just gather at church, "Us four and no more." The world needs our story today. Share with someone; just tell them what Jesus did in your life. It opens the door to the heart of the listener.

# For Health's Sake

## Young burn survivors gather for 2014 'Camp Beyond the Scars'

From July 29 -August 3, more than 70 children with severe burn injuries will have a chance to do what kids do best - have fun and make friends.

Established in 1987, Camp Beyond the Scars celebrates its 28<sup>th</sup> year and is one of the Burn Institute's most successful burn survivor support programs specifically designed for burn-injured children, 5-17 years. Campers come from all over Southern California and from as far as Nevada. The program provides important tools in a supportive atmosphere where each child can learn how to deal with the emotional and physical hardships they face as a result of their burn injury. Held in an environment with caring counselors and fellow burn survivors, young campers build self-esteem and improve coping skills. For many, the weeklong camp is the first time they have the opportunity to

meet other young burn survivors just like themselves. The Burn Institute provides this camp free of charge to burn-injured children.

This year's summer program will be held at Oakbridge Camp located in Ramona. Throughout the week, campers will participate in a variety of activities, including swimming and water sports, crafts, rock wall climbing, "world cup kickball tournament", a ropes course, laser tag, skate boarding at the camp skate park, a talent show, hiking, a visit from therapy pets, crafts, movie night, and a Bounce House Carnival Day Superhero Themed Party.

"Our theme this year is inspired by Superheroes as we recognize that many of our campers have fought and continue to fight many battles involving their burn injuries. This camp is coming together

to support each camper and inspire them find the superhero within, said Dana Kuhn, Director of Programs for the Burn Institute. "Our camp provides the opportunity for them to form long-term bonds and to build self-esteem."

This year's camp will also emphasize the power of a positive attitude. Campers will learn tools to guide them through difficult circumstances. Workshops and support groups are designed for both teens and pre-teens. Also, once again this year, families dropping off their campers will be invited to a one-hour family support group.

Camp counselors include off-duty firefighters, UCSD Regional Burn Center staff, medical staff, educators and adult burn survivors who volunteer their time for the entire week. Camp Beyond the Scars allows burn-injured children to be kids again -- and not worry about looking different from everyone else," said Susan Day, Executive Director for the Burn Institute. "Camp is a place where these kids can come and just have fun."

The Burn Institute is the local

nonprofit agency dedicated to reducing the number of burn injuries and deaths in San Diego and Imperial Counties. Founded in 1972, one of the Institute's first accomplishments was to help establish the area's first and only regional burn center. Today, the Burn Institute continues to reach thousands of children and adults each year with lifesaving fire and burn prevention education, fund vital burn research and treatment, and conduct burn survivor support programs that help children and adults cope with the devastating psychological and physical effects of their injuries. Usually her memory throws my memory in a different light.

No matter how I recount my memory, she always has some correction to it. More than once, she has claimed I stretched the truth. But I believe, if the truth cannot handle some stretching what good is it in the first place?

As my body gets weaker, my memory gets stronger.

In the Old Testament, David spoke often of the importance of memory. "I remember the days of old; I meditate on

# Skip 'Lucy' if you like common sense in your films

After watching the trailers for *Lucy*, I was looking forward to this film – especially with the

proficient Scarlett Johansson playing the title character. Unfortunately, during the very first scene I was already annoyed.

Lucy is attending college in

Taiwan. One day she's met outside a big building by her new friend Richard (Pilou Asbæk), who carries a small briefcase. He asks her if she would do him the favor of delivering that briefcase to Mr. Jang (Min-sik Choi) inside the building.

When Lucy asks Richard what's in the briefcase, he's evasive. She declines, and he becomes more agitated. She again demands to know what's in the case. At this point, Richard confesses he's in trouble but has been paid \$1000 to deliver the item. Then he sticks \$500 in Lucy's bra. Lucy tells him she doesn't want the money and she doesn't want to do it. At that moment he slaps handcuffs on her which are strapped to the briefcase and runs away telling her the only way she will get it unlocked is to see Mr. Jang.

Luc Besson's film is supposed to be a sci-fi offering concerning the immense power of the human brain, but to me it seems more about drugs, bad people, and repetitive action that comes to no conclusion. Even with only 10 percent of our brain power – which is what the film tells us most of us have (not true though) – any

female facing Lucy's situation would head to a police station to get the cuffs off instead of up the elevator to Mr. Jang, a drug lord and gangster.

However, that would leave the movie nonexistent, so Lucy goes up to Mr. Jang's room, actually sees his minions kill Richard, and is met by a group of thugs. Eventually she's knocked around and drugged. She wakes up the next morning in a bed not knowing where she's at and with blood all over abdomen. At first we wonder if she was raped, brutally beaten or what?

No, she was surgically opened so they could insert a bag of special drugs into her abdomen, so she could transport them out of the country. This scenario inflates as more people show up in different areas in the same situation. But, unlike Lucy, they don't survive.

Before we get to 99 percent of the movie – which shows gangsters and supposedly innocent people shooting each other – Besson inserts crazy visuals (like mice, and cheetahs chasing gazelles, etc.) between scenes. This only complicates what the film is about and what we're supposed to think. And then we meet Professor Norman (Morgan Freeman), a noted specialist on the potential of the human brain.

So Lucy somehow escapes the huge team of Jang's killers that are barely steps behind her so chase scenes make up most of the movie. Conveniently, or in this case probably not, the drugs inside Lucy's body are now increasing her brainpower. Eventually she can see anything, anyone in the world and know what everyone's thinking. We suffer through a long list of things she can remember experiencing such as telling her mother on the phone that she remembers when she was breast-feeding from her mother. Ho-Hum.

Sci-fi geeks will probably love this film, taking it for what it is. But I like a little sensibility to my movie plots, even sci-fi

ones. To me, the scientific aspects inserted here interfere with reason as well as with any concern for the characters.

It's only when Lucy goes to Paris to find Professor Norman (with the Korean gangsters only a shadow behind her) that we see the shallowness of the man's character. Norman and his cronies stand wide-eyed but do nothing to aid Lucy as her body goes into explosive contortion mode and blows up everything around them just to avoid the gangsters. This is a total misuse of an actor like Freeman, who generates more excitement in a Visa commercial than in *Lucy*.

Although this is a portrayal of a character who appears almost like a robot and expresses little interaction other than a blank staring face through most of the film, there's no doubt Johansson is a powerful actress.

Although she's turned into the new mega hero having

appeared in films such as *Avengers*, *Capt. America*, and *Ironman*, she can actually create wonderful characters who move and impact moviegoers. She was nominated for a teen choice award for her role in *The Other Boleyn Girl* and *We Bought a Zoo*; nominated for a Golden Globe Best Performance by an Actress in a Motion Picture in *Girl with a Pearl Earring* and in *A Love Song for Bobby Long*.

Johansson has earned many more awards in films, and I hope to see her make more movies that will express her true talents rather than something like *Lucy* or super heroes that any good actress with a costume could have played.

If drugs, gang lords, killings – even when Lucy shoots a cab driver because he doesn't understand English – films that have no ending and the like, are your thing, see *Lucy*. Otherwise keep those dollars in your pocket for a better film.

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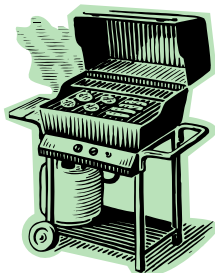

# 'Wish I Was Here' — comedy with sad undertones

A few years ago young actor/writer/director Zach Braff was praised for *Garden State*, his first feature film. Whether it was a stroke of luck or just plain talent, the film put Braff on the map as a young new director to watch. This is always dangerous for a young director because the second creative output is always looked upon with more harshness than anyone should have to endure. Critics are now scrutinizing Braff's Focus Feature *Wish I Was Here*, expecting it to be as good as *Garden State*.

Aidan Bloom (Braff) at 35 is still a struggling actor who yearns to have his dream come

true. He has difficulty getting cast and is usually the wrong type. In one funny scene he auditions for a film — with such stalwart actors as the late James Avery — for a part for which he is obviously unsuited. Bloom is rather messed up psychologically as he is trying to find his own identity while trying to be a father and a husband.

Wife Sarah (Kate Hudson) is a bland blonde in a sea of Hollywood blondes. The film doesn't give her much to do except support her husband's dreams. Aidan's trying to find a purpose in life, but Sarah doesn't seem to have an interest in her own. She seems to be content raising the children.

Aidan and his father Gabe,

played by Broadway veteran Mandy Patinkin, have never seen eye to eye. What they do agree on is that the children be sent to a private Jewish school, for which grandpa has always paid. Unfortunately he is ill and can no longer afford to pay for the children's education. Aidan attempts to home-school the kids and it turns into a hilarious disaster.

The scenes between Braff and Patinkin have a ring of truth. Braff's character desperately wants approval from his father, but dad thinks acting is a silly profession to pursue; and that attitude breaks Aidan's heart. As an actor, Braff has a puppy-dog cuteness to his manner and we can't help but like him, even when he is being unreason-

able. The film wavers between drama and comedy, with the comical scenes lightening what could ultimately turn into a tear-jerker.

TV's Jim Parson comes in for a few cameo scenes to add some laughs, but it doesn't advance the plot, nor should it. Parson is a brilliant comic actor and should be given his own film in which to shine. Pierce Gagnon as Aidan's son and Joey King as Grace, his daughter, both do a great job with their character's arcs.

Aidan's errant and good-for-nothing brother Noah is played by Broadway's Josh Gad. He's good at playing unshaven slobs, and this part is perfect for his comic abilities. Noah doesn't want to have anything to do with his father because he feels he never got any support from him while growing up. Thus,

Noah avoids going to the hospital when his father is dying. Instead he's concentrating on making his costume for comic-con. It's not nice but it's understandable from the son's point of view.

Kudos must go to Patinkin as a generally unlikeable character. He's terrific as the tough old Jew who won't compromise his expectations of what he wants his two sons to become. He would be a good choice as a nominee for Best Supporting

Actor at next year's Academy Awards.

The film is certainly light-hearted and has plenty of comedy to amuse. But it has many dark sides to the story which may not coincide with the audience's expectations from a Braff movie. There are far too many "F" words that are totally unnecessary to the story. In this half comedy and half drama, the audience will have to decide whether it's better to have a half loaf of something or a whole loaf.

vehicle that is exhibiting signs of heat stress by using the amount of force necessary to remove the animal, and shall not be liable for any damages reasonably related to the removal. The pet owner may be charged with animal cruelty.

Creating greater awareness is the key to preventing pets from this unnecessary suffering. TripsWithPets.com offers some tips to help spread the word:

- A good start is to let friends know about the dangers of leaving their pets in a parked car and remind them to keep their pets at home on warm

sunny days if they'll be going anywhere pets are not allowed.

- The Humane Society of the United States has posters available for a nominal fee that store managers can post inside their windows to remind shoppers that "Leaving Your Pet in a Parked Car Can Be a Deadly Mistake." They also have similar hot car flyers.

- Get involved. If you see a pet in a parked car during a warm sunny day, go to the nearest store and have the owner paged. Enlist the help of a local police officer or security guard or call the local police department or animal control office.

## Dangers of leaving your pet in a hot, parked car

With the summer months upon us, pet travel is at its height and it's time for a reminder about the dangers of leaving your pet in a parked car. Whether you're parking in the shade, just running into the store, or leaving the windows cracked, it is still NOT ok to leave your pet in a parked car.

The temperature inside a car can skyrocket after just a few minutes. Parking in the shade or leaving the windows cracked does very little to alleviate this pressure cooker.

On a warm, sunny day try turning your car off, cracking your windows and sitting there. It will only be a few short minutes before it becomes unbearable. Imagine how your helpless pet will feel. On an 85-degree day, for example, the temperature inside a car with the windows cracked can reach 102 degrees within only ten minutes. After 30 minutes, the temperature will reach 120 degrees. At 110 degrees, pets are in danger of heatstroke. On hot and humid days, the temperature in a car parked in direct sunlight can rise more than 30 degrees per minute, and quickly become lethal.

Stanford University School of Medicine conducted a study to measure the temperature

rise inside a parked car on sunny days with highs ranging from 72 to 96 degrees F. Their results showed that a car's interior can heat up by an average of 40 degrees F within an hour, regardless of ambient temperature. Ambient temperature doesn't matter - it's whether it's sunny out. Eighty percent of the temperature rise occurred within the first half-hour. Even on a relatively cool day, the temperature inside a parked car can quickly spike to life-threatening levels if the sun is out.

Further, the researchers noted that much like the sun warms a greenhouse in winter; it also warms a parked car on cool days. In both cases, the sun heats up a mass of air trapped under glass. Precautions such as cracking a window or running the air conditioner prior to parking the car were found to be inadequate.

"If more people knew the danger of leaving their pets in their parked car, they wouldn't do it," states Kim Salerno, TripsWithPets.com President & Founder. "Pets are very susceptible to overheating as they are much less efficient at cooling themselves than people are" adds Salerno. The solution is simple - leave your pets at home if the place you are going does not allow pets.

Dogs are designed to conserve heat. Their sweat glands, which exist on their nose and the pads of their feet, are inadequate for cooling during hot days. Panting and drinking water helps cool them, but if they only have hot air to breathe, dogs can suffer brain and organ damage after just 15 minutes. Short-nosed breeds, young pets, seniors or pets with weight, respiratory, cardiovascular or other health problems are especially susceptible to heat-related stress.

Signs of heat stress include: heavy panting, glazed eyes, a rapid pulse, unsteadiness, a staggering gait, vomiting or a deep red or purple tongue. If a pet becomes overheated, immediately lowering their body temperature is a must.

- Move the pet into the shade and apply cool (not cold) water all over their body to gradually lower their temperature.
- Apply ice packs or cool towels to the pet's head, neck and chest only.
- Allow the pet to drink small amounts of cool water or lick ice cubes.
- Then take the pet to the nearest vet.
