Senator Anderson's Corner

Tragedy turned into live saving foundation

Eric Paredes was a sophomore at Steele Canyon high school when his life was tragically cut short by Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) in 2009. Eric was always known to have a smile on his face, and according to

his friends and family, he was energetic and motivated. His death came with no warning signs or symptoms. When Eric's parents decided to pour their energy into preventing losses like the one they had to go through, the Eric Paredes

Save A Life Foundation was born.

The Eric Paredes Save A Life Foundation hosts free heart screenings for teens to determine the risk for SCA. Early November, hundreds of parents and their teens gathered at Steele Canyon High School for the heart screenings. The Foundation screened 718 teenagers and found 6 of them at risk for SCA.

Devin Lawson is the founder of the Eric Paredes Save A Life Foundation Club at Steel Canyon High School who, thanks to the Foundation, discovered an one-inch hole in his heart and underwent an open heart surgery. Lawson said, "After my open heart surgery, I found the need to give back to the foundation that helped save my life, so I decided to

become a volunteer at their normal screenings around the San Diego area."

The volunteers of the Eric Paredes Save A Life Foundation received Certificates of Recognition from State Senator Joel Anderson at the November 2 screening event. Anderson said, "Hector and Rhina have turned their tragic loss into an inspiring personal mission to educate our community and have saved lives from Sudden Cardiac Arrest. It's an honor to recognize them and Eric Paredes Foundation's dedicated volunteers for their amazing work."

The next screening is at Rancho Buena Vista High School on January 25, 2015.

Lakeside Roundup of Events

Sheriff's Captain Meeting

At the December 16 Captains meeting at the Santee Sheriff's Department, Captain James Bovet delivered some good news — the property and violent crimes rate has lowered by 41% in Santee and 37% in Lakeside. Bovet said the passage of Prop. 47, also known by its ballot title Criminal Sentences, could have a negative effect on these numbers.

Homelessness continues to be an issue in the riverbed in Santee and Lakeside. The mounted horse patrol has been working the riverbed as they are able to look over brush and discover problems that might otherwise be missed. The sheriff's department will be looking for horse patrol volunteers. All volunteers undergo a thorough background check.

Homelessness in the East County tends to be different than it is in San Diego where they have closer access to outreach programs. East County homeless tend to want to be left alone and don't reach out in the same way intercity homeless do.

The next quarterly meeting will be scheduled in March.

Free Citizenship Classes at the Rancho San Diego Library

Take advantage of free resources at the Rancho San Diego Library and attend citizenship classes that will prepare attendees to take the citizenship test. Classes take place on Mondays from 4 – 5:30 p.m. The Rancho San Diego Library is located at 11555 Via Rancho San Diego, El Cajon, CA 92019.

Immigrants have made up a large percentage of the American population since the country was founded. According to the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services, "During the last decade, U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) welcomed more than 6.6 million naturalized citizens into the fabric of our nation. In fiscal year 2013, 777, 416 individuals were naturalized, and in fiscal year 2014, 654,949 people were naturalized." USCIS also reports that, in fiscal year 2013, California was the top state for naturalized citizens.

Your input is needed! The San Diego Multijurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan is a framework that guides communities in making decisions and developing policies to reduce or eliminate risk to life and property. It identifies the types of hazards that threaten our communities, evaluates our vulnerabilities and outlines a strategy to reduce or eliminate the risk posed by those threats.

This year, local, county and special district government agencies will update the region's plan for reducing the threat to life and property from man-made and natural disasters. The results of this survey will be essential in helping a regional working group understand concerns and questions the community has about the threats the region faces and will guide discussions as the group revises the San Diego Multijurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan. This year, the region's 18 city governments, the County and several fire protection and water districts are working together to update the region's plan for mitigating the impact of potential disasters. The group is asking for your input through an online survey. With 18 questions—16 of them multiple choice—the survey just takes a few minutes. It will help gauge residents' level of disaster preparedness and awareness and help local governments set priorities for addressing potential disasters before they happen. Chargers lose to the Chiefs

Much like Christmas, the season is over for Chargers fans. Hopes were high heading into Sunday.

In the final game of the regular season at Arrowhead Stadium, the message was clear. Win 10 games and you're in the playoffs.

That didn't happen for the Chargers as their season ended due to the defensive front seven of the Kansas City Chiefs. Laying the lumber to Philip Rivers, pressuring him by disrupting the pocket, the

Chargers quarterback was sacked seven times. They did not allow him time to get good looks downfield.

With both teams finishing the regular season (9-7), it was Déjà Vu in a sense with last year's season coming down to week 17 against the Chiefs that determined playoff destiny. The Bolts narrowly won that game, and narrowly made the playoffs.

Again it was Philip Rivers versus KC backup QB Chase Daniel who looked spectacular in both duals.

Managing his team well,

Daniels masterfully directed his team to victory.

Ironically with a lot of statistics on their side the Chargers outrushed a much heralded KC running game. Rivers finished the game 20-of-34, 291-yards, no touchdowns, two INT's. The Bolts won the time of possession, and allowed only one touchdown from a recovered fumble in the end zone. The game ended with Rivers second interception. Nothing went right for the Bolts.

Kansas City premier pass rusher nose-tackle Justin Houston was a one-man wrecking crew who wreaked havoc upon

the Chargers backup lineman with four sacks, three tackles for a loss, and three quarterback hits.

Going just 2-for-11 on third down conversions 1-for-3 on fourth down, the Chargers turned the ball over three times, and allowed seven sacks of their quarterback. It's hard to win at home with that performance, especially on the road at Kansas City.

"Unfortunately we didn't play good enough football to win," confided Chargers Head Coach Mike McCoy. "We made too many mistakes in all three phases against a good football team on the road. The (Bolts) defense held them to field goals. The offense didn't get enough points to win."

Good points from an injury wracked season for San Diego, was the play of the Tony Paga-

no coached defense, virtually keeping the Chargers in every game. The running of non drafted free-agent RB Brandon Oliver, and, the "never say die" Mike McCoy attitude exhibited by the Chargers during the entire 2014 season making it exciting, and fun to watch.

"I thanked the players for the effort they gave us. I thanked them for everything they did from Dean Spanos all the way down the organization. A lot of hard work went into putting this organization together" said McCoy.

“Unbroken” – inspiring, shocking, a must-see

There’s a reason Laura Hillenbrand’s *Unbroken* was on the New York Times Bestseller list for three years and ultimately becoming a contender in this season’s awards for Best Picture.

The epic drama of Louis “Louie” Zamperini’s (Jack O’Connell) life kept me glued from begging to end in both the book and the film.

After settling in Torrance, California with his Italian immigrant parents and older brother Pete (John D’Leo in the early scenes, Alex Russell later) Louie’s (his boy years portrayed by C.J. Valleroy) life is not the greatest.

He’s often bullied and turns to some unsavory ways to spend his days. Louie loves to prank people which often

comes back to bite him. He also loves to steal things, which may have actually been fate since he learns to run so fast, Pete begins training him in competitions. Louie ends up at the 1936 Olympics in Berlin at just 19-years-old.

His love of running quickly comes to a sudden stop when WWII begins and the Olympics are stopped in Berlin. Louie, still a fearless lad, runs and jumps up to steal a German flag off the Reich Chancellery.

Louie joins the Army Air Corps and becomes a bombardier based out of Oahu. He’s daring and courageous but his luck only lasts so long. After a fight where his plane is struggling with 600 holes in it, he and only two others on board who survived, find themselves floating in two small life boats.

This part of the film is inspiring. Although Director Angelina Jolie or screenwriters Ethan and Joel Cohen, drug this situation out a little too long, it’s intense. Not only do the men have to deal with no food or water, getting ill and barely staying alive for their 47

days on the ocean; they also have to deal with each other’s personalities.

As the pilot of the plane Louie automatically feels in charge and explains to Russell “Phil” Phillips (Domhnall Gleeson) and Francis “Mac” McNamara (Garrett Hedlund), that they will occasionally share one square from the chocolate bar that was in their survival kit and a small source of water. Over the next 47 days they become more discouraged when they run out of food and water and their attempts to reveal themselves to search planes go unnoticed.

Although these are horrific times, the men soon learn they are nothing compared to the treatment they receive when

captured by the Japanese and sent to the Naoetsu POW camp. The men swiftly learn their prisoners would rather kill them than deal with them. For some reason, the camp’s leader, Mutsuhiro Watanabe (Takamasa Ishihara), a.k.a. “The Bird,” takes an immediate liking to personally seeing that Louie is severely mistreated every day. A somewhat psycho-sadist, he beats Louie in the head and elsewhere with a thick bamboo stick and yet moments later whispers sweet words in the hero’s ear.

Just watching this film and imaging anyone could survive this treatment says so much about Zamperini. Gleeson and Hedlund and all the cast do a great job, but O’Connell is amazing in his portrayal.

Zamperini’s life after his release is also inspiring. He attended a Billy Graham Cru-

sade and became a born-again Christian. Zamperini made a trip to Japan to find the guards from the POW camp and tell them he forgave them; Ishihara was deceased by then.

Zamperini passed away on July 2, 2014, at the age of 97. He did get to see a draft of the film, described as one of the greatest stories of triumph in the 20th century.





Here are three simple ways pet owners can prepare for emergencies and prevent accidents:


- The American Red Cross recommends taking a Pet First Aid Class to learn such basics as how to administer medicine, treat wounds, care for injuries and prepare for disasters.
