Parkway Plaza marketing director embraces El Cajon community

Every business needs good leadership and the ability to make decisions that will keep the business thriving in a competitive atmosphere. With a large shopping center like Starwood's Parkway Plaza, part

of that responsibility lands on the shoulders of the marketing director.

Ken Gray was marketing director for Westfield Shopping Center in Carlsbad and eventually promoted to regional marketing director and overseeing marketing activities for

all seven San Diego Westfield centers as well as Westfield Palm Desert and Main Place in Orange County. Gray chose to work with Starwood because he likes their philosophy.

"Starwood believes that every center needs to have the voice of the community,"

Gray said. "They don't need to brand their name with a specific center, so we are simply Parkway Plaza. Every one of the 29 Starwood centers will have its own voice and feed into the community."

Changes have already been made at Parkway Plaza under

Starwood's philosophy, but Gray sees many more to come.

"We are not a UTC or Fashion Valley; we focus on being a family center," Gray said. "That's what I liked about Starwood, so this was the right place for me. Starwood Retail Partners was formed in 2012 and is a division of leading real estate investment firm Starwood Capital Group."

Changes are being made in the mall colors to coincide with the community. A program to give back to the community was initiated at local schools in January. Twenty local schools were asked to send in Parkway Plaza receipts or scan them online and they would get a point for their school to use towards computers, uniforms or other needs of the school. The program will likely return for the next school year. In a recent all day blood-drive at the mall they achieved 122% of their goal.

"We have new flooring coming and new soft seating in a park-scape mode" Gray said. "We have new LED lighting to make it warmer and friendlier, and will be doing some major landscaping upgrades and have new signage."

As far as marketing goes, Gray has footprints in many venues. He did event market-

ing for the Chrysler Corporation and was one of first ones to start negotiating contracts with malls to put cars inside so people could come in and look at them without the pressure of going to a car dealer.

Gray also served as a teacher who oversaw a special virtual enterprise for juniors and seniors at Mission Vista high school.

"Students created their own virtual business," Gray said. We have a CEO, Vice President, marketing VP, HR head, payroll department and others. The student would earn a virtual salary and decide when they could live on their income and other real-life situations. It was very valuable for the students."

Gray has many ideas to enhance Parkway Plaza and meet community needs.

"We're continuing to focus on several projects," Gray said. "We're pleased that with our security we have less criminal incidents than other San Diego centers. The El Cajon community is important to us so we are committed to the look and feel of Parkway Plaza and to make it a destination everyone will seek out."

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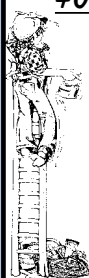

SDG&E has sufficient power supplies to meet the summer demand

San Diego Gas & Electric (SDG&E), the California Independent System Operator Corp. (ISO), and the California Energy Commission announced that sufficient electricity supplies are available to meet regional energy needs this summer. Customers, however, may be called to conserve in the event of an unexpected power emergency, such as much hotter than expected weather or the unplanned loss of a power plant or transmission line.

"Our mission is to ensure safe and reliable energy to our nearly 3.4 million customers," said Steven D. Davis, president and chief operating officer for SDG&E. "As the weather continues to warm, energy demand increases due to more air conditioning use. Despite having adequate electric resources to meet that de-

mand, conditions may change anytime due to unexpected situations that may require our customers to conserve."

"The ISO's recent assessment of summer conditions show we have adequate electricity resources to meet California's needs this summer, even with the severe drought and high demand expected over this warm summer," said Steve Berberich, ISO's president and chief executive officer. "The ISO is committed to a reliable grid, and we will keep a close watch on the system, especially in Southern California where fires, high demand and transmission congestion can present challenges. Consumers also play a vital role in keeping the system reliable by voluntarily conserving power when a Flex Alert is called."

"While recent summers

have delivered relatively mild weather, active collaboration between California's energy agencies, SDG&E, Southern California Edison and the California Independent System Operator has ensured adequate electricity supply for what may be warmer temperatures ahead," said Drew Bohan, chief deputy director of the California Energy Commission. "We need residents and businesses to play their part by conserving energy and water, especially when Flex Alerts are issued as a way to help maintain service reliability during short and prolonged heat waves."

Over the past several years, SDG&E has increased the reliability of the local grid through new and improved infrastructure, such as the new East County substation project. Customer Service enhancements include the re-

cently launched Reduce Your Use Thermostat program that provides programmable communicating thermostats to eligible customers, free of charge, and when installed offers a higher bill credit on Reduce Your Use Rewards days.

SDG&E also recommends these tips to save on energy use and costs especially during the summer:

- Adjust your thermostat. Set it to 78F for summer AC.
- Use smart strips or unplug items when not in use.
- Replace regular light bulbs with compact fluorescent or LEDs.
- Use motion sensors on outdoor lighting to save up to 50% of lighting costs.
- Seal and insulate your

home to keep the cool air in during summer.

- Lower your water temperature or try a cold water wash with clothes, especially if you have an electric water heater.

- Change out a single speed pool pump to a variable speed one.

When it's hot - visit a Cool Zone near you

You can beat the heat and save on energy costs by going to a local Cool Zone! Cool Zones are designated air-conditioned buildings easily identifiable by a light blue Polar Bear Cool Zone logo. There are more than 100 locations throughout San Diego County in libraries, indoor malls and senior centers. (Like the Downtown El Cajon Library and the Parkway Plaza Mall) The Cool Zones website provides a list of places to go that are air-conditioned when the weather is extremely hot as a way to stay cool and save on energy costs. For more information on Cool Zones, visit www.CoolZones.org or call (800) 510-2020.

Some HOT weather safety tips:

- Dress for the heat. Wear lightweight, light-colored clothing. Light colors will reflect away some of the sun's energy. It is also a good idea to wear hats or to use an umbrella.
- Drink water. Carry water or juice with you and drink continuously even if you do not feel thirsty. Avoid alcohol and caffeine, which dehydrate the body. Avoid using salt tablets unless directed to do so by a physician.
- Eat small meals and eat more often. Avoid high-protein foods, which increase metabolic heat.
- Slow down. Avoid strenuous activity, such as gardening and exercise. If you must do strenuous activity, do it during the coolest part of the day, which is usually in the morning before 7 a.m.
- Stay indoors when possible. If air-conditioning is not available - go to the nearest Cool Zone. Be a good neighbor. During heat waves, check in on elderly residents in your neighborhood.
- Make sure pets are safe. Be sure they have cool shade and plenty of water.
- Remember - temperatures in a vehicle can rise dramati-

cally, quickly causing serious injuries even death. NEVER leave babies, children, the elderly or your pets in a vehicle - not even for a moment.

"John and his staff work extremely hard to educate our community about the importance of water conservation and ways we can help during this critical drought in California," said

The success of the Water Conservation Garden depends on the dedication of its volunteers, and Thom and Dianne exemplify what it means to give back."

Santee City Council approves Santee's Magnolia Avenue shopping center

The Santee City Council recently approved the Santee Station for the development of a 16,942-square-foot, four-building commercial center, located on 2.65 acres at 8866 North Magnolia Ave. in Santee.

"This is a significant step in the ownership's plans to develop this important site," said Kyle Clark, senior director at The Heritage Group. "We have been working with the key tenants for 18 months to finalize a workable site plan and design. Fortunately, we were able to put a package together that will allow the Omelette Factory to stay in Santee."

The buildings are anticipated to be completed in January and the tenants will be able to complete their improvements and open for business in late March or early April of 2016, Clark said. The now-completed 52 freeway terminates at the intersection of Highway 67, Magnolia Avenue and Prospect Avenue, creating a revitalized eastern gateway to the city of Santee.

The Omelette Factory signed a 15-year lease for a 4,030-square-foot build-to-suit space at the new retail center. Clark represented the owner and tenant in securing the lease. The Heritage Group is in

negotiations with a national retail tenant for the northern pad.

The land, which is owned by Cameron Brothers, has been vacant for close to 30 years. The property had been home to Hanley's Steak House restaurant and Buy-Lo market, which was torn down in August 2001. Prior to that, the land was near the Santee Railroad Station.

The new development's name, Santee Station, pays tribute to the land's history. The site may feature railroad-themed enhancements, possibly utilizing old rails as a component of the monument signage.

"The Cameron Family is excited about the ZAAP-designed development and the relocation of The Omelette Factory to Santee Station," said Jim Moxham, CEO at Cameron Brothers Company. "The Omelette Factory is a Santee institution and they will be in a beautiful new building adjacent to the 52 and 67 highways. We expect their business to grow significantly at the new location."

Understanding the Grandpa rules

As circumstance would have it, and I like to give circumstances due credit, I was visiting my grandchildren without the Gracious Mistress of the Parsonage.

Normally, if there is such a status, my wife travels with me when we visit the grandchildren. However, when she is along I do not have a chance. I will not say that she hogs the grandchildren, she does, I just will not say so. As a husband, I know when to speak my mind and when to mind my speaking. The inexperienced husband does not know the difference and pays for it.

With the opportunity before me to go solo with the grandchildren, I determined to make the best of it. I never know when this kind of a situation will repeat itself. When my wife is with me, she always holds the reins, but now I have nobody to curtail my visit with the grandchildren. I am a freelance grandpa.

What many people may not know is that there are rules governing the successful grandfather. Most people do not know these rules because

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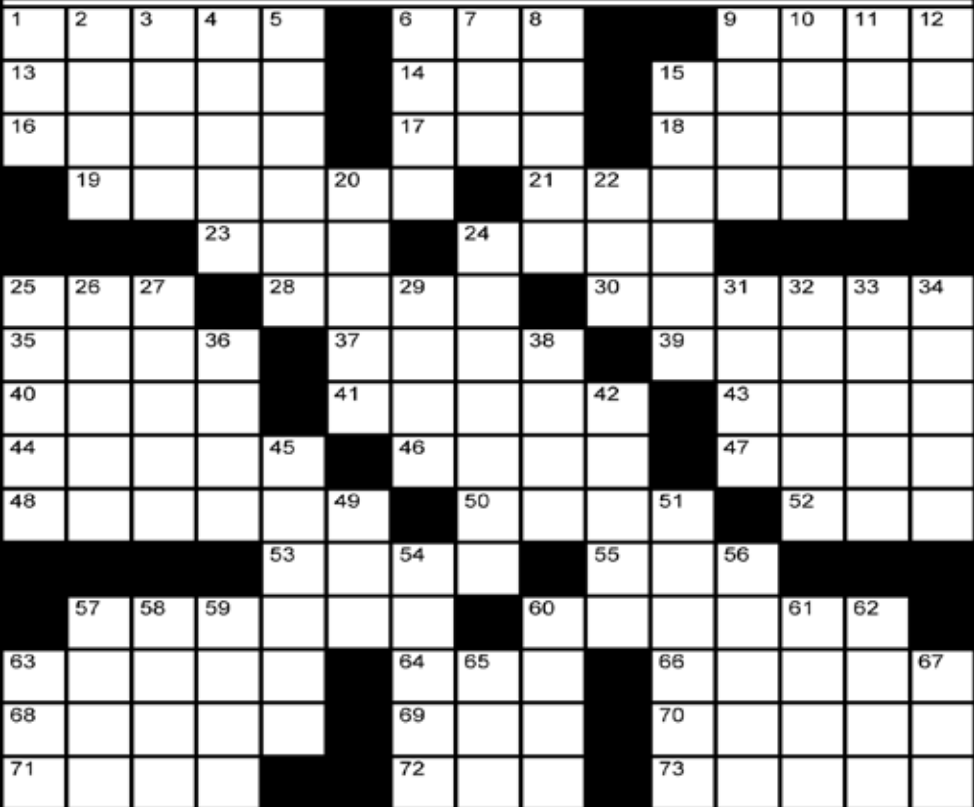

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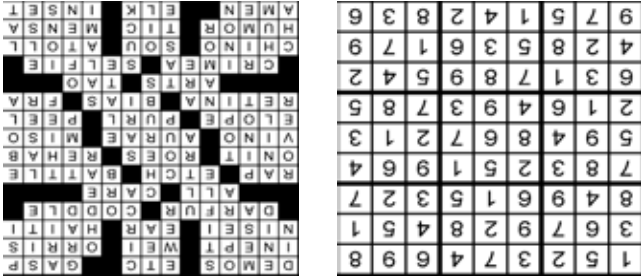
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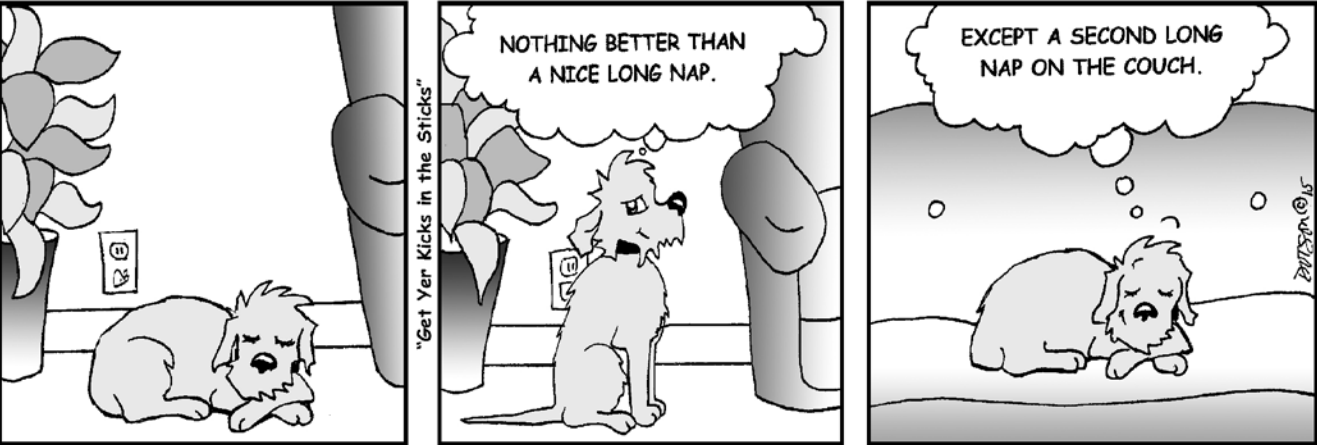

'Amy' — from obscurity to one of England's most popular new singers

Six-time Grammy winner Amy Winehouse is the subject of this penetrating documentary. The brilliant, yet tragic singer-songwriter, died at age 27 from alcohol poisoning in her London home. Surprisingly, there is quite a lot of archival footage of the singer taken throughout her career, and director Assif Kapadia has selected the most

powerful scenes that depict Winehouse's out-of-control life.

Amy Jade Winehouse was born September 14, 1983 in Southgate, London and joined her older brother Alex (b. 1979) and her parents Mitch and Janis. Influenced by many of her musician relatives, Amy expressed an interest in jazz. Her grandmother encouraged her musical in-

clinations and suggested she attend the Susi Earnshaw Theatre School, which led to Winehouse attending other music and theatre schools in London to expand her theatrical knowledge. She formed the rap group Sweet 'n' Sour with her life-long best friend Juliette Ashby. Writing her own songs at age 14, Winehouse agreed her main influences were top jazz singers Sarah Vaughn and Dinah Washington.

The archive footage that has been cleverly patched together shows a young and unspoiled Amy with her high school friends, singing and joking. She was young, pure and joyful. She was introduced into the recording field by her friend and soul singer Tyler James. Amy was signed by Simon Fuller's famed 19 Management in 2002 for development as a recording singer. Her talent was of such tremendously innovative power that she couldn't be contained under wraps for long. Island Records, a division of Universal, immediately signed her to a contract.

The film goes behind the scenes many times and reveals what it was like to go from obscurity to one of England's most popular new singers. Her debut album, *Frank*, topped

the charts in England in 2003 and propelled Winehouse into the stratosphere of celebrity-ism. Her rise to the top was swift, but in many scenes she wasn't particularly enamored of being a celebrity and her rebellion probably began at this time. With the release of her second album titled *Back to Black*, the tiny 5'-3" star achieved international success in 2006. The biggest song to come out of that album was "Rehab," almost an anthem for her life. Josh Tyrangiel of *Time* magazine selected "Rehab" as the Best Song of 2007 and said, "It's impossible not to be seduced by her originality. What she is, is mouthy, funny, sultry and quite possibly crazy."

Her fans loved her but her personal life was becoming more and more chaotic. The paparazzi wouldn't leave her alone, and she positively was shattered by all the attention. The film shows how scary it was for her to be confronted by a pack of "animals" wielding cameras everywhere she went.

In 2007 her life began a downward spiral of drugs and alcohol aided and abetted somewhat by her new husband, a some-time musician and bad boy who ended up in jail for possession of narcotics. Winehouse began missing

play-dates, or showing up drunk and drugged on stage. It was the beginning of the end. The documentary shows the sadness of her potentially great career and life being snuffed out.

Although in the last few months of her life, Winehouse got off drugs, the damage was already done to her fragile body. She died peacefully in her sleep at age 27 on July 23, 2011 from what has been noted as heart failure and alcohol poisoning.

her emotions into characters, then we can see what is happening to the girl and what is happening inside her mind. I can't think of another film that has done this to tell a story.

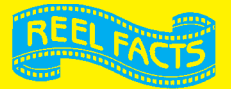
All actions in Riley's head are administered in Headquarters. Her five emotions work hard to keep Riley safe and happy. Captained by Joy (voice of Amy Poehler), she's bubbly and funny and is determined to make Riley happy. Stand-up comic Lewis Black is hysterically funny as Anger, something he does so well in his stage act and which works perfectly for the character. TV favorite Bill Hader does the voice of Fear, who heads up safety. His manic actions are highlights of the film. The character of Disgust is green and is determined

to keep Riley from getting poisoned physically and socially. Indian actress Mindy Kaling knocks this character out of the park. And finally there is Sadness, played charmingly by Phyllis Smith.

Going inside someone's mind is like being a psychoanalyst, and we are expected to do so to understand Riley's fragile emotions. She's very upset and sad by having to leave her hometown to move to San Francisco. The audience is taken on a roller coaster ride of Riley's emotions as she survives everyday life. All these emotional escapades are done with color, verve and an imaginative flair. A touch of humor here and there relieves some of the seriousness, and laughs will arise from the witty

dialogue and silly shenanigans of certain characters.

The picture is a bit abstract for mainstream audiences, but those hip and sharp youngsters bouncing in the theater seats will get it and love it.

How to Check for Fleas and Ticks

Adult ticks are often visible to the naked eye, so you may be able to spot them on short-haired pets. But with longer haired pets, it's best to do a thorough inspection with a fine-toothed comb.

Signs your pet may have fleas can include flea dirt (small dark flakes), excessive itching or scratching, redness and inflammation, hot spots and pale gums. You may also see adult fleas on your pet's coat and skin.
