# Miss Amazing pageant — encourages big dreams for women and girls with disabilities

Local resident, Jocelyn Tatum - Miss Amazing Teen, participated in the opening ceremonies for the Special Olympics World Games

t one very special pageant, it isn't about who has the best voice or the prettiest dress. It is, however, still about the tiara.

"Every girl at the Miss Amazing pageant receives a crown because every girl to an extent in her own way is Miss Amazing, just by participating in the event and really pushing her limits," said Jordan Somer, the founder of the Miss Amazing pageant, which is just for girls with physical and mental disabilities.

"We have participants who have Downs Syndrome, we have participants who have autism, high-functioning, low-functioning. We have participants that don't use words to talk," said Somer.

Somer created the Miss Amazing pageant when she was just 13 years old, and now, eight years later, pageants are held across the country. Events, which include an introduction ceremony, evening wear and talents like martial arts and singing, are designed to help build confidence and self-esteem.

With millions of eves on beauty pageants worldwide, it had come to our attention that we could be the ones to start an entire new journey of pageants. This new pageant circuit forever changes the lives of girls and women with disabilities and allows the participants and audience members to realize, on stage, and thereafter, that they too have amazing abilities. Crowns, prizes, dresses, and the works are all put together to crown Miss Amazing participants throughout the United

Jocelyn Tatum won the State title earlier this year and participated for the National title on July 28. A sophomore at Granite Hills High School Tatum entered her first pageant in 2013, The Alpine Princess Pageant. She then went on to win her first title — CYE Junior Miss Mountain Empire 2014.

Diagnosed at age 2 with autism Tatum's parent's Karina and Josh found out that their daughter gained self confidence and public speaking abilities by participating in these pageants. This year Tatum is a co-Capitan for a team for Relay for Life in San Diego and participated in the opening ceremonies for the Special Olympics World Games.

Miss Amazing is so much more than a pageant. It is a platform for girls and women with disabilities to share their abilities and ambitions. By encouraging its participants to dream big and reach their full potential, the Miss Amazing Pageants prove that the world is a much

better place when the talents and ambitions of all people are celebrated and valued.

In 2007, Jordan Somer held the first Miss Amazing Pageant in her hometown of Omaha, Nebraska. The program evolved into a non-profit organization in 2010 and spread to 10 more states that year. Today, the Miss Amazing Pageant is held in 30 states across the country and has touched the lives of more than 650 girls and women with disabilities.

# SDG&E and Girl Scouts partner to improve fire safety

an Diego Gas & Electric (SDG&E) and Girl Scouts San Diego are pleased to announce the completion of a \$150,000 helipad at Girl Scouts' Camp Winacka near Julian. This helipad provides a new strategic landing area for CAL FIRE and emergency responder aircraft in a key, high-risk fire area.

The helipad is located just 200 yards from Upper Lake at Camp Winacka. The lake became a dipping station for CAL FIRE helicopters as a result of restoration work funded by SDG&E in 2013. Now, with the completion of the helipad, a fire-fighting helicopter can be pre-positioned at Camp Winacka and load water directly from the lake, saving precious response time in the event of a backcountry wildfire. CAL FIRE also will use the camp for logistics training.

"Every second is critical when getting to the scene of a wild-fire," said Tony Mecham, CAL FIRE and San Diego County Fire Chief. "We thank Girl Scouts San Diego and SDG&E for providing a valuable asset that will help us more quickly reach small wildfires and prevent them from becoming big ones."

The helipad and lake renovation serve dual purposes. During summer camps and weekend visits, Girl Scouts can fish, canoe, and engage in sci-



ence, technology, engineering and math activities, such as stargazing through telescopes and launching water rockets.

The helipad also improves the local community's ability to respond to medical emergencies involving campers, hikers or area residents.

"We are thrilled that, by partnering with SDG&E to renovate the lake and create the helipad at Camp Winacka, we are contributing to emergency response during fire season," said Girl Scouts San Diego CEO Jo Dee C. Jacob. "These enhancements will also provide valuable program space for thousands of Girl Scouts."

"Sealing the lake and building a helipad at Camp Winacka greatly improve the region's fire preparedness," said John Sowers, vice president of electric distribution operations for SDG&E. "SDG&E is proud to support the safety of the region, and we applaud Girl Scouts San Diego for creating a 'win-win' situation that benefits campers, the community and CAL FIRE."

SDG&E is a regulated public utility that provides safe and reliable energy service to 3.4 million consumers through 1.4 million electric meters and 868,000 natural gas meters in San Diego and southern Orange counties.

# SANDAG awards \$15 million in grants to fund Smart Growth and Active Transportation Projects

The SANDAG Board of Directors recently voted to award 29 grants totaling \$15 million to jurisdictions throughout San Diego County to support a variety of projects that promote smart growth, as well as walking, biking, and transit ridership. As part of the grant applications, the recipients have committed to provide \$12.7 million as matching funds to complete the projects, resulting in more than \$27 million in combined regional investments.

Twelve million dollars in grants are being distributed under the TransNet Smart Growth Incentive Grant Program, and \$3 million under the Active Transportation Grant Program. These grant programs are funded by the TransNet regional half-cent sales tax for transportation approved by San Diego County voters.

The grants will pay for both capital and planning projects. Projects funded range from a bus/bike safety outreach program in Oceanside to way-finding and gateway signs in National City, from a Sixth Avenue bridge promenade in Downtown San Diego to a bike project in Santee. A complete list of awards is available online.

Evaluation panels for each program reviewed the grant applications in each category and ranked them according to criteria approved by the SANDAG Board last winter. The top-ranking projects were recommended for funding. The grants were approved July 24 by the SANDAG Board.

Both grant programs aim to fund projects with the potential to serve as catalysts for change in local communities. The Smart Growth Incentive Grant Program focuses on facilitating compact, mixed-use development around transit, thereby increasing housing and transportation choices. The Active Transportation Grant Program focuses on adding and improving bike and pedestrian facilities, as well as supporting the Regional Bike Plan.

Most people, instead of using the cold water that initially comes out when they take a shower, allow the water to flow until it gets warm enough for the person to bathe in. That initial cold water however, just flows down the drain. Guzman's bucket would catch the unused water and save it, and a large pitcher would be used to scoop it out for a variety of other uses, such as flushing toilets or watering plants.

Guzman excitedly shared, "We already use it in our house and we're getting other people in our community to use it too. We go to a lot of the Water Conservation Garden's events to speak to the people in the community about it."

Guzman's water bucket idea stemmed from her experiences, like meeting with her organization's sponsor, the Water Conservation Garden and her family members. "My grandma is a gardener," she explained. "And she taught me how to save water by planting succulent plants that conserve water."





eeping the excitement new and unexpected in film sequels can be a challenge. That's no problem with Mission: Impossible – Rogue Nation, the fifth installment in the constantly accelerating action-thriller series. Director Christopher Mc-Quarrie (Edge of Tomorrow, Jack Reacher, The Usual Suspects) waste no time in getting the adrenaline of audience viewers pumping as Hunt is in the mist of The Syndicate's trained killers with little hope of surviving. The heated moments slide away as Ilsa Faust (Rebecca Ferguson), the beautiful Syndicate agent sent in to kill him, instead aids his escape

but not before Hunt rumbles with several other agents.

On the run and contacted by his colleague Benji (Simon Pegg), Hunt learns about the IMF being ordered to disband. Benji realizes how urgent Hunt's mission is and insists he join him in his efforts.

McQuarrie, who also wrote the screenplay, leaves no minute in this film that is not filled with danger, crazy chase scenes, and very funny moments as well. Because Ilsa appears to be a real dilemma since at one moment she seems to want to aid the IMF: but then will do something unexpected to aid The Syndicate. As Hunt's other colleagues; Luther Stickell (Ving Rhames) and Solomon Lane (Sean Harris) eventually show up to assistance in his situation, the energy, mystery and excitement reaches fever peaks.

Cruise carries on as if he's in his 20's and Ferguson is eye-candy and sensational in keeping viewers wondering whose side is she really on.




