



Classroom of the Future Foundation honors local schools and educators

Contemporary Teaching Achievements and San Diego County Superintendent Randolph Ward Recognized at 13th Annual Innovation in Education Awards

onoring education leaders, schools and programs that use dynamic educational technology and practices to prepare San Diego County students to thrive in a competitive workforce, the Classroom of the Future Foundation is hosting its 13th Annual Innovation in Education Awards on May 25.

Among the awardees is San Diego County Superintendent of Schools Dr. Randolph E. Ward, recipient of the Visionary & Outstanding Leadership Award. Ward's decade in San Diego has been marked by a technological transformation in San Diego County schools. Under Ward's guidance, teachers have been provided not only the tools, but also the training they need to more fully engage students through technology. Ward has also ensured thousands of children across the county are able to take advantage of high-speed internet at home for "24-7"

"Dr. Ward's digital literacy initiatives are preparing students for success in the real world," said James Wright, the newly appointed CEO at Classroom of the Future Foundation. "Along with leading the overall technological advancement of San Diego County schools, he has also provided access to technology for many students in need. The foundation wants to honor that kind of exploration and assistance."

Classroom of the Future Foundation works hand-in-hand with educators like Ward to connect students to programs that prepare them for the workforce.

"Each year, the foundation recognizes classroom leaders and programs that expand student learning through contemporary teaching techniques," said Wright. "The awardees this year are prime examples of how schools can use innovative learning practices to create pathways to success in a 21st Century workforce."

Education programs to be honored at the 13th Annual Innovation in Education Awards event, which is sponsored by G Force Global Technologies and other companies, and will be

held at the University of San Diego, include:

- Health Science High & Middle College in San Diego will receive the Impact Award for its Health Pathways Program. The four-year-old program is a comprehensive career development model that integrates an on-site health care internship into coursework. Students aspiring for a career in health can not only prepare for industry certification, but also enter wage-earning jobs during their education. In partnership with Sharp HealthCare, the program provides more than 500 internships, through which students accumulate more than 50,000 hours of experience annually.
- Orange Glen High School in Escondido will receive the Inspire Award for the integration of technology into teaching methods for intellectually disabled students. The students use Chromebooks and iPads for daily innovative. fun and experimental projects. Through engaging multimedia, intellectually disabled students learn how to send emails, seek community resources and apply for volunteer jobs. Students takes an active role in their learning process to maximize ability and enrich their quality
- Montgomery Middle School in San Diego will receive the Innovate Award for its Makerspace Lab. The school's 20th century woodshop was recently gutted and turned into a 21st century engineering lab. From electronic circuits to 3-D printers, students have the opportunity to create inventions that solve a problem or satisfy a need. The design thinking process allows students to feel empowered for their creativity and recognize their ability to create real-world solutions.
- Hilltop Middle School in Chula Vista will receive the Achieve Award for its Foreign Language and Global Studies program. With a dedicated team of students, teachers and parents, FLAGS creates rigorous interdisciplinary projects to encourage collaborative problem solving and foster global perspectives. Students engage in mock trials, Socratic seminars, blogging and digital media creation to become effective communicators and critical thinkers. A strong component of FLAGS is the interdisciplinary approach to instruction. Educators work collaboratively to teach in-

terconnected content, such as baseball statistics in math, Jackie Robinson in history, and experiments between wood and aluminum bats in science.

Along with Ward, individual education leader honorees include:

- Innovative Superintendent Award recipient Dr. Jeffrey Felix, who holds a doctorate in education, has been superintendent of the Coronado Unified School District since 2008. His groundbreaking research on edublogging was the first in-depth study on the use of blogging as an instructional practice.
- Innovative Principal Award recipient Laura Smith is the principal of Casita Center, a STEM magnet school in Vista. Principal Smith's incorporation of technology in the classroom results in strong standardized test scores, a feat that's impressive because more than 60 percent of the school's students are low-income and more than 40 percent are English language learners. (Award sponsor: Curriculum Associates)
- Innovative Educator Award recipient Laura Spencer is the director of educational technology at Lakeside Union School District. Spencer oversees the implementation of technology-integrated instructional programs in the classroom. As a teacher, her project LemonLink provided high-speed Internet connectivity and access to quality digital resources for all middle school students. (Award sponsor: Peterson Hill Marketing)
- The Innovative Technology Award recipient Tom Nusser is a science teacher at Innovation Middle School in San Diego. Nusser has taught science for 18 years and strives to share his passion for engineering and robotics through a rigorous science curriculum. His students learn in a one-on-one, iPad teaching

environment and participate in blended, inquiry-based STEM projects school-wide. (Award sponsor: SDCUE)

 A second Innovative Technology Award recipient is Jo-Ann Fox an elementary school teacher in the Escondido Union School District. Fox is a co-planner for EdCamp San Diego, which provides free professional development for educators across Southern California. In addition, Jo-Ann shares the effectiveness of technology, STEAM learning and design thinking implementation in the classroom at education conferences countywide. (Award sponsor: SDCUE)

At the Innovation in Education Awards, leaders will also present \$28,000 in scholarships provided by the USS Midway Museum and the Jack in the Box Foundation to 14 students participating in the AVID program and pursuing a

STEM degree. AVID, founded in San Diego in 1980, is the country's most successful college prep program.

Why Mothers would make good politicians

Moreover, the messes they cleanup are not their doing, which is what makes it so terrific.

Anybody who steps outside their house knows that the country is in a terrible mess these days. It would be impossible to blame one political party over another. In this area, everybody is equal. The truth is, politicians make messes. Furthermore, they leave these messes for other people to clean up. Many politicians have dirty mouths and minds, but none has dirty hands from cleaning up messes.

There are two kinds of politicians in our country. Those who make messes and those who allow those messes to be made. Wouldn't it be nice to find a politician who actually would clean up a mess?

Their universal answer to everything is, "Because I'm your mother!"

Question a politician, you get the runaround. Question your mother and she will chase you around. It would be more beneficial to be chased around by your mother than to have some politician give you the runaround.

Another reason mothers would make good politicians is that they never stop until the work is finished. Everybody has heard the old saying, "A man works from sun up to sun down, but a woman's work is never done." At the end of the day, every mother has something to show for her work.

It would be beneficial for our country if every politician were apprenticed to a mother with four or five kids. Let him follow her around for a week, if he can last a week, and he will get some idea of what working is all about.

Let some politician clean up after four or five kids for a week and experience real work. Perhaps, if he has to clean up messes of other people's making he might think twice before he makes a mess himself. The only work a politician really does, is working his mouth, which rarely accomplishes anything useful.

Instead of putting his political career ahead of everything else, he would sacrifice himself to benefit other people, to help clean up the messes around him.

Although it may seem like a good idea, we cannot afford to send mothers to Washington and neglect the important work she has at home. Nehemiah said it so well, "I am doing a great work, so that I cannot come down: why should the work cease, whilst I leave it, and come down to you?" (Nehemiah 6:3).

God knew exactly what he was doing when he put together a marvelous creature we now know as Mother.



Get the scoop on Spring allergies

In Come Live With Me (1941) Lamarr stars as Johnny Jones, a Viennese refugee who gets hitched to a struggling American writer (James Stewart) in order to stay in the US of A. The green card marriage takes a turn for true when the worldly Lamarr gets taken in by the aw shucks of Stewart. EXPERIMENT PERILOUS (1944) finds the lovely Lamarr inhabiting the neo-gothic role of Allida who's been shut away as a crazy lady by her secretive spouse (Paul Lukas). But this husband is no Mr. Rochester, so it's a good thing George Brent is no Jane Eyre. The aquariumshooting scene became a cinema staple.

Waxman's orchestration lifts



the audience to its feet with moments of stirring heroism, while possessing enough deft subtleties to keenly accompany scenes of wrenching tragedy. Top-notch ensemble cast includes John Garfield, Gig Young, and Arthur Kennedy, but it's the big birds that star. In Destination Tokyo (1943) Franz Waxman's score surrounds the nautical action, enhancing and emphasizing the environment braved by Cary Grant's band of brave sub-mariners in this fictionalized account of the run-up to the Doolittle Raid. In Confidential Agent (1945) Franz Waxman's score is a sweeping encapsulation of Spanish spy Charles Boyer's dark and dangerous mission as he confronts Fascist agents poised to prevent the success of his mission to England. Lauren Bacall's co-starring role proved the trigger for The Big Sleep's reshoots.







Garnish with mint sprigs and reserved raspberries. Refrigerate 2 hours before serving. Store in refrigerator.

Make Crusts Extra Special

When making a top crust for pies, these tips can help you make them look extra special.

Glossy Upper Crust: Brush the dough with slightly beaten egg white (if desired, sprinkle with sugar, too) before baking.

Sweet Glazed Top:

Brush the top pastry with a small amount of water, and sprinkle with granulated or coarse sugar before baking.

Pretty Cutouts:

Cut shapes from the top crust with a canapé cutter or a knife before placing the top crust over the filling. With water or beaten egg, moisten the back of each cutout and set the design, moistened side down, on the crust.



Heartworm testing: What every dog owner needs to know

our dog is your best friend, and you take good care of him, making sure he gets quality food and exercise, immunizations and heartworm medication. Why, then, does your veterinarian also insist on a yearly heartworm test?

Chances are, your veterinarian is following the advice of the American Heartworm Society (AHS), whose mission it is to lead the veterinary profession and the public in the understanding of heartworm disease.

"The AHS recommends annual testing for all dogs," explains veterinary parasitologist and AHS board member Dr. Patricia Payne. "Heartworm is a devastating disease. It is preventable and can be treated in dogs, but early detection is essential."

Unprotected dogs are at riskAlong with testing, the AHS recommends year-round ad-

ministration of heartworm preventives. Unfortunately, says Dr. Payne, far too many dogs do not receive this measure of care.

Almost two-thirds of dogs in the U.S. that are seen by veterinarians are given no preventives at all, according to studies conducted by heartworm medication manufacturers.

Among those on preven-

tion medication, far too many are only given medication in spring, summer and fall, when the mosquitoes that transmit heartworm larvae are active. Because weather is unpredictable and hardy mosquitoes can survive indoors as well as outdoors in protected areas, so-called "seasonal" usage creates ample opportunity for animals to unintentionally become infected.

Mistakes can happen

Another factor is human - and animal — error. "Pet owners who give heartworm medications year-round and on time are to be commended," says Dr. Payne. "Even so, it is still possible for heartworm infection to occur.

The following are three scenarios that make heartworm testing a necessity for all dogs:

- Even the most diligent owner can forget a dose now and then. "If you have medication left when your veterinarian reminds you that it's time to purchase more preventive, it's a pretty clear sign that you missed a dose or two," says Dr. Payne.
- Not all pills are swallowed, and not all topical medications are properly applied. If your dog vomits or spits out a pill when you aren't looking -- or if a topical medication isn't absorbed completely -- a pet may be less protected than you think.
- Heartworm resistance is rare but real. "Owners can rest assured that heartworm medications are highly effective, but a few cases of heartworm strains that are resistant to common preventives have been documented," explains Dr. Pavne, adding that the issue is being studied by the AHS.

Test annually

The good news for owners is that heartworm testing is simple and inexpensive. "Your veterinarian can easily conduct this simple blood test during a dog's annual or semiannual wellness visit," assures Dr. Payne. "If your dog tests positive, treatment can begin. With a negative test result, an owner has the peace of mind of knowing that his or her pet has been protected for another year."
