Two hundred physically and/or mentally challenged contestants between the ages of 8 to 60 competed in a full gamut of track events that included the long jump, the standing long jump, meter (up to 100 meter), wheelchair races (5 and 10-yard dashes), and a softball throw.

Inspired by the 50th and 30th memorial anniversaries of Mahatma Gandhi and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., this international event honors their vision for an empowered non-violent world.

In keeping with this vision, Christ Church Unity held several events that kept observance of the 'Season' in the forefront of the congregation. A spaghetti dinner/fundraiser was held to raise funds to distribute in the community; Dana Brown, a Social Entrepreneur/Youth Activist spoke on the power each person

has in effecting change; Helice Bridges, the founder of the blue ribbon program "Who You Are Makes A Difference," was a guest speaker and the Youth Ministry read selected poems for the Season.

ovota decided the Highlander would be a four door car-like vehicle with lots of room and ground clearance that would still drive like a car. I feel they have accomplished what they set out to do. My tester came from Toyota Inc. so I could do what I wanted with it as long as I didn't go to Mexico. But what I did was drive the wheels off it and found the Highlander to be a very pleasant ride, plenty of room until you need to slip a full size dog crate in the rear cargo area and find the rear hatch will not close with out flipping down the second row captain chairs so the rear door

will close. But hey how many of us haul 100 pound Rottweilers around?

The interior was cream in color and the exterior was a cool dark red. This year Toyota introduced a new 2.7-liter 187 horsepowered four culinder engine, which will be the base model Highlander. Backed by a six speed electronically controlled automatic transmission that is only available in the base 2.7-liter Highlander, the other Highlander comes with a 3.5-liter V6 that produces 270 horsepower and 248 foot pounds of torque. ave: We have a 1993 Ford Econoline 250 pickup truck, converted into a motor home, with 56,351 miles on it. It had very good stability on the roads. If one wanted to do so, one could go 70 miles an hour on the freeway with no problems. In the last few years it has developed a lot of play in the steering wheel where you cannot go over 45 miles an hour on the freeway and feel anything close to safe--because of that play in the steering wheel. This has put a real damper on our travels. We have taken the motor home into the Ford dealer twice to see if they could fix it. They insist there is nothing wrong with it or the gear box. We have tried rotating the tires and even new tires--nope didn't work. Do you have any suggestions? A reply back would be much appreciated. Oh one more thing, we don't live in El Cajon were just visiting the kids, we live in Orange County Thanks Alice, El Cajon.

Alice: It sounds like you have some worn out front end parts and the dealership has not dug deep enough to figure out your problem. When you get play side to side in the steering wheel then it usually turns out to be a steering gear box. I would recommend when you get back home going to a specialty shop that specializes in front ends and motor homes. Since the Econoline was converted it doesn't have the front suspension and steering to handle the added weight coming from the motor home on the back. You may need a steering stabilizer along with a few new front end parts and for sure a steering box adjustment.

**Dave:** I have read you say distilled water in the radiator is what you should put in your car's radiator. # Three reasons to build muscle

besity is an epidemic. An outsized share of our medical dollar is being spent on lifestyle related conditions such as high cholesterol, heart disease, elevated blood pressure, reflux disease, strokes, falls in the elderly, osteoporosis, etc. (chronic disease related to poor lifestyle behaviors accounts for more than two thirds of deaths in the United States). In light of this, we

have been "attacking" the fat everywhere you turn without making a dent in the problem. Why? Because our focus is wrong. We should be focusing on a better long - term solution. We should be concentrating on building muscle in everyone rather than just losing weight.

Lean mass should be the end point for dietary, nutritional, and exercise recommendations, not scale weight. That means weight loss centers, doctors offices,

etc. need to focus on body composition, not just how much someone weighs. This would allow proper adjustment of food intake, exercise prescriptions, medications and other interventions.

Focusing on muscle instead of scale weight does three primary things:

1. Keep the focus on metabolism. Every "diet" out there that utilizes scale weight is a set up for long term failure. It only takes 363 kcal to burn a pound of muscle off your body, but it takes 3500 kcal to burn a pound of fat from your body. Starving people by putting them on a major caloric deficit eating plan and the most likely outcome is muscle loss. The body is very good at protecting fat in the face of "famine". When you focus on muscle, your shift goes from losing pounds to increasing muscle i.e. your metabolism!

2. Prevents disease. The lack of muscle contributes to disease. Many doctors believe that the metabolic changes of a majority of lifestyle related diseases such as insulin resistance and diabetes occur before you get fat, and therefore, that fat is yet another indicator of inadequate hormonal, cellular, and biological function. In other words, fat is a

symptom of disease rather than the cause of it. Focusing on building muscle prevents those metabolic changes. A prime example is that with osteoporosis: maintenance of adequate bone density and strength is decidedly dependent on adequate muscle mass and function.

**3.** Leads to long term success. When you fix peoples metabolism with proper nutrition and exercise (i.e. help them build muscle), you enable them to maintain the fat loss by, once again, increasing their metabolism and giving them the ability to maintain it.

If we were to change our approach from anti-fat to pro-muscle, we would begin to see a serious dent in the epidemic we face. So get off the scale and start building muscle! Don't worry; you will not start looking like Arnold Schwarzenegger. You'll simply look better nourished, healthier, and ready to take on the world!



# How to tell if cat is stressed... ask a trainer

Dear Trainer,

ow do I tell if my cat is stressed out? My cat is a 2-year old shorthaired tabby, and she seems edgy all the time. Is there something I can do or read to find out about stress in cats? I adopted her over a year ago and she still hasn't settled in well. Would another cat help?

Signed, Fretful Feline

#### Dear Fretful,

The first thing you will want to do is take your cat to the vet to make sure there is not some sort of underlying medical reason for your cat's anxiety. There are many medical conditions that can present with behavior symptoms, so do have a check up and ask for some blood work to help determine if there is something going on. Once you have cleared any medical conditions, you can begin to do some detective work to help you determine what might be going on.

#### Keep a log

One of the most useful things that can help with "profiling" your cat and the underlying behavior issues is to keep a log. Watch your cat and write down your cat's daily responses to things in the environment and track your cat's activities during the course of a few days.

Also, watch your cat's body language and write down what you see. Be sure to go into as

much detail as you can. Look at the following things and write them down:

- What does your cat look like when she is resting or relaxed?
- What does your cat look like when she is tense?
- What does your cat look like when she is about to respond to something she doesn't like?

Next, look at the following questions. Your answers should be from Edgy/Nervous to Steady/ Relaxed or somewhere in between:

- 1. Cat is comfortable with all noises/sounds
- 2. Cat is comfortable around all men or women
- 3. Cat is comfortable around toddlers/babies
- 4. Cat visits when strangers approach
- 5. Cat loves attention from strangers
- 6. Cat is comfortable being touched all over
- 7. Cat is comfortable around other cats
- 8. Cat is comfortable around other animals
- 9. Cat is okay being left with someone else
- 10. Cat has not changed homes in the last 6 months

- 11. Cat always eats even when you are gone
- 12. Cat has never eliminated on clothing or bed
- 13. Cat has never been punished with squirt bottle, shaker can or physical punishment
- 14. Cat never hides for long periods
- 15. Cat allows touching from strangers
- 16. Cat never meows for attention
- 17. Cat never tries to escape outside
- 18. Cat rarely shows signs of stress via excess grooming, scratching or scent marking
- 19. Cat never hisses or growls at people
- 20. Cat eats food without high-grain content
- 21. Cat has only lived in one household
- 22. Cat has regular veterinary health checks
- 23. Cat receives daily mental exercise or enrichments
- 24. Cat is provided with fresh water daily

After you go through all of these questions, and work on your log, these should give you a better idea of where your cat lands on the stress-o-meter. If you find your cat "scored"

mostly in the Edgy/Nervous range, your cat needs a stress reduction program. Stress reduction programs can include a better diet, training, access to quieter areas, and/or herbs or medications that can help if

the problem is severe.

To answer your question about adding another cat, yes, sometimes adding another cat in the home can help, but you would really need to choose the correct fit for your current cat. Since your cat is already anxious, you should consider an older, a steady female that

has been around other cats, and then plan for very slow introductions if you decided to go this path.

You may also want to work with a trainer or behavior expert to help you with your cat. They can help you adjust your environment and provide training plans that will minimize the stressors in the environment as well as show you how to train your cat with specific exercises for your particular cat's situation. I hope this gives you some direction for helping you cat become better adjusted to your household.
