

Local bands get a chance at fame and fortune

re you part of a local band good enough to stand up to the competition? Then the Ultimate Music Challenge wants you. This is a Cover Band Contest held in the Dream-Catcher at Viejas Casino. The competition will be held every Sunday night from April 19 through June 28 from 6 - 10p.m. Up to five bands will perform each Sunday with the winning bands advancing to the Semifinals, then to the Championship on June 28th. All bands must use the same backline drums and bass amp. provided by Viejas.

To keep changeover times to

a minimum, any band with a left-handed drummer will play either first or last on the bill.





'Hannah Montana: The Movie' is a young girl's delight

s the daughter of Billy Ray Cyrus it's no surprise that singer/ TV star Miley Cyrus has had the best of both worlds. She dove into the pool of fame and from tabloid reports, obviously loved it. Naturally, the closer she was drawn into the world of stardom, the farther she became from her natural roots. That's why Cyrus is just the right star to play the lead role in Hannah Montana: The Movie.

Miley Stewart (Miley Cyrus) is a teenage pop star known as Hannah Montana and has everything going for her – looks, style, and social status. The more popular she becomes, the more her ordinary life back in Tennessee fades.

Miley is learning sacrifices come with celebrity life when she has to fit in the birthday of her best friend, Lily Truscott (Emily Osment) on the same day as her Hannah Montana concert. Miley's already unnerved from the shopping trip to buy Lily a present because she ended up in a shoe fight at the store; photographed by papazzari. It only gets worse when she shows up at Lily's party, still dressed in her wig as Hannah Montana. This takes the focus off Lily and ruins her birthday. Meanwhile, Vita (Vanessa Williams), Miley's publicist, is busy trying to keep Oswald (Peter Gunn), a nosy reporter, away from Hannah.

When photos of Hannah appear in the newspapers and Robby Ray (Billy Ray Cyrus), Miley's father, sees them, he knows its time to step in. He arranges what Miley believes is a celebrity appearance in New York City. When her private jet actually lands in the grassy plains of Tennessee, Miley's family home, she's not happy. Things get worse when her dad mentions her "limo" is here and it's a broken down pickup truck her brother (Jason Earles) is driving to take Miley to her grandparent's house.

Miley is soon walking the line between trying to pacify her good old country-mannered family and still wanting to be in New York. When she is reunited with Lucas (Travis Brody), a former crush, she hardly recognizes him. Along with the pressures of celebrity life, Miley now has to decide who she is, and who she really wants to be; Hannah Montana or Miley.

Miley Cyrus does a great job in her dual role with both her music and acting. She comes through with all the right emotions when deciding her future. Billy Ray Cyrus, although he's had a lot of practice in real life and on the *Hannah Montana* TV show, plays Robby as an authentic father as he tries to guide his daughter on the right path.

Many of the comedic moments resulted in constant laughs throughout the movie. Although a few parts of the movie drag on a bit (probably more so for the adults), girls who love Hannah Montana will love this movie.

'The Fast & Furious' promotes bad behavior

This is the fourth installment of *The Fast and the Furious film series*. This latest version takes place between the first film and *The Fast and The Furious: Tokyo Drift* and brings back the entire original cast.

After successfully hijacking several fuel tanks from a semi-truck in Mexico, Dominic Toretto (Vin Diesel) sells the fuel and splits his take with his partners in crime; his girlfriend Leticia "Letty" Ortiz (Michelle Rodriguez) and Han (Sung Kang) who immediately leaves for Tokyo. Dominic is worried that Letty will get hurt when the authorities finally catch up to him so he leaves her behind. Sometime later, Letty is murdered and Dominic comes back to America to find her killed.

Now an FBI agent, Brian O'Connor (Paul Walker) is trying to track down notorious drug smuggler Arturo Braga, who uses street racers as the drug runners. Because of O'Connor's familiarity with racing, he requisitions a few altered street cars from the impound yard and enters in a contest to become Arturo's newest drug runner. Dominic finds out that Letty was killed in connection to the drug running and competes with O'Connor for the top spot.

nothing new from the previous films other than to further illegal street racing. The graphics are horrible. Some scenes obviously used green screens to create a racing environment. The main race shows O'Connor racing through city streets where innocent drivers end up in minor fender benders, usually with the bad guys dyeing and not because of racing.




