

The English singer rose to fame in the late 1960s and early '70s with his cover

versions of The Beatles' "With A Little Help From My Friends," Traffic's "Feelin' Alright" and Billy Preston's "You Are So Beautiful.' Over the years, Cocker has

released nearly two dozen albums and remains one of today's biggest music legends.

Cocker continues to cele-

'Up' — Touching, beautiful, memorable

hile Pixar's new movie *Up* seems loaded with inventive characters who appeal more to adults than children, it also has a sweet, but poignant plot, one hardly noticeable until the heart feels a jolt and a tear or two gathers along the way.

The story begins with youngster Carl Fredricksen (voiced by Jeremy Leary) watching a Fox Movietone newsreel at the theater. The escapes of adventurer Charles Muntz (voiced by Christopher Plummer), steal his heart, and he too wants to be an adventurer and travel to faraway places.

Shortly afterwards Carl meets Ellie (voiced by Elie Docter), a springy, fish-out-of-water young girl who steals his heart at the word hello and leaves him speechless as she pantomimes her zeal for life. In a short photo montage, their life whizzes by and reveals their marriage, a hope but then loss of a child, Carl's job

as a balloon salesman, and their dream to travel to their ideal place, Paradise Falls. But ultimately Carl ends up facing the latter part of his life without Ellie.

If that isn't heart-breaking enough, Carl's treasured home – which he and Ellie built together – is now surrounded

by high rises. Greedy developers eagerly wait for Carl (now voiced by Ed Asner) to make are Monst Finding No Incredible

When that happens, Carl uses what's left of his imaginative brain, and ties hundreds of balloons to his house to lift it up, up and away. His yellow-brick-road-move could have been his dream of sailing off into the sunset except for one hitch – the young wilderness explorer, Russell.

one false move so they can

snatch up his property.

Russell (voiced by Jordan Nagai) arrives at Carl's home on a mission. He's hoping to do something nice for Carl so he can get the "assistance to the elderly" merit badge, the last one he needs to complete his badges. Instead Russell ends up on the porch as the house lifts off, and finally the movie sails into happier territory.

The jovial Russell is onboard for a trip with the Walter Matthau-like Carl, and what an adventure they have in South America where they discover dogs that talk, befriend a dog named Dug and a beautiful bird given the name Kevin by Russell. They also encounter Charles Muntz, the adventurer Carl has longed to meet. Surprisingly, Muntz turns out to be anything but what he expected.

Pixar has become one of the most reliable companies bringing entertainment to the big screen. Among Pixar's popular previous films are Monsters, Inc. (2001), Finding Nemo (2003), The Incredibles (2004), Ratatouille (2007) and WALL-E (2008).

At midpoint however, *Up* almost seems like two different films. The first part of the movie offers few laughs. It's somber and covers many of life's mature elements. The young boy behind me, about 8 years old, rarely laughed during the first hour and instead kept raising questions about what was going on and why the characters were doing certain things.

The second half evokes many laughs but still includes some edgy material such as the vicious dogs. Parents will probably notice that this film, unlike most Disney films, is rated PG for peril and action instead of G. Youngsters might also be disappointed that the 3-D version lacks those fun things shooting out from the screen as seen in the trailer for *G-Force*.

Up's directors Pete Docter (Monsters, Inc.) and Bob Peterson (Ratatouille) still deliver magic on the screen. The story is one mature audiences will understand all too well, and yes I can verify men do cry. Up reminds us how important it is to chase our dreams. The characters - certainly not Hollywood tupes - are all adorable. The beautiful animation is typical of Pixar, and alleviated by Michael Giacchino's magnificent music; transports us to a far away make-believe place in the blink of an eye.

Outrageous old school comedy unfolds in 'The Hangover'

no hasn't had a moment, a day or a night they will never forget? In The Hangover, four friends who are about to have a bachelor party in Las Vegas experience such a night, and it's one that changes their lives forever. Although I usually run as fast as I can from comedies like this, I'm pleased to say *The Hangover* ends up being one of the funniest movies I've seen in a long time.

Doug (Justin Bartha) is about to say I do. So his best buddies, Phil (Bradley Cooper) and Stu (Ed Helms), want to make sure he has the night of his life before walking down the aisle. They didn't invite his future brother-in-law Alan (Zach Galifianakis), but the guy worms his way in and persuades his father to loan them his treasured Mercedes convertible.

What starts out as innocent fun and frivolity goes appallingly wrong -- even by Las Vegas standards. It begins when Alan takes them to Caesars' rooftop for an incredible view of city lights and a toast. Then they hit the casino where Alan plans to practice the card-counting method he read about on the way over. What happens next is only surmised, for the next scene takes place the morning after in the \$4,000 luxurious suite Stu reluctantly put on his credit card.

Ed's missing tooth, the growling tiger in the bathroom, the whimpering baby found in a closet and the pant-less Alan don't seem important after the men discover the groom

isn't with them. It's now only hours until Doug must be at the altar, so the three groomsmen try to backtrack their night of bad-boy behavior. Phil believes the hospital band on his arm is the starting path. Soon we see the friends in Buster Keaton-type escapades which show them running from Asian gamblers, having an unpleasant encounter with Mike Tyson, stealing a cop car and almost getting killed in the desert. Fortunately, one laugh after another ensues

Although I didn't care for director Todd Phillips' Old School, The Hangover is offthe-charts clever and funny. Each character has an arc that takes him from responsible to outrageously reckless, and we can't help laughing at every turn of each one's next high-

Because he's absent in most of the film, Bartha (Failure to Launch) doesn't have much screen time, but Doug is loyal to his pals throughout the ordeal, and Bartha appears sincere in his portrayal. As the only married man among the group, Phil steps in as the natural leader to keep his buds out of trouble. Cooper sets the tone as the defenseless protector by displaying the innate sense of humor he exhibited in Yes Man, The Rocker and the TV show Nip Tuck.

Alan is everything a Jack Black character would be, and Galifianakis (What Happens in Vegas, Reno 911!) handles every action impressively. His naïve attitude at Alan's oddness and ability to make every action appear so haphazard is exceptional. Helms (Night at the Museum: Battle of the Smithsonian, Meet Dave) probably delivers the most remarkable performance as Ed, a serious man, engaged to a fiercely controlling woman who wants every accounting of every dollar he spends.

definitely "R" rated, screenwriters Jon Lucas and John Moore, both who penned Ghosts of Girlfriends Past and Four Christmases, have upped the level of bad-behavior comedies with their great script. Interspersed among the typical antics is a mystery of what happened to the groom, and every layer uncovered seems funnier

The juxtaposition of the characters is ingenious. Phil, the weary teacher, participates in everything he hopes he doesn't represent. Ed, the trustworthy dentist, not only looses his tooth, but his trustworthiness. Alan, a man who only wants to be in the "in crowd, creates his own far-fetched world. All of this unfolds with complete believability, which with these scenarios, is nothing short of amazing.

The Hangover does have trailers, but anyone with some very raunchy scenes, and a lot of the funny scenes are unveiled in the

A few suggestions: 1. Find out who your child is hanging around with because bad company corrupts good morals. 2. If they are hanging around with bad company, remove them from that environment; don't wait until they are 16 or 17, because you will lose them. 3. Spend more time with your teen, bond with your teen. If you work and are never home, change your schedule, you only have one shot. You are not going to get another chance to do it over again, you want to do it right the first time. 4. Speak life over your child, tell them they are going to do great things and tell them you believe in them. 5. The most important thing is find a really good church that has a great youth group and good preaching.

Raising a child correctly starts when they are little and if you have neglected your responsibility then you must repent and ask God to help you restore the broken pieces; nothing is too hard for the Lord! His plans for you are good. (Read these scriptures: I Corinthians 15:33, Proverbs 22:6, Proverbs 19:8, Proverbs 19:18, and Proverbs 23:13-14)


