et's face it; the world is needy. Every day there's one organization after another seeking to change the world, fix the environment or help those in need. At a fundraiser in March by the International Institute of Human Factor Development (IIHFD) to build an academy in Ghana, Africa, Quinn and Mark Rawdin took what they saw to heart and put a plan into action.

Jeanne Rawdin, a producer for the Cox Channel 4 San Diego Insider show and frequent segment reporter for NBC39, attended the fundraiser with her three children Marl, Quinn and Hannah. The evening was mesmerizing complete with a bright yellow moon glowing on a star-lit ceiling of the packed auditorium. Smells reminiscent of Africa wafted through the air as inspirational music provided

a heartbeat for Point Loma Professor and founder of the IIHFD, Senyo Adjibolosoo, shared native tales to a group of young kids surrounding him on the stage.

The video presentation of how Adjibolosoo and La Mesa businessman Jason Jenkins, CEO of Causeworth Insurance and the IIHFD, met and began their crusade to improve the human quality with a school that will generate *Honest* and *Compassionate* leaders who will transform lives, captivated all

Rawdin was surprised when she got home to discover how enthralled her two boys, Mark and Quinn, were with the evening. There were particularly inspired by Jenkin's 6-year-old son Hunter. The Gazette reported a story on young Hunter earlier in the year about how he handmade and wrote books to sell so he

could buy toys for the children in Ghana.

"When my boys saw how Jason's son made those books, the wheels started turning on how they themselves could help build a school for the children in Ghana," Rawdin said. "They wanted to come up with another way to raise money, too. I suggested they could made artwork for T-shirts, and we could print and sell them."

After several designs and a warning from Mom that they, not her, would have to do most of the work, the boys got busy creating their designs. Mark's design, shown here in the picture, reflects a burst of color on a map of Africa, with a simple but heartfelt message – Save Children in Africa.

The first batch of shirts that came off the press are nearly sold out, and to date the boys' project has earned \$323. Along with cards Rawdin printed explaining about the Human Factor Leadership Academy, Mark made a big poster with his own explanation, too.

"This is the type of education we should be providing for our kids," Jason Jenkins said. "To see these young boys take the initiative to reach out should inspire all of us to do more for others"

Rawdin, who herself has

been instrumental in spreading the word about the Human Factor Leadership Academy by producing a show about Adjibolosoo and Jenkins on San Diego Insider, is naturally proud of her sons.

"In a way it's sort of a "pass-

ing it on" theme," she said, "and one Senyo continues to hope will inspire many hands to touch this project."

Groundbreaking for El Cajon Public Safety Center next week

■1 Cajon City officials will gather for the ■groundbreaking of the new Public Safety Center on Tuesday, June 23, 10:30 a.m. at 100 Civic Center Way. This very special occasion was made possible by the generous support of the people who call El Cajon their home. Their foresight in approving Proposition O in November 2004, to fund the Public Safety Center project, will create a community treasure for decades to come. The building will be 119,400 square feet with 212,750 square feet of parking garage, which will be located on 5.7 acres at 100 Civic Center Way, adjacent to City Hall.

The Public Safety Center will be a state-of-the-art facility comprised of a joint police/fire Emergency Operations Center, community meeting room, modern communications center, expanded jail, and an indoor firing range. The center will house all police operations in one location for the first time in many years and will facilitate enhanced public service for our community.

New El Cajon Landmark lights up the city

On Wednesday night dozens attended the official lighting of the new downtown El Cajon archway. Mayor Mark Lewis, Councilmembers Bob McClellan and Jillian Hanson-Cox, and City staff were on hand, along with several members of the El Cajon Historical Society, including President Rick Hall, and 99-year-old Eugene Vacher, who did the honors of officially turning on the lights of the archway. Also in attendance was Vice President Jonna Waite, and Eldonna

Lay, curator of the Knox House on Park and Magnolia.

The ceremony took place just after 8 p.m. following the downtown weekly Classic Car Show. If you haven't seen our beautiful downtown landmark, it's located on West Main Street, just west of Magnolia Avenue. An interesting feature – the back lighting of the white lettering will change colors with the temperature. When the temperature is below 65 degrees the lighting changes to red, when it's above 65 degrees the lighting changes to blue.

Lakeside Round Up of events

Eucalyptus Hills Landowners Association Homeowners meeting

The June 10 Eucalyptus Hills Landowners Association Homeowners meeting was attended by nearly 250 people. The annual meeting held at the Lakeside Farms Elementary school featured speakers from the Lakeside Fire Department, Santee Sheriff's Department and Lakeside Water District.

Deputy Fire Marshal/Fire Captain Victor Gonzales advised homeowners "Eucalyptus Hills has unique threats unlike anywhere else in Lakeside." Gonzales, who has spent his 27 years career in Lakeside and who has been stationed in the Hills, said "the key is prevention. Handle problems before they get too big- use common sense. The house address should be visible and clearly marked so responders can find the location quickly."

Fire is physics. Its science, fuel, topography and weather, said Gonzales. By having a defensible space the resident will give the fire department the best chance to do their job.

Two fire stations in Lakeside are nearly 50 years old. One is in Eucalyptus Hills on Valle Vista and the other is the Riverview Station. Both fire stations need to be upgraded with the best location to protect the vast majority of people as a priority.

The corner of Lakeside Ave. and Channel Rd. is the new location replacing the Eucalyptus Hills Station which will be sold. The proposed date to open the new station is 2011. For further information visit www.lakesidefire.com

Santee Sheriffs Department Deputy Tim Johnson told the Eucalyptus Hills Homeowners they are living in a good area comparably speaking. Deputy Johnson was asked why Lakeside doesn't appear to have a lot of coverage. Johnson explained the City of Santee contracts with the Sheriffs and they have requested 10 Sheriffs. The county board of supervisors deals with the unincorporated areas.

One problem the Sheriffs deal with in the Hills is the rambling streets which makes it even more important to have residence addresses clearly marked, said Johnson. Crime prevention Specialist Alyssa Dean told the homeowners she is available to speak to neigh-

borhood watch groups. Email her at <u>Alyssa.dean@sdsheriffs.org</u>

The group was advised Captain Patricia Duke is in favor of Lakeside having a Sheriffs Sub-Station of it's own.

Chairwoman Dianne Jacob has been in favor of a Lakeside Sub-Station for a number of years.

A representative form the Lakeside Water District explained there are a number of reasons for pipe breaks which have occurred in Eucalyptus Hills; tree roots and pipe failures. There are 18 miles of pipe in the hills.

The question was asked why the water is becoming so hard. Water is brought in from the Colorado River so there are more minerals in it. The County Water Authority is the primary water source for Lakeside.







2010 Chevy Equinox

just returned from Detroit last week as a guest of GM. They had me and a hand full of journalists drive the

all new 2010 Chevy Equinox through the back hills of Michigan just outside Ann Arbor. It was a beautiful trip but the real reason I went was to see what GM had to say since they just

filed for Bankruptcy and this was their first press event since then. Well it turned out just as I figured, they were all upbeat and ready to keep building cars and trucks, the only difference was the company would be leaner-meaner and keep striving to build world class cars and trucks we will want to buy.

That brings me to the 2010 Equinox. Did they deliver as to what they promised? I would say yes, and it has nothing to do with the trip it had everything to do with the vehicle. Thirty miles per gallon, power, and an SUV this size? Amazing, sure they did it with a six speed automatic transmission and a four cylinder that develops 182 horsepower and 172 pound foot of torque. Wondering is there enough horsepower coming out of this four cylinder? Yes there is. Okay, it is not neck snapping, but if driven as we all should I found the four cylinder very responsive got to freeway speed with no problem and that is with myself and a GM guy that hadn't missed a meal ever!

We traveled all over the back country and experienced hard turning, rain storms and light flooding and not know the area I had no problems at all.

The Equinox came with Navigation but if Navigation is not wanted, it can be ordered without. I like that and it is not buried in a "package" when the buyer wants one

thing but has to buy three to get it!

There is three trim levels LS, LT, LTZ, two engines, the four cylinder as mention earlier and the optional V6 that will get 264 horsepower and 222 pound foot of torque, two automatic six-speed transmissions, one for the V6 and the other for the four cylinder. The V6 will get you in the fuel mileage range of 25 on the freeway and 18 miles per gallon in town.

The interior is done with a family in mind; entertainment for back seat riders is not in the head rest but a flip down model that I think works better that a roof flip down or even a head rest model. Why one asks? If it is a flip down on the back of the front seats no one can drive up from behind and be distracted by watching the movie in the car ahead.

Another feature I thought was worth mentioning is the automatic rear door. On many SUV's when the rear door is open folks can't reach the door to close it, so a strap is installed. But on the Equinox, one can set the door electrically to open up as high as they want it to, nice touch.

Safety was another area Chevy worked on. All the airbags inside the vehicle have e sensors in the doors that will help deploy curtain airbags in the event of an accident. OnStar is standard, Blue Tooth connection, XM Radio you get

traction control, stability control it is really a great SUV.

If there was a down side to this vehicle it is something I have been complaining about

for years, their base warranty. Three year, 36,000 miles. So I guess the buyer should buy a service contract if they keep it longer than three years 36,000 miles!

Bumper-To-Bumper with Dave Stall

Dave: Back when I was a kid my dad insisted on having a hide-a-key tucked somewhere under his car so in the event he locked himself out of the car he could get in. I would like to follow his lead but the car I'm driving has a key fob that is bigger than the hide-a-key holder. Plus if that hide-a-key falls off the hiding place replacement key fob is around \$300. What would you recommend? Carl.

Carl: That is a dilemma; I have thought about it myself (all my cars have hide-a-keys hidden under my cars). The other problem is trying to find a piece of metal you can attach the hide-a-key too. The only thought I have is to find a leather pouch that can be tied to the undercarriage of your car. I would wrap the key fob in aluminum foil so as to protect it from the elements and find a place to secure it with a zip tie. I would also pull the key fob out from under the car occasionally to make sure it has not been damaged and it still works. Some of those expensive key fobs have a door key blank that slides in and out of the electronic key fob that would surly fit in a hide-a-key box.

Dave: What is your take on all these machines that have been advertised on TV and in magazines that allow you to make your own Bio-Diesel? I have a Ford F-350 diesel truck I use to tow my toys and family out to the desert but I don't know if I can afford to go back out to the desert next season due to the high price of diesel. Larry.

Larry: I have looked into a few of the system and they are pretty expensive, \$8,000 to \$10,000. I think it would take a long time to recoup your investment if you're only using the truck to go to the desert a few times a year. Then there is the collection of product to make Bio-Diesel, where are you going to get it? Is there going to be a smell in the neighborhood? I am waiting to se if city municipalities will even allow you to make Bio-Diesel in your garage or back yard. If you don't go to the desert every weekend then do like most people do and budget for trips to the desert like we do when we want to go on vacation. I would wait and see what shakes out, right now everyone driving a diesel is in a panic and a lot of companies are trying to take advantage of a very bad situation.



Our Best Friends

My dog won't leave the house ... ask a trainer

Dear Trainer:

have a newly adopted dog and she is wonderful in the house. She loves my other dog, she "flirts" with the cat and has been pretty easy to train, but if I try to take her for a walk, she completely falls apart. I have to carry her out the door to even get her outside and once there, she shakes, cowers and does everything in her power to get back in the house. I would really like to take her for walks with my other dog but at this point, I would have to force her to even move. What should I do? By the way, she is just about a year old and was a stray so I don't have much information about her background.

Signed, Agoraphobic Dog Mom

Dear Agoraphobic,

The good news is that your new dog is doing fine in the house and getting along with everyone, including the cat. Whatever might have happened to her to create her fears, keep in mind that behavior is just behavior, not good or bad, and it's time to move forward and work on helping her come out of her shell, or in this case, her house.

Where to start

The place to start is at the front door (or the door you normally exit with your dog). Place your dog on a long line and go to the front door. You can find long lines at most pet stores. Look for about a 15-20

foot length. You will be stepping outside, but your dog will remain in the house with the front door open.

Bring a chair for you to sit on, just outside of the door. This will change the picture for your dog since you are sitting. Dogs are very smart at calculating what humans are going to do, and she might think you are going to pick her up if you are standing outside while she is wearing her leash. Your job in all of this is to give your dog the choice of coming outside on her own by reinforcing all efforts and attempts of her moving toward and eventually over the threshold.

Using a marker

The first thing to consider is how to get the information to

your dog that she is on the right track. Using a marker signal is ideal. A marker, such as using a clicker or a word, such as, 'Yip," can indicate to your dog what she was doing correctly. Once you mark or click her correct response, she gets a really yummy food treat. Be sure to follow every marker signal with a reward so you dog learns that she can "make vou." mark her and the treat will follow. For more information about clicker training, the rules of using a clicker and where to buy clickers visit: http://clickertraining. com/what_is_clicker_training

Before you start, have lots of really high-value treats cut into pea-sized rewards and put them into something that you can dip into and grab a few at a time, (a treat bag or fanny pack is the easiest). High value treats include: Turkey dogs, cooked chicken or turkey, cooked hamburger, or even things like little pieces of steak, cheese, or anything your dog would love.

Next, you will position your chair outside of the door where you can watch your dog and her movements. Hold the long line or have someone else hold it for safety reason and observe your dog. If she looks at you, mark or click and toss her a treat. At first try to toss the treats right to her so she gets into the game without any pressure to move toward the door, but eventfully, after she realizes what great treats you have, toss them a little closer to you so she has to step forward to eat them.

Raise the bar

Stay at the just looking outside level until your dog is consistently looking out the door. Now hold out for more actual movement toward the door. Be sure to mark or click even shifting her weight forward, as that might be all she can do in the early stages. When she can do that a number of times, hold out for a little more, such as a foot moving forward.

Continue training for no

more than 10 minutes at a time, and when you stop, tell your dog, "All done," toss one extra treat to her, and stop training. Put the chair away, close the door and take off her long line. Your dog should be a little disappointed that you stopped doing this fun game so when you come back and train some more, she should be pretty excited. You can train a few times each day, but spread the sessions out and only do short trials; from 2-10 minutes each time.

The end goal is to have your dog, on her own, step out of the door. When she is able to do that, begin to add a verbal cue, such as, "Outside," just as she is stepping over the threshold. Practice many times with her just going out the door before trying to do more, but once your dog is successful going out with your verbal cue, you can move your chair a little further out (2-3 feet from the original place) and begin to toss your treats near you so she has to

come all the way to you to get her reward. You can close the door once she is out if she is doing well and hasn't been running back into the house during training, otherwise just leave it open.

After your dog is able to come out of the house on her own, use that time to hang out and play in the front area. Don't try to walk just yet, as you are only working on her trusting you and feeling comfortable being outside.

I would suggest that you

work with a positive reinforcement trainer that can help you transfer to walking on leash as there are a lot of considerations to ensure you don't make a mistake and set yourself back in your training.

If you go slow and allow your dog to work through her fear, you should be able to build back the courage for her to feel safe outside.
