

Lakeside Round Up of events

by Patt Bixby San Vicente Dam reaching new heights

early 200 local water, business and community leaders along with California Secretary for Natural Resources Mike Chrisman gathered near San Vicente Dam site in Lakeside to commemorate the start of construction of the \$568 million Dam project.

The commemoration on July 9 marked the beginning of construction for the San Vicente Dam Project, the tallest dam raise ever in the United States. The existing San Vicente Dam was completed in 1943, the original designers of the San Vicente Dam planned for a 120 foot raise. The new dam will be as strong as the existing dam and designed to withstand a 7.5 magnitude earthquake.

Maureen A. Stapleton, General Manager, san Diego Water Authority said the project, which will also be the tallest dam raise in the world using roller-compacted concrete will take three years to complete. The 220 foot tall dam will be raised by 117 ft., an additional 152,000 acre-feet of storage will be provided. The San Vicente Dam raise will

provide 100,000 acre feet of carryover water storage for sue during dry seasons. Had this additional storage been available today, it could have significantly reduced the need to cut back water deliveries to our member agencies, said Water Authority General Manager Stapleton.

"Raising San Vicente Dam will provide the biggest increase in regional water storage in San Diego County history,' said the Honorable Claude A. "Bud" Lewis, Board Chair, san Water authority and mayor of Carlsbad. When the dam is completed it will greatly expand the capacity to hold emergency water supplies and water storage for use during dry seasons.

California Secretary for Natural Resources Mike Chrisman praised the Water Authority, 'This project is an excellent example of the kind of new infrastructure California needs to respond to our water supply challenges.

The first construction phase of the San Vicente Dam Raise project began in July and will continue through summer 2010. Preparations will include preparing the existing dam to be raised by excavating the foundation, filling any crevices with concrete and preparing

the face of the dam to create a strong bonding surface for the new concrete.

The next phase of construction installing the new concrete to raise the height of the dam is scheduled to begin in the spring of 2010. The project completion date is expected to be 2012.

The new dam will be built on top of the existing dam using roller compacted concrete, which has the strength of conventional concrete but can be placed in less time at lower cost. Roller-compacted concrete is placed in layers, one on top another without interruption so crews can work 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Roller-compacted concrete is made with much less water and cement than conventional concrete and has the consistency of wet gravel or cookie dough.

Mining the aggregate on site of the roller-compacted concrete will reduce over 100,000 truck trips over a six month period during roller-compacted

The Water Authority will build a new marina with improved access road, more boat ramps and a larger parking area.

San Vicente Reservoir will re-open to recreation sometime between 2014 and 2017 when the water level reaches the boat launch ramp at the

new marina. The amount of time to refill the reservoir will depend on water supply and demand.

he newly redesigned Mazda 3 has hit the ground running and it couldn't have picked a better time to come out with a new wardrobe. Lots of new angles to the Mazda 3, which comes with a much better sports flair then previous models but buyers can still stop at the big box store and hit your normal \$300 purchase (I think anything bought at a big box store that costs less than a \$100 be free). What we have here is a

five door people mover with a lot of style. The outside is obvious but once inside I was taken back by the audio system, not like any I had seen in a while. The audio system was integrated into the dash so replacing the sound system would seem to be a chore if not impossible, AM/FM/CD with MP3 and six speakers is standard. But wait, I have an updated Mazda 3 and this baby came with a whopping 245 watt Bose® Centerpoint® 10 Speaker Surround Sound System and yes it comes in a

package that includes a Moon Roof with a one touch opening system. Back to the audio system for a moment. A Sirius Radio with six month free subscription and a perimeter alarm is also included, and lets not forget the Bluetooth — remember we are a hands free state?.

Another added feature ordered by the dealer was an in-dash six-disc CD Changer that is MP3 compatible, and last but not least, a navigation system tucked up in the top of the dash area sharing a pace with an information center that, I must admit, works very well as far as ergonomics go! Since we are talking about options, the only other option picked out by the dealer is the Technology Package with includes full color Navigation sustem, advanced keyless entru and a push start ignition, just keep the key fob close by and no need for a key to start, lock or unlock the Mazda 3.

Since we are still inside the Mazda 3 lets talk seating. Very comfortable and well adjustable leather trimmed seating, eight-way power driver seat, three position memory, in the rear is a 60/40 split rear seats for added storage space.

Under the hood power comes from a very efficient 2.5-liter dual overhead cam 16-valve Variable Valve Timing (VVT) in-line four cylinder engine backed by a 5-speed electronically controlled automatic transmission that really gets the job done in city and freeway driving. There are two manual transmissions, available but they only come in certain models but they are a 5-speed and a 6-speed manual transmission, also a Dynamic Stability Control (DSC), Traction Control System (TCS) and it is a front wheel drive vehicle. With the standard set of 17inch tire and wheel package and the fuel mileage should get 22 miles per gallon in the city

and 29 miles per gallon on the freeway, that is how my tester would fair on the roads.

My impression was on a scale of one to 10, 10 being the best, I would have to give it a 9.5. Why? I like a manual transmission. This is a great car to put on your family hauler wish list, and it has a base price of only \$15,045. My tester came fully loaded out the

gate at \$25,640 plus tax and license. There wasn't enough room on this page to talk about safety, but trust me, Mazda has their customers in mind when it comes to safety.

My tester came from Hine Mazda in Mission Valley. In one month period they lost all of their franchises except the Mazda. If you stop by to see them, tell them I sent you!







Bumper-To-Bumper with Dave Stall

ave: I have a '94 Crown Victoria with 290,000 miles. It's been a great reliable car. However, with its advanced age, the headlights effectiveness have deteriorated. The bulbs inside the lens are o.k. but it seems to me that the lens have become obscured and the light will not shine through properly. I think that maybe because of accumulated exposure to the sun and ultraviolet light, the clearness has been compromised. Have you ever heard of this problem and is there a product that will restore the clearness? A left and right lens will probably cost a fortune from Ford parts. Thanks, Robert.

Robert: Yes it is a common problem with cars with plastic headlight covers. There are companies that will restore your headlight covers, the shop I recommend is Bumper Doc, check them out on the web at www.bumperdoc.com and see if they have someone in your area. I know they will restore your headlights for around \$35 per headlight, not bad when the replacement from Ford is over \$200 per headlight.

Dave: For the past several years I have attended the San Diego Auto Show, and each time I have come away disappointed. No one can answer technical questions. There are booth babes, sales people, and minimum wage people in lab coats and they all have a canned speech. I have tried to ask intelligent technical questions but each time I am told "I don't know", I am ignored and walked away from. Whoever sponsors this show needs to put in people who are technically competent so we can ask, and receive answers to, relevant technical questions. Dave.

Dave: You need to become an automotive journalist so you can go on press events and sit with the engineers that build the cars and trucks we drive and ask as many questions as they are allowed to answer. But there is an alternative, radio or web radio. I do both, and the one you would want to listen to is You Auto Know every Saturday from 3 to 5 pm on KCBQ The You Auto Know Show. I may not have all the answers but I assure you I won't hang up or walk away from you. I will get you your answers and you can email me or listen to my radio show.



CHAPTER 16.24 OF TITLE 16 OF THE EL CAJON MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING EXTENSIONS FOR TENTATIVE SUBDIVISION MAPS AND **TENTATIVE PARCEL MAPS**

WHEREAS, California Government Code Sections 66452.6 and 66452.21 as amended, now provide for extensions of tentative subdivision maps and tentative parcel maps for up to six years; and

WHEREAS, Sections 16.12.110 and 16.24.180 of the El Cajon Municipal Code limit the total period of extensions of tentative subdivision maps and tentative parcel maps for up to five years; and

WHEREAS, the City Council intends by this ordinance to amend Title 16 to reflect the new extension period for tentative subdivision maps and tentative parcel maps to remain consistent with State law.

16.12.110 Extension of tentative map.

A. The subdivider may request an extension of the tentative map approval or conditional approval by written application to the city engineer. Such application shall be filed before the approval or conditional approval is due to expire. The application shall state the reasons for the requested extension.

B. The city council may approve, conditionally approve, or deny the requested extension An extension shall not exceed one year from the preceding expiration date. No more than three such extensions may be granted; except that, a fourth such extension may be granted provided that a public hearing on the matter is held before the city council prior to any fourth

such extension being granted. The public hearing required by this subsection shall be held at the sole expense of the subdivider.

C. Prior to granting an extension, the city council may refer the request to the planning commission for recommendation and report. The planning commission shall report within forty-five (45) days of the council's referral.

SECTION 3. A new Section 16.24.180 of Chapter 16.24 of Title 16 of the El Caion Municipal Code is hereby added to read as

16.24.180 Extension of tentative parcel map.

. The subdivider may request an extension of the tentative parcel map approval or conditional approval by written application to the city engineer. Such application shall be filed before the approval or conditional approval is due to expire.

B. The city engineer may approve, conditionally approve, or deny the requested extension, fo a period not exceeding one year from the original expiration date

C. An additional one-year extension, not exceeding three years from the original expiration date, may be approved, conditionally approved, or denied by the city council upon written application by the subdivider prior to the first extension expiration date.

D. An additional one-year extension, not exceeding four years from the original expiration date, may be approved, conditionally approved, or denied by the city council upon written application by the subdivider prior to the third extension expiration date. However, this fourth extension may only be granted after a public hearing is held before the city council. Furthermore, the public hearing required by this subsection shall be held at the sole expense of the subdivider

E. Any decision by the city engineer in regard to an extension may be appealed to the city council pursuant to Section 16.24.140.

SECTION 4. The City Council of the City of El Cajon hereby declares that should any section,

paragraph, sentence, phrase, term or word of this ordinance, hereby adopted, be declared for any reason to be invalid, it is the intent of the City Council that it would have adopted all other portions of this ordinance irrespective of any such portion declared invalid.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall be effective thirty (30) days after its adoption. Within fifteen (15) days after its adoption, the City Clerk shall cause this ordinance to be published pursuant to the provisions of rnment Code Section 36933.

- The Tom Dyke/Sheriff's sites (~10 acres) remain the most viable large park land site going forward. But development action can not start until the General Plan Update is approved (2010) and Mr. Dyke then relocates his blasting magazine. This project becomes Priority #2 (continuing in parallel to be actively pursued).
- Although the Grossmont UHSD board has approved the purchase of the Lazy A ranch site for an Alpine high school, several steps remain in the approval process for building school facilities; including the sports complex. The district's target opening date is fall 2013. This project becomes Priority #3 (continuing in parallel to be actively pursued).
- Discussion & Vote: Authorize Alpine's PLDO funds to be used for the design & construction of the Albertsons site.
 - The APG had previously authorized Alpine PLDO funds (~\$400,000) to be used for purchasing additional properties in the Tom Dyke/Sheriff's area. However, PLDO terrain restrictions preclude this; and development of the general area as parkland must await General Plan approval (see revised priority list above). As the Albertsons site is the only one ready to go, and as the PLDO funds appear sufficient to complete this project, it is recommended to change the PLDO funds allocation to the Albertsons site's development.
- Discussion & Vote: Authorize the County of San Diego to evaluate Park Land for Alpine Youth (P.L.A.Y.) as the suitable local entity to undertake the operation & maintenance obligations of the Albertsons site as a park.
 - Under PLDO, the County no longer operates & maintains parks. Development of the Albertsons site into parkland requires a local non-profit to step forward and to undertake the obligations of park maintenance & operation. As P.L.A.Y. was set-up for this undertaking, the APG needs to vote to authorize the County to perform an evaluation of P.L.A.Y. as a suitable vehicle for this. It is likely that P.L.A.Y. will have to sign a long-term lease/operations/maintenance agreement with the County.


