U.S. home fire smoke alarm report

fire deaths resulted from fire deaths resulted from fires with no smoke alarms in 2003-2006, according to a new report *Smoke Alarms in U.S. Home Fires*, released today by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA).

"Smoke alarms are one of the greatest fire protection devices of our time and have significantly contributed to the decline in home fire fatalities since the late 70's," said James M. Shannon, president of NFPA. "But it's not enough to randomly put up one smoke alarm and forget about it. In addition to placing smoke alarms in recommended areas, they must be kept in good working order, which includes testing them monthly, changing batteries at least once a year, and making sure that they are not disconnected.'

Working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in reported home structure fires in half. The 2007 edition of <u>NFPA 72</u>, <u>National Fire Alarm Code</u>® requires smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each sleeping area, and on every level. They should also be interconnected so that when one sounds, they all sound.

Other key findings from Smoke Alarms in U.S. Home Fires:

• Smoke alarm failures usually result from missing, disconnected, or dead batteries.

• In one-fifth of all homes with smoke alarms, none were working.

• Most homes still have

smoke alarms powered by batteries only.

• More than half of home fire deaths that occurred where no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms were present happened between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m.

• The death rate per 1,000 reported fires is 84% lower when hardwired smoke alarms and wet pipe sprinklers are present.

• People 55 or older were more likely to have smoke alarms that were more than 10 years old. (Smoke alarms should be replaced every ten years.)

According to NFPA approximately 3,000 people a year die in home fires. "This report reinforces the importance of smoke alarms in saving lives and identifies the way to further reduce that number through the installation of home fire sprinklers," said Shannon. "It is not acceptable to say 3,000 deaths are okay when we know we can do better."

NFPA offers the following tips for smoke alarms. Visit <u>http://</u><u>www.nfpa.org/smokealarms</u> for more information and to see video with basic smoke alarm safety tips.

• Choose a smoke alarm that bears the label of a recognized testing laboratory.

• Install a smoke alarm in every bedroom, outside each sleeping area, and on every level of your home, including the basement.



• Interconnect all smoke alarms throughout the home. When one sounds, they all sound.

• Replace batteries in all smoke alarms at least once a year. If an alarm "chirps," warning the battery is low, replace the battery right away.

• Replace all smoke alarms, including alarms that use 10year batteries and hard-wired alarms, when they are 10 years old or sooner if they do not respond properly when tested.

• Test your smoke alarms at least every month, using the test button or an approved smoke substitute and clean the units,

First of all you need to learn what type of suggestibility you are and then learn to recognize your "natural opposite". Ask yourself what qualities does that person have that allows you to like them? 2. Trust...it is impossible to have a lasting relationship with someone you can't trust. 3. Respect... Again, you can not have a long term relationship with someone you don't respect...do they their life in an honorable manner? Loss of respect is quite often the underlying reason for a breakup? Do you request respect and give respect? 4. Good communication...Don't fall into the trap of expecting someone else to read your mind.

It is your responsibility to communicate your needs. 5. Good sex...sex should never be used to control or manipulate the relationship. Good sex is 10 percent of a great relationship and bad sex is 90 percent. Sex is usually the barometer of a relationship. 6. Michael Moore stirs a nation in 'Capitalism: A Love Story'

o matter which side of the political arena or the economic tsunami you are on, no one can deny that Michael Moore gets the storm troopers out on both sides in his new film Capitalism: A Love Story. In yet another look at what's wrong with XYZ, Moore points out a lot of truths and offers some biased observations. But while he smacks us in the face about the realities of what's going on around us, he also does it with a keen sense of humor.

One element of the film involves a Bart Simpson style look at Wall Street. Moore entertains moviegoers – and people on the street there while filming was going on who look on in disbelief – while he puts crime tape around buildings on Wall Street. Through a bullhorn, he beckons bank scoundrels to come out for a citizen's arrest. In another scene he goes to a bank with a laundry bag to get back the money CEO's took as bonuses.

Next up on Moore's list are home foreclosures. The networks have done a pretty good job of covering this topic but Moore goes a little deeper when he follows a few families literally thrown out on the street with only a few hours notice. His cameras focus on a neighborhood of locals fed up with injustice. They match wits with a local sheriff over whether their family can remain in their home even though they had a legal eviction notice. The sheriff finally succumbs to Moore's attention-getting methods and leaves. A note in the film claims the family is still living there a year later without paying any additional payments.

It concerns American companies that take out insurance polices on their employees without their knowledge. In a memorandum from one company Moore spotlights, it refers to these people as Dead Peasants. In one family exposed in the film, the wife was an employee who died unexpectedly. The husband and kids are shown as he explains her company got \$81,000 from her policy while he didn't even have enough

money to pay for her funeral. Other companies mentioned have netted millions with this practice.

Although Moore is a liberal, he puts on the gloves against both national parties in this film, and it seems moviegoers on both sides are hailing his efforts. His look at the coverage of a group of auto workers let go without pay and their reaction is quite inspiring about the human spirit. As a filmmaker, he certainly goes to great lengths to prove a point – or at least to bring it into the forefront. And you can't argue with his success. Combining the above average ratings of his last five films, the approval rate is 90 percent by the nation's critics.

In the end, I believe Moore wants us all to consider our own answer to the question *Capitalism: A Love Story* ultimately asks, which is, "What is the price that America pays for its love of capitalism?" And I can't help smiling at Moore's response to the question concerning what he hopes audiences will take away from this film – "Popcorn and pitchforks."

2009 Ducati Monster 1100

The philosophy of Ducati is when they were designing the Ducati Monster 1100 motorcycle was 'less is more'. Well I can now say Ducati accomplished what they have set out to do.

Thanks to Moto Forza in Escondido I had the thrill of riding the Monster all over San Diego County racking up around 500 miles of back country, freeway and city roads. I know a few of you folks know me and also know I'm 64-years-young, that's right young and that is why I had so much fun riding the Ducati. Now I have ridden a lot of sport bikes and really wasn't all that comfortable, but the Monster was a different story, maybe it was the fact it only weighed in at 370 pounds dry, correct 370 pounds carrying a 1100 cc engine that

produces 95 horsepower at 7500 rpm. What really makes the Monster stand out is the torque, 75.9 foot pounds of raw torque, rider snaps the throttle while in six gear doing around 70 miles per hour, and had better hang on! Because this horse what's to run!

The Ducati is fuel injected by the way of Siemens electronic fuel injection with a 45 mm throttle body, dual aluminum exhaust pipes run through the chassis and out the rear next to the tail section of the bike. Being a Harley rider, noise is everything. Not so on the Monster, sure it makes noise, but very docile, in fact it was a sound I could really get used to, and did (I feel like taking her out for just one more spin, but I better finish this review first!)

When starting a Ducati Monster one must be aware it is

very cold blooded, not a bad thing, just need to turn on the key, flick the ignition knob to "on" and push the button and she will come alive, wait a minute or two and it's off and riding. Oh, did I mention that Ducati is smarter than the average motorcycle? Like Harley Davidson? What I'm driving at is once I started the Monster and dropped it into first gear the engine died. Okay still cold, started it again and again it died. I looked at the very informative instrumentation pod (which is full of good information) and it showed that it was almost warm. I started it again, dropped it into first gear and guess what? It died!

For the seasoned sport bike riders, stop chuckling, I know you have already figured it out. I had left the kick stand down and when the rider tries to start a sport bike with the kick stand down it will automatically die, safety first!

Back to the bike, this was the S model with adjustable Ohlin rear suspension, Brembo brakes for that "stop on a dime and give nine cents change" feel. This bike was very well balanced and one thing I need to mention, yes it is wicked fast, but when coming to an off or on ramp the rider needs to slow down a little and all he/she really needs to do is de-accelerate, no brakes just twist the throttle back and the compression really pulls the Monster down, grab a lower gear and knee drag yourself through the turns. (Okay I never dragged my knee, but I did think about it.)

I know what my readers are thinking, this is an Italian bike and must be very expensive to operate, which is farthest from the truth. Service every 7500 miles, a fewer parts and a two year unlimited mile warranty.

I loved this bike and if anyone is a first time rider male or female and they like the sport bike, check out Ducati's line of bikes at <u>www.moto-forza.com</u> or call (760) 746-6001 and tell them "Dave sent you"! As far as price, Moto Forza will be happy to tell you the number, but look at all the accessories first then ask for the price!

Dave: I have been using this same shop in my hometown for years and I just found out that when he changes my engine oil he used to use 20-50 motor oil now he uses a synthetic blend of 5-40, my question is will this harm my engine? One more question, I have 2 cases of 20-50 in garage, can I mix the oils? If not what would I do with the 20-50 oil? Dorothy.

Dorothy: I just had the same thing happen to me! I would not recommend mixing oils. Give your technician a call and tell him when you bring in the car for an oil and filter service you will be bringing in your own oil until all the 20-50 is gone, he should have no problem with that.

Halloween — not always trick or treat fun for pets

Dear Readers,

t's almost that time again, and I wanted to give you my annual tips and tricks for having your pet enjoy and be safe during the festivities.

While Halloween is a wonderfully fun time for humans, the animals we share our homes with might not appreciate All Hallows Eve as much as we do. Whether you have dogs, cats, puppies, kittens or birds, Halloween can be dangerous and/or stressful for animals in many ways, including the potential to escape, being scared by people in costumes, decorations that can be dangerous and candy that your pets should not eat. So, as you shop for goodies and fuss over decorations, also plan to spend a little time making arrangements for your pets so they are safe from goblins and other hazards.

Keeping your pet's routine

Because of all the mentioned potential dangers, it is ideal to have your pets put away during the evening's activities. "As creatures of habit, pets rely on their daily routines and become very agitated when those are disrupted," said Nancy Peterson, companion animal issues specialists for The Humane Society of the United States. "For their comfort and safety, the most considerate thing you can do is keep them away from the evening's activities."

Planning for the confinement of your pets should be done with their comfort in mind. Think "resort, not jail." You can make the time less stressful by using white noise such as music or television to mask the sounds of the evening, and if your dog reacts to the doorbell, think about disconnecting it, or stage yourself at the front door so the kids don't have to ring in the first place.

In addition, plan to give dogs special chew toys such as stuffed Kongs, (<u>http://www. kongcompany.com/worlds</u> <u>best.html</u> for recipes) raw bones, rawhide or other things to gnaw. Chewing helps relieve stress and keeps your pooch occupied so he won't worry as much about what's going on in the rest of the house.

Cat safety becomes more of a concern around this time of year since there are always discussions about cats used in ritualistic sacrifices, and especially black cats. Luckily the likelihood of satanic activity finding it's way into most neighborhoods is pretty slim, however, it is more likely that a wandering cat might become the victim of pranksters out for the evening, so caution should be taken to keep your cat inside.

Just as with any other time of year, there are also possibilities of someone taking your cat home with them, the risk of your cat hiding (sometimes for days), being hit by a car, or attacked by another animal such as a coyote. Therefore, play it safe and secure your cat in a room or a carrier until the last trick-or-treater is gone.

If you have a bird in your home, use a cage and cover it with a dense cover to help block the evening noise and encourage sleep.

Other potential hazards during Halloween: • Chocolate is toxic to both cats and dogs, so make sure your fur friends do not have access to the candy bowls.

• Be sure your pets are wearing ID tags, just in case they get out.

• Cats might be tempted by decorations like fake cobwebs or dangling streamers—both of which can be hazardous if your feline becomes entangled in these or ingests this type of product.

• Birds, both pets and wild birds also run the risk of entanglement in decorations, so use these sparingly.

• Jack-o-lanterns with candles are dangerous to any animal that might be tempted to play with them or eat them. Pumpkin is fine for dogs and cats to eat, but only if it's fresh and not moldy, however candles pose a risk of your pet being burned, and possibly setting a fire.

• Seventy percent of all dog bites happen on the property of the owner—another reason to keep your dogs inside and away from visitors.

Finally, and most importantly, whether you have a dog, cat or bird, make sure that between trick-or-treaters, you visit with your pets to make sure they are doing okay, or better yet, have a member of your family stay with them until the activities are over.
