

The Viejas tribal council, tribal members – Diana L. Aguilar, Tim Bactad, John A. Christman, Virginia Christman, Greybuck S. Espinoza, Robert Welch, Jr., – and dignitaries attended the official ribbon cutting for the Viejas Bowl, located in the Viejas Outlet Center on Tuesday, Nov. 24.

General Manager of the Outlet Center and VP of Property Management for the tribe, Peter M. Cortese, welcomed everyone before Viejas Councilwoman Virginia Christman did the tribal blessing on the bowling alley. Viejas Bowl opens to the public on November 25 at 4 p.m. and will remain open through midnight on Thanksgiving Day.

"We want to thank the tribal council for the opportunity to try a new product," Cortese said. "We look forward to the impact it will make on our community."

The 15,667 sq. ft. Viejas houses 12 U. S. Bowling Congress certified lanes, flat screen TVs for sporting and other events, and it includes an enclosed gaming area with class 2 slot machines. The décor – as witnessed by one patron after another's wide eyes of surprise when entering - is stunning. The Bowl boasts a family-friendly atmosphere, pool tables, an eating lounge and roomy seating areas. The lighting is exciting, and management is excited about the different options of bowling that will begin after the new year including leagues and late night bowling. Times are set for couples, seniors, juniors bowling and Beat the Clock on Sunday Mornings where games are only \$1 per game from 9 -10 a.m.

"What Viejas is doing reflects a vision to serve its community," said Patrick Murrey, President and CEO of Murrey International whose company installed the bowling lanes. "Our company has been around since the 1930s, and we understand that to be successful you must be willing to make change. Viejas is ahead of the curve in their model."

The tribal council all took their first swings together – some blushing, others boasting and a few who just wanted to have fun.

Please remember that the Board of Directors of the Mother Goose Parade Association are volunteers who want to serve their community and be forerunners of the Parade for future generations.



#### Wildfire Safety from Chairwoman Supervisor

Second District Dianne Jacob The catastrophic events of two of the largest fires in California history, as well as a number of other fires over the past six years demonstrates how important it is for San Diego to be on constant alert. The county has invested over \$180 million since 2003 to improve fire protection and emergency medical services.

As a result the county now has two new firefighting helicopters, over 70 pieces of additional or replacement apparatus' (34 engines and water tankers), the installation of mass notification system such as ALERT San Diego and Reverse 911, the formation of the San Diego County Fire Authority, an improved regional communication system and new Emergency Operations Center, as well as removal of over 500,000 dead, dying or diseased trees.

These are just a few examples of the improvements that have been put into place to further protect lives and property against the next major fire.

# Teaching good manners with positive methods

#### Dear Trainer,

I'm trying to teach my dog good manners. I've read several books about positive reinforcement and want to use these methods to help her be a canine good citizen. Do you have any suggestions that will add to my success? Signed,

Positive in Poway

#### Dear Positive,

Thanks for taking a positive road to training your dog. For doing so, your dog will have a better understanding about living with humans, and you will get better, long-term results with these methods. This is according to two different and recent scientific studies. The following are from my recent book, "Chill Out Fido, How to Calm Your Dog," which you can get at www.dogwise.com if you would like to learn more about how dogs learn, and the best tools for teaching your dog.

## Top 10 list for good dog training

1. Develop a daily training plan. This requires a number of components, the first of which is defining your shortterm goals. Each behavior you want to train should be defined and goals set to help your dog succeed. Considering this, it is important to break down the components of the behavior into small enough increments that the dog understands each part before moving to the next level. You will also need to train in an environment that promotes clear thought. Trying to train in a crisis is like asking someone to do math after they were just in a car accident! Not only would that person not be able to think clearly, he or she would consider the person demanding the math equation crazy!

2. Consider how important the behavior is to you. The more important the behavior or the problem, the more the details of the behavior should be defined into its tiniest components. This will ensure better results since you will be building a strong foundation on which the finished behavior will rest. Make a list of each component so you can clearly see what you will need to train!

3. Now, decide what the behavior should look like when you are finished, and be sure to write it down so you are clear about what you want. Don't just write that you want your dog to sit; go further and be detailed, such as, "I want my dog to sit fast at my side and continue to sit until I release her." If you can't figure out the final product, it will be difficult for your dog to understand what you are trying to teach her.

4. Define your dog's reinforcement history. If you are trying to solve a problem, you will need to analyze how long, and how strong the reinforcements have been during the period of time she has been practicing the behavior. How many times has your dog accomplished the unwanted behavior? Daily? Hourly? When dogs repeat behaviors, there is some sort of reinforcement for doing so, such as it's fun, it results in attention from humans (even negative attention can be rewarding), it relives stress, it makes scary things go away, it gets the result (such as pulling on leash gets the dog where she wants to go), etc. This step will help to plan how many repetitions you are going to need to make progress and counter the undesired behavior.

5. Decide if you need any foundation skills or behaviors to complete the final goal. These might include a fast sit, desensitization to things in the environment, teaching your dog to take something in her mouth, clicker readiness, etc.

6. What equipment will you need to start training? Make a list of things such as clicker, food rewards, leash, tug toys, etc.

7. Understand your dog's limits and vow to avert your dog from practicing any unwanted behaviors by management and prevention. Also, vow to prevent your dog from becoming overly aroused or stressed when you are training. To accomplish this, you will need to learn to watch your dog for calming behaviors and signs of stress, many of which result in impulsive actions such as pulling on leash, tugging on clothes, jumping on people, and the like.

8. Don't train if you feel stressed. This is important since human emotions are very much sensed by dogs. Are you feeling public pressure and stress by not having Lassie when you take your dog out? Everyone wants the perfect dog, and the social pressure can be reflected in how you handle your leash, the tone of your voice and even the way you stand. Dogs are perfect at being dogs, and they should get the things they like, as long as they can work together with humans as a team. It is, therefore, your job to build teamwork and show your dog how to live in the human world in a fair and benevolent manner. After all, your dog didn't get a choice of where she wanted to live, so it's only fair that you

cations; positive reinforcement training is just that.

9. Don't jump ahead with your training. If your dog can't do the behavior in her comfort zone, such as when she is at home or her own yard, with fluency, don't try to take it on the road. If that means forgoing walks because she reacts or bites your leash, you will need to fill that gap with other things that will stimulate her mentally and physically until she is able to stay focused and relaxed while you increase the stimulation, a little at a time.

10. Find things that motivate your dog. You need a way to communicate with your dog that she did the right thing. Rewards are in the eye of the beholder, so find things your dog loves, and then lavish them on your dog in the early stages of training so she can learn: all the while, you are making a significant emotional connection between the behavior and the reward. Once you have your dog doing well at one level, raise the bar a little and train that piece to fluency. Be sure that as you add duration or distractions that you only do one or the other at a time, and then be willing to throw in a few easy things now and then so your dog is drenched in success.

Once you have examined and fulfilled all of these things (there are others, but these would make a good start), you are ready to train you dog, so the next step is to get your dog into a good class. Please visit <u>www.sandiegodogtrainers.</u> <u>com</u> for classes and trainers in your area.


