The running of the goats

ith fire season around the corner, residents of Crest are getting prepared — the "green" way! Devastated by the 2003 Cedar Fire, Crest has began an integrated fuel reduction project with the introduction of 250 goats to eat their way across a 150-acre fuel reduction project. This environmentally balanced project combines the goats, machines and manpower to reduce vegetation, which might otherwise play a role in another wildfire.

On Saturday, March 7, the Crest Firesafe Council sponsored "The Running of the Goats," event, which kicked off the fuel reduction project. Goats raced down a back road by South Lane Park, led by local boy scouts and herded into

a large field, where they began their feast.

The State of California has also began to use goats to thin undergrowth in areas where controlled burns are too risku See FIRE PREVENTION page 2

Continued from page 1 or terrain is too difficult for humans to navigate, according to Tom Hoffman, chief of fire prevention for the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection. They (the goats) love their job and need no prodding to eat their way through tasty undrebrush. All they require is water, supervision and portable fencing to keep them under control.

There are many reasons to use goats:

Goats are versatile. They can be used effectively in almost any location or terrain type, especially in terrain too rocky or steep for human or machine clearing. Goat cleared areas are more fire resistant, and significantly more attractive appearances result.

Goats are one of the most cost effective brush and weed abatement resources per contracted area.

Goats are an environmentally friendly method for clearing areas containing endangered or sensitive vegetation and animal life. Thinning by goats is a natural method resulting in a naturally balanced environment over the long term. Erosion from over-stripped recently cleared land is eliminated safely and effectively.

Goats are far less intrusive than mechanical clearing tools. The loud noise of heavy equipment is much more bothersome to resident than the quiet grazing of goats.

Goats are one of the most effective fire prevention tools available. Areas cleared or thinned by goats recover more naturally and resist wildfires giving fire crews the upperhand and protecting life and property.

Smokey Bear watch out. . . . here come the goats!



For Health's Sake

What color is that migraine?

unshine Cleaning, a simple story with unexpected surprises, is filled with reality by the performances of Amy Adams, Emily Blunt and Alan Arkin. In this film about a dysfunctional family, it's the quirky tone and simplistic direction by Christine Jeffs (Sylvia) that makes the movie work.

Too busy to worry about her future, Rose instead has to take care of her 7-year-old son, Oscar (Jason Spevack), who always seems to get into trouble at school. Rose also has to rein in her out-of-control, tattooed and prickly sister Norah (Blunt).

When Rose is offered a cleaning job at a new house, she opens her eyes concerning how sad her life really is. The home belongs to Rose's old school chum who invites her to a baby shower with some of their former friends. Although Rose is excited to finally "fit in," the situation only accentuates the mundane aspects of her life. After Rose runs into Mac's wife (Mary Lynn Rajskub) who tells her she knows about the affair, Rose understands she's basically a looser.

A chance to start a better job arises when Rose and her sister begin Sunshine Cleaning, a business cleaning up crime scenes. Unaware of the protocol or environmental rules involved, the girls plunge

head on into cleaning up blood and other elements left behind once the yellow tape gets taken down. Her ignorance of the law presents even more obstacles for Rose.

The story is about more than what one sees on the screen. The underlying theme concerns how two sisters overcome the tragic death of their mother while helping their father (Arkin) move on with his life, and making their own dreary lives better.

While the theme is understated, it's highlighted by screenwriter Megan Holley's quirky humor as illustrated mostly through the characters portrayed by Arkin and Blunt -- with Adams the re-bounder of their mirth. Arkin appears like a shadow of the character he won the Best Supporting Actor Oscar for in *Little Miss Sunshine*. In *Sunshine Cleaning*, he's not quite as caustic, and his noble desire to do good by his fractured daughters shines through all his bizarre efforts.


> Blunt stands out far differently than she did in *The Devil Wears Prada*. More than a snide, jealous woman, Blunt presents Norah as a troubled and defiant teen on the outside but a needy and

wounded soul on the inside. Adams (*Miss Pettigrew Lives* for a Day) immerses herself in every role she plays as her Oscar nominations for both *Doubt* and *Junebug* validate. As Rose, she carries the weight of the world on her shoulder while sloughing off the torpedoes of failure like they're balloons.

"I really could identify with wanting to be more than you are, in a different place than you were born into, to sort of elevate your status in the world," Adams said. "That's something I think a lot of people identify with."

In the supporting cast, Clifton Collins Jr., as a somewhat mentor to Rose, and Jason Spevack, as Oscar, add interesting elements to the story.

Sunshine Cleaning is a sliceof-life entertainment offering both humor and heartbreaking melodrama.

Dodge Sprinter, the answer for large families

ot a big family? Maybe a small church or a tour business? Then you need passenger space and the Sprinter by Dodge may be just your cup of tea. The Sprinter I tested was the 170-inch wheel base, which is the longest they make or one can opt for the smaller version that is a 144-inch wheel base. Single or dual wheels in the rear are available for added stability especially if with the Sprinter with the tall ceiling that is over six feet tall. My test van had single rear wheels and the high roof worked just fine, although I did get into a little wind in Alpine but had no problem.

There is one engine to choose from — a 3.0-liter V6

that burns diesel. Expect fuel mileage around the 20's, which isn't bad and with a 25 gallon fuel tank, there is a range in the 600 mile area. I must admit the V6 was a little under powered but manageable.

There are a lot of standard creature comforts like A/C front and rear, AM/FM/CD, power windows and door locks and power heated mirrors. The driver and passenger seats were very comfortable with air ride adjustments for those long trips. Sliding passenger side door that was pretty big but it slid on its tracks as if it didn't weigh a thing. The seating layout worked great for unloading and loading passengers (I was going to head out to Viejas and



see if I could make a buck or two hauling gamblers but no takers, must have been the lack of decals!)

The first row of seating held three, the second row held three and the third row held four passengers for a total of 10 plus the passenger and driver. Rear air was available and the windows were well tinted with a great view. The rear doors opened barn-style and you had enough room in the back for luggage for 12 and there was a nice step to help passengers into the rear of the Sprinter and plenty of lights to help guide the way.

Safety was a concern for Dodge so they added traction control, air bags up front, Latch-Ready Child Seat Anchor System, Adaptive Electronic Stability Program, heavy duty stabilizer bar up front, power rack and pinion steering, and a emergency exit window.

My tester came with a lot of extras that brought it from a base price of \$47,220 to a whopping \$63,365 plus tax and license. But I can state that Rancho Dodge in Kearny Mesa has over 100 units in stock and they will do what they can to put one in your garage or driveway. Talk with Doug Wilson and he will sharpen his pencil, just tell him "Dave sent you"!




Bumper-to-Bumper with Dave Stall

Dave: I have heard you talk on your radio show on KCBQ AM 1170 about putting a transmission oil cooler on a vehicle that will be used for excessive towing. I didn't hear where you should put the cooler. I tow a Bob Cat and the truck I use is a 2007 Ford F-350. I have checked my transmission fluid a couple of times and the fluid is pretty dark. The truck only has 23,443 miles on it. I'm going to do a transmission service (not a flush, I listen) and install a transmission cooler. Keep up the great work! Len, El Cajon.

Len: Thanks for the kind words. If your truck didn't come with a cooler (it should have) you will want to install the cooler at the transmission lines that go up to the radiator, which is the stock cooler, don't eliminate the radiator from the system. Cool water from the radiator helps keep your transmission cooler and helps eliminate wear and tear. I would also put in a transmission temperature gauge, cut into the hot side of the cooler line so you will get an accurate reading on how hot the transmission gets during towing and climbing hills.



The 2009-2014 Consolidated Plan (CP) document represents the City of El Cajon's effort in fulfilling the requirements under the federal Community Planning and Development (CPD) regulations for the HUD-funded grants. Key components of the document include a comprehensive housing and community development needs assessment and a five-year strategic plan that addresses the identified needs. A draft of the document will be available for public review and comment beginning March 12, 2009.

For fiscal year 2009-2010, the City of El Cajon anticipates receiving \$1,234,525 in CDBG funds and \$759,051 in HOME funds. An additional \$902,547 of unallocated prior year CDBG and \$477,271 of HOME funds is also available for allocation at this time. The CDBG funds must be utilized to meet one of three national objectives to qualify for funding: 1) benefit 70% low and moderate income persons in the community; 2) aid in the elimination of slum and blight; or 3) meet other community development needs having a particular urgency because existing conditions pose a serious threat. HOME funds may be used "to provide incentives to develop and support affordable rental housing and homeownership affordability through the acquisition..., new construction, reconstruction, or rehabilitation...with suitable amenities, including real property acquisition, site improvement, conversion, demolition and other expenses...and to provide for the payment of reasonable administrative and planning costs; and to provide for the payment of operating expenses of community housing development organizations (CHDOs) – 24 CFR 92.205(a). Each participating jurisdiction must set aside 15% of their HOME entitlement for CHDOs.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING ZONE RECLASSIFICATION NO. 2294 REZONING PROPERTY LOCATED AT 1335 GREENFIELD DRIVE FROM R-2-R ZONE TO PRD – LOW ZONE.

Whereas, the City Council held a public hearing on **February 26, 2008** to consider Zone Reclassification No. 2294 in which it was requested that the property at 1335 Greenfield Drive (APN: 484-120-019) be rezoned from R-2-R zone to PRD – Low zone in order to allow the development of a new six lot single-family planned residential development; and

Whereas, the City Council approved the rezoning request, subject to pre-conditions being completed prior to the first ordinance reading; and

Whereas, the applicant has complied with all pre-conditions required for Zone Reclassification No. 2294, as modified by the City Council.

The City Council of the City of El Cajon does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. The proposed project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Section 15332 (Class 32 – Infill Development) of CEQA Guidelines.

SECTION 2. The proposed rezoning request, while less than one acre in size, is adjacent to other property zoned PRD-Low and together they create a PRD District of more than one acre in size.

SECTION 3. Changing the zoning on the property from the R-2-R zone to the PRD – Low zone is in the public necessity and convenience and general welfare because this infill property is a narrow lot with limited frontage on a public street and the PRD zone will allow the property to be developed with a for-sale housing product with a less traditional, more innovative site plan reflective of the constraints of this property shape, than would be allowed without the zoning change.

SECTION 4. The proposed PRD zoning designation permits single-family developments, which is consistent with the General Plan land use designation of Low Density Residential (3-10 du / ac) applicable to this property.

SECTION 5. The City Council hereby REZONES Assessor's Parcel 484-120-019 to PRD – Low.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days following its passage and adoption.

Therapy dog ... ask a trainer - part 1

Dear Trainer, Movies of I get my dog involved in therapy work? My dog is so gentle and sweet and loves everyone that she meets, and I think she would be really good at helping to cheer people up that are sick or in extended care facilities. Any time I don't feel well, my dog will just come and sit near me and it makes me feel much better. Signed.

Healing dog mom

Dear Healing,

Your dog sounds really sweet and you might be right, your dog might be a good candidate for therapy work.

The first step for your dog becoming a therapy dog will be to get her ready to take the Canine Good Citizen test. Once you have your certificate in hand, you can query different groups, such as the Helen Woodward's, or the San Diego Humane Society's Pet Assisted Therapy department for more specific goals that they require. You can also look directly at different hospitals, such as Kaiser where they have their own program. You will likely have to have your dog do other testing per each organization, so do call them for their ground rules.

So you are familiar with the Canine Good Citizen program, read through the following which are the requirements per the American Kennel Club for dogs to pass the test. This will help you recognise your dog's strengths and deficits so you can go to work on the things that you will need to have in place before taking the CGC test

CGC Test Items:

Before taking the Canine Good Citizen test, owners will sign the Responsible Dog Owners Pledge. We believe that responsible dog ownership is a key part of the CGC concept and by signing the pledge: owners agree to take care of their dog's health needs, safety, exercise, training and quality of life. Owners also agree to show responsibility by doing things such as cleaning up after their dogs in public places and never letting dogs infringe on the rights of others.

After signing the Responsible Dog Owners Pledge, owners and their dogs are ready to take the CGC Test. Items on the Canine Good Citizen Test include:

Test 1: Accepting a friendly stranger

This test demonstrates that the dog will allow a friendly stranger to approach it and speak to the handler in a natural, everyday situation. The evaluator walks up to the dog and handler and greets the handler in a friendly manner, ignoring the dog. The evaluator and handler shake hands and exchange pleasantries. The dog must show no sign of resentment or shyness, and must not break position or try to go to the evaluator.

Test 2: Sitting politely for petting

This test demonstrates that the dog will allow a friendly stranger to touch it while it is out with its handler. With the dog sitting at the handler's side, to begin the exercise, the evaluator pets the dog on the head and body. The handler may talk to his or her dog throughout the exercise. The dog may stand in place as it is petted. The dog must not show shyness or resentment.

Test 3: Appearance and grooming

This practical test demonstrates that the dog will welcome being groomed and examined and will permit someone, such as a veterinarian, groomer or friend of the owner, to do so. It also demonstrates the owner's care, concern and sense of responsibility. The evaluator inspects the dog to determine if it is clean and groomed. The dog must appear to be in healthy condition (i.e., proper weight, clean, healthy and alert). The handler should supply the comb or brush commonly used on the dog. The evaluator then softly combs or brushes the dog, and in a natural manner, lightly examines the ears and gently picks up each front foot. It is not necessary for the dog to hold a specific position during the examination, and the handler may talk to the dog, praise it and give encouragement throughout.

Test 4: Out for a walk (walking on a loose lead) This test demonstrates that

the handler is in control of the dog. The dog may be on either side of the handler. The dog's position should leave no doubt that the dog is attentive to the handler and is responding to the handler's movements and changes of direction. The dog need not be perfectly aligned with the handler and need not sit when the handler stops. The evaluator may use a pre-plotted course or may direct the handler/dog team by issuing instructions or commands. In either case, there should be

a right turn, left turn, and an about turn with at least one stop in between and another at the end. The handler may talk to the dog along the way, praise the dog, or give cues in a normal tone of voice. The handler may sit the dog at the halts if desired.

Test 5: Walking through a crowd

This test demonstrates that the dog can move about politely in pedestrian traffic and is under control in public places. The dog and handler walk around and pass close to several people (at least three). The dog may show some interest in the strangers but should continue to walk with the handler, without evidence of over-exuberance, shyness or resentment. The handler may talk to the dog and encourage or praise the dog throughout the test. The dog should not jump on people in the crowd or strain on the leash.


